GOVERNMENT OF THE HOSPITAL.

A BOARD of Management meets in the Board Room of the Hospital fortnightly on Wednesdays at 11 a.m. for the transaction of the ordinary business.

Meetings of the Court of Governors will be held, in 1923, on Thursday, March 22nd, Thursday, June 7th, and Thursday, December 6th for the confirmation of such acts of the Board as require the sanction of a Court, and the transaction of special business. A Special Meeting of this Court may be called at any time, either by order of the Court or of the Board, or upon the requisition of the Treasurers or of any five Governors.

The Patrons, President, and Vice-Presidents are *ex-officio* Members of the Court, of the Board, and of Committees of a Court or Board.

THE MIDDLESEX HOSPITAL.

REPORT FOR 1922.

To the Court of Governors.

MY LORDS, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

We open our Report for the year with the usual statistics regarding the work of the Hospital and its cost.

During the past year 5,524 patients were admitted to the Hospital, and at the beginning of the year 341 were in Hospital, making a total of 5,865, of whom 328 were still under treatment at the end of the year. The number of admissions show the slight increase of 31 over those for the preceding year. The average number of beds occupied daily was 332·91, as compared with 337·58. This small drop is accounted for by the fact that owing to the unfortunate introduction of infection by patients into the Wards some beds had necessarily to be left unoccupied for a time. Even with this drawback to take into account the percentage of occupied beds was 92·22 of the available total.

The average number of days each patient was under treatment was 21·94, compared with 22·44 during the year 1921.

The average cost of each In-patient per week was £3 12s. 4·07d., whereas for 1921 it was £3 17s. 1·05d.

The average total cost of each In-patient was £11 6s. 9·47d., compared with the sum of £12 7s. 1·47d. for the previous year.

The total number of new cases treated in the Out-patients Department was 34,699, and the attendances amounted to 145,455, including 26,775 in the Electrical Department.

The cost per Out-patient attendance was 1s. 5·03d., compared with 1s. 3·27d. in the year 1921, and the average cost per patient was 5s. 11·40d., compared with 5s. 3·16d. for the previous year.

As anticipated, there has been an improvement on both sides of the Income and Expenditure Account for the year 1922. The income exceeded expenditure by approximately £10,000.

Thus, whilst the year 1922 began with an overdraft of more than £20,000, we carry forward into 1923 a deficit of rather less than £10,000.

Much credit is due to the Finance Committee, whose untiring efforts in reducing costs and increasing income are reflected in the yearly figures and accounts.

The Voluntary Hospitals Commission, through the King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, has granted the sum of £10,220 (making a total Emergency Grant to the Hospital of £13,220), which has given us very material relief from our financial anxieties.

During 1922, also, we received from the preliminary distribution of the Hospitals of London Combined Appeal the sum of £9,300. Almost the whole of the energies of our St. Marylebone Associated Hospitals Local Appeal organisation was devoted to the furtherance of the Combined Appeal, and we may claim to have done our full share in promoting this splendid effort to clear the London Hospitals of debt. Incidentally this explains a fall which we have to report in the Annual Subscriptions of £1,000 and in Alms Boxes of £300.

The Local Appeal, an organisation formed to co-ordinate the appeal of all the St. Marylebone Hospitals to workers, whether employer or employee, in the Borough, had taken over the whole of the collecting work, just as the Combined Appeal called for all the support which individual Hospitals could give to it. It is intended that this organisation shall be the sole collecting authority from the classes to which its activities are directed, and it is hoped that it will not only diffuse a true knowledge of the finance of the Hospitals among them but also provide an organisation for inciting a far larger proportion of all classes of the business community actively to support them according to their means. And this as a duty and in anticipation of no direct personal benefit. Although during this first year the organisation, by devoting its efforts to the furtherance of the Combined Appeal in the Borough, was forced to neglect its own objects, we trust that in 1923 it will justify the hopes formed of it at its inception. The experiment is being carefully watched by the Finance Committee.

Contributions by patients towards their maintenance, a scheme instituted in December, 1920, yielded in 1922, £14,528, as against £11,815 in

1921. The Almoner's Department is to be congratulated on its efficient and tactful handling of this scheme. Evidence that our patients recognise the justice of our request, and that the friendly relations between them and us, on which we have always prided ourselves, continue unimpaired, is amply afforded by the ease with which this large sum is collected, and by the readiness of patients to continue to help after they have left the Hospital.

We welcome in this connection the attitude of those Approved Societies who are devoting a portion of their funds to the maintenance of their members who use the Hospitals. The policy of one of the largest in sending its members to our Convalescent Home marks another step in the progress through preventive treatment, towards a better standard of public health.

The All Help League, through Mrs. Richard Davis's valuable work, has not only maintained its receipts, but has actually increased them. Mrs. Davis is to be congratulated also upon having increased the number of our subscribers amongst the patients in spite of the fact that they have already been asked to contribute, according to their means, during their stay in the Hospital.

Other notable contributions, which have assisted the Hospital to reduce its burden, have been received from the King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, the Hospital Saturday Fund and the Metropolitan Hospital Sunday Fund, the total increase from the three funds amounting to £1,704.

A special receipt, from the "David Hughes" Trust Fund, has this year been doubled, the period during which it was directed that half the income should be invested having come to an end. A total of £4,685 10s. 8d. has been received.

The reorganisation of endowment investments which has been made during the last two years has caused an increase in dividends of £1,700 per annum.

We record with much regret the death of the Viscount Portman, who was for many years a member of the Board of Governors. Recently indifferent health had prevented him from taking an active part in the administration of the Hospital, but he was a proved and valued friend.

We regret to have to record the death of the Hon. Windham Baring; although he had been a member of the Board for a comparatively short time his business acumen and financial abilities will be greatly missed, especially by his more immediate colleagues on the Finance and Contracts Committee to whose work he mainly devoted his services.

All connected with the Hospital, and more particularly its patients, who benefited so largely from her beneficent activities, mourn the loss of the Dowager Countess of Derby. It was but a short time before her lamented death that you publicly marked your recognition of her great work for the Hospital by appointing her to the office of Vice-President (an honour which she enjoyed for all too brief a period). Lady Derby was President of the Ladies' Work Society and a generous contributor to the Hospital with an especial interest in the Bird Ward for women. It is with deep regret that we record the death of so sincere and hardworking a supporter of the work of the Hospital.

We congratulate Major The Hon. J. J. Astor, M.P., on his appointment as Vice-President of the Hospital.

We welcome as a new colleague George Grossmith, Esq., who has already shown his keenness to advance the interests of the Hospital, especially in respect of those objects with which he is most intimately connected.

The increasingly close bond between the Borough of St. Marylebone and the Hospital is marked by the readiness with which the present Mayor, Alderman A. E. Hughes, accepted his *ex-officio* membership of the Board in succession to Councillor E. Sanger, who proved that his seat on the Board was no mere sinecure, and expressed his determination that his interest in the Hospital would not cease with his year of office.

We have had to deplore the temporary absence of the Secretary-Superintendent, owing to a breakdown in his health attributable to overwork, but we trust that the holiday which he has taken has restored him to full strength for the resumption of the work which he has so much at heart.

The most notable event in connection with our administration has been the redrafting and consolidation of the Laws of the Hospital. The necessity for co-ordinating them and incorporating the many amendments which had been passed during a very long period had been recognised for some time, but it was a big task requiring much care and thought. We congratulate ourselves on having on the Board the right man for the work, who was both able and willing to undertake it. We owe a very deep debt of gratitude to Mr. Reginald Beddington for the masterly ability with which he has carried out the enormous mass of work entailed by drafting the New Laws, and for the time and patience which he devoted to ensuring their accuracy and completeness. The eminently successful result of his labours was brought before your Court in November, when the New Code was adopted unanimously.

We have much pleasure in announcing that our negotiations with St. Luke's Hospital for a scheme of co-operation for the benefit of neurological patients culminated in a definite satisfactory agreement. This is, we believe, the first instance of a working alliance between a General and a Special Hospital on such lines, and it is anticipated with confidence that the result will prove to be wholly beneficial. A Neurological Clinic and two small Wards will be established at this Hospital, where border-line cases will be specially treated under the care of the Staff of St. Luke's Hospital working in conjunction with our own Neurological Department. The necessary alterations to provide this additional accommodation have already been put in hand.

Additions to the equipment and structural alterations to the fittings of the Radiological Department have been made to facilitate its work, on which there is a growing demand.

Various other desirable improvements have been carried out or are in course of execution; these include the complete rewiring in successive blocks for electric light, the power for which is now taken direct from the mains of the Borough Generating Station; improvements in the heating and ventilation of the Chapel; and the provision of Isolation cubicles for infectious cases in the De Morgan Wards.

It is hoped that a complete installation of a satisfactory domestic Telephone system will shortly be provided.

Much of the old plant at the Steam Laundry has been replaced with the most up-to-date machinery working with greater efficiency and economy; it is hoped that when circumstances permit the remainder will be treated in the same way. We still continue to utilise as far as possible the full capacity of the plant by undertaking laundry work for other Hospitals.

We have to thank Lt.-Col. C. Fox, of the London Salvage Corps, for valuable help in still further improving our fire equipment, and giving instructive lectures on modern methods of fighting fire.

We are deeply grateful to Mr. Edmund Davis for his great generosity in providing for the panelling and redecoration of our Board Room; the artistic result is a notable tribute to his taste and judgment.

We also thank Mr. G. Vaughan Morgan for his gift of a grate, which is in harmony with the rest of the room.

Yet once more we have the greatest pleasure in expressing our gratitude to the Associated Newspapers, Limited, for their extremely generous support of the Hospital. The special display of Royal Gardens at their Ideal Homes Exhibition at Olympia obtained gross takings of £7,301, and this sum was most liberally handed over to the Hospital without any deduction for the expenses incurred in providing for this section of the Exhibition. A Silver Barrel for visitors' contributions was also allowed in the Royal Gardens, and a sum of £662 was obtained from this source. We would express our particular obligations to Mr. F. E. Bussy, one of the Directors, for his efforts to bring about this successful and gratifying result. Our thanks are also due to the Horticultural firms who did so much to ensure the prolific beauty of the Gardens.

We have to record also the generosity of the Essex Motor Club, which, at the instance of Mr. Duncan Watson, of whose unfailing readiness to promote the interests of the Hospital this is but the latest evidence, devoted to the Middlesex Hospital the half-share in the proceeds of the Royal Motor Race Meeting at Brooklands, held on May 20th, under the patronage of H.R.H. The Duke of Connaught. This half-share amounted to no less than £1,196 8s. 3d., a very welcome addition to our income.

We take this opportunity of recording our thanks to the Stock Exchange Dramatic and Operatic Society for their kindness in giving a most successful performance of "If I were King" at the Shaftesbury Theatre in aid of our funds.

We are especially gratified with the most welcome support afforded in the form of permanent Endowment of Beds. We thank most cordially the following for their liberality in this respect:—

We have erected a memorial tablet to him in the Chapel; the apt inscription on this, "Full of Faith and Power," sums up his life's great work.

* We greatly regret to record the untimely death of Mr. T. H. Kellock, M.A., M.D., M.C., F.R.C.S., Surgeon to the Hospital, which occurred while

he was still pursuing his full activities as a member of the Honorary Staff. Mr. Kellock's death is a great loss at once to our humanitarian and to our scientific work.

The Middlesex Hospital Ladies' Association, whose formation we were pleased to record last year, has fully justified what was then said regarding its activities, and has worked efficiently, if unostentatiously, to further the interests of the Hospital in its manifold spheres of usefulness.

We are yet again indebted to that zealous band of Voluntary Workers who with regular precision carry on their quiet but highly useful work of transporting patients from the Wards to the Operating Theatres, and we thank them for the services which they so willingly render.

The Lady Superintendent was compelled by illness to relinquish her duties for a time, but we can congratulate her and ourselves on her complete recovery.

Miss D. Millington has been appointed Theatre Sister.

Miss M. Jones has been appointed Extern Sister.

Nurse Lampard gained the special Theatre Prize presented by a kind but anonymous donor.

The Nurses' Annual Dance was held at the Savoy Hotel and improved upon last year's success. We have to thank Mrs. Richard Davis again, and the Nurses Committee, for organising this very pleasant and valuable addition to our annual functions.

The Convalescent Home has been occupied by 1,232 patients during the year, an increase of 102 compared with 1921. The average cost per patient a week has been £1 18s. 1·33d., as compared with £2 2s. 1·02d. last year. Our agreement with the Prudential Approved Societies has worked with notable smoothness and success; two representatives of the Societies have been appointed as members of the Convalescent Home Committee, and have proved their value in this capacity.

Important improvements in the water, heating and lighting plant have been effected, and the whole of these desirable alterations will shortly be completed.

It has been necessary to raise a further sum by mortgage on the Home towards the capital cost involved, but very considerable annual economies will be effected by the improvements, whilst space will be freed for an additional recreation room. The financial position of the Home, as can be seen from the accounts, is very much better than last year.

Our heartiest thanks are due to the Chairman and Members of the Convalescent Home Committee.

In conclusion, we are happy in being able to strike once more the note of conscious optimism. The Hospital is emerging slowly, but definitely, and without a departure from the Voluntary System from the depression which descended upon the world after the full effects of the War were realised.

It is our constant endeavour, as your Board, to educate the public in the many and valuable uses of a great General Hospital, and we think the support we are increasingly getting from all classes is evidence of some success in our aims. But we are yet a long way from our goal, a steady income to meet our present needs and a reasonable prospect of widening the scope of our work. Though in 1922 our income, thanks in great part to grants from the King's Fund, the Voluntary Hospitals Commission and the Combined Appeal, which will not recur, exceeded our expenditure, we still carry forward an overdraft at our Bankers of about £10,000. We look to you, and beyond you to the community, for renewed and increased support for an institution of which we are so justly proud.

The opening of the Winter Session of the Medical School was held at the Wigmore Hall, W.1, on October the 3rd, 1922, The Right Honourable the Earl of Athlone, G.C.B., G.C.V.O., D.S.O., presiding and distributing the prizes.

By his generous actions, his inspiration, and the personal care he has devoted to the arrangement of the specimens and to the compiling of this catalogue, Sir John Bland-Sutton has made our School the possessor of a Pathological collection of the greatest possible value for teaching purposes.

We must also express our gratitude to Mr. Reginald Beddington for the great amount of time and care he expended in revising the Laws of the Hospital and Medical School.

We are sure you will be interested to know that the Hospital Company of the O. T. C. has been re-formed and greatly strengthened, the Dean having recently obtained many new recruits.

We are pleased to report that certain additions and alterations in the School buildings have been completed, they include a new Biological Department and a new Bio-Chemical Department. Further additions and alterations to the School Buildings are now in hand and include an extra storey to the eastern end of the Bland-Sutton Institute of Pathology; alterations to the spiral staircase, to provide an additional room on each floor; the enlargement of the present Lift to serve as a passenger lift; alterations to one of the Class Rooms and the present Directors' Room, and the provision of a Common Room for the use of the Teaching Staff. Owing to the growth of the Medical School, the need of this extra accommodation has been acutely felt. This building work will be completed in the course of a few months, and will greatly assist us in maintaining and improving the high standard of efficiency which the Medical School now enjoys.

ALMONER'S REPORT FOR 1922.

GENTLEMEN,

The work in the Almoner's Department has continued steadily during the year, and it was found necessary to make a further addition of one to the Staff.

INSTRUMENTS.

386 Surgical, Dental and Optical Appliances have been supplied to In-Patients at a cost of £722 18s. 6d.

454 Surgical, Dental and Optical Appliances have been supplied to Out-Patients at a cost of £881 5s.

Patients and their friends have contributed towards the cost, and grants have been obtained from the Hospital Sunday Fund, Hospital Saturday Fund and other charitable agencies. Grants have also been given from the Dresden Assistance Fund and the Samaritan Fund.

CONVALESCENT AND SANATORIUM TREATMENT.

991 adult patients and 106 children (both In and Out-Patients) have been sent to our Convalescent Home at Clacton-on-Sea; 58 adult patients and 64 children have been sent to various other Convalescent Homes, and 84 patients to the Schiff Home of Recovery, Cobham; 53 adult patients and 10 children have been sent to Sanatoria through the Ministry of Health and County Councils; one patient to Creaton and one child to Holt, beds given by the King Edward's Hospital Fund.

Grants from the Dresden Assistance Fund towards the cost of convalescence, other than at our own Home at Clacton, have been given to the value of £200 9s. 4d., and from the Samaritan Fund to the value of £12 6s. 4d.

Patients have been assisted with the cost of railway fares, cab fares or ambulances to Convalescent Homes or to their own homes from the Dresden Assistance Fund to the extent of £213 10s. 3d., and from the Samaritan Fund to the extent of £22 2s. 11d.

RELIEF.

Only a small amount has been spent from the Dresden Assistance Fund in making grants to patients after being discharged from the Hospital and in providing the necessary clothing for those going to Convalescent Homes.

Small grants from the Samaritan Fund have also been given to necessitous Out-Patients, and Invalid Dinners have been given to some of the poorer Extern Maternity cases.

£82 14s. has been spent in giving weekly grants, from the George Balfour Black Fund, to several patients suffering from Cancer.

We are still indebted to the various branches of the Charity Organisation Society, Relief Committees, and to the local Clergy for their help; to the Queen Victoria and other Nursing Associations for their assistance in attending patients in their homes; to the United Services Fund and to the Invalid Children's Aid Association for their continued help to the children attending the Hospital.

INFANT WELFARE DEPARTMENT.

REPORT FOR 1922.

The steady progress of previous years has been continued during the last twelve months, the average attendance of babies at the Clinics has increased, and at the same time the deaths amongst them have fallen to the low figure of about one per hundred. The following table shows these figures for the last three years:—

In considering the decline in the numbers of new cases admitted to the Centre, it must be remembered that each case is retained up to five years, and that the total attendances are our important figures.

The work of the Centre, and, consequently, its value to the community could be greatly increased but for lack of space in which to develop.

Of the deaths during the past year, two were due to whooping-cough, one to convulsions, and one to marasmus.

The Physician in charge of the Department notes a continuation of these beneficial effects on the health of Infant Out-Patients which have previously been observed as the result of the Centre. Thanks very largely to the continuous supervision, careful feeding, and home visiting, cases of infantile diarrhoea and marasmus, two of the chief causes of infant mortality, are becoming relatively rare.

How many aspects there are of the social value of this work may be shown by the two following instances:—Firstly, there are on our Register a certain number of illegitimate children. It is found that, whereas these usually form the most neglected class of the child-community, the sympathy and assistance given by the Department result in the majority of such cases emerging from their hopeless position to a condition of happiness and health. In exceptional cases where economic reasons have made it impossible for the mother to look after the child, we have been able to secure the adoption or care of these children whilst the mother returned to work. Secondly, there are a certain number of cases of congenital syphilis discovered, and it has

been possible in these cases to secure, not only thorough treatment for the baby, but treatment for the parents which will ensure that any future children born to them may be free from this disease.

Miss Neville, who has been Sister-in-Charge of this Department since its inception, has recently left us to become Assistant Matron of another Hospital. We take this opportunity of expressing our appreciation of the great skill and devotion with which she has worked during these years.

We owe a debt of gratitude to our indefatigable voluntary workers, without whom the work on our Clinic days would be impossible, and we are also very grateful for a large number of babies' garments received from various Working Parties, which have been sold to the mothers at low prices, or given to them when necessity demanded. Several ladies who have been interested in our work have given money to help us to send children into the country for holidays. This has been much appreciated, and altogether we have been able to give holidays to nine children and four mothers during the summer months.

GOVERNORS.

THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, RIGHTS, AND PRIVILEGES.

1. Annual Subscribers of *Three Guineas or upwards* to the Hospital's General Fund, or to its particular establishments, viz., the Cancer Charity, the Convalescent Home (Clacton-on-Sea) or to the Medical School, are entitled to be Governors so long as their Subscriptions are paid.

2. Donors of *Thirty Guineas or upwards*, at one time, are made Life Governors, and at once entitled to all the privileges of Governors. The Endowment of a Bed or Cot (see p. 126) qualifies the donor as a Life Governor.

3. Honorary Governors are appointed, and the propriety of making such appointments is first considered by the Board, and then submitted for the consideration and approval of a Court of Governors.

4. Honorary Governors have, from the day of their appointment, the same rights and privileges in all respects as Life Governors. In cases of Bequests of *Two Hundred Pounds and under Five Hundred Pounds*, one of the Executors under the will is eligible for appointment as an Honorary Governor.

5. All Governors have the right of attending the Courts of Governors, but Governors who are in arrear with their subscriptions are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any Board or Committee appointed in accordance with the Laws of the Hospital, and Governors who are new Annual Subscribers or Donors are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any such Board or Committee unless their subscriptions or donations have been paid at least three calendar months previously, and Governors being Salaried Officers or holding similar offices, or being Students or Servants of the Hospital, are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court, or to serve on any such Committee, and are not entitled to speak, vote, or serve at or on any such Court, Board, or Committee for one year after they have ceased to be such Salaried Officers, to hold such similar Offices or to be such Students or Servants, unless specially authorised so to do by the Board.

6. No Governor is entitled to speak or vote at any Court, Board, or Committee on any question or matter wherein he or she is personally interested.

7. Every Governor has the right of visiting the Wards and other departments in the presence of any one of the Physicians or Surgeons of the Hospital, the Resident Medical Officer or his substitute, the Chaplain, the Lady Superintendent, one of the Visiting Governors, or the Secretary-Superintendent.

Patients are required to contribute in accordance with their means towards the cost of their maintenance. The amount of a Patient's contribution is agreed upon after enquiries made, either before or after admission to the Hospital, from the Patient or the Patients' relatives or friends; but no distinction is made between those who can and those who cannot afford to contribute.

No letters of recommendation are required for the Out-Patient Department. Patients are required to contribute 6d. at each attendance, but are excused from payment if their circumstances warrant it. Further contributions are invited from those attending the Special Departments.

Accidents and urgent cases are admitted at any time of the day or night.

Bearers of letters of recommendation should attend at the Hospital (entrance in Mortimer Street) at TWELVE o'clock noon, on any week-day.

Medical Cases are seen by the Casualty Medical Officer every week-day at 9.30 o'clock, and attended:—On Mondays and Thursdays, at 1.30 p.m., by Dr. G. E. S. WARD; on Tuesdays and Fridays, at 1.30 p.m., by Dr. E. A. COCKAYNE; and on Wednesdays and Saturdays, at 1.30 p.m., by Dr. G. E. BEAUMONT.

Surgical Cases are seen by the Casualty Surgical Officer every week-day at 9.30 o'clock, and attended:—On Mondays and Thursdays, at 1.30 p.m., by Mr. C. H. S. In-Patients are expected to be provided with clean and decent clothing, and a change of linen. They also have to provide themselves with washing. In all cases where the Patients are too poor to provide themselves with these articles, they are supplied to them by the Lady Almoner from special funds which she has at her disposal for the purpose.

Any Officer, Sister, Nurse, Servant, or person employed in any Department of the Hospital accepting Money, or Presents of any kind, from a Patient, or relative or friend of any Patient, on any pretence whatever, is liable to dismissal.

The following Cases are not admitted into the Hospital:—

1. Those which are, upon due examination, deemed *Incurable*, as Advanced Consumption, etc.
2. Complaints so tedious of Cure as to preclude for a long time the admission of more urgent cases, as *Chronic Ulcers* of the Legs, etc.
3. Disorders, to the Cure of which other establishments are devoted, as *Persons of Unsound Mind*, etc.
4. Those which are more properly objects for Parochial Relief, as wanting Food and not Medicine.
5. Those whose admission might endanger the other patients, as persons suffering from *Infectious Diseases*.
6. Complaints likely to be aggravated rather than relieved by confinement within the walls of a Hospital, but such cases, if deemed proper objects, may receive advice and medicine as *Out-Patients*.

Prior to sending up Patients from the Country, the Secretary-Superintendent should be applied to, in order to learn whether there is room, and such application should be accompanied by a medical certificate setting out fully the nature of the case.

SAMARITAN AND CONVALESCENT HOME FUND.

Patients of the Hospital recommended by or through any Physician, Surgeon, Visiting Governor, the Resident Medical Officer, or the Chaplain, are the objects of the Samaritan portion of this Fund, the distribution of which is vested in the Board.

In such distribution the following purposes are kept in view, viz. :—

- (a) Forwarding poor patients to their homes.
- (b) Sending to and maintaining at the Convalescent Home at Clacton-on-Sea, or other similar institution, such In-Patients as the proper Medical Officer certifies to be suitable cases.
- (c) The purchase of clothing, flannel, linen, or such other necessities as the condition of the Patient may require, including the whole or a portion of the cost of surgical appliances.
- (d) The temporary assistance of poor convalescent Patients requiring further medical aid as Out-Patients on leaving the Hospital.

The Convalescent Home is devoted to the following purposes, viz. :—

- (a) The reception of such In-Patients of the Hospital as are, on the recommendation of the proper Medical Officer, deemed convalescent but requiring change of air, rest, and nutritious diet for complete recovery.
- (b) The similar reception of such officers, sisters, nurses, and servants on the establishment of the Hospital as the Board, on the recommendation of the proper Medical Officer, deem, from sickness or other cause, in need of rest and change of air.
- (c) The reception of such other Patients as the Board, with the approval of a Court of Governors, shall from time to time determine.

THE GEORGE STURGE TRUST.

In the year 1884 Mr. George Sturge, of Woodthorpe, Sydenham Hill Road, executed a Deed of Trust providing for the payment of certain sums of money to various Charitable and Philanthropic Institutions, and amongst others The Middlesex Hospital, to which he devoted the munificent sum of £895* Railway Stock, representing one thousand pounds (£1,000), under the following conditions, viz.:—

“In giving the sum of £1,000 for a Samaritan Fund for the
 “above Hospital, Mr. Sturge gives it on the conditions
 “that this Fund shall be kept entirely separate from the
 “general funds of the Hospital, and that the income shall
 “be paid to or applied for such In-patients as may be
 “necessitous, and within three months from their discharge
 “from the Hospital, and for the purpose of their having
 “necessary nourishment or change of air.

“Mr. Sturge hopes that this Fund may be made known
 “and that others may be induced to subscribe to it.”

THE MEDICAL SCHOOL.

TWO Casualty Medical and Two Casualty Surgical Officers, Four Resident Officers to the Special Departments, Eight Resident House Surgeons, Six Resident House Physicians, and Two Resident Obstetric and Gynæcological House Surgeons, are appointed annually from among the qualified Students of the Hospital, besides a Medical Officer and Medical, Surgical and Obstetric Registrars.

Three Open Entrance Scholarships of the value of £100, £50 and £25, and a Scholarship of £50 open to Students of Universities who have completed their Anatomical and Physiological Studies, are awarded at the commencement of the Winter Session. An Entrance Scholarship is awarded annually to a Pupil of Epsom College who has passed the First examination for Medical Degrees of the University of London. A Scholarship of £50 is awarded to New Zealand Students who have passed their examinations in Anatomy and Physiology and who are proceeding to take a qualification in England. An Exhibition of £10 10s. is awarded at the end of the second Winter Session for proficiency in Anatomy and Physiology. The Hetley Prize of £25, the Leopold Hudson Prize of £11 11s., and the Lyell Medal and Scholarship, value £55 5s., are awarded annually. Two Broderip Scholarships, of the value of £60 and £40 respectively, are awarded to fifth year's Students for proficiency in Clinical knowledge. The Freeman Scholarship, of about £30, is awarded annually to Senior Students for proficiency in Obstetric Medicine. The Murray Medal and Scholarship of £25 is awarded every third year. Two Cancer Research Scholarships of the value of £100 each and one of £60 are awarded annually. Class Prizes are also awarded.

The Tutors superintend and assist the Students in their studies without extra fee, and thus the necessity of obtaining private instruction away from the Medical School is obviated.

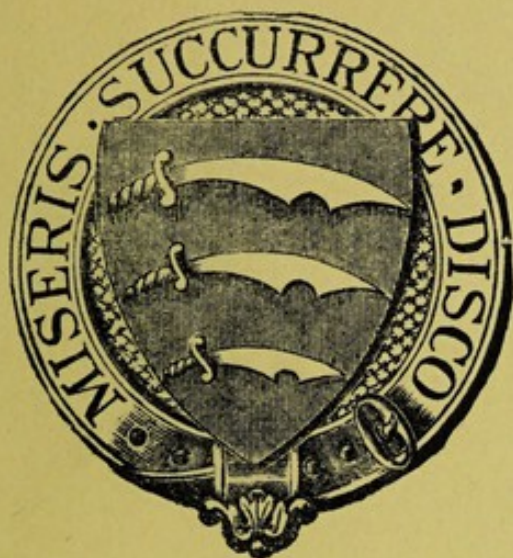

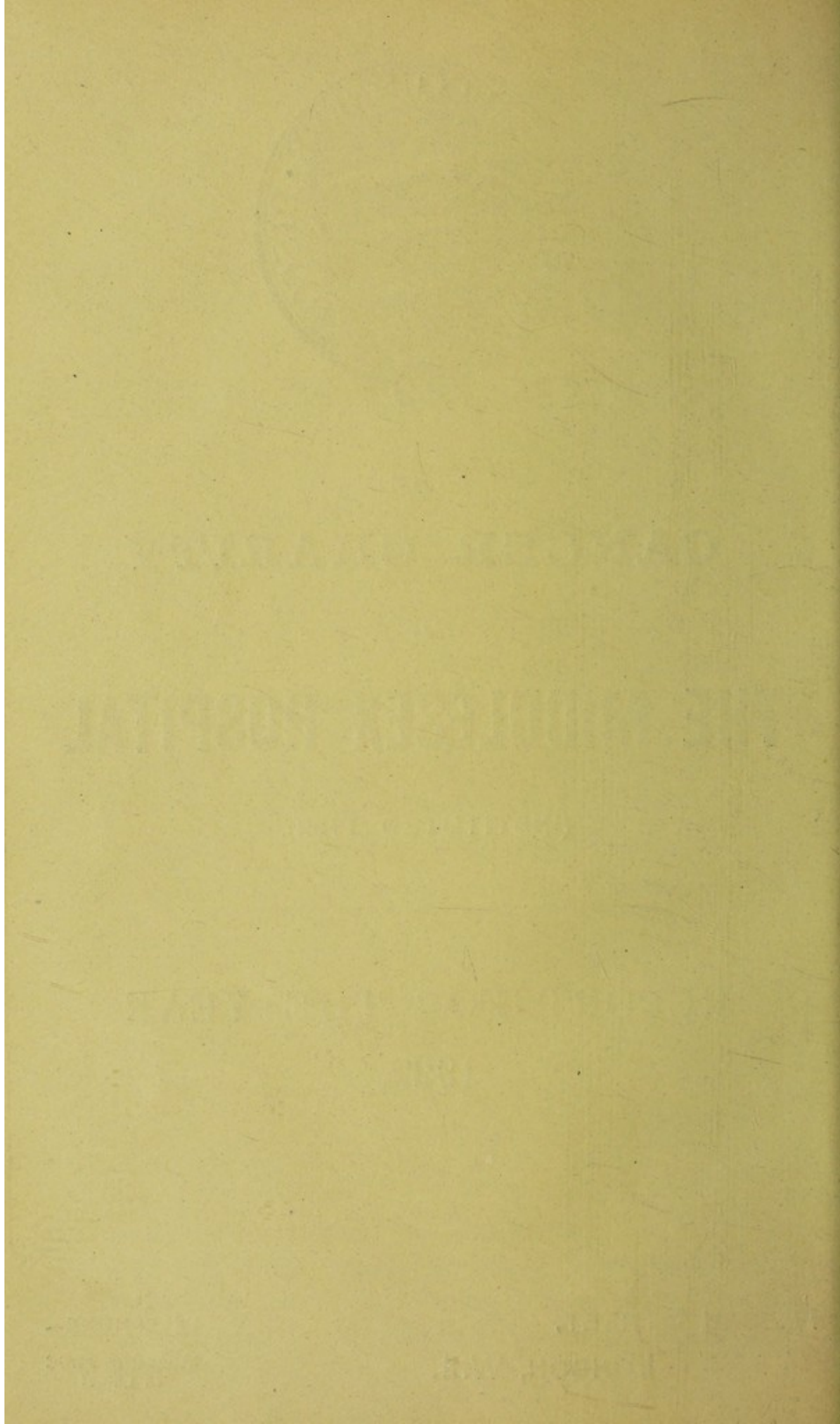

GOVERNMENT OF THE CHARITY.

A BOARD of Management meets in the Board Room of the Hospital fortnightly on Wednesday, at 11 a.m., for the transaction of the ordinary business.

Meetings of the Court of Governors will be held, in 1923, on Thursday, March 22nd, Thursday, June 7th, and Thursday, December 6th, for the confirmation of such acts of the Board as require the sanction of a Court, and the transaction of special business. A Special Meeting of this Court may be called at any time, either by order of the Court or of the Board, or upon the requisition of the Treasurers or of any five Governors.

The Patrons, President, and Vice-Presidents are *ex-officio* Members of the Court, of the Board, and of Committees of a Court or Board.

THE CANCER CHARITY. MIDDLESEX HOSPITAL.

REPORT FOR 1922.

To the Court of Governors.

MY LORDS, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

At the beginning of the year 76 patients were under treatment in the Wards, and during the year 513 patients have been admitted, while 86 remained at the end of this period.

For the previous year the number of admissions was 505.

The average daily bed occupancy was 86.13, compared with 85.74 for the year 1921; the average length of stay was 62.37 days, as compared with 60.65 the previous year.

The average cost of each In-Patient per week was £4 4s. 1.78d., as compared with £4 7s. 6.89d. the preceding year, and the average total cost per patient £37 9s. 9.58d., as against £37 18s. 9.67d.

There were 191 new cases treated in the Out-Patient Department, where the attendances numbered 708.

These figures both show a falling off from 1921, when they were respectively 234 and 789.

The average cost for each Out-Patient was £1 2s. 4.59d., compared with 19s. 2d.

The Income and Expenditure Account shows an increase of £427 15s. 2d. in the Ordinary Income, from £15,757 19s. 7d. to £16,185 14s. 9d., while the Extraordinary Income, thanks to the special grants from the Voluntary Hospitals' Commission and the preliminary distribution from the Combined Appeal Fund, is raised from £2,850 to £4,436 17s. 10d., an increase of £1,586 17s. 10d.

It is gratifying to note that subscriptions for 1922 total £1,530 4s. 3d. as compared with £1,190 13s. 3d. for 1921, making an increase of £339 11s.

Another item in the receipts which compares favourably with that of the preceding year is the amount received as contributions from patients towards their maintenance, the respective sums being £1,963 19s. 8d. and £1,412 18s. 3d., a growth of £551 1s. 5d.

On the other hand, we regret to have to record a serious diminution in the receipts from legacies—from £2,850 to the very small total of £153 17s. 10d.

The total income amounts to £20,622 12s. 7d., an increase of £2,014 13s. over that for the year 1921. It has been possible to effect a slight decrease in the cost for the year amounting to £745 5s. 1d., the respective totals reading £20,714 17s. 6d. and £21,460 2s. 7d.

Thus the adverse balance on the year's working has been reduced to £92 4s. 11d., whereas for the preceding period this amounted to £2,852 3s.

This practical balancing of the Income and Expenditure Account for the year is very hopeful when we consider the conditions under which it has been achieved.

The most notable gift in support of the Charity during the year is attributable to a kind friend who prefers to remain anonymous, and has contributed the generous sum of £600.

We express our cordial thanks to Miss Fanny M. Marriage, to whom we are much indebted for her continued interest in our work; the proceeds of her annual sale of jams and pickles amounted to the gratifying sum of £112.

GOVERNORS.

THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, RIGHTS, AND PRIVILEGES.

1. Annual Subscribers of *Three Guineas or upwards*, to the Cancer Charity, or to the Cancer and General Research Fund, are entitled to be Governors so long as their Subscriptions are paid.

2. Donors of *Thirty Guineas or upwards*, at one time, are made Life Governors, and at once entitled to all the privileges of Governors. The Endowment of Beds (see p. 47) qualifies the donor as a Life Governor.

3. Honorary Governors are appointed, and the propriety of making such appointments is first considered by the Board, and then submitted for the consideration and approval of a Court of Governors.

4. Honorary Governors have, from the day of their appointment, the same rights and privileges in all respects as Life Governors. In cases of Bequests of *Two Hundred Pounds and under Five Hundred Pounds*, one of the Executors under the will is eligible for appointment as an Honorary Governor.

5. All Governors have the right of attending the Courts of Governors, but Governors who are in arrear with their subscriptions are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any Board or Committee appointed in accordance with the Laws of the Hospital, and Governors who are new Annual Subscribers or Donors are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any such Board or Committee unless their subscriptions or donations have been paid at least three calendar months previously, and Governors being Salaried Officers or holding similar offices, or being Students or Servants of the Hospital, are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court, or to serve on any such Committee, and are not entitled to speak, vote, or serve at or on any such Court, Board, or Committee for one year after they have ceased to be such Salaried Officers, to hold such similar Offices, or to be such Students or Servants, unless specially authorised so to do by the Board.

6. No Governor is entitled to speak or vote at any Court, Board, or Committee on any question or matter wherein he or she is personally interested.

7. Every Governor has the right of visiting the Wards and other departments of the Cancer Charity in the presence of any one of the Physicians or Surgeons of the Hospital, the Resident Medical Officer or his substitute, the Chaplain, the Lady Superintendent, one of the Visiting Governors, or the Secretary-Superintendent.

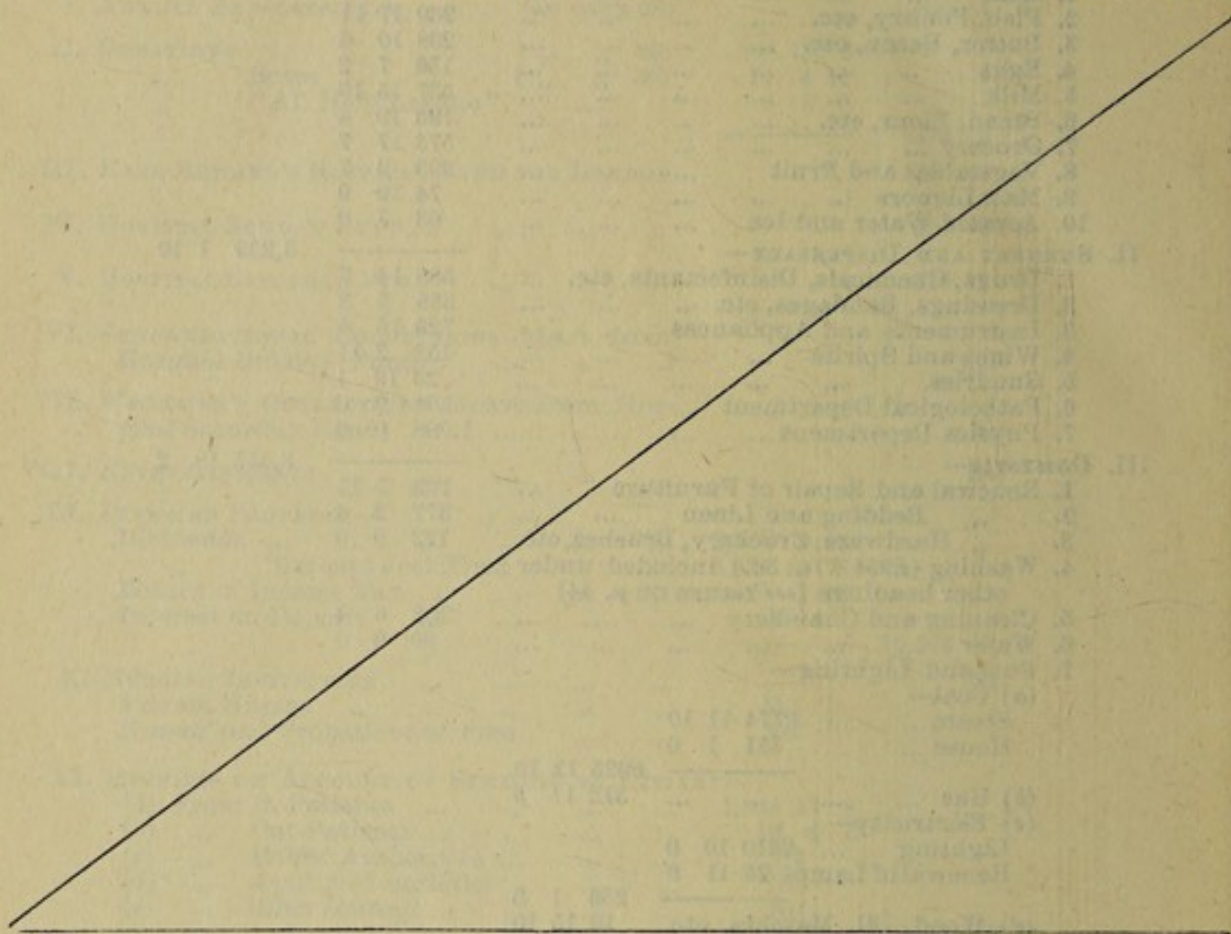

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Patients are required to contribute in accordance with their means towards the cost of their maintenance. The amount of a Patient's contribution is agreed upon after enquiries made, either before or after admission to the Hospital, from the Patient or from the Patient's relatives or friends; but no distinction is made between those who can and those who cannot afford to contribute.

No letters of recommendation are required for the Out-Patient Department. Patients are required to contribute 6d. at each attendance, but are excused from payment if their circumstances warrant it. Further contributions are invited from those attending the Special Departments.

1. Out-Patients afflicted with cancer can be specially attended and relieved with advice and medicine on Wednesdays at 1.30 P.M. (Nassau Street entrance).

2. No letters of recommendation are required. Patients are required to contribute 6d. at each attendance. Further contributions are invited from those attending Special Departments.

3. Persons who are afflicted with cancer or cancerous disease *in such an advanced stage as to be deemed incurable* are admitted as In-Patients, and may remain "UNTIL RELIEVED BY ART OR RELEASED BY DEATH," unless it be found necessary to discharge them for insubordination or mental derangement.

4. Patients to be admitted into these wards should be decently clothed, have a change of raiment, and find security (if required) for a future supply, and for their removal if it be found necessary to discharge them.

5. In all cases patients are admitted for a fortnight's observation to enable a complete diagnosis to be made previous to being permanently placed upon the establishment.

6. No pauper can be received from any Parochial Institution without the special permission of the Board of Management.

7. No patient afflicted with cancer and usually resident in the country can be admitted, unless previous application be made to know whether there be room.

8. The name of any applicant declining to come into the Cancer Wards on receiving an intimation of a vacancy will be removed from the application register, and no application for re-entry will be entertained until after the expiration of three months.

9. Patients who have been once admitted and discharged are ineligible for re-admission except on special application to, and sanction by, the Board of Management.

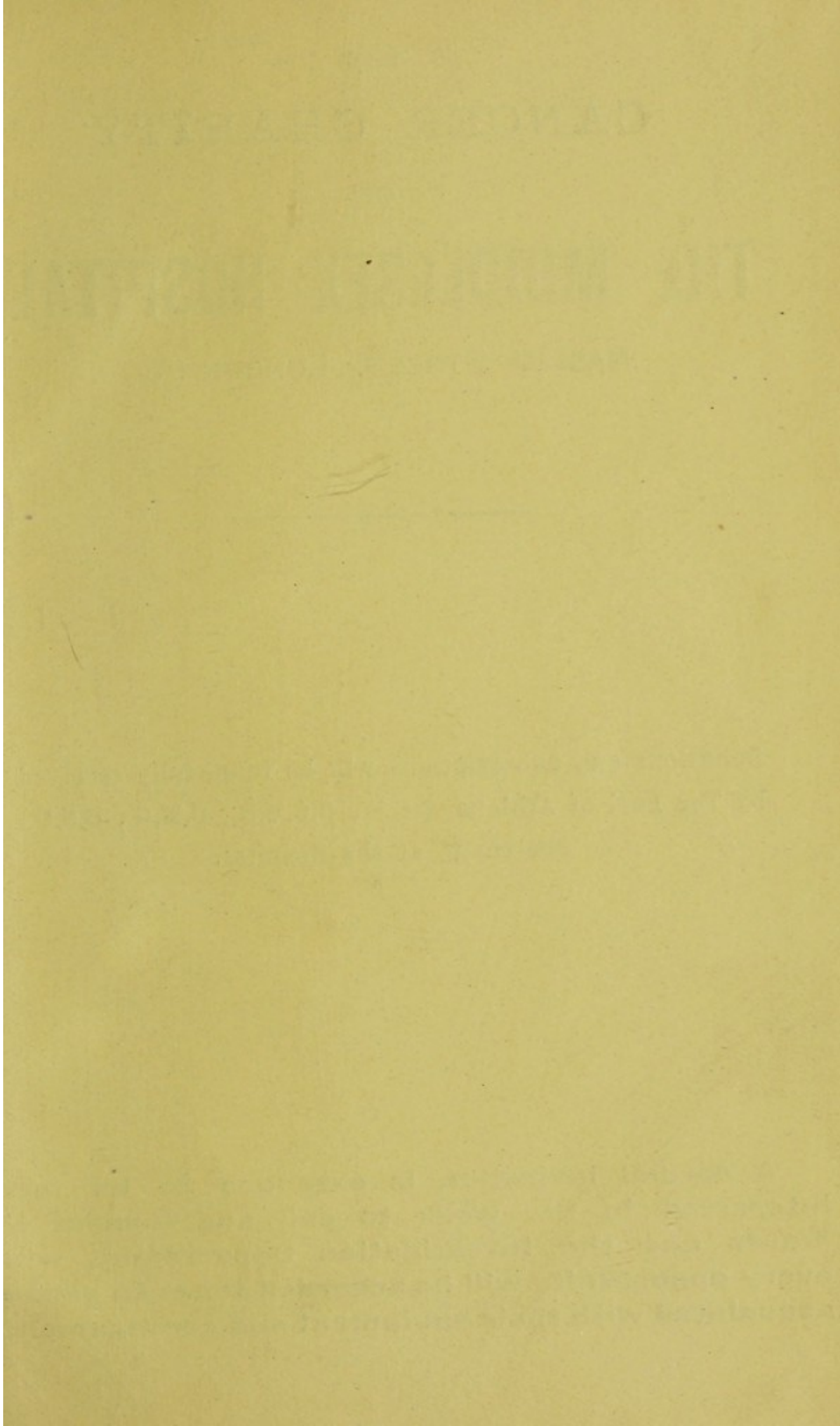
