GOVERNMENT OF THE HOSPITAL.

A BOARD of Management meets in the Board Room of the Hospital fortnightly on Wednesdays at 11 a.m. for the transaction of the ordinary business.

A Court of Governors is held on the last Thursday in the months of February, May, and November for the confirmation of such acts of the Board as require the sanction of a Court, and the transaction of special business. A Special Meeting of this Court may be called at any time, either by order of the Court or of the Board, or upon the requisition of the Treasurers or of any five Governors.

The Patrons, President, and Vice-Presidents are *ex-officio* Members of the Court, of the Board, and of Committees of a Court or Board.

To the Court of Governors.

MY LORDS, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN.

It must be borne in mind by all who study the Hospital statistics for this year that the figures throughout are most materially affected by the closing of the Hospital during the months of July, August and September for the purpose of carrying out extensive replacement of plant and general repairs. The numbers relating to In-Patients are further reduced by the fact that the Wards had to be gradually emptied during June, and that it was some time after the nominal re-opening before they received their full normal complement. In making comparisons with previous years it is essential to remember the very considerable effect of these factors. The Hospital, for the first complete year since the early autumn of 1914, has again resumed its purely civil functions, and the Branch Hospital once more becomes in name and in deed The Convalescent Home. It may be mentioned that for an intervening period of $3\frac{1}{2}$ months the Home was utilised for the reception of patients from the closed Cancer Charity.

During the past year 3,607 patients were treated in the Hospital, as compared with 4,720 in 1918; the average length of stay being 21.45 days for each patient.

The average number of beds occupied daily was 263, reckoning the year at 267 days, during which the Hospital was actually open, but the above caveat as regards the periods of emptying and re-filling must also be taken into account.

For the complete year the figures are 192.38. The corresponding figures in 1918 were 291.09.

In the Out-Patient Department 34,079 new patients were treated and the number of attendances was 100,833; the average attendances per patient were 2.96 compared with 3.24 in 1918.

In the Electrical Department 2,937 new patients were treated, and the total number of attendances was 20,333.

The financial aspect of the year has been marked by two special features; the Expenditure Account has been inflated to an extraordinary extent by the payment for all the replacements of plant and repairs, the necessity for which was referred to in the last Annual Report, and by the general rise in employees' wages; the Income Account has been exceptionally swollen by the proceeds of the Special Appeal, though not the whole of these can be credited to current income.

It will be seen from the Income and Expenditure Account of the General Fund that the Annual Subscriptions amounted to £5,315 0s. 7d., a decrease of £1,172 5s. 10d., largely due to withdrawals owing to deaths, and to arrears, which it is hoped will be cleared up early in the current financial year. The receipts from Donations were (apart from the Special Appeal) £2,593 18s. 3d., a decrease of £1,741 11s. 3d. But it must be remembered that many supporters preferred during the Appeal to send their donations to this rather than to the General Fund. The "All Help" League contributed £1,751 18s. 5d. The Special Appeal produced up to the end of the financial year £47,614 5s. 7d.

The yield from invested property was £5,961 16s. 9d., an increase of £61 12s. 4d. over that of 1918

The Trustees of the "Annie Zunz" Fund have again shown their practical sympathy with the work of the Maternity Department by making a grant of £1,400. We desire to record our deep gratitude to the Trustees for their great generosity, which is especially welcome in the exceptional difficulties of this year.

The year's dividend from the "David Hughes" Hospital Trust Fund was £1,993 15s. 0d.

The total income was £93,610 0s. 7d., which (omitting the Special Appeal Fund), is £4,184 15s. 11d. less than that of 1918.

The total expenditure amounted to £84,355 10s. 2d.

Of this total, Renewals and Repairs account for £24,832 6s. 0d., mostly abnormal expenditure; if this sum is deducted the remainder £59,523 4s. 2d. compares with a total of £54,502 9s. 0d. for the year 1918. But in considering this comparatively small increase of £5,020 15s. 2d., it must be borne in mind that the Hospital was closed for three months and the cost of provisions, drugs, dressings, fuel and lighting, washing, etc., thereby proportionately diminished.

The weekly cost per occupied bed was £6 15s. 8d.; an increase of £3 19s. 1d. over the corresponding cost for 1918. A mere comparison of the figures, without taking into account the peculiar conditions existent during this period, would be misleading. We would here emphatically repeat the warning given at the beginning of the Report. Bed occupancy was abnormally low, expenses of repairs, etc., unusually high; with a smaller Divisor, and a larger Dividend, the Quotient must be increased out of all proportion to the average preceding Quotients.

The most prominent feature in the Special Appeal campaign was the Festival Dinner, held in December, at the Savoy Hotel, with His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales in the chair. At the same time, in conjunction with this, there was a Ladies' Dinner at which Her Royal Highness Princess Alice, Countess of Athlone, presided. Both events were markedly successful, and the joint proceedings after the dinners were attended with most satisfactory results. H.R.H. The Chairman made an eloquent speech in support of the Appeal, and was able to announce a substantial list of contributions to the Fund. We desire to pay a high tribute to the influence exercised by the interest taken in the Hospital's work by the Prince of Wales, and to record our appreciation of, and gratitude for, the value of his hearty co-operation.

A Concert, held at 10, Downing Street, under the auspices of Mrs. Lloyd George, was responsible for a notable addition to the Fund. A "Shilling Fund," kindly and ingeniously organised by the "Daily Sketch," took the form of an offering from the Women of Great Britain to H.R.H. the Prince of Wales on his return home from Canada, to be handed by him to the Hospital at the Festival Dinner; the grand total of £7,000 was the successful result.

A considerable space at the Ideal Home Exhibition at Olympia was given over to a Nursery section, shewing nurseries, so kindly planned by various Queens, and by T.R.H. Princess Mary and Princess Alice, Countess of Athlone ; the proceeds of admission to these amounting, with donations from visitors, to over £5,000, were devoted to the Hospital Fund, thanks to the generosity of Associated Newspapers Limited. This gratifying success was largely due to the efforts of Mr. F. E. Bussy of the "Daily Mail."

We have also to thank Sir Ernest Shackleton for devoting the proceeds of his first Illustrated Lecture to the Special Appeal Fund ; Mrs. Kendal and Miss Maud Jennings for organising and managing a special theatrical performance at the Prince of Wales' Theatre ; and the European Management of the Canadian Pacific Railway for generously contributing the proceeds of a Kinematograph entertainment picturing the Canadian tour of the Prince of Wales.

For the success of the Special Appeal campaign we owe much to our Chairman the Earl of Athlone ; his energy, tact and unremitting toil have gained their due reward : to him and to all the members of the Special Appeal Committee we offer our most sincere thanks for their ungrudging labours.

The "All Help" League, under Mrs. Richard Davis' able guidance, has widened and strengthened its connection with ex-patients, and in spite of last year's special drawbacks, has increased its income. For further details we would refer you to the separate Report to be issued by the League itself. It has healthily outgrown the limits of a paragraph in this Report.

The return of the Chairman to the active resumption of his duties is warmly welcomed by his colleagues on the Board.

We have to record with regret the death of Mr. W. C. Houghton, and Captain A. Campbell, both of whom had served on the Weekly Board for many years.

We welcome as new colleagues, Mr. J. A. Berners, who maintains his family's connection with the Hospital, the Hon. Windham Baring, and Mr. Alistair N. Tayler.

A new departure in the constitution of the Board is to be noted ; the Mayor of the Borough of St. Marylebone has been made an ex-officio member for his year of office ; and it is with the greatest pleasure that we welcome so good a friend to the Hospital as Mr. Duncan Watson as the first Mayor to occupy a seat at the Board.

We welcome the appointment of Ernest W. Robinson, Esq., as Hon. Auditor.

Dr. C. E. Lakin has been elected a Physician to the Hospital in succession to Dr. W. Pasteur, who has been elected a Consultant Physician ; and Dr. G. E. Beaumont has been elected an Assistant Physician.

Mr. A. S. Blundell Bankart has been elected Surgeon of the new Orthopædic Department.

Two other new Special Departments have been created to treat cases of Proctology and of Urinary Diseases, under the care of Mr. C. H. S. Webb and Mr. A. E. Webb-Johnson respectively.

Mr. Herbert Charles and Mr. R. E. Apperly have been elected as Honorary Anæsthetists to the Hospital, and Mr. T. G. A. Burns Consulting Anæsthetist.

Mr. A. de Winter Baker has relinquished his temporary appointment as Resident Medical Officer, and Mr. S. S. Beare has been elected to fill this important post.

The Revd. W. E. Cargill has been elected as Chaplain to the Hospital.

It is with profound regret that we have to record the death of Dr. C. R. C. Lyster, Consultant to the Electro-Therapeutic Department. He had been compelled by illness, due to his devotion to duty, to resign his active control of this Department but a short time before his death. His untiring and unselfish efforts on behalf of humanity had been rewarded with many valuable results; the University of London, recognising the importance of his work, has instituted a Chair of Radiology at the Hospital, and it is hoped that a fitting memorial to Dr. Lyster may materialise in the adequate endowment of this Professorship.

We would also record our regret at the sudden death of the Revd. Prebendary F. S. Webster, Rector of All Souls, only a few days after he had relinquished the office of Chaplain to the Hospital. He had taken up this work at a time of difficulty during the War, and carried it on with conspicuous success.

To our regret we have lost an old and valued member of the Drug Committee, Sir Peter Squire, who for many years had given us the benefit of his experience and advice.

We are fortunate to have obtained the services of Mr. J. D. Marshall as a new member of the Drug Committee.

The Endowment of the "Die Hards" Bed in memory of the Officers and other Ranks of the Middlesex Regiment who fell in the War has been completed. A touching dedicatory service was conducted by the Bishop of London in the presence of a large gathering of members and friends of the Regiment. We have largely to thank the energy and generosity of Mr. G. F. Sexton for the successful issue of this undertaking.

The St. Marylebone Committee of the United Services Fund propose to endow 2 Beds and 1 Cot for the benefit of ex-service men and their dependents. We hope that shortly the complete scheme will be settled.

The Ladies' Work Society, under the Presidency of the Dowager Countess of Derby, has once more contributed largely of their time and good work, with the result that a most gratifying number of garments for the patients' use has been regularly forthcoming; on their behalf we thank the willing wielders of the needle.

The organising of the work of this Society is in the able hands of Lady Rew as Work Secretary, to whose voluntary and efficient efforts in yet another sphere of usefulness we are once more deeply indebted.

The Dowager Countess of Derby has further earned our gratitude by direct and indirect help in aid of the Hospital, and we have to thank her more particularly for the contribution of £43 ls. 4d. towards the upkeep of the Bird Ward.

We again tender our thanks to those ladies, who with military regularity and punctuality, attend at the Hospital to help in transferring patients to and from the Operating Theatres.

Our efforts to assist the Ministry of Health and the Local County Councils in the national campaign against Venereal Diseases have been continued with unremitting zeal and efficiency. Steps have been taken to increase and improve the facilities offered, for the work still, sad to say, tends to increase. But in this section, as in others, the limited accommodation of the Out-Patient Department is a hindrance to the development at which we would aim.

The total number of attendances was 8,298, an increase of 1,576 compared with last year, and 254 in-patient days of treatment were given to sufferers from these diseases. In addition 2,507 pathological specimens were examined in the Bland-Sutton Institute.

The important and beneficent work of our Infant Welfare Centre, in conjunction with the Health Society of the Borough of St. Marylebone, has extended its sphere of usefulness. The value of diminishing infant mortality and improving the health of surviving children has now become universally recognised; we do our full share to achieve these ends.

The organisation of the Baby Clinic, shown at the Ideal Home Exhibition, was in the hands of this Department, and we congratulate Miss Price, the Lady Almoner, and Miss Neville, the Health Visitor, on their energy and skill, to which the success of this scheme was largely due.

A far-reaching Scheme for improving the Administration of the Hospital has been approved by the Board, and recommended to a Special Court of Governors for their sanction. We have a firm confidence that, if adopted, this will lead to still further economy and efficiency in the control of the management of the Hospital.

Another important Scheme will also be submitted to the same Court: The Amalgamation of the Cancer Research Department and Bland-Sutton Institute of Pathology with the Medical School has been approved by the Board, in the sure anticipation that unity of control will result in improvements alike beneficial to scientific research and medical education; the accountancy of these Departments will be at the same time greatly simplified.

We have been able to acquire a long lease of No. 8 Mortimer Street; the School of Massage has been removed to these premises, which provide much better accommodation than was hitherto available for this growing Department.

The increased scale of salaries for the Nursing Staff is now in force and the improved Schedule of working hours and leave, to which allusion was made in our last Report, will be brought into full effect as soon as the Nurses' New Home is open to accommodate the necessary increase of the Staff. It is hoped that the Home will be open on the 1st July.

The curriculum has been modified to suit the change of training period from 4 years to 3 years.

An innovation has been made by the employment of a small number of Male Nurses for special cases.

We wish to express our hearty thanks to H.R.H. Princess Alice, Countess of Athlone, for her successful efforts in raising the sum of £5,133 11s. 3d. towards the cost of the Nurses' New Home, and for her general interest in the welfare of the Hospital and the Nursing Staff in particular.

A contribution of £1,000 has been received from King Edward's Hospital Fund for London towards the cost of the New Home.

The Convalescent Home at Clacton was utilised from the end of May to the middle of October for housing the inmates of the Cancer Charity. After their departure redecoration and repairs had to be carried out; a work which was considerably delayed by labour difficulties. But now the Home has resumed its proper functions.

We regret to have to report the resignation of Dr. Campbell Thomson from the Office of Dean. His zealous administration was entirely successful, and during the last five years he had carried on under extraordinary difficulties. The School is to be congratulated on obtaining the services of Mr. A. E. Webb-Johnson as his successor.

We have to report with pleasure the following appointments :— Prof. Swale Vincent, M.D., D.Sc., associated with London University and, of recent years, Professor of Physiology at the University of Manitoba, Winnipeg, has been appointed to the Professorship of Physiology, newly instituted.

Dr. James McIntosh, who has made many contributions to research work, has been appointed Professor, and Director of the Bland-Sutton Institute of Pathology.

We wish to congratulate Dr. Sidney Russ on his election to the newly instituted Professorship of Physics, which he will hold jointly with the office of Physicist to the Hospital, and we feel confident that the collaboration of the Physicist's department with the department of Radiology will be fruitful of results in the investigation of Cancer.

We wish to take this opportunity of offering our grateful thanks to Professor C. H. Browning, previously Director of the Bland-Sutton Institute of Pathology, and to Dr. J. Strickland Goodall, Sub-Dean and Lecturer on Physiology, for their good services to the Medical School.

In conclusion we would point out that, in looking back on the period covered by this Report, we remember the difficult task confronting us in having to provide for the heavy cost of repairs which we were compelled to effect, and for the debt to our Bankers. We faced this task in the full confidence that we had only to make our difficulties known, and those who realised the value of the Hospital's work would come to our aid. We are grateful to them for all that they have done for us, but must remind them and others that our full purpose has not yet been achieved. It is true that with their generous help we have been able to pay the heavy cost of repairs, and to discharge our obligation to our Bankers; but the sum we set out to obtain was £200,000, the amount required for these desirable objects, for building a new Out-patient Department, and to make provision for the higher maintenance charges, which must prevail in the future. We still require £150,000 for these purposes. We plead earnestly to one and all to do their utmost to attain this end. The end may seem far off, but we plead with confidence in our ultimate success. Our hopefulness is based on the fact that our need is apparent to all who think on our position, on what a great Hospital does, and on the necessity that its work must not be hampered to the detriment of those who depend upon it for restoration to health. If all these resolve to pull together with a will, the winning-post will be reached, and the great race against death and disease will culminate in a grand victory. For this we look to those who enjoy the opportunities of giving large sums, as well as to those of smaller means who can help so materially by becoming annual subscribers to our funds.

Let all who read our plea work hard for the good cause, and enrol themselves in the ranks of our supporters, and enlist as many as possible to battle under the standard of the Middlesex Hospital.

GOVERNORS.

THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, RIGHTS, AND PRIVILEGES.

1. Annual Subscribers of *Three Guineas or upwards* to the Hospital's General Fund, or to its particular establishments, viz., the Cancer Charity, the Convalescent Home (Clacton-on-Sea) or to the Medical School, are entitled to be Governors so long as their Subscriptions are paid.

2. Donors of *Thirty Guineas or upwards*, at one time, are made Life Governors, and at once entitled to all the privileges of Governors. The Endowment of a Bed or Cot (see p. 149) qualifies the donor as a Life Governor.

3. Honorary Governors are appointed, and the propriety of making such appointments is first considered by the Board, and then submitted for the consideration and approval of a Court of Governors.

4. Honorary Governors have, from the day of their appointment, the same rights and privileges in all respects as Life Governors. In cases of Bequests of *Two Hundred Pounds and under Five Hundred Pounds*, one of the Executors under the will is eligible for appointment as an Honorary Governor.

5. All Governors have the right of attending the Courts of Governors, but Governors who are in arrear with their subscriptions are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any Board or Committee appointed in accordance with the Laws of the Hospital, and Governors who are new Annual Subscribers or Donors are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any such Board or Committee unless their subscriptions or donations have been paid at least three calendar months previously, and Governors being Salaried Officers or holding similar offices, or being Students or Servants of the Hospital, are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court, or to serve on any such Committee, and are not entitled to speak, vote, or serve at or on any such Court, Board, or Committee for one year after they have ceased to be such Salaried Officers, to hold such similar Offices or to be such Students or Servants, unless specially authorised so to do by the Board.

6. No Governor is entitled to speak or vote at any Court, Board, or Committee on any question or matter wherein he or she is personally interested.

7. Every Governor has the right of visiting the Wards and other departments in the presence of any one of the Physicians or Surgeons of the Hospital, the Resident Medical Officer or his substitute, the Chaplain, the Lady Superintendent, one of the Visiting Governors, or the Secretary-Superintendent.

ANNUAL SUBSCRIBERS, DONORS, AND CONTRIBUTORS.

AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

1. Every Annual Subscriber of *Two Guineas and less than Three Guineas*, and every Donor of *Twenty Guineas*, at one time (or of smaller sums that may together equal that amount in the course of the current year), is entitled to recommend four Patients yearly; and Donors of *less than Twenty Guineas*, are entitled, at the discretion of the Board, to recommend four Patients yearly during a period of three years.

2. Every Annual Subscriber of *Three Guineas and less than Five Guineas*, and every Donor of *Thirty Guineas and less than Fifty Pounds*, at one time, is entitled to recommend nine Patients yearly.

3. Every Annual Subscriber of *Five Guineas and less than Ten Guineas*, and every Donor of *Fifty Pounds and less than One Hundred Pounds*, at one time, is entitled to recommend fifteen Patients yearly.

4. Every Annual Subscriber of *Ten Guineas or upwards*, and every Donor of *One Hundred Pounds or upwards*, at one time, is entitled to recommend twenty-five Patients yearly.

5. Annual Subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the quarter-day next preceding the date of Subscription; and Subscribers are not entitled to any privilege until their Subscriptions are paid.

6. Every Incumbent or other Minister who permits a Collection to be made in his Church or Chapel, for the benefit of the Hospital, is entitled, for every £31 10s. so contributed, to the privilege of recommending nine Patients annually during five years; but in all cases where such Contributions is less than £31 10s. the Incumbent or Minister is entitled to recommend nine Patients during the first year after such contribution for the first sum of Six Guineas so contributed, a similar number during the second year for the second sum of Six Guineas, and so on. And every Clergyman (or other Minister, not being the Incumbent) who preaches for the benefit of the Hospital (provided the sum contributed is not less than £31 10s.) is entitled to the privilege, during the year ensuing the day on which the collection was made of recommending five Patients.

In-Patients are expected to be provided with clean and decent clothing, and a change of linen. They also have to provide themselves with tea, sugar and washing. In all cases where the Patients are too poor to provide themselves with these articles, they are supplied to them by the Lady Almoner from special funds which she has at her disposal for the purpose.

Any Officer, Sister, Nurse, Servant, or person employed in any Department of the Hospital accepting Money, or Presents of any kind, from a Patient, or relative or friend of any Patient, on any pretence whatever, is liable to dismissal.

The following Cases are not admitted into the Hospital:—

1. Those which are, upon due examination, deemed *Incurable*, as Advanced Consumption, etc.
2. Complaints so tedious of Cure as to preclude for a long time the admission of more urgent cases, as *Chronic Ulcers of the Legs*, etc.
3. Disorders, to the Cure of which other establishments are devoted, as *Persons of Unsound Mind*, etc.
4. Those which are more properly objects for Parochial Relief, as wanting Food and not Medicine.
5. Those whose admission might endanger the other patients, as persons suffering from *Infectious Diseases*.
6. Complaints likely to be aggravated rather than relieved by confinement within the walls of a Hospital, but such cases, if deemed proper objects, may receive advice and medicine as *Out-Patients*.

Prior to sending up Patients from the Country, the Secretary-Superintendent should be applied to, in order to learn whether there is room, and such application should be accompanied by a medical certificate setting out fully the nature of the case.

I give, devise, and bequeath to "The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurers, and Governors of The Middlesex Hospital," All the residue and remainder of my Messuages, Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, and Real Estate: And also all the rest, residue, and remainder of my goods, chattels, and personal estate and effects whatsoever and wheresoever not herein by me otherwise disposed of, to hold to them, their Successors, and Assigns for ever, for the purposes of that Institution.

SAMARITAN AND CONVALESCENT HOME FUND.

Patients of the Hospital recommended by or through any Physician, Surgeon, Visiting Governor, the Resident Medical Officer, or the Chaplain, are the objects of the Samaritan portion of this Fund, the distribution of which is vested in the Board.

In such distribution the following purposes are kept in view, viz. :—

- (a) Forwarding poor patients to their homes.
- (b) Sending to and maintaining at the Convalescent Home at Clacton-on-Sea, or other similar institution, such In-Patients as the proper Medical Officer certifies to be suitable cases.
- (c) The purchase of clothing, flannel, linen, or such other necessaries as the condition of the Patient may require, including the whole or a portion of the cost of surgical appliances.
- (d) The temporary assistance of poor convalescent Patients requiring further medical aid as Out-Patients on leaving the Hospital.

The Convalescent Home is devoted to the following purposes, viz. :—

- (a) The reception of such In-Patients of the Hospital as are, on the recommendation of the proper Medical Officer, deemed convalescent but requiring change of air, rest, and nutritious diet for complete recovery.
- (b) The similar reception of such officers, sisters, nurses, and servants on the establishment of the Hospital as the Board, on the recommendation of the proper Medical Officer, deem, from sickness or other cause, in need of rest and change of air.
- (c) The reception of such other Patients as the Board, with the approval of a Court of Governors, shall from time to time determine.

THE SAMARITAN FUND.

THE GEORGE STURGE TRUST.

In the year 1884 Mr. George Sturge, of Woodthorpe, Sydenham Hill Road, executed a Deed of Trust providing for the payment of certain sums of money to various Charitable and Philanthropic Institutions, and amongst others The Middlesex Hospital, to which he devoted the munificent sum of £884* Railway Stock, representing one thousand pounds (£1,000), under the following conditions, viz. :—

“In giving the sum of £1,000 for a Samaritan Fund for the
 “above Hospital, Mr. Sturge gives it on the conditions
 “that this Fund shall be kept entirely separate from the
 “general funds of the Hospital, and that the income shall
 “be paid to or applied for such In-patients as may be
 “necessitous, and within three months from their discharge
 “from the Hospital, and for the purpose of their having
 “necessary nourishment or change of air.

“Mr. Sturge hopes that this Fund may be made known
 “and that others may be induced to subscribe to it.”

THE MEDICAL SCHOOL.

TWO Casualty Medical and Two Casualty Surgical Officers, Two Resident Officers to the Special Departments, Eight Resident House Surgeons, Six Resident House Physicians, and Two Resident Obstetric and Gynæcological House Surgeons, are appointed annually from among the qualified Students of the Hospital, besides a Medical Officer and Medical, Surgical and Obstetric Registrars, and a Registrar to the Cancer Wing.

Three Open Entrance Scholarships of the value of £100, £50 and £25, and a Scholarship of £50 open to Students of Universities who have completed their Anatomical and Physiological Studies, are awarded at the commencement of the Winter Session. An Entrance Scholarship is awarded annually to a Pupil of Epsom College who has passed the First examination for Medical Degrees of the University of London. A Scholarship of £50 is awarded to New Zealand Students who have passed their examinations in Anatomy and Physiology and who are proceeding to take a qualification in England. An Exhibition of £10 10s. is awarded at the end of the second Winter Session for proficiency in Anatomy and Physiology. The Hetley Prize of £25, the Leopold Hudson Prize of £11 11s.; and the Lyell Medal and Scholarship, value £55 5s., are awarded annually. Two Broderip Scholarships, of the value of £60 and £40 respectively, are awarded to fifth year's Students for proficiency in Clinical knowledge. The Freeman Scholarship, of about £30, is awarded annually to Senior Students for proficiency in Obstetric Medicine. The Murray Medal and Scholarship of £25 is awarded every third year. Two Cancer Research Scholarships of the value of £100 each and one of £60 are awarded annually. Class Prizes are also awarded. Certain of these Scholarships have been modified during the period of the War.

The Tutors superintend and assist the Students in their studies without extra fee, and thus the necessity of obtaining private instruction away from the Medical School is obviated.





GOVERNMENT OF THE CHARITY.

A BOARD of Management meets in the Board Room of the Hospital fortnightly on Wednesday, at 11 a.m., for the transaction of the ordinary business.

A Court of Governors is held on the last Thursday in the months of February, May, and November for the confirmation of such acts of the Board as require the sanction of a Court, and the transaction of special business. A Special Meeting of this Court may be called at any time, either by order of the Court or of the Board, or upon the requisition of the Treasurers or of any five Governors.

The Patrons, President, and Vice-Presidents are *ex-officio* Members of the Court, of the Board, and of Committees of a Court or Board.

THE CANCER CHARITY. MIDDLESEX HOSPITAL.

REPORT FOR 1919.

To the Court of Governors.

MY LORDS, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

At the beginning of the year there were 88 patients under treatment in the Cancer Charity, and 198 were admitted during the year, making a total of 286 for the year.

The average number of occupied beds was 78·13, and the average days' stay of the patients was 144·55. The former figure shows a decrease of 10·03, and the latter an increase of 54·77, compared with the corresponding figures of 1918.

In the Out-patient Department 140 new patients received treatment, and the total attendances were 513, compared with 185 and 605 for the year 1918.

In making the above comparison with the previous year you must take into account that the Wing was closed for over three months, that during this period very few patients could be admitted, and none treated in the Out-Patient Department, and that only those well able to bear the journey were transferred to the Convalescent Home at Clacton-on-Sea, where the number of occupied beds was appreciably less than the normal.

For the safe transit of all the movable patients to and from Clacton we are deeply indebted to the good offices of The St. John Ambulance Association for the use of travelling stretchers, to the R.A.S.C. (M.T.) for the use of ambulances at either terminus, and to the G.E. Rly. Co. for the provision of special hospital coaches; to all the above we tender our sincere thanks.

With a view to simplification of management and accounts it has been decided to amalgamate the original 49 beds of the Charity with the 43 provided by the Trustees of the Barnato-Joel Charity; consequently, the dividends of this Charity appear in the accounts, and the expenditure includes the cost of maintaining the whole 92 beds.

For purposes of comparison the figures of last year's two accounts are combined to correspond with those given for this year.

The total income for 1919 is £17,451 4s. 11d. compared with £13,371 12s. 2d., and the total expenditure £21,520 4s. 7d. compared with £13,685 3s. 4d. for 1918; the deficit for the year amounting to £4,068 19s. 8d.

We regret to notice a falling off in the Subscriptions, which were only £1,140 3s. 8d. compared with £1,432 3s. 6d.; we cannot appeal too strongly on behalf of this important branch of the Hospital's work.

The cost of renewals, repairs and redecorations, carried out while the Charity was closed, was £6,355 15s. 8d.

The grant from King Edward's Hospital Fund for London was £400, from the Hospital Sunday Fund £322 2s. 11d., and from the Hospital Saturday Fund £213.

A bequest of the value of £3,108 17s. 6d. was received from the estate of the late Evelyn Wright, Esq.

GOVERNORS.

THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, RIGHTS, AND PRIVILEGES.

1. Annual Subscribers of *Three Guineas or upwards*, to the Cancer Charity, or to the Cancer Investigation Department, are entitled to be Governors so long as their Subscriptions are paid.

2. Donors of *Thirty Guineas or upwards*, at one time, are made Life Governors, and at once entitled to all the privileges of Governors. The Endowment of Beds (see p. 51) qualifies the donor as a Life Governor.

3. Honorary Governors are appointed, and the propriety of making such appointments is first considered by the Board, and then submitted for the consideration and approval of a Court of Governors.

4. Honorary Governors have, from the day of their appointment, the same rights and privileges in all respects as Life Governors. In cases of Bequests of *Two Hundred Pounds and under Five Hundred Pounds*, one of the Executors under the will is eligible for appointment as an Honorary Governor.

5. All Governors have the right of attending the Courts of Governors, but Governors who are in arrear with their subscriptions are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any Board or Committee appointed in accordance with the Laws of the Hospital, and Governors who are new Annual Subscribers or Donors are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any such Board or Committee unless their subscriptions or donations have been paid at least three calendar months previously, and Governors being Salaried Officers or holding similar offices, or being Students or Servants of the Hospital, are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court, or to serve on any such Committee, and are not entitled to speak, vote, or serve at or on any such Court, Board, or Committee for one year after they have ceased to be such Salaried Officers, to hold such similar Offices, or to be such Students or Servants, unless specially authorised so to do by the Board.

6. No Governor is entitled to speak or vote at any Court, Board, or Committee on any question or matter wherein he or she is personally interested.

7. Every Governor has the right of visiting the Wards and other departments of the Cancer Charity in the presence of any one of the Physicians or Surgeons of the Hospital, the Resident Medical Officer or his substitute, the Chaplain, the Lady Superintendent, one of the Visiting Governors, or the Secretary-Superintendent.

ANNUAL SUBSCRIBERS, DONORS, AND CONTRIBUTORS

AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

1. Every Annual Subscriber of *Two Guineas and less than Three Guineas*, and every Donor of *Twenty Guineas, at one time* (or of smaller sums that may together equal that amount in the course of the current year), is entitled to recommend four Patients yearly; and Donors of *less than Twenty Guineas* are entitled, at the discretion of the Board, to recommend four Patients yearly during a period of three years.

2. Every Annual Subscriber of *Three Guineas and less than Five Guineas*, and every Donor of *Thirty Guineas and less than Fifty Pounds, at one time*, is entitled to recommend nine Patients yearly.

3. Every Annual Subscriber of *Five Guineas and less than Ten Guineas*, and every Donor of *Fifty Pounds and less than One Hundred Pounds, at one time*, is entitled to recommend fifteen Patients yearly.

4. Every Annual Subscriber of *Ten Guineas or upwards*, and every Donor of *One Hundred Pounds or upwards, at one time*, is entitled to recommend twenty-five Patients yearly.

5. Annual Subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the quarter-day next preceding the date of Subscription; and Subscribers are not entitled to any privilege until their Subscriptions are paid.

6. 

· ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

1. Out-Patients afflicted with cancer can be specially attended and relieved with advice and medicine on Wednesdays at 1 p.m. (Nassau Street entrance).
2. No letters of recommendation are required.
3. Persons who are afflicted with cancer or cancerous disease *in such an advanced stage as to be deemed incurable* are admitted as In-Patients, and may remain "UNTIL RELIEVED BY ART OR RELEASED BY DEATH," unless it be found necessary to discharge them for insubordination or mental derangement.
4. Patients to be admitted into these wards should be decently clothed, have a change of raiment, and find security (if required) for a future supply, and for their removal if it be found necessary to discharge them.
5. In all cases patients are admitted for a fortnight's observation to enable a complete diagnosis to be made previous to being permanently placed upon the establishment.
6. No pauper can be received from any Parochial Institution without the special permission of the Board of Management.
7. No patient afflicted with cancer and usually resident in the country can be admitted, unless previous application be made to know whether there be room.
8. The name of any applicant declining to come into the Cancer Wards on receiving an intimation of a vacancy will be removed from the application register, and no application for re-entry will be entertained until after the expiration of three months.
9. Patients who have been once admitted and discharged are ineligible for re-admission except on special application to, and sanction by, the Board of Management.

N.B.—Every patient on admission is supplied with two visitors' cards, and on no account can more than two visitors be allowed to see a patient at the same time.


