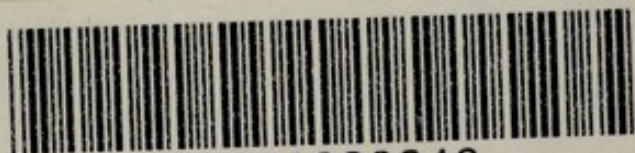

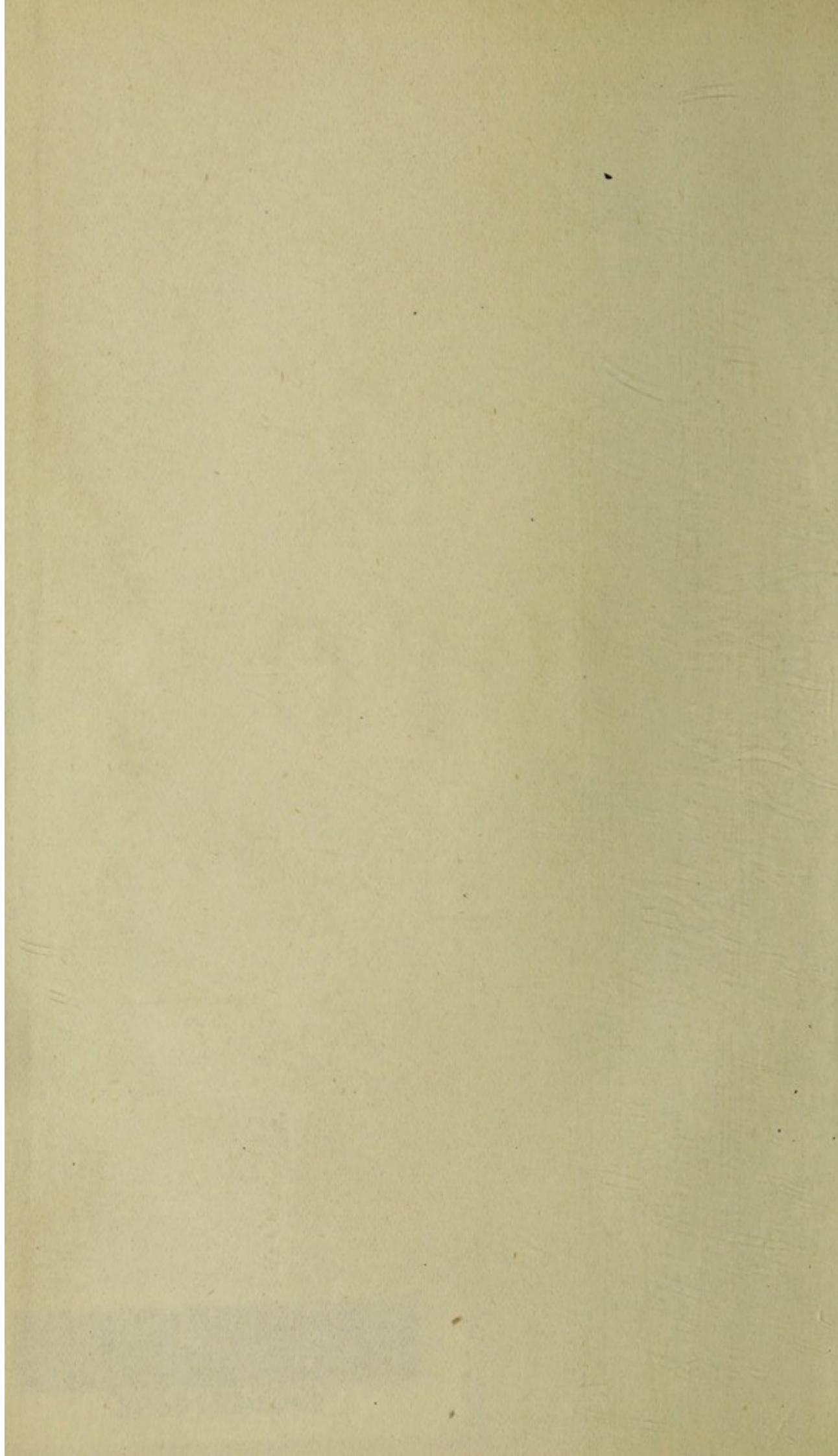

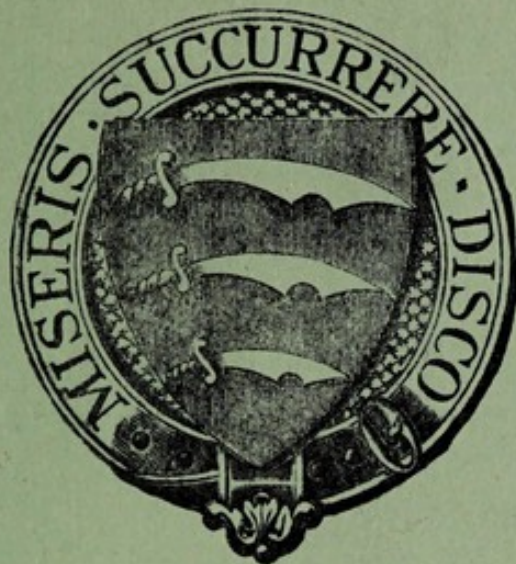

# THE MIDDLESEX HOSPITAL.

## REPORT FOR 1920.

*To the Court of Governors.*

MY LORDS, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

For the first complete year since 1913, the Hospital has been able to carry on its normal functions uninterruptedly, and the figures and statistics in this Report require no special qualifications or explanations, such as have been necessary in recent Reports to account for peculiarities in the various Returns.

There were 334 patients in the Hospital at the beginning of the year, and 5,438 were admitted during the year, making a total of 5,772, of whom 339 remained under treatment on the 1st January, 1921; during 1919, the number of In-patients was 3,607.

The average number of beds occupied daily was 333.48, as compared with 263 for the period of 1919 during which the Hospital was open.

The average length of stay in the Hospital was 22.46 days.

In the Out-Patient Department, 51,929 new patients were treated, 146,888 attendances being recorded; the average attendances per patient being thus 2.83 compared with 2.96 in 1919.

In the Electrical Department, 859 new patients were treated, and the attendances were 18,545 for a total of 5,418 patients; in the Massage Department there were 599 new patients.

The year opened with a weight of liabilities incurred in 1919. Heavy as the estimated costs of the deferred repairs and renewals of the war-period were, steadily rising costs and wages soon left them behind. To set against over £29,000 of Creditors, 1919, and the increases on the original estimates, we had a small cash balance, £20,000 of Treasury Bills, and a reasonable expectation of further gifts in response to the Special Appeal.

So far as in the early Spring it was possible to forecast income and expenditure, it appeared as if the year would show a deficit of £37,000.



It cannot be said that "a masterly inactivity" is the marked characteristic of our new and strong Finance Committee. Steps were taken to deal with both aspects of our problem, and our efforts redoubled with our needs.

On the expenditure side of the account the Finance Committee, by means of a close analysis of costs and of consumption, by laborious detail work as well as by long-sighted policy, have achieved a reduction, great or small, but always a reduction, in percentage costs throughout the year. Consumption graphs and constant reports enabled them to check any extravagance in use and to advise other Committees where they found a tendency to waste.

In view of the difficult nature of markets the Committee dropped the normal system of three months tenders, and bought as opportunity offered. In this way they made the most of the markets, and, especially in the autumn and winter, very materially reduced the average of cost by some very large purchases for cash.

Again, the costs of the Laundry were reduced from 1·6d. per piece in March to 1·1d. per piece in November and December, in spite of the rise in wages. This was chiefly due to the invitation extended to two other Hospitals to send us their washing to be done at cost. The Hospital of St. John and St. Elizabeth joined us in May, the City of London Hospital at the end of the year. Our plant is consequently now working at its maximum efficiency, with admirable results in greatly reduced costs, and upon the whole, better work as the result of a regular routine and higher pay. Both these institutions, as we ourselves, have reason to be very well satisfied by this essay in co-operation and higher efficiency.

So much for the expenditure and consumption side of the account.

On the other, we have to record the receipt of £10,000 from the Emergency Grant by the King's Fund in the summer. It went a long way towards meeting the estimated deficit of £37,000.

Other notable non-recurrent receipts were £13,026 from the Special Appeal, and £750 from the National Relief Fund.

A number of other items of Ordinary Income showed marked increases. Despite the Special Appeal our subscriptions were over £100 better than in 1919, Donations £5,000, Alms-boxes £1 000, the All Help League £1,500, and the Hospital Sunday Fund £500.

For the continued and increasing success of the All Help League we are deeply indebted to the untiring efforts of Mrs. Richard Davis.



Endowment Capital increased by £12,304, and the income from Invested Property increased by £1,345 1s. 4d.

Receipts from Nurses' Fees and from Public Authorities show increases of £300 and £400, but other receipts decreased by £1,900. In 1919, £1,400 was received from the Annie Zunz Trustees, and £700 in Gifts in Kind, as against nothing and £100 respectively in 1920.

On the other hand, £260 was received as interest on money which we were able from time to time to place on deposit.

Finally, £15,900 was received from Legacies, an increase over 1919 of £5,250.

Briefly, our Income for the year, including the large non-recurrent receipts, met our actual running costs, but, in clearing 1919 liabilities, of which only £3,157 13s. 1d. remains unpaid, and in making good the deficit on the Cancer Charity Accounts, £6,254 14s. 0d., we have found ourselves some £16,000 to the bad on the year's working.

Among the special efforts on behalf of the Hospital funds we wish to record with grateful recognition those put forth by Mr. Edmund Davis and Miss Halford which produced the handsome sum of £735 9s. 11d. by the successful performance of "Goldfields"; we also thank Miss Gertrude Jennings and Mrs. Kendal for their organisation of the performance of "The Young Person in Pink" which resulted in the addition of £200 to our Funds.

In view of the increased cost of all necessities constituting a constant drain on the resources of the Hospital, and of the existing economic conditions of the Country, a most important change of policy has been sanctioned by a special Court of Governors. This change consists in the inauguration of a system of contributions by patients towards the cost of their maintenance. Under this system In-patients are required to contribute according to their means a weekly sum agreed upon between the Hospital and the patient after all the circumstances of the case have been taken into due consideration.

Out-patients are required to contribute 6d. for each attendance, while those treated in the Special Departments are expected to make an additional payment.

Nothing in this system prevents the admission or treatment of patients unable to contribute; the Hospital thus maintaining its tradition of the open door for all necessitous patients.

The administration of this system is under the control of the Almoner, and entails a very considerable addition to the work of this Department, whose staff has been enlarged proportionately.



The system has been working only since the middle of December, and it is too early yet to form a definite judgment on its results, but it is hoped that these will amply justify the innovation by providing an adequate addition to our Income.

A new Committee has been formed to deal with the work of the Almoner's Department.

In connection with this new Scheme and the financial difficulties to be faced by this, in common with other Hospitals, it is interesting to note that a London Regional Committee of the British Hospitals Association has been formed to deal, as a representative body, with the questions affecting the general interests of the Voluntary Hospitals. In view of the appointment by the Ministry of Health of a Committee to enquire into the needs of the Voluntary Hospitals, and of the importance of many questions touching Voluntary Hospitals as a whole, this Regional Committee should prove of much value. It may also be noted that King Edward the VII's Hospital Fund for London has issued an argued statement containing strong recommendations of the Voluntary System.

We welcome as new Members of the Board the Honourable Mrs. Hanbury-Tracy, and the Honourable Ursula Lawley. Mr. Duncan Watson at the end of his year of office as Mayor of the Borough ceased to be a member, but has by no means ceased to interest himself in the welfare of the Hospital, which he has much at heart. Alderman A. C. Rickatson, the present Mayor, has succeeded to his seat on the Board, and has already shown that he means this to be no sinecure.

We may mention here that a Scheme now being organised for a Local Levy has the keen support of both the ex- and present Mayors of St. Marylebone.

The Scheme for improving the administration of the Hospital referred to in our last Report has been sanctioned by the Court of Governors; it has now been brought into full working order and has fulfilled the expectations formed of the valuable results to be derived from it.

We have to report with regret the retirement from Active membership of the Honorary Staff of Sir John Bland-Sutton and Dr. J. J. Pringle, the former of whom has been connected with the Hospital for 42 years, and the latter for 37 years. Their valuable work has been recognised by the election of Sir John Bland-Sutton as Consulting Surgeon, and of Dr. J. J. Pringle as Consulting Physician to the Department for Diseases of the Skin.

Mr. Gordon Gordon-Taylor has been elected as Surgeon to the Hospital; Dr. H. MacCormac as Physician to the Department for Skin Diseases; Dr. T. Izod Bennett as Assistant Physician, and Mr. Eric Pearce Gould as Assistant Surgeon.



A further gratifying proof of the growing intimacy between the Hospital and the Borough of St. Marylebone and of the recognition of the value of the Hospital to its municipal neighbours has been given by the allocation of a large proportion of the Borough War Memorial Fund to the endowment of five beds in the Hospital.

We wish to thank most heartily Mr. Duncan Watson and the responsible Committee, and the subscribers to the Fund, for their large-hearted generosity, which has resulted in so valuable and welcome an addition to our Bed Endowment Fund. The Dedication Ceremony was officially attended by the Mayor and Corporation of the Borough.

The proposal (referred to in the last Report) of the St. Marylebone Committee of the United Services Fund to endow 2 Beds and 1 Cot for the benefit of ex-service men and their dependents has been successfully completed, and a Dedication Service was conducted by the Bishop of Willesden.

We have grateful pleasure in recording two other Memorial Endowments during the year, 1 Bed by the Holborn Welfare Sub-Committee; and one by the Glenster Hat Company in memory of the Firm's employees who fell in the Great War; which also was dedicated by the Bishop of Willesden with fitting ceremony.

The activities of the Ladies' Work Society have once more resulted in a welcome supply of garments for our patients, and our thanks are due to its members, who, under the Presidency of the Dowager Countess of Derby, aided by the organising energy of Lady Rew, have devoted their time and skill to so good an object.

Our gratitude is further paid to the Dowager Countess of Derby for her continued interest shown in the welfare of the Hospital in many ways, and especially for her generous contribution of £56 5s. 9d. towards the upkeep of the Bird Ward.

That devoted band of voluntary workers, who give their valuable help to the transport of patients between the Wards and the Operating Theatres, have again earned, and receive, our sincere gratitude.

Our co-operation with the Ministry of Health and Local Authorities in combating the dire effects of Venereal Disease has continued, and our increased activities in this important remedial work are markedly shown in the following figures:—1,492 patients were treated during the year, who were actually suffering from some form of Venereal Disease, the attendances



mounting to 15,536, compared with 8,298 in 1919, while the number of In-patient days of treatment increased from 254 to 643. The number of pathological examinations made in the Bland-Sutton Institute in connection with the Treatment Centre was 3,235, an increase of 728 over 1919. In addition, 1,115 examinations were made on behalf of Outside Practitioners.

Our efforts on behalf of mothers and children have been further extended. The Department of our Maternity and Infant Welfare Centre has been more completely organised. The value and importance of this Department has now earned the recognition of the Ministry of Health, which requires a very high standard of efficiency.

The scheme for the Amalgamation of the Cancer Research Department and Bland-Sutton Institute with the Medical School has been sanctioned by the Court of Governors, and the desired unity of purpose and simplification of administration have been attained.

In the Chapel additional tablets memory in of those who have died in the service of the Hospital have been affixed, and a movement is on foot to complete the series of stained glass windows by a Memorial Window to the late Prince Francis of Teck.

We are pleased to report that the Nurses' New Home in Gower Street was officially opened on the 8th of July by H.R.H. Princess Alice Countess of Athlone, and will constitute a lasting record of Her Royal Highness's especial interest in the Nursing side of the Hospital work, for it will, by her consent, bear the name of "The Princess Alice Home."

The requisite number of Nurses are now on the roll to permit of the important Schedule of working hours and holidays being brought into effect with mutual advantage to the Nursing Staff and patients.

The Convalescent Home at Clacton-on-Sea has been peacefully carrying on its normal functions in completing the recovery of patients from the Hospital.

The daily average number of resident patients has been 54·97, the bed capacity being 90 : the total number admitted during the year was 883.

The total expenditure on the Home was £8,314 2s. 0d., whereas the total income was only £2,603 8s. 1d., the heavy deficit of £5,710 13s. 11d. having to be met from the General Fund of the Hospital.

The cost of each patient per week was £2 7s. 9·44d., and the total cost per patient £8 5s. 10·62d., but this does not include the items of Rent, Rates and Taxes.

In view of the importance of the work of the Convalescent Home in restoring patients to a state of efficiency before returning to their normal duties in life, a most valuable asset in its economic and productive aspect, we would plead for far greater support for this most essential department of our Hospital work. Of the Home it may be truly said, *finis coronat opus*.

It will thus be seen that our campaign for the advancement and teaching of Research by effecting a sound financial position has met with a very large measure of success.

To cope with the abnormal number of incoming students, the Departments of Chemistry, Physiology and Anatomy have had to be considerably extended, and a self-contained Department of Biology has been established.



The Smoking Concert held in December at the Queen's Hall, after a long compulsory interval, resulted in an unprecedented success. The Cancer Charity benefits to the extent of £360. For this most welcome sum we, on behalf of the Charity, congratulate the Honorary Secretaries of the Concert on their organising abilities and business capacity, and thank them for their zealous efforts in so good a cause.

Reference has been made above to the present position of the movement to secure adequate endowment for Research in Medicine and Medical Education. With a view to obtaining wider publicity for these most important branches of our work, advantage has been taken of the Efficiency Exhibition at Olympia to bring them into greater prominence by means of a large exhibit of Research work and open Lectures on kindred topics. From Research there follow better prevention of disease, and greater hope for success in fighting disease in the Wards; from Medical Education there is obtained a sufficient supply of men competent to deal with the health of the community at large. Let the community then see to it that Hospitals with this dual equipment shall not fail in well-doing through lack of the support necessary to carry out their practical ideas.

## ALMONER'S REPORT FOR 1920.

---

GENTLEMEN,

During the past year the work in the Almoner's Department has been steadily on the increase and, in the latter part of the year, in anticipation of a still further increase, an addition to the staff of three was made.

In March, of 1919, an Infant Welfare Centre was opened, primarily for the attendance of mothers with their infants born in the Hospital. This has been extended to those born in their homes and attended by the Hospital and to others in the neighbourhood whose mothers wish to bring them. In September of the same year a Health Visitor, Miss E. F. Neville, late Sister of the Maternity Ward, whose Report is appended hereto, was appointed to carry on this work. The Centre has been recognised by the Ministry of Health.

Closer co-operation was sought by the Medical Officer of Health for Marylebone, in sending to the Hospital, children from the various Infant Welfare Centres of the Borough, needing treatment, and an arrangement was made by which these children should be sent to the Hospital through this Department.

In March, of 1920, an Orthopædic Out-Patient Department was opened and 207 new patients have attended during the ten months of the year. As a large proportion of these patients need some kind of Surgical Appliance, this has meant more work for this Department.

In May, of 1919, a sum of money was given to the Hospital for the exclusive use of patients suffering from Cancer, who are attending the Out-Patient Department or awaiting admission to the Cancer Wing of the Hospital. It has been most helpful to have this Fund, and several patients have benefited by it.

Since December 20th, Out-Patients have been required to contribute at each attendance, and In-Patients, towards the cost of their maintenance, according to their means. Patients are also required to make a contribution towards their Convalescent treatment at the Home at Clacton-on-Sea. The scheme has not been in operation sufficiently long to give any report, other than to say that, on the whole, patients have taken very kindly to the scheme and appear to be anxious to take their share of the responsibility and to do



their utmost. The contributions are chiefly taken weekly. In all cases where there is inability to pay, the question of a contribution is waived.

All the work occasioned by this scheme has been undertaken by this Department.

About 2,196 new cases have been referred to the Department for advice or help in various ways.

A large proportion of the Appliances supplied to Out-Patients, especially those attending in the Orthopædic Department, have been paid for by instalments, and some of the payments have not yet been completed.

### Convalescent and Sanatorium Treatment.

(i) *In-Patients.*—883 patients have been sent to our Convalescent Home at Clacton-on-Sea; 26 adult patients and 26 children (cases thought not to be suitable for Clacton) have been sent to other Convalescent Homes, and 54 to the Schiff Home. 21 insured, 10 uninsured patients and 6 children have been sent to Sanatoria, besides 3 to Benenden, 1 to Kelling, and 2 to Creton, beds given to us by the King Edward's Hospital Fund.

The amount spent on Convalescence other than at our Home at Clacton, from the Dresden Assistance Fund, is £211 3s. 10d.

Patients have been assisted with railway fares, cab fares or ambulances to Convalescent Homes or to their own homes to the extent of £325 10s. 4d.



(ii) *Out-Patients*.—56 patients have been sent to Convalescent and other Homes and 42 to Sanatoria through the Insurance Committees, or County Councils; 2 patients have gone to Benenden and 1 to Kelling.

Towards the cost of this, £25 4s. 6d. has been paid by the Samaritan Fund.

Patients have been assisted with railway fares and cab fares to Infirmaries or their own-homes to the value of £13 11s. 9d.

### Relief.

In-Patients have been helped, after leaving the Hospital, by grants from the Dresden Assistance Fund amounting to £111 0s. 6d. Small grants to the value of £8 3s. 11d. have been given to Out-Patients needing assistance. £52 6s. 0d. has been given from the George Balfour Black Fund to necessitous patients suffering from Cancer. This has chiefly been given in weekly grants.

### Maternity Department.

It has not been found necessary to give Invalid dinners to many cases attended on the District. Only a sum of £6 1s. 0d. has been spent in this way.

50 cases have been referred to the Diocesan Rescue Worker, either when attending in the Out-Patient Department or from the Wards. Some cases from the Ward have been sent to Convalescent Homes.

There have been numerous enquiries from one or other interested in a patient, and anxious to help, of which no record is given here.

Our continued thanks are due to the various branches of the Charity Organisation Society, Relief Committees and to the local Clergy for their help; to the Queen Victoria and other Nursing Associations for their assistance in attending patients in their homes; to the London Insurance Committee and the London County Council for the Vacancies given us at Sanatoria, and to the Invalid Children's Aid Association for the very great assistance given to the children attending the Out-Patient Department.

## INFANT WELFARE REPORT.

**JANUARY, 1920-1921.**

The Infant Welfare Department has made considerable progress during the year.

New cases number 361.

The average attendance during the first half-year has been 45 per week. The Monday Clinic became so crowded that it was found necessary for Mothers to attend on Friday mornings to relieve Monday afternoons. The attendance of Infants during the second half-year was 66 per week.

Twelve babies have died—seven of broncho-pneumonia; one after operation for harelip; one of meningitis; one of enlarged spleen, and two of causes unknown.

The Infant Welfare Work aims at preventing disease amongst infants by detecting minor ailments and dealing with them, and by encouraging breast feeding and otherwise improving nutrition. Faulty feeding is, in the main, responsible for our high infant mortality, which, in spite of all efforts made, is still 80 per 1,000 during the first year of life.

The value of the Infant Welfare Department is indicated by the fact that there have been fewer attendances at the Children's Out-Patient Department and fewer cases for admission to the Children's Ward, with practically no cases of Marasmus.

The work of the Clinic is followed by the Home Visiting. The Visitor is always welcome in the home and the advice and help are much appreciated, the Mothers in most cases being anxious to learn. During the year 1,096 visits have been made.

There is a Class held on Thursday afternoons in the Gymnasium, where the Mothers are taught to cut out and make simple garments, in connection with which it is hoped to give talks on Hygiene, Home Nursing and Baby Feeding.

The importance of this work cannot be over estimated. Socrates says:—"In every work the beginning is the most important part, especially



in anything young and tender." If that is so, and we all agree that it is, it is our bounden duty to protect and nurture our infant life to our utmost capacity.

Dr. Bennett, who holds the Infant Consultations, writes:—"It is not generally appreciated how great a number of cases of Illness amongst children of the poor are due to faulty dieting and hygiene. It is impossible to calculate the amount of sickness and suffering that is avoided by an Infant Welfare Centre; it is, however, obvious to me, as Physician to Children's Out-Patients, that diseases of this nature have materially declined, and I have been constantly able to cure such cases by treatment and the aid of the careful home instruction given by the ladies attached to the Centre. It is very much in the interest of the poor of this district that the activities of the Centre be extended by every available means."

We are greatly indebted to our Voluntary Workers, without whose help at the Clinics it would have been impossible to carry on.

## GOVERNORS.

### THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, RIGHTS, AND PRIVILEGES.

---

1. Annual Subscribers of *Three Guineas or upwards* to the Hospital's General Fund, or to its particular establishments, viz., the Cancer Charity, the Convalescent Home (Clacton-on-Sea) or to the Medical School, are entitled to be Governors so long as their Subscriptions are paid.

2. Donors of *Thirty Guineas or upwards*, at one time, are made Life Governors, and at once entitled to all the privileges of Governors. The Endowment of a Bed or Cot (see p. 130) qualifies the donor as a Life Governor.

3. Honorary Governors are appointed, and the propriety of making such appointments is first considered by the Board, and then submitted for the consideration and approval of a Court of Governors.

4. Honorary Governors have, from the day of their appointment, the same rights and privileges in all respects as Life Governors. In cases of Bequests of *Two Hundred Pounds and under Five Hundred Pounds*, one of the Executors under the will is eligible for appointment as an Honorary Governor.

5. All Governors have the right of attending the Courts of Governors, but Governors who are in arrear with their subscriptions are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any Board or Committee appointed in accordance with the Laws of the Hospital, and Governors who are new Annual Subscribers or Donors are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any such Board or Committee unless their subscriptions or donations have been paid at least three calendar months previously, and Governors being Salaried Officers or holding similar offices, or being Students or Servants of the Hospital, are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court, or to serve on any such Committee, and are not entitled to speak, vote, or serve at or on any such Court, Board, or Committee for one year after they have ceased to be such Salaried Officers, to hold such similar Offices or to be such Students or Servants, unless specially authorised so to do by the Board.

6. No Governor is entitled to speak or vote at any Court, Board, or Committee on any question or matter wherein he or she is personally interested.

7. Every Governor has the right of visiting the Wards and other departments in the presence of any one of the Physicians or Surgeons of the Hospital, the Resident Medical Officer or his substitute, the Chaplain, the Lady Superintendent, one of the Visiting Governors, or the Secretary-Superintendent.

1. Every Annual Subscriber of *Two Guineas and less than Three Guineas*, and every Donor of *Twenty Guineas, at one time* (or of smaller sums that may together equal that amount in the course of the current year), is entitled to recommend four Patients yearly; and Donors of *less than Twenty Guineas*, are entitled, at the discretion of the Board, to recommend four Patients yearly during a period of three years.

2. Every Annual Subscriber of *Three Guineas and less than Five Guineas*, and every Donor of *Thirty Guineas and less than Fifty Pounds, at one time*, is entitled to recommend nine Patients yearly.

3. Every Annual Subscriber of *Five Guineas and less than Ten Guineas*, and every Donor of *Fifty Pounds and less than One Hundred Pounds, at one time*, is entitled to recommend fifteen Patients yearly.

4. Every Annual Subscriber of *Ten Guineas or upwards*, and every Donor of *One Hundred Pounds or upwards, at one time*, is entitled to recommend twenty-five Patients yearly.

5. Annual Subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the quarter-day next preceding the date of Subscription; and Subscribers are not entitled to any privilege until their Subscriptions are paid.

6. ## ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Patients are required to contribute in accordance with their means towards the cost of their maintenance. The amount of a Patient's contribution is agreed upon after enquiries made, either before or after admission to the Hospital, from the Patient or the Patients' relatives or friends; but no distinction is made between those who can and those who cannot afford to contribute.

No letters of recommendation are required for the Out-Patient Department. Patients are required to contribute 6d. at each attendance, but are excused from payment if their circumstances warrant it. Further contributions are invited from those attending the Special Departments.

The above requirement does not apply to children under 14 years of age.

Accidents and urgent cases are admitted at any time of the day or night.

Bearers of letters of recommendation should attend at the Hospital (entrance in Mortimer Street) at TWELVE o'clock noon, on any week-day.

**Medical Cases** are seen by the Casualty Medical Officer every week-day at TEN o'clock, and attended:—On Mondays and Thursdays, at 1.30 p.m., by Dr. G. E. S. WARD; on Tuesdays and Fridays, at 1.30 p.m., by Dr. E. A. COCKAYNE; and on Wednesdays and Saturdays, at 1.30 p.m., by Dr. G. E. BEAUMONT.

In-Patients are expected to be provided with clean and decent clothing, and a change of linen. They also have to provide themselves with washing. In all cases where the Patients are too poor to provide themselves with these articles, they are supplied to them by the Lady Almoner from special funds which she has at her disposal for the purpose.

Any Officer, Sister, Nurse, Servant, or person employed in any Department of the Hospital accepting Money, or Presents of any kind, from a Patient, or relative or friend of any Patient, on any pretence whatever, is liable to dismissal.

The following Cases are not admitted into the Hospital:—

1. Those which are, upon due examination, deemed *Incurable*, as Advanced Consumption, etc.
2. Complaints so tedious of Cure as to preclude for a long time the admission of more urgent cases, as *Chronic Ulcers* of the Legs, etc.
3. Disorders, to the Cure of which other establishments are devoted, as *Persons of Unsound Mind*, etc.
4. Those which are more properly objects for Parochial Relief, as wanting Food and not Medicine.
5. Those whose admission might endanger the other patients, as persons suffering from *Infectious Diseases*.
6. Complaints likely to be aggravated rather than relieved by confinement within the walls of a Hospital, but such cases, if deemed proper objects, may receive advice and medicine as *Out-Patients*.

Prior to sending up Patients from the Country, the Secretary-Superintendent should be applied to, in order to learn whether there is room, and such application should be accompanied by a medical certificate setting out fully the nature of the case.

*Form of a Bequest of Money, Stock, or other Personal Estate.*

I give and bequeath to "The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurers, and Governors of The Middlesex Hospital," for the purposes of that Institution, the sum of—— (if of Stock, or other personal Estate, describe it).

*Form of a Devise and Bequest of the Residue of Real and Personal Property.*

I give, devise, and bequeath to "The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurers, and Governors of The Middlesex Hospital," All the residue and remainder of my Messuages, Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, and Real Estate: And also all the rest, residue, and remainder of my goods, chattels, and personal estate and effects whatsoever and wheresoever not herein by me otherwise disposed of, to hold to them, their Successors, and Assigns for ever, for the purposes of that Institution.



## SAMARITAN AND CONVALESCENT HOME FUND.

---

Patients of the Hospital recommended by or through any Physician, Surgeon, Visiting Governor, the Resident Medical Officer, or the Chaplain, are the objects of the Samaritan portion of this Fund, the distribution of which is vested in the Board.

In such distribution the following purposes are kept in view, viz. :—

- (a) Forwarding poor patients to their homes.
- (b) Sending to and maintaining at the Convalescent Home at Clacton-on-Sea, or other similar institution, such In-Patients as the proper Medical Officer certifies to be suitable cases.
- (c) The purchase of clothing, flannel, linen, or such other necessities as the condition of the Patient may require, including the whole or a portion of the cost of surgical appliances.
- (d) The temporary assistance of poor convalescent Patients requiring further medical aid as Out-Patients on leaving the Hospital.

The Convalescent Home is devoted to the following purposes, viz. :—

- (a) The reception of such In-Patients of the Hospital as are, on the recommendation of the proper Medical Officer, deemed convalescent but requiring change of air, rest, and nutritious diet for complete recovery.
- (b) The similar reception of such officers, sisters, nurses, and servants on the establishment of the Hospital as the Board, on the recommendation of the proper Medical Officer, deem, from sickness or other cause, in need of rest and change of air.
- (c) The reception of such other Patients as the Board, with the approval of a Court of Governors, shall from time to time determine.



## THE SAMARITAN FUND.

### THE GEORGE STURGE TRUST.

In the year 1884 Mr. George Sturge, of Woodthorpe, Sydenham Hill Road, executed a Deed of Trust providing for the payment of certain sums of money to various Charitable and Philanthropic Institutions, and amongst others The Middlesex Hospital, to which he devoted the munificent sum of £895\* Railway Stock, representing one thousand pounds (£1,000), under the following conditions, viz.:—

“In giving the sum of £1,000 for a Samaritan Fund for the  
 “above Hospital, Mr. Sturge gives it on the conditions  
 “that this Fund shall be kept entirely separate from the  
 “general funds of the Hospital, and that the income shall  
 “be paid to or applied for such In-patients as may be  
 “necessitous, and within three months from their discharge  
 “from the Hospital, and for the purpose of their having  
 “necessary nourishment or change of air.

“Mr. Sturge hopes that this Fund may be made known  
 “and that others may be induced to subscribe to it.”

## THE MEDICAL SCHOOL.

**T**WO Casualty Medical and Two Casualty Surgical Officers, Two Resident Officers to the Special Departments, Eight Resident House Surgeons, Six Resident House Physicians, and Two Resident Obstetric and Gynæcological House Surgeons, are appointed annually from among the qualified Students of the Hospital, besides a Medical Officer and Medical, Surgical and Obstetric Registrars, and a Registrar to the Cancer Wing.

*Three Open Entrance Scholarships of the value of £100, £50 and £25, and a Scholarship of £50 open to Students of Universities who have completed their Anatomical and Physiological Studies, are awarded at the commencement of the Winter Session. An Entrance Scholarship is awarded annually to a Pupil of Epsom College who has passed the First examination for Medical Degrees of the University of London. A Scholarship of £50 is awarded to New Zealand Students who have passed their examinations in Anatomy and Physiology and who are proceeding to take a qualification in England. An Exhibition of £10 10s. is awarded at the end of the second Winter Session for proficiency in Anatomy and Physiology. The Hetley Prize of £25, the Leopold Hudson Prize of £11 11s., and the Lyell Medal and Scholarship, value £55 5s., are awarded annually. Two Broderip Scholarships, of the value of £60 and £40 respectively, are awarded to fifth year's Students for proficiency in Clinical knowledge. The Freeman Scholarship, of about £30, is awarded annually to Senior Students for proficiency in Obstetric Medicine. The Murray Medal and Scholarship of £25 is awarded every third year. Two Cancer Research Scholarships of the value of £100 each and one of £60 are awarded annually. Class Prizes are also awarded.*

The Tutors superintend and assist the Students in their studies without extra fee, and thus the necessity of obtaining private instruction away from the Medical School is obviated.

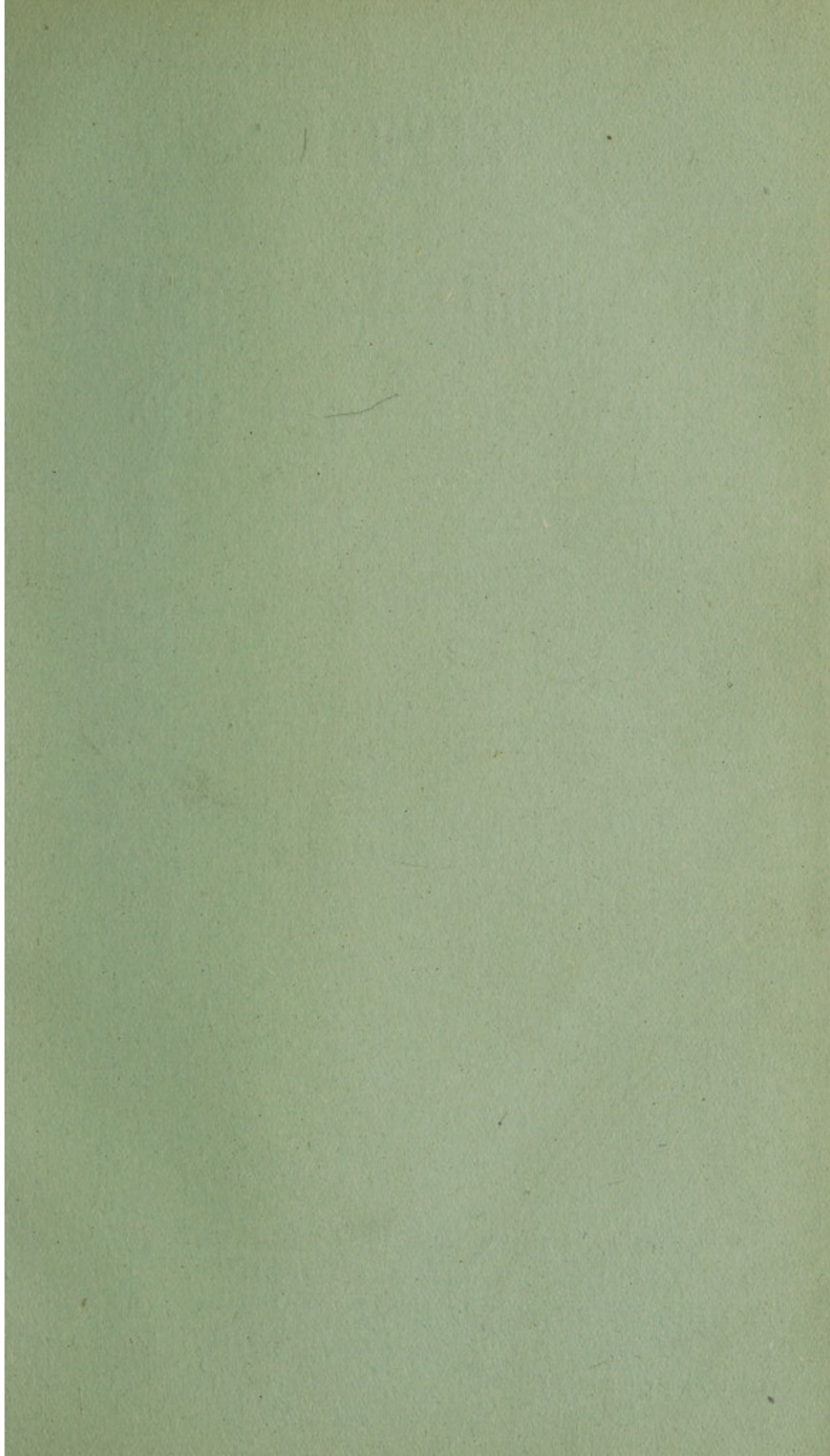

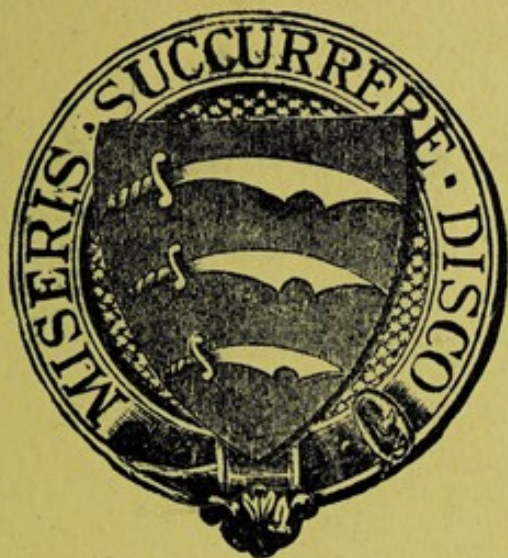

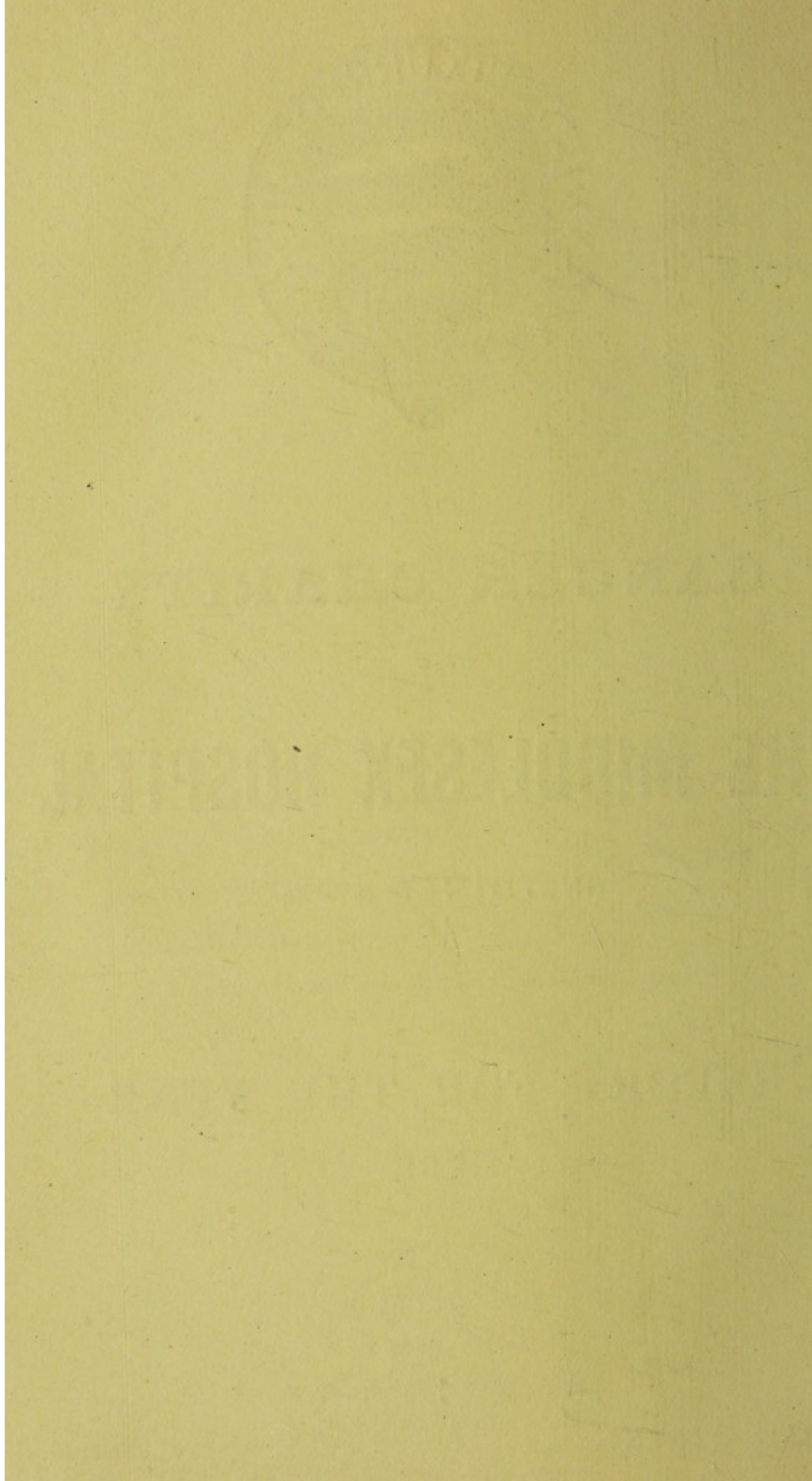

## GOVERNMENT OF THE CHARITY.

A BOARD of Management meets in the Board Room of the Hospital fortnightly on Wednesday, at 11 a.m., for the transaction of the ordinary business.

A Court of Governors is held on the last Thursday in the months of February, May, and November for the confirmation of such acts of the Board as require the sanction of a Court, and the transaction of special business. A Special Meeting of this Court may be called at any time, either by order of the Court or of the Board, or upon the requisition of the Treasurers or of any five Governors.

The Patrons, President, and Vice-Presidents are *ex-officio* Members of the Court, of the Board, and of Committees of a Court or Board.

## REPORT FOR 1920.

---

*To the Court of Governors.*

---

MY LORDS, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The number of patients in the Cancer Charity on 1st January, 1920, was 88, and 302 new patients were admitted during the year, making a total of 390 treated during this period : and there were 87 cases remaining in the Wards at the end of the year.

In 1919 the number of patients treated was 286.

The average daily number of occupied beds was 87·05, as compared with 78·13 in 1919 ; and the average stay in the Wards was 105·14 days compared with 144·55 in 1919.

In the Out-Patient Department 188 new patients were treated, and the number of attendances was 832 ; the corresponding figures for 1919 being 140 and 513 respectively.

A partial change has been made in the conditions of admission to the Cancer Charity applying to two Wards ; hitherto the Charity has been used only for cases deemed to be incurable, there to remain "until relieved by art or released by death." The former alternative of relief by art can now, in view of present knowledge, be exploited to a greater degree. So cases diagnosed as suitable for operation or for treatment by radium are now admitted, but kept separate in the specially assigned Wards from the other patients.

The accounts of the Cancer Charity and the Barnato Joel Charity, which, as was shown in the last report, by amalgamation achieved simplicity, can again be contrasted with the combined reports of the previous year.



The total Income for 1920, £16,585 2s. 1d., compared with that for 1919, £17,451 4s. 11d., shows, 'unfortunately, a decrease of £866 2s. 10d., whilst the total expenditure for the year, £18,727 2s. 5d., compared with that for 1919, £21,520 4s. 7d., is less by £2,793 2s. 2d.

There was thus a deficit on the year's working of £2,142 0s. 4d. Unhappily this loss, serious as it is, does not represent the full gravity of the position.

Last year also showed a deficit and, although the Charity realised all its free capital to reduce its liability, it entered upon 1920 with a debt to the Hospital General Fund, which has been increasing ever since.

Its share of the cost of the new Nurses' Home was £985 16s. 7d., its loss on 1920, £2,142 0s. 4d. In all it owes on the 1st January, 1921, £6,254 14s. 8d.

We regret to record yet another decline in subscriptions and donations. The former are less by £168 17s. 8d., the latter by £1,343 8s. 6d., than in 1919. Alms boxes, on the other hand, produced £131 10s. 11d. more than in the previous year.

The Scheme for obtaining contributions from patients according to their means is now in operation, but the yield from these patients cannot be great.

We must appeal once more, and with all the eloquence in our power, for greater support from the public for this branch of our work. There are no sufferers whose claims upon us are greater. They pay towards their own maintenance all they can afford. Surely help will be forthcoming for those who help themselves?

But, before ending our Report, we desire to call your attention to the work going forward unceasingly in the Cancer Research Laboratories.

We have already spoken of the provision made for operable cases. Intimately allied with the work of the Surgeons is the research upon which their knowledge of this disease is based, and by which new methods for its relief are devised.

We have a double appeal to make to you, and beyond you to the world. Relieve the sufferers: attack the disease itself. It is inconceivable that such an appeal should find ears deaf, hearts untouched, reason unconvinced.

Our need is great. Our claims, both moral and material, are unanswerable. They have, we must believe, only to be more fully known to obtain just and generous recognition.

## GOVERNORS.

### THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, RIGHTS, AND PRIVILEGES.

---

1. Annual Subscribers of *Three Guineas or upwards*, to the Cancer Charity, or to the Cancer and General Research Fund, are entitled to be Governors so long as their Subscriptions are paid.

2. Donors of *Thirty Guineas or upwards*, at one time, are made Life Governors, and at once entitled to all the privileges of Governors. The Endowment of Beds (see p. 47) qualifies the donor as a Life Governor.

3. Honorary Governors are appointed, and the propriety of making such appointments is first considered by the Board, and then submitted for the consideration and approval of a Court of Governors.

4. Honorary Governors have, from the day of their appointment, the same rights and privileges in all respects as Life Governors. In cases of Bequests of *Two Hundred Pounds and under Five Hundred Pounds*, one of the Executors under the will is eligible for appointment as an Honorary Governor.

5. All Governors have the right of attending the Courts of Governors, but Governors who are in arrear with their subscriptions are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any Board or Committee appointed in accordance with the Laws of the Hospital, and Governors who are new Annual Subscribers or Donors are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any such Board or Committee unless their subscriptions or donations have been paid at least three calendar months previously, and Governors being Salaried Officers or holding similar offices, or being Students or Servants of the Hospital, are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court, or to serve on any such Committee, and are not entitled to speak, vote, or serve at or on any such Court, Board, or Committee for one year after they have ceased to be such Salaried Officers, to hold such similar Offices, or to be such Students or Servants, unless specially authorised so to do by the Board.

6. No Governor is entitled to speak or vote at any Court, Board, or Committee on any question or matter wherein he or she is personally interested.

7. Every Governor has the right of visiting the Wards and other departments of the Cancer Charity in the presence of any one of the Physicians or Surgeons of the Hospital, the Resident Medical Officer or his substitute, the Chaplain, the Lady Superintendent, one of the Visiting Governors, or the Secretary-Superintendent.

### AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

1. Every Annual Subscriber of *Two Guineas and less than Three Guineas*, and every Donor of *Twenty Guineas, at one time* (or of smaller sums that may together equal that amount in the course of the current year), is entitled to recommend four Patients yearly; and Donors of *less than Twenty Guineas* are entitled, at the discretion of the Board, to recommend four Patients yearly during a period of three years.

2. Every Annual Subscriber of *Three Guineas and less than Five Guineas*, and every Donor of *Thirty Guineas and less than Fifty Pounds, at one time*, is entitled to recommend nine Patients yearly.

3. Every Annual Subscriber of *Five Guineas and less than Ten Guineas*, and every Donor of *Fifty Pounds and less than One Hundred Pounds, at one time*, is entitled to recommend fifteen Patients yearly.

4. Every Annual Subscriber of *Ten Guineas or upwards*, and every Donor of *One Hundred Pounds or upwards, at one time*, is entitled to recommend twenty-five Patients yearly.

5. Annual Subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the quarter-day next preceding the date of Subscription; and Subscribers are not entitled to any privilege until their Subscriptions are paid.

6. ## ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Patients are required to contribute in accordance with their means towards the cost of their maintenance. The amount of a Patient's contribution is agreed upon after enquiries made, either before or after admission to the Hospital, from the Patient or from the Patient's relatives or friends; but no distinction is made between those who can and those who cannot afford to contribute.

1. Out-Patients afflicted with cancer can be specially attended and relieved with advice and medicine on Wednesdays at 1.30 p.m. (Nassau Street entrance).

2. No letters of recommendation are required. Patients are required to contribute 6d. at each attendance. Further contributions are invited from those attending Special Departments.

3. Persons who are afflicted with cancer or cancerous disease *in such an advanced stage as to be deemed incurable* are admitted as In-Patients, and may remain "UNTIL RELIEVED BY ART OR RELEASED BY DEATH," unless it be found necessary to discharge them for insubordination or mental derangement.

4. Patients to be admitted into these wards should be decently clothed, have a change of raiment, and find security (if required) for a future supply, and for their removal if it be found necessary to discharge them.

5. In all cases patients are admitted for a fortnight's observation to enable a complete diagnosis to be made previous to being permanently placed upon the establishment.

6. No pauper can be received from any Parochial Institution without the special permission of the Board of Management.

7. No patient afflicted with cancer and usually resident in the country can be admitted, unless previous application be made to know whether there be room.

8. The name of any applicant declining to come into the Cancer Wards on receiving an intimation of a vacancy will be removed from the application register, and no application for re-entry will be entertained until after the expiration of three months.

9. Patients who have been once admitted and discharged are ineligible for re-admission except on special application to, and sanction by, the Board of Management.

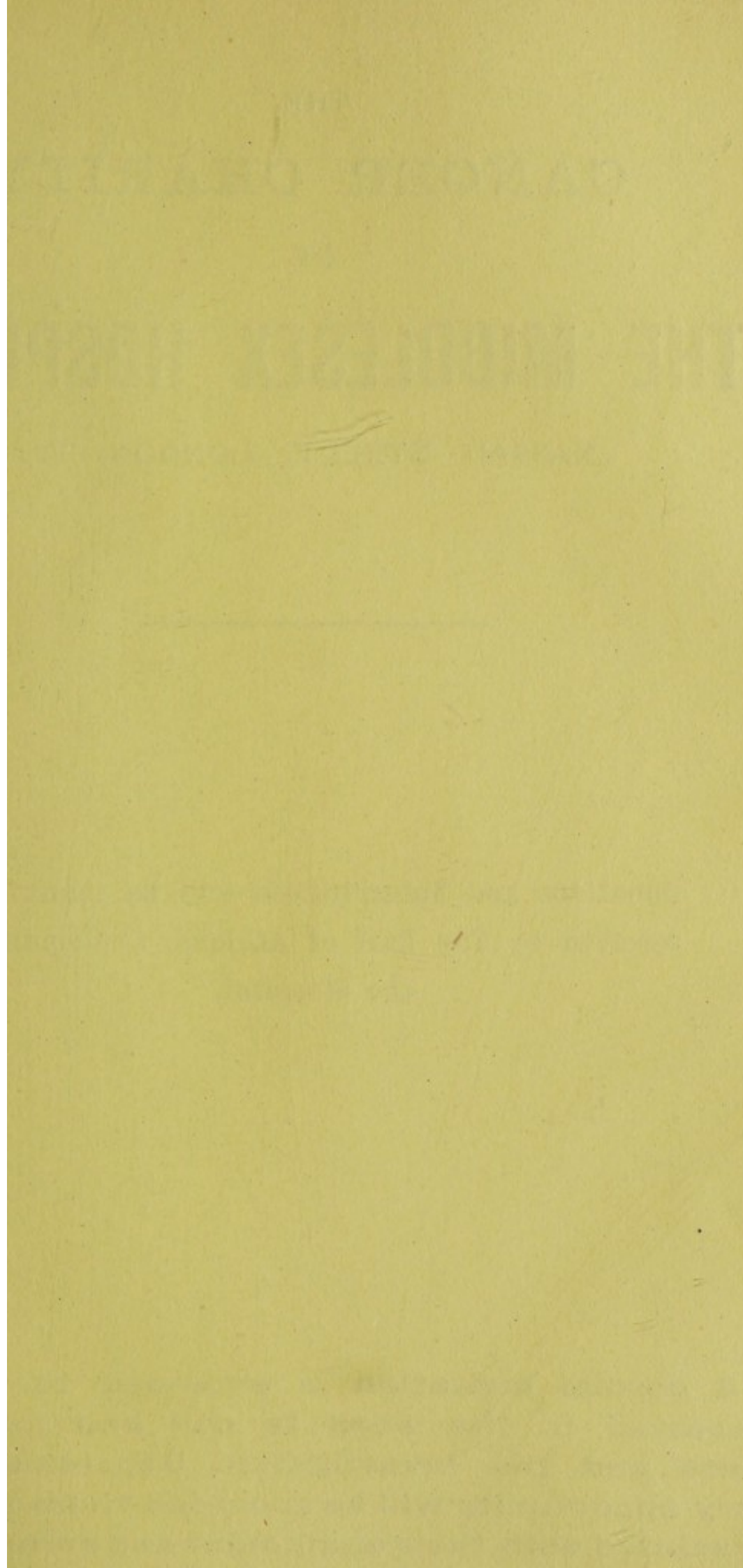
