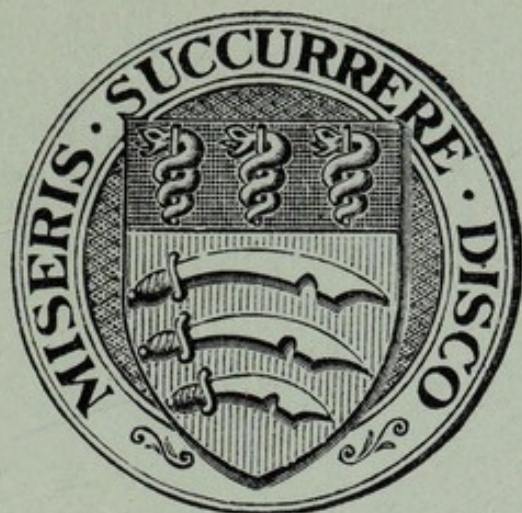

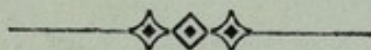

Income Tax on Annual Subscriptions.

Charitable gifts escape Income Tax and, provided there is a covenant to pay a sum to this Hospital (or Cancer Wing) for a period which can exceed six years, the contributor also escapes Income Tax and Super-tax on it. The Hospital (or Cancer Wing) can recover from the Inland Revenue the amount of such Income Tax, and thus obtains the full benefit of the contribution although the contributor actually pays it a smaller sum. There is a small Stamp Duty, which the Hospital will bear.

Thus, suppose a person (or firm or company) covenants to pay £100 a year, he (they or it) deduct Income Tax (now 4s. 6d. in the pound) and pay the Hospital (or Cancer Wing) only £77 10s. 0d., but the Hospital (or Cancer Wing) recovers from the Inland Revenue the £22 10s. 0d., and so acquires the £100. The contributor would accordingly gain £22 10s. 0d. a year through his covenant.

A person also escapes Super-tax in respect of such a contribution as any annual sums payable by an individual from which he may deduct Tax are excluded from his total income for the purposes of that tax.

Cheques should be made payable to the order of the Treasurer or Secretary-Superintendent of the Middlesex Hospital and should be crossed "Not negotiable."

A form of Agreement under seal is annexed.

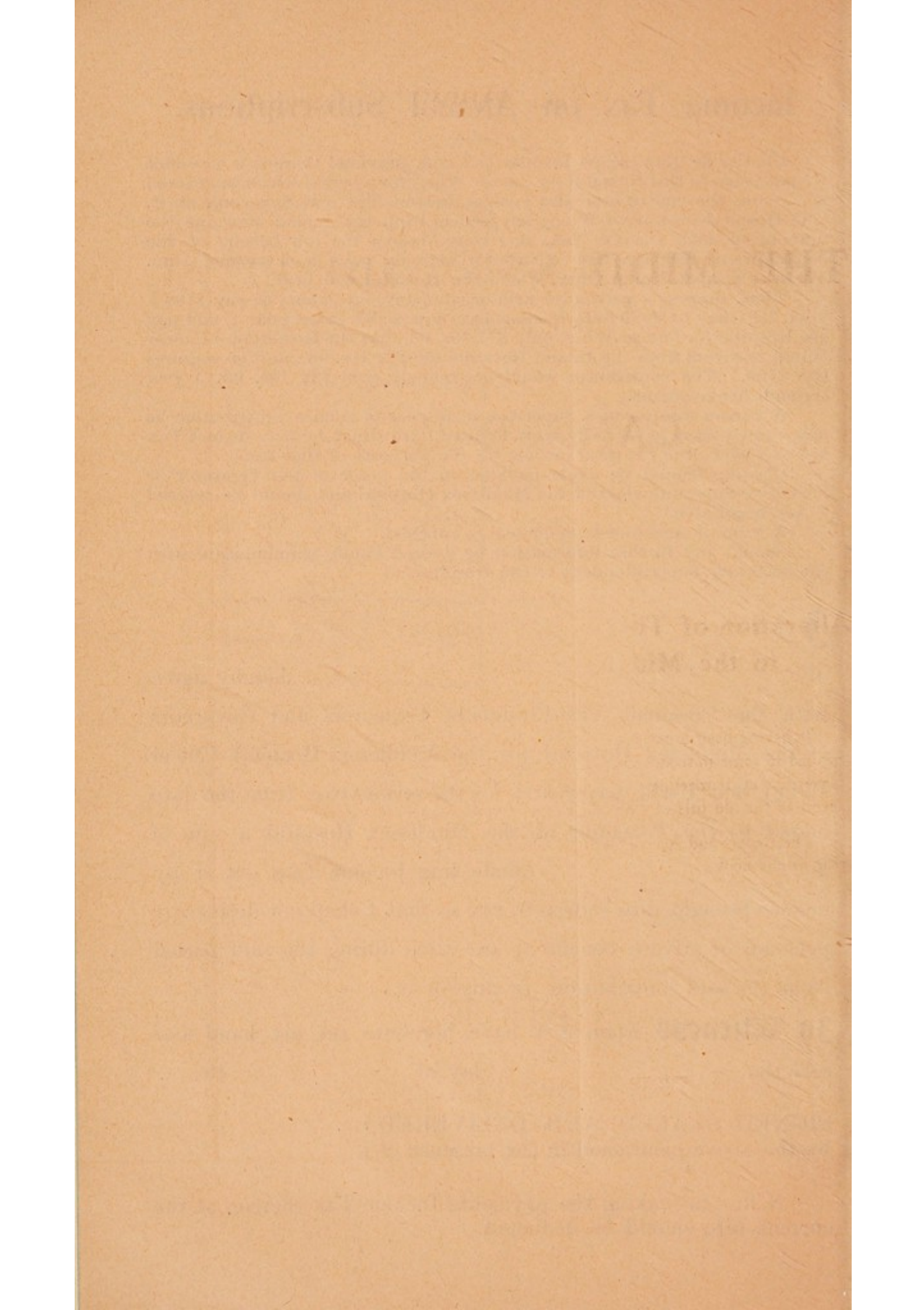

THE MIDDLESEX HOSPITAL AND CANCER WING.

REPORT FOR 1929.

To the Court of Governors.

MY LORDS, LADIES, AND GENTLEMEN,

The year 1929 was, for the Voluntary Hospitals of this country, one of critical importance. In it was passed the Local Government Act, 1929, which enacted that from April, 1930 "all then existing Poor Law Authorities shall cease to exist" so that their functions pass to Councils of Counties and County Boroughs.

For many years past the State has been busy with the creation and development of a national health service. The Ministry of Health has become an important and an essential Department of Government. It has provided, directly and indirectly, a network of clinics for Tuberculosis, for Venereal Disease, for Ante-Natal and Infant Welfare work. Councils have assumed responsibility for controlling epidemics as for improving conditions of living and the general standard of health: and the Medical Staff to carry out these duties is now a charge upon local taxation.

Institutional treatment for the sick has hitherto been provided by the Poor Law, administered by Boards of Guardians, and by the Voluntary Hospital system. The Poor Law was designed some three hundred and fifty years ago to meet destitution primarily, and sickness only in so far as it was incidental to destitution. The Voluntary Hospital system—its origins can be traced back more than a thousand years earlier—deals primarily with disease, medical teaching, and research.

The Poor Law provided assistance for the destitute either by outdoor relief, or in an institution analogous to, though from the medical standard infinitely behind, the Voluntary Hospital. In the re-arrangement and re-organization of institutional relief under the Local Government Act, will be found one of the greatest reforms initiated under the

new system. It must be remembered that the Guardians have been under a statutory obligation to relieve destitution without regard to the cause which may have brought that destitution about. Among the inmates of their institutions were to be found persons suffering from various diseases, the treatment of which, had they not been destitute, would have been met by the Voluntary Hospital System, or would have devolved upon the municipal or county authorities. The test of treatment has always been, for the Poor Law, the fact of destitution and the destitute sick were grouped by the locality from which they came and not by the nature or treatment of their disease.

But the best modern medical practice is based on specialisation. We have specialists in medicine and surgery, specially trained nurses, and special diagnostic and treatment departments with their elaborate and expensive equipment, and we have costly research departments. All this means expense which is only justified where the services of the specialists, and the elaborate apparatus, can be utilized to their full value.

Under the new Act the Government transfers the Infirmaries and Asylums of the Poor Law to the Local Authorities, and the medical departments of those authorities develop from advisory and supervisory into executive and administrative services.

This seems to your Board to be undoubtedly a wise policy. It removes the waste and friction of the old dual system, and it promises a uniform and progressive management of the municipal hospital system.

The result of this transfer to the Local Authorities of Institutional treatment, no longer confined to the destitute, means the inauguration of a National Hospital service. Its development cannot, in the nature of things, be very rapid. It will take the Local Authorities some time to adjust themselves to the new duties imposed upon them. The cost, too, of the development of Municipal Institutions up to the standard set by the Voluntary Hospitals, will be great. Nevertheless the powers are there, and the Councils everywhere are alive to their responsibilities and their opportunities.

We have, naturally, given long and careful thought to the effect of this great change upon the Voluntary Hospitals. Clearly, in the absence of mutually acceptable co-operation, there is real danger of competition between rate-supported and voluntary hospitals and of an extravagant and inevitably inefficient overlapping of functions. Now the Act lays down that every County or County Borough Council in making provisions for hospital accommodation, shall first consult some body representing the Voluntary Hospitals in its area. London itself has been divided

into five areas. The Voluntary Hospitals of these areas have elected their representatives to Area Committees, and a Central Committee to deal with the London County Council direct, is elected from members of the Area Committees. The London County Council have recognised this body as the Consultative body of the Act, and will welcome discussion with a body so representative of the most enlightened lay and medical opinion of the Voluntary Hospitals. We for our part are ready and eager to assist in a co-ordination of activities which should develop to the utmost the best in both bodies, and provide for all classes of the community the finest medical service in the world.

The wider and more progressive the development of national health services, the greater will be the need of the Voluntary Hospital services and in particular of the great General Hospitals with their teaching schools. In their research laboratories the causes of disease are studied and its control or cure discovered. Their results have always been freely at the services of mankind. It is not more bricks and mortar that are needed here. There are already more laboratories in this country than there are men capable of fully utilizing them. It is to be hoped that there will be no wasteful overlapping but that existing Research Departments will receive additional support to enable them to attain their fullest possible development. Moreover, from the medical schools of the General Hospitals come, and must come, the Medical Officers of the national services, the general practitioners and specialists. It should be possible to improve with co-operation, teaching facilities, and close co-operation should ensure, in personnel, that free circulation, which as in the world of ideas, best facilitates orderly and harmonious progress.

To turn from consideration of the Hospital Service as a whole, to a review of our own particular affairs, your Board have to report upon another year's progress and development. The year 1929 was, for the Middlesex Hospital, one of marked progress. We gave for instance, a lead to the Hospitals of this country in opening a number of beds specially for radiological treatment of cancer. This means that patients who are afraid of surgery can come direct from their own doctor to the Radiologist who now has charge of beds.

Most people interested in the Hospital world will know, too, that we started a new system of not waking patients in the morning before 7 o'clock. Under the old system they were often called as early as 5 a.m. or even 4.30 a.m. By a re-arrangement of nursing duties and with the co-operation of the Medical Staff we have been able to change this. Over a hundred other hospitals, not only in this country, but also in South

Africa, Australia, etc., have written to us to know how this has been done, and many of them are following suit. These changes are evidence of the vitality and the progressive spirit of the Hospital.

But if we often lead others we are not afraid to acknowledge taking advantage of their experience where we think it is for the good of our patients or for the Hospital. We have decided, in the interests of our patients and ourselves, to co-operate with the Hospital Savings Association. You will remember our old objection was to the risk of a claim for priority of treatment. Cases at the Middlesex Hospital are, and always will be, admitted in order of their medical needs. With this fear dissipated we see no reason why we should prevent possible patients—for that is what it comes to—from taking the wise precaution of insuring themselves against the costs of illness or accident. Insurance is a very good thing. But insurance is definitely confined to the advantage of the individual. We believe that our patients recognise this and we believe that we can count upon them when their means allow, to contribute later for the benefit of the community as a whole.

Of our immense task of reconstruction there is good progress to report. More than two-thirds of the scheme is completed. Half our patients are already back from the Annexe and housed in the new West Wing. The Annexe itself is well on its way to conversion for its ultimate purpose as a great Out-Patient Department. The first section of the new Nurses' Home is occupied and the construction of the second section nearing completion. The new Neurological and other Wards will be finished in the early summer, and the new Residents House is nearly ready for occupation. We have already opened a number of private rooms for paying patients and we shall shortly be starting work upon the great block of sixty separate rooms with their own operating theatres and offices, to meet the needs of those who, though their means exclude them from the general wards provided by public subscription and endowment, are yet unable to meet the cost of Specialists fees and Nursing Homes outside. And for all this immense development we have funds in hand. So magnificent has been the response of the public to the claims of one of its greatest and most important hospitals, that we have not a doubt that when we come to ask for the provision of the final section that it will be forthcoming.

For 1928, with the Annexe continually in use for In-Patients, we were able to report a bed occupancy of 340 and a total of 6271 In-Patients. During 1929, however, we occupied the West Wing, and set to work upon the conversion of the Annexe by sections, to its final use as a large new

Out-Patient Department. This meant a loss of wards, for most of the time two, but as many as four were at one time out of commission. This is reflected in a bed occupancy of 298, and a total of In-Patients of 5607. And this inevitable loss of beds has, as inevitably, increased the cost per bed. There are savings in food, dressings, and the like when beds are closed, but all the more costly services must be maintained and their expense shared by the smaller number of beds. The comparative figures for 1928 and 1929 are £4 15s. 1d. per week against £5 4s. 8d.

The work in the Out-Patient Department, which has not been so much affected, has actually increased again, new cases numbering 54,400 as against 52,580.

The year was one of the utmost financial difficulty. It was inevitable that the great Reconstruction Appeal should affect adversely the ordinary maintenance income, while at the same time we could not cloud the issue by making a separate appeal for running expenses. By Midsummer the last of our available securities was sold, whilst there was an adverse difference between current expenditure and income at the rate of £16,000 per annum. Thanks to a special effort by our supporters a large sum was raised by the middle of the autumn, and, with some legacies falling in, we had a balance on the year of £5588. Income was up by £18,497, while Expenditure showed the satisfactory decrease of £3,645. But it must not be forgotten that all our free investments have been realised and that we are living from day to day.

We have, unhappily, to record the loss by death of a great philanthropist who was also a most generous friend of the Hospital, the late Bernhard Baron. Among his many benefactions we recall with especial gratitude his magnificent gift of a new Children's Ward now occupied and named after him. On the top floor of the new West Wing, its walls are tiled with designs from nursery rhymes, there is a sun balcony, an open air playground, and isolation rooms to minimise the risks of infection. It forms a beautiful memorial to one who did so much for, and gave so generously to, the Hospitals of this country.

To turn to the Middlesex Hospital Cancer Wing, both normal work and technical progress are most satisfactory. The total number of patients treated was 870, compared with 712 in the year 1928. This remarkable increase calls for explanation, and the explanation gives you some idea of the progress that is being made in the treatment of cancer. We have no more beds than last year. Therefore to get a greater number of patients, their stay must have been shorter. That is, a much greater number were operated on by the Surgeon, or treated by the Radiologist, and a far smaller number lingered on for whom little or nothing could be done.

When the specialised side of our work was begun in 1792 the vast majority of cases admitted were incurable. By the end of the last century the proportion of operable to inoperable beds had to be raised. In the last few years more and more cases have been classed as operable. Last year we definitely set aside beds exclusively for Radiological treatment.

In the special Out-Patient Department, too, the number increased, from 172 in 1928 to 230 in the year under review.

With the increase in numbers the cost fell, for In-Patients from £6 6s. 11d. to £5 18s. 11d., and for Out-Patients from £1 14s. 3d. to £1 5s. 7d. Nevertheless these figures are high, as indeed they must be in so specialised and costly a side of our work.

Income for the year was £26,753 and expenditure £25,278, giving us a balance of £1,475. But here again we have no funds or securities and we have a debt on capital account of some £12,000.

Taking the financial position of the two Institutions together, the result of the year's work is most satisfactory. Good as it is, compared with the position earlier in the year, it does not afford more than a breathing space in which to build up the maintenance income and many more subscribers are still needed to ensure that end. But it does afford remarkable evidence of the vitality of the Hospital and encourage a spirit of sober optimism.

The past Academic Year has been a busy one for our Medical School, and we feel that the following outstanding events should be mentioned :—

This year brought with it, for the School the loss of a very true friend Mr. Bernhard Baron. We have already referred to his gift of a new Children's Ward and the Medical School remains his debtor for a valuable research scholarship which he endowed in the Ferens Institute of Otology.

Amongst the many distinctions and honours gained by our Staff, by past and present students of the Medical School, it is with peculiar pleasure that we are able to record that two of our teachers, Dr. L. E. H.

Whitby and Professor E. C. Dodds received decorations for their services in connection with the illness of His Majesty the King. We feel these distinctions have been merited, not only by the high professional attainments of these two gentlemen, but their departments and the whole School are honoured by these awards.

The results of the Higher Examinations of the Universities reveal once more the fact that honours fall to our students in an important proportion. Mr. H. Joules was awarded the Gold Medal of London University in the Examination for the M.D. Degree, and this Degree was also conferred upon Dr. K. Shirley Smith, Dr. A. R. Balmain, Dr. J. W. Brown and Dr. A. N. Kingsbury. The Diploma of Member of the Royal College of Physicians was gained by Mr. C. A. Keele; Mr. H. I. Deitch and Mr. D. H. MacLeod both receiving the Degree of Master of Surgery. Mr. S. H. Nanavutty has secured his Doctorate in Philosophy and Messrs. D. H. MacLeod, F. W. G. Nash, C. E. Beare and E. G. Muir all obtained the Diploma of Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons. Another old student, Mr. S. J. Mehta, was awarded the first Sir Frederick Hallet Prize of the Royal College of Surgeons.

With regard to the research work accomplished in the Bland-Sutton Institute of Pathology, Professor James McIntosh, with the able assistance of his Staff, has pursued his researches into the nature of that obscure group of organisms known as the filtrable viruses. The work is of great complexity and difficulty and is of great importance in connection with Cancer, and is of further interest in that it throws light upon the problems of vaccination, particularly with regard to the cases of encephalitis associated with vaccination, which have caused so much concern in recent years. The work done in our Laboratories with regard to these problems promises to be of very great value indeed.

Cancer Research is carried out in various forms in nearly every laboratory in the Medical School, and an important addition to this work has been achieved owing to the British Empire Cancer Campaign enabling us to engage the services of Mr. D. H. Patey, M.S., F.R.C.S. to carry out a systematic enquiry into the nature of certain groups of malignant tumours.

In the Courtauld Institute of Biochemistry, Professor Dodds and his Assistants are following a number of interesting investigations. Cancer Research is here once more prominent and the views of certain Continental workers concerning the chemistry of the body in cases of malignant disease have caused much interest in recent years, and most promising work is being carried out in this connection by Dr. F. Dickens,

whose salary is being defrayed by the Medical Research Council. Another important branch of research carried out in this Institute, concerns the investigation of glandular extracts of medical utility.


Professor Sydney Russ continues to lead our Department of Physics with distinction, but in addition to his teaching duties, his expert knowledge of radiation enables us to apply the latest advances in knowledge concerning the therapeutic effects of X-Rays and Radium to the clinical work of the Hospital. Working under him, Professor Russ has an able Staff of assistants and by co-operation and close liaison with our other scientific departments, we believe that we are successful in turning the whole strength of our scientific staff towards the elucidation of this terrible problem. In a further endeavour to pursue the attack against Cancer, the Medical School and Hospital have jointly appointed a special Registrar, who is charged with the duty of keeping accurate scientific record of the effects and of the precise dosage of Radium employed in the Middlesex Hospital; Mr. J. P. Monkhouse, F.R.C.S., who has been appointed to this office, is affording us most valuable assistance. It is our hope that in the near future the radiological work will be even further increased, and it is our boast that no other Institution in the country affords facilities for this purpose at once so wide in their scope and so closely co-ordinated.

The need for better Library accommodation in the Medical School still exists, and lack of funds alone prevents immediate advance in this direction.

The work of the Convalescent Home during 1929 has again been most satisfactory. The number of patients under its care was 1,426 while the average number resident daily was 75.29. The number of days during which each patient was resident in the Home remains practically unchanged at 19.27.

We feel that we can congratulate ourselves upon the decrease in costs in comparison with the previous year. The cost of each patient was £1 16s. 9d. compared with £1 17s. 9.82d. and the total cost of each patient £5 1s. 2d. compared with £5 2s. 5.28d. It is also satisfactory to note that the "statistical cost" of each patient per week, that is the actual cost of treatment, is 1s. 10d. lower than in 1928.

The Income for the year was £5,841 7s. 2d. compared with £5,390 10s. 7d.; the increase being shewn under the head of Patients' Contributions.

The grant of £1,370 14s. 0d from the General Fund of the Hospital required to balance the accounts of the Home shews a welcome decrease for the year of £753 7s. 5d.

We feel that this money is very well expended. In the first place, the Home completes the treatment begun at the Hospital, and, secondly, in view of the facilities at the Home for medical and surgical treatment, the Home to some extent relieves the Hospital's beds.

The Rev. A. H. Morris, who has acted as Honorary Chaplain to the Home for the past four years, to whom we are most grateful for his kindly service, has resigned on taking up another appointment, and the Chaplaincy has been accepted by his successor the Rev. Edward H. Shaw.

ALMONER'S REPORT FOR 1928.

There is little change to report in the work of the Department which has been carried on during the year and which, we hope, has made some progress. Our many friends and the various charitable organisations have given their usual kind support, and we would take this opportunity of tendering them our very best thanks.

The particulars of patients admitted to our Home at Clacton-on-Sea are to be found in the Convalescent Home Report. The Home has kept well filled, the total number of patients admitted being 1,426.

Convalescent treatment, elsewhere, was also arranged for our male patients and those for whom Clacton was unsuitable, and 522 adults and 89 children, either In- or Out-Patients of the Hospital, were admitted to various Homes, of which number, 136 went to the Schiff Home of Recovery at Cobham. 74 adult patients and 8 children received Sanatorium treatment.

Surgical appliances have been supplied to 411 In-Patients, and 874 to Out-Patients. Patients have contributed their share towards the cost of these appliances, and also towards their convalescent treatment. Assistance has been given to them with railway and travelling expenses and, where necessary, some little help has been granted to patients, on discharge, to aid their recovery at home.

The total expenses of these services amounted to £4,330 3s. 9d., towards which grants from the special Funds of the Hospital have been given in the following manner :—

Beyond these sums, £61 4s. 0d. has been granted to patients, from our Dental Fund, in helping them with the supply of Dentures or other necessary dental treatment, and £129 5s. 9d. has been spent from the George Balfour Black Fund in assisting patients, suffering from Cancer, with weekly Grants for the maintenance, or with their fares to and from the Hospital for treatment.

The receipts for the year, contributions from and on behalf of In- and Out-Patients, amounted to £17,276 19s. 6d., which shows a considerable increase on those of last year. This sum includes £2,749 13s. 10d. from the Approved Societies, which is rather less than the amount received from that source the previous year.

GOVERNORS.

THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, RIGHTS, AND PRIVILEGES.

1. Annual Subscribers of *Three Guineas or upwards* to the Hospital's General Fund, to the Middlesex Branch Hospital and Hulke Endowed Home, Clacton-on-Sea, to the Cancer Wing, to the Cancer Research Fund, to the Reconstruction Fund, or to the Medical School, are entitled to be Governors so long as their Subscriptions are paid.

2. Donors of *Thirty Guineas or upwards*, at one time, are made Life Governors, and at once entitled to all the privileges of Governors. The Endowment of a Bed or Cot (see p. 328) qualifies the donor as a Life Governor.

3. Honorary Governors are appointed, and the propriety of making such appointments is first considered by the Board, and then submitted for the consideration and approval of a Court of Governors.

4. Honorary Governors have, from the day of their appointment, the same rights and privileges in all respects as Life Governors. In cases of Bequests of *Two Hundred Pounds and under Five Hundred Pounds*, one of the Executors under the will is eligible for appointment as an Honorary Governor.

5. All Governors have the right of attending the Courts of Governors, but Governors who are in arrear with their subscriptions are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any Board or Committee appointed in accordance with the Laws of the Hospital, and Governors who are new Annual Subscribers or Donors are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any such Board or Committee unless their subscriptions or donations have been paid at least three calendar months previously, and Governors being Salaried Officers or holding similar offices, or being Students or Servants of the Hospital, are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court, or to serve on any such Committee, and are not entitled to speak, vote, or serve at or on any such Court, Board, or Committee for one year after they have ceased to be such Salaried Officers, to hold such similar Offices or to be such Students or Servants, unless specially authorised so to do by the Board.

6. No Governor is entitled to speak or vote at any Court, Board, or Committee on any question or matter wherein he or she is personally interested.

7. Every Governor has the right of visiting the Wards and other departments in the presence of any one of the Physicians or Surgeons of the Hospital, the Secretary-Superintendent, the Resident Medical Officer or his substitute, the Chaplain, the Lady-Superintendent, or one of the Visiting Governors.

Patients are required to contribute in accordance with their means towards the cost of their maintenance. The amount of a Patient's contribution is agreed upon after enquiries made, either before or after admission to the Hospital, from the Patient or the Patient's relatives or friends ; but no distinction is made between those who can and those who cannot afford to contribute.

No letters of recommendation are required for the Out-Patient Department. Patients are required to contribute 1/- at each attendance, but are excused from payment if their circumstances warrant it. Further contributions are invited from those attending the Special Departments.

Patients are received for admission, or for Out-Patient Treatment :—

Admissions—Nassau Street Entrance, 11.30 a.m., on any week-day.

Accidents and Urgent Cases—Nassau Street Entrance, at any time of the day or night.

Medical and Surgical Cases—Out-Patient Department, Cleveland Street, as follows :—

Medical Cases are seen by the Casualty Medical Officer every week-day at 9.30 o'clock, and attended :—On Mondays and Thursdays, at 1.30 p.m., by Dr. T. IZOD BENNETT ; on Tuesdays and Fridays, at 1.30 p.m., by Dr. G. E. BEAUMONT ; and on Wednesdays and Saturdays, at 1.30 p.m., by Dr. D. E. BEDFORD.

Daily treatment (Male and Female) by arrangement.

In-Patients are expected to be provided with clean and suitable clothing and change of linen. They also have to provide themselves with washing. In all cases where the Patients are too poor to provide themselves with these articles, they are supplied to them by the Lady Almoner from special funds which she has at her disposal for the purpose.

Any Officer, Sister, Nurse, Servant, or person employed in any Department of the Hospital accepting Money, or Presents of any kind, from a Patient, or relative or friend of any Patient, on any pretence whatever, is liable to dismissal.

The following Cases are not admitted into the Hospital :—

1. Those which are, upon due examination, deemed *Incurable*, as *Advanced Consumption*, etc.
2. Complaints so tedious of Cure as to preclude for a long time the admission of more urgent cases, as *Chronic Ulcers of the Legs*, etc.
3. Disorders, to the Cure of which other establishments are devoted, as *Persons of Unsound Mind*, etc.
4. Those which are more properly objects for Parochial Relief, as wanting Food and not Medicine.
5. Those whose admission might endanger the other Patients, as persons suffering from *Infectious Diseases*.
6. Complaints likely to be aggravated rather than relieved by confinement within the walls of a Hospital, but such cases, if deemed proper objects, may receive advice and medicine as *Out-Patients*.

Prior to sending up Patients from the Country, the Resident Medical Officer should be applied to, in order to learn whether there is room, and such application should be accompanied by a medical certificate setting out fully the nature of the case.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

1. Out-Patients suffering from cancer are specially attended on Wednesdays at 1.30 P.M.
2. No patient can be admitted unless previous application has been made to know whether there be room.
3. Patients to be admitted should be suitably clothed, have a change of linen, and find security (if required) for a future supply, and for their removal if it be found necessary to discharge them.
4. Persons suffering from cancer or cancerous disease are admitted as In-Patients, and may remain "UNTIL RELIEVED BY ART OR RELEASED BY DEATH," unless it be found necessary to discharge them for insubordination or mental derangement.
5. No pauper can be received from any Parochial Institution without the special permission of the Board of Management.

TWO Casualty Medical and Two Casualty Surgical Officers, Four Resident Officers to the Special Departments, Eight Resident House Surgeons, Six Resident House Physicians, Two Resident Obstetric and Gynaecological House Surgeons, Ten Registrars, and Three Resident Anaesthetists, are appointed annually from among the qualified Students of the Hospital.

Two Open Entrance Scholarships of the value of £100 each. 2 Scholarships of £90 and £60 open to Students of Oxford and Cambridge Universities who have completed their Anatomical and Physiological Studies, are awarded at the commencement of the Winter Session. An Entrance Scholarship and the Asher Asher Prize are awarded annually to a Pupil of Epsom College who has passed the First examination for Medical Degrees of the University of London. A Scholarship value £36 15s. 0d. is awarded to New Zealand Students who have passed their examinations in Anatomy and Physiology and who are proceeding to take a qualification in England. An Exhibition of £10 10s. is awarded at the end of the second Winter Session for proficiency in Anatomy and Physiology. The Hetley Clinical Prize of £25, the Leopold Hudson Prize of £11 11s., and the Lyell Medal and Scholarship, value £55 5s., are awarded annually. Two Broderip Scholarships, of the value of £60 and £40 respectively, are awarded to fifth year's Students for proficiency in Clinical knowledge. The Freeman Scholarship, of about £30, is awarded annually to Senior Students for proficiency in Obstetric Medicine. The Murray Medal and Scholarship of £25 is awarded every third year. Cancer Research Scholarships and Class Prizes are also awarded.

The Tutors superintend and assist Students in their studies without extra fee, and thus the necessity of obtaining private instruction away from the Medical School is obviated.

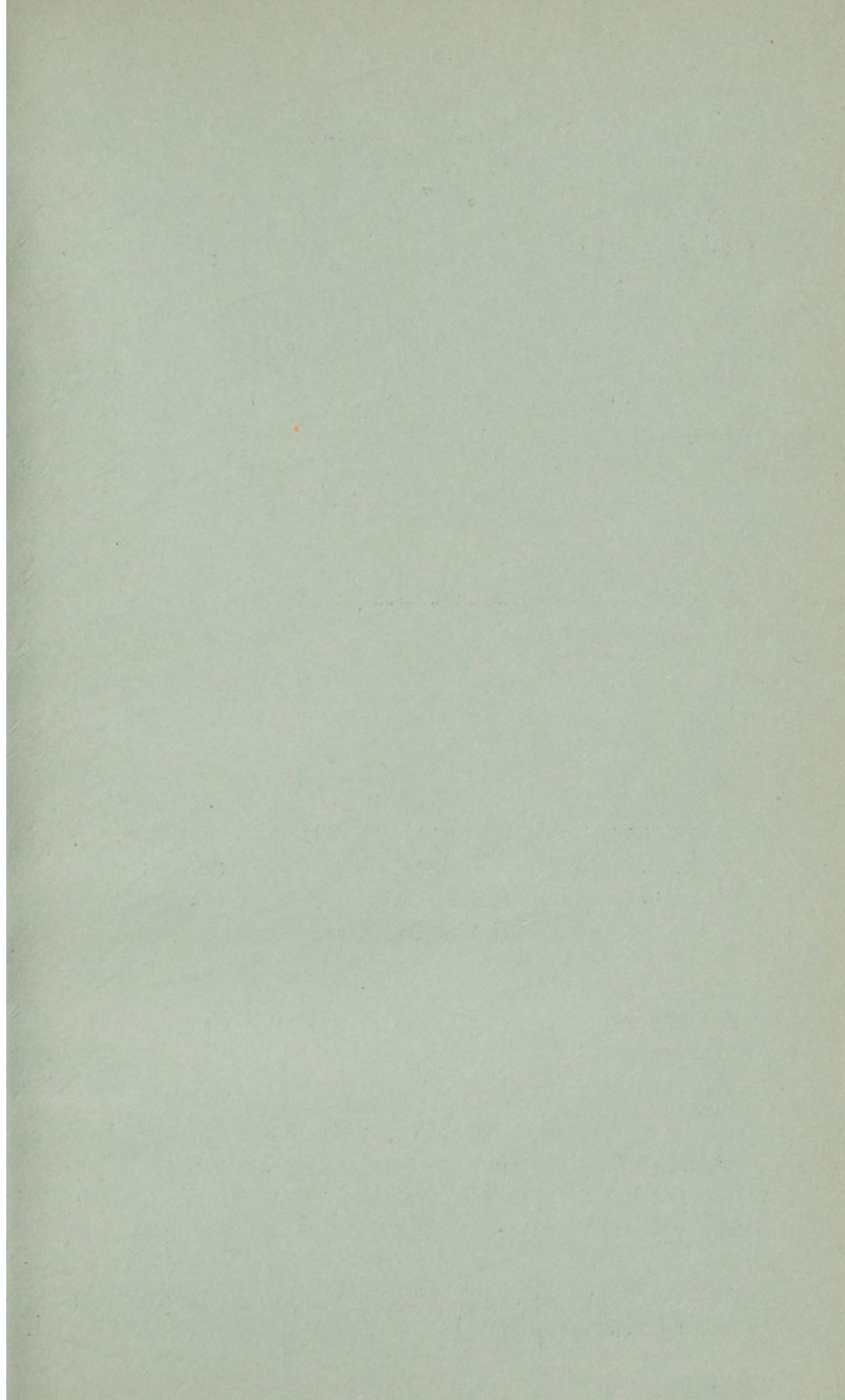
