THE MIDDLESEX HOSPITAL AND CANCER WING.

REPORT FOR 1934.

To the Court of Governors.

MY LORDS, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The year 1934 was for the Hospital one on which events of capital importance crowded one upon another. The half of them would have made the year one of the most memorable in our history. The swift succession of them left us almost breathless.

First came in January the opening of the Woolavington Wing, to which Their Majesties the King and Queen, our Patrons, paid a visit of inspection. We have been greatly honoured by their sympathy and interest throughout these ten strenuous anxious years of our huge Reconstruction Scheme. The Queen laid the foundation stone of our beautiful Nurses' Home, and the King and Queen later paid us another visit to inspect it when it was opened. Perhaps, though I shall be referring to the completion of our building contracts later, I may here quote yet another instance of His Majesty's commendation of our successful policy. He has graciously commanded that in our new Hospital one ward shall be named the "King George V Ward," thus linking his name for all time with the greatest philanthropic adventure of his reign.

For it was an adventure. It seemed to us, when we first planned it, on a much more modest scale than that of to-day, a task beyond us. But so wonderful was the response of the public that we determined to discard makeshifts and plan the ideal hospital, and though there have been most anxious moments, and doubtless will be again when we have to find a greatly increased income to make use of all our new opportunities of improved service, the Hospital has, through the unfailing support of its friends, triumphantly surmounted each crisis as it arose.

To all those who helped to bring about this success we are deeply grateful, but we owe our special thanks to the members of the Rebuilding Committee and the Plans Committee. The former has held over 318 and the latter over 202 meetings, since the work began. To Mr. A. E. Webb-Johnson in particular, a member of the first and Chairman of the second, is credit due for the splendid support he brought to us, and the years of almost daily labour he has given to our huge undertaking. We have, to mark our appreciation, broken with tradition and named a ward the "A. E. Webb-Johnson Ward" after a member of the Honorary Medical Staff during his tenure of office.

When the year 1934 began we still needed over £200,000 to complete our scheme, and it looked as though we must face a long slow struggle to get into the last Hundred Thousand. When the autumn came we had close on 35,000 subscriptions to record, great and small, and the bricks and mortar contracts were covered. Here are some of the greater gifts of this year :—

Mr. E. W. Meyerstein, £30,000 for the new Radio-Therapy Department.

Mr. W. H. Collins, a further £10,000, to make £35,000, for the new X-Ray Diagnostic Department.

Mr. E. W. Meyerstein, again, £70,000, to enable us to place the final contracts.

Then came a host of smaller gifts. I cannot enumerate them all, but I do assure all our friends of my very deep gratitude to them. Then followed :—

Lord Woolavington, a promise of £10,000 towards this final effort.

The staff of "The Times" and the Times Book Club, £300 to provide a new Patients' Library.

Mr. S. A. Courtauld, £15,000 for a Clinical Research Unit, unique in this country and, we believe, an improvement upon those which we have studied on the Continent.

Mr. E. W. Meyerstein, for the third time, with one splendid gift writing off the whole balance of the money required to complete the new Middlesex, £85,675.

A swift complete success surpassing all expectations or even hopes, a wonderful end to the huge ten years' scheme. And yet, I must warn you that much more is still expected of all of us.

The bricks and mortar are paid for, and so is the very expensive plant of the two new Departments which Mr. Collins and Mr. Meyerstein have given to us. But there is the heavy cost of equipping and then of maintaining all the new accommodation which will soon become available.

What we most need is new subscribers, and I want to emphasise again my request of last year, that each of all the many friends of the Middlesex should have it on their consciences to rope in one more new annual subscriber before we meet again. And when you do this, write at once to the Hospital and let us have the new name and address, so that we may get into touch, and the new impulse not be wasted. If each of you who read this will do that I can look forward this year to writing to thank thousands of new friends.

Among the many improvements planned in our service to the public is an innovation which will shortly come into operation. In charge of our new Kitchens we have appointed a Food Supervisor, borrowing this excellent idea from the London Hospital. We hope to raise the standard of catering again, offsetting the cost by the economies which we look for in marketing.

The Woolavington Wing for Private Patients was opened at the beginning of the year, and has abundantly justified the generosity and public spirit of its donor. It has had a higher bed occupancy than we estimated, and it has waiting lists for each class of bed. We have, as time went on, been able to improve upon details of equipment and management, but the unanimity of grateful appreciation expressed month after month must be as deep a source of satisfaction to Lord Woolavington as it is to us. I should like to congratulate Mr. Theobald Mathew and his Committee of Management, both Medical and Lay members, on the efficiency with which they control its affairs.

Turning to our domestic affairs, I think we should all wish first of all to congratulate Sir Comyns Berkeley on the well-deserved honour of Knight Bachelorhood which was recently conferred upon him by the King. Sir Comyns Berkeley's work as gynaecologist and joint author with Mr. Victor Bonney of the standard work on his subject, as Treasurer of the Royal College of Nursing, and as Vice-Chairman of the National Radium Commission is too well known to you to need recapitulation. Any one of these activities merited the honour, in which the Middlesex is happy, indirectly, to share.

Another honour won in that year was the Medal for Gallantry of the Order of the British Empire bestowed upon Sister D. Thomas for an act of great courage. The valve of an oxygen cylinder exploded in an anæsthetic room and flames and sparks shot across the operating theatre. All in it escaped at once and then Sister Thomas, not knowing whether

the cylinder itself might not explode at any moment, ran in again and turned off the valve.

His Majesty the King himself presented her with the Medal in the Courtyard of the Hospital on the 29th March, 1934, in the presence of a large number of Sisters, Nurses, and members of the Board and Medical Staff.

During this year three appointments of Vice-Presidents were made : Lady Violet Astor, in recognition of her invaluable work as Chairman of the Ladies' Committee ; Mr. W. H. Collins and Mr. E. W. Meyerstein in recognition of their own great individual gifts.

We are most happy to welcome Mr. Donald Campbell, Mr. J. H. Hambro, and Mr. E. W. Meyerstein as new members of the Board.

We greatly regret to record the resignation of Sir Edward Penton from the Board. He worked unsparingly for the cause of the Voluntary Hospitals, both on King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, and as Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Middlesex Hospital.

We suffered further loss through the death of Sir James Kingston Fowler, Consultant Physician to the Hospital for many years. Sir James left a legacy to provide an annual prize in the Medical School.

It is impossible to thank all our supporters individually for what they have done and are doing for us, but we hope that they will understand how grateful the Hospital is to them, and that they are sharing with us in the deep satisfaction we feel in work well done. To some of the larger organised activities we can make our acknowledgments here and accept the opportunity with great pleasure.

The Ladies' Committee, under the wise and generous Chairmanship of Lady Violet Astor, succeeded, during the Reconstruction Appeal, in raising the remarkable sum of £45,474 2s. 1d. Thanks to the energy and great organising ability of its Treasurer, Mrs. Sam Baer, several notably large sums were derived from such efforts as the Autumn Ball which she started, and has improved upon each year. But the bulk of this splendid contribution came from a host of smaller events, each adding through unselfish co-operation to the common stock. We can never be sufficiently grateful—though, if "gratitude is a lively sense of favours to come," then we are doubly grateful, for what the members of the Committee have done for the building fund and for what we hope they may still do to swell our maintenance income.

The Ladies' Association, too, with its manysided activities, has, under Mrs. Vaughan Morgan's guidance and with Mrs. Boldero as its

energetic Secretary, increased its efforts, for the Wards, the Library, and in half-a-dozen different directions, to keep pace with the growth of the Hospital. Its youngest branch, started by Lady Wilberforce in 1931, and later under Mrs. Rivett, with Lady McFadyean now its Chairman and Miss Denny its indefatigable Secretary, is the "Middlesex Mice." These are the children who collect pennies and silver paper, cards and stamps and the like for the Hospital. So keen are they that they have already begun the endowment of a cot in the Children's Ward, and we like to think that as they grow up they will retain their interest and assure us the support of the next generation. The last General Meeting of the Association showed a record attendance and promises increased support in the future.

The Middlesex County Rugby Union again held their Seven-a-Side Competition at Twickenham at the close of the season, when the Board and Staff were well represented, in aid of the Cancer Fund. The proceeds amounted to £950 8s. 2d., a result which says a great deal both for the popularity of this fastest of winter games, and for the generosity of the followers of Rugby Football.

The Middlesex County Bowling Association, whose Patron I am, completed this year their endowment of a bed, and, with great generosity, are proposing to begin, by annual instalments, the endowment of another.

The All Help League continues to grow. There can be no greater encouragement to us than this evidence of the appreciation of the Hospital's service by its old patients. Since its formation thousands have joined the League.

The Bond Street Association's annual effort on behalf of the Hospital with which they are so happily linked raised the splendid sum of £600 7s. 0d. We are most grateful to Mr. G. Dines, their President, and to all those who by gifts and personal efforts contributed to so satisfactory a result.

Now let me refer briefly to various special sections of our work.

Thanks to Mr. Meyerstein's generosity interest has been centred for some time on the provision, at the northern end of the Cancer Wing, of a Radio-Therapy Department which can challenge comparison with any on the Continent or at home. Members of our Radio-Therapy and Research Committee have visited the principal centres in Europe and have been able to work out plans which embody the best features of modern practice. On five floors, adequately protected, the plant will be capable of over six times our present output and treatment. Following the lines of our Woolavington Wing we are making provision for six beds

for private patients, as we hold it right to extend the special services and skill of our Departments and Staff to all classes of the community, so far as our facilities allow and provided that this does not involve any encroachment on the general Hospital beds, or charge on its funds. Just as we were the first Hospital to specialise on the treatment of cancer, so we are to-day among the foremost, and to-morrow shall have a magnificently equipped Department in which to extend our usefulness.

Our Convalescent Home at Clacton, with its 90 beds, pleasant rest rooms, excellent cuisine and large garden, continues to flourish, and the very many letters received from patients show how much their time there is appreciated.

The Infant Welfare Department continues to do good work under difficulties. We shall, before long, when the remaining in-patients have been transferred from the Annexe to the new East Wing, be able to house the Department better. That, in spite of cramped quarters, its work is held in esteem is shown by the constant increase in the numbers of mothers and expectant mothers who apply to attend it.

The one side of its work which can be extended in these circumstances is the number of home visits, which last year reached 2,391. This volume of work is only possible because of the splendid support given to the Department by our voluntary workers, some twenty-five in all, of whom more than half make regular attendances. Other friends knit garments for the children, and the British Red Cross Society has again helped by supplying garments, wool, and materials at cost price. We are most grateful for the splendid support the Infant Welfare Department receives. The evening lectures and demonstrations given during the winter by the Health and Cleanliness Society, and the instructional classes have been greatly appreciated.

The All Help League continues to give us very great encouragement. That so many thousands of our patients should band together, after they have contributed towards their own maintenance, to raise funds to help the Hospital to provide the same or better services for others shows an appreciation of our work which should stimulate us to maintain and improve it. And the material support they bring is most valuable and again shows an increase.

The total receipts for 1934 were £1,341 5s. 3d., being £50 more than for 1933. As a legacy of £68 was received in that year, in effect this year the League raised £118 more by its own efforts. The special efforts of the year were an X-Ray Equipment Collection, realising £242 18s. 5d., and

the Polytechnic Swimming Gala which yielded £28 5s. 7d. Mr. J. H. Maunder's enthusiasm is again responsible for splendid collections regularly sent in to the League. Tinfoil collections realised £38 1s. 5d., and the League hope that all its members will become collectors.

The membership of the League continues to increase. Last year 241 new members were enrolled, and 65 Crusaders joined the Junior Branch. This enthusiasm is infectious, about the only kind of infection which we like to see spreading.

Our very grateful thanks are due to the Chairman of the League, Mr. F. F. Taylor, and to the Committee members for a splendid year's work.

The Almoner's Department is one which has become extremely important in the large modern Hospital. It is responsible in the first place for testing the eligibility of would-be patients to receive free treatment from the members of the Honorary Medical Staff. In the course of the enquiry the patients' means and responsibilities are discovered, and from long experience some suggestion of the amount of contribution towards the cost of maintenance can be made. Clearly the manner in which such enquiry, naturally distasteful to many, is made will make, definitely, a good or a bad impression which, being the first contact, is likely to affect and colour all subsequent experiences. The kindly sympathy of an experienced Almoner is thus of great value.

It is interesting to note that if some patients occasionally try to take unfair advantage of the Hospital, others try to give more than the Almoners think that it is right, in their circumstances, for the Hospital to accept. Some 30% of our patients last year were considered to be unable to make any contribution whatever.

But this is only the beginning of the Almoners' work and the more important is to follow.

The after-care of the patients, the value of which is becoming always more clearly realised, is the main purpose of this Department. The provision of surgical appliances, arrangements for ordinary convalescence, longer periods for invalid children, liaison with District Nurses to see that treatment is carried out at home, and assistance in obtaining the dietary necessary for gastric, diabetic, or other conditions are all part of their work. It is the responsibility of this Department to see that all possible help is given both to In-patients and to Out-patients in these and other ways.

Of those for whom a period of Convalescence was advisable, the great majority of our women patients went to our own Home, with its 90 beds, at Clacton-on-Sea. In addition we sent 153 men and women to the Schiff Home of Recovery, and to other Convalescent Homes, suitable to their needs, 367 men and women, and 119 children. Sanatorium treatment was also arranged for 61 adults and 14 children, chiefly through the appropriate County Councils.

271 adult cases were referred to District Nursing Associations for home attendance, and a large number of children after operation for removal of tonsils and adenoids.

331 surgical appliances were supplied to In-Patients and 1,195 to those attending in the Out-Patient Departments.

Many of our patients were able to contribute something, if not all, directly, or through such mutual aid organisations as the Hospital Saving Association, of the cost of these services, but in many cases they were provided, in whole or part, from our Samaritan and our Dresden Assistance Funds, as follows :—

We were further able to assist patients, suffering from cancer, with small weekly grants in their homes, or with their fares, from the George Balfour Black Fund, to the extent of £130 7s. 0d. And from the Dental Fund £50 18s. 0d. was spent in helping patients with the cost of dentures.

It is most satisfactory to note an increase both in the numbers of patients who were in a position to contribute something, however small, towards their cost, and in the total amounts contributed. The latter amounted to £30,995 17s. 6d., made up of £15,066 15s. 4d. in direct contributions, £13,811 8s. 3d. from the Hospital Saving Association, £1,245 5s. 6d. from the Hospital Saturday Fund, and £872 8s. 9d. from various Approved Societies.

And so we come to our summary of numbers of patients, and their cost, our vital statistics. You will find them all amplified and analysed with the year's accounts in another part of our Report.

Here I give them in brief :—

In-Patients.—In 1934 we had, with the Woolavington Wing, 534 beds as against 468, with an average of 512.4 occupied daily. The number of patients admitted was 10,174, as against 7,987. Their average stay 18.5 days, against 20.38, and the average cost per week £4 15s. 1d. against £4 13s. 4d. The difference in cost is accounted for by the extra cost of nursing and maintaining single rooms for the Woolavington Wing. This cost does not fall upon the Hospital Funds, but has to be shown as expenditure in our accounts.

Out-Patients.—52,561 new patients were recorded, against 47,995, and, as in each recent year, we have to record another heavy increase in total Out-Patient attendances at 288,973, against 264,911.

Income and Expenditure.—The total income for the year amounted to £145,458, and the total expenditure to £152,145. Thus, unlike last year when we had a surplus of £3,512, we had a deficit of £6,687.

The Hospital and School are so inextricably interwoven that the story of one is incomplete without that of the other. For the School too this year 1934, has been one of equally solid if not perhaps so spectacular progress. That will come, for they march together in this unceasing war upon disease and pain.

THE MEDICAL SCHOOL.

The year just completed is the 99th annual session. Dt. T. Izod Bennett has been Dean of the Medical School for the last five years and has been succeeded by Dr. H. E. A. Boldero. During Dr. Bennett's term of office the entry of medical students to the School steadily increased and now the School flourishes to a degree, I suppose, never before experienced. We may recall that during the whole of his Deanship the rebuilding and reconstruction of the Hospital has been in progress, and carefully though this is being effected, it must needs bring attendant problems for administrators. I am sure that everyone will wish me to thank Dr. Izod Bennett for all the work and energy he has given to the School during the last five years.

I have already referred to the death of Sir James Kingston Fowler, Consulting Physician to the Hospital and Emeritus Lecturer in the Medical School. Sir James Kingston Fowler was appointed Assistant Physician to the Hospital in 1880 and Physician 11 years later. He was a great Physician, a man of wide interests. Among the many sides of his teaching perhaps we shall best remember the stress he laid on the value of observation. He was Knighted in 1910 and retired from the active service of the Hospital before the war.

His contributions to our profession were not confined to this School. He took an active part in the life of the University of London, being one time Dean of the Faculty of Medicine.

Sir James has left the School a legacy to provide a Prize in General Pathology, including Bacteriology, for annual competition among students of the Medical School.

Professor Swale Vincent also died this year. He joined the Staff of the School in 1920, and became the first holder of the John Astor Chair of Physiology.

We also regret the untimely death of Colin Mackenzie, F.R.C.S. He qualified in 1908, served with distinction in the Great War and became Surgeon to the Royal Infirmary, Bradford. He was greatly liked by all those who knew him and he demonstrated his gratitude to his alma mater by bequeathing the School a legacy, the interest of which is to provide a prize for future students.

We much regret these losses but on the other hand it is a pleasure to record an addition and to welcome Dr. A. A. Moncrieff who this year has been appointed Physician in Charge of our Children's Department. He has also been elected a Physician to Out-Patients at the Hospital for Sick Children, Great Ormond Street, W.

The list of honours awarded to Middlesex men is a long one this year. Chief among them is the Knighthood conferred upon Mr. Comyns Berkeley.

Mr. Somerville Hastings has accepted the Chairmanship of the Hospitals and Medical Services Committee of the London County Council.

Dr. R. W. Scarff has been appointed University Reader in Morbid Anatomy and Histology, a position he now holds in the Bland-Sutton Institute of Pathology.

Mr Frank Law, a past student of this School, has been appointed Assistant Ophthalmic Surgeon to Guy's Hospital.

The list of Academic Distinctions is also lengthy, to which however, I can refer only briefly. The University of London has awarded the degree of M.D. to E. H. Capel, B. Halfpenny, F. P. Lee Landers, K. N. Masani and R. H. Parry. Mr. A. J. Bernfield was awarded the Sir William Dunn Exhibition in Physiology which is given to the candidate obtaining the highest marks in the Second M.B., Examination of the University of London; this is the second successive year in which a Middlesex student has proved himself the best candidate at this examination.

In common with other Medical Schools in London, the provision of adequate clinical experience in Midwifery has become an increasing anxiety in recent years. Here, the co-operation and good will of the London County Council will, to a large extent, help us to overcome our difficulties for Sir Frederick Menzies, Medical Officer of Health to the London County Council has arranged for some of our students to attend the practice of St. Mary Abbott's Hospital.

As everyone now recognizes, Medical Education and Research Work must progress hand in hand and in this connection it is a cause for congratulation that Mr. C. S. Hallpike's brilliant research work on "Hearing" has been recognized by the Royal Society by the award of the Foulerton Research Studentship, the most valuable one of its kind in this country. Mr. Hallpike was one time holder of the Bernhard Baron Scholarship tenable in the Medical School.

We are also fortunate in being able to welcome Dr. Paul Fildes and his co-workers to our laboratories where he will continue, by arrangement with the Medical Research Council, to further knowledge in Bacterial Chemistry.

There is a great deal of original work being undertaken in the various Departments of the School. This all needs money, and we are grateful that the British Empire Cancer Campaign has been able this year to restore the 10 per cent cut which they were forced to make in our Grant in 1933.

I have deliberately left until the close of this Report the most important event of the School year. Mr. S. A. Courtauld, Chairman of the School Council, has again added to his great benefactions. He has given the Hospital £15,000 to establish a Clinical Research Unit. The idea behind this gift is original and without precedent. Under its terms the Council of the Medical School obtains direct access to, and a large measure of control over, some of the beds in the Hospital. This means that the Professors of Pathology, Biochemistry and Physiology will have direct contact with patients and their illnesses; moreover, the fact that they will be working in collaboration with members of the clinical staff of the Hospital forges yet one more link between the School and the Hospital and between the Academic and the Clinical Staffs. We are confident that nothing but mutual benefit can accrue.

We believe that far reaching effects will ensue, one of which will be to increase the clinical bearing of laboratory teaching given to our students; another, the fruits of laboratory work will be carried more quickly into

the wards ; again, the patients having the advantages of the constant services of both Professorial and Clinical Staffs will benefit from the dual specialised observations and investigations made possible by such a Unit.

Mr. Courtauld's generosity and foresight will provide the cradle out of which the future advances of therapeutics will come : it is reasonable, therefore, to say that his action will not only immediately benefit the School, but, ultimately, Medical Science throughout the World.

Though I have given this Report to you at some length, I am still conscious of the very much that I have omitted. There are so many sides to our work on which I have not touched, there are so many friends and voluntary workers whom I should have liked to have thanked, so much unselfseeking effort which I should have liked to have praised. I have said nothing of the work of the Medical Staff, and yet that is the key position in the great general Hospitals. Indispensable as is the Nursing Service, and we are most happy in ours, essential, too, the work of the Board and its Committees, and essential the support of our friends, subscribers, and benefactors, the reputation of the Hospital must necessarily rest most heavily upon its Medical Staff. We are exceedingly fortunate in the character and calibre of the men who serve the Middlesex.



Form of a Devise and Bequest of the Residue of Real and Personal Property.

I give, devise, and bequeath to "The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurers, and Governors of The Middlesex Hospital, London, W.1," for the purposes of The Middlesex Hospital, or for the purposes of its Cancer Wing, or its Cancer Research Department (as the case may be), All the residue and remainder of my Messuages, Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, and Real Estate : And also all the rest, residue, and remainder of my goods, chattels, and personal estate, free of duty, and effects whatsoever and wheresoever not herein by me otherwise disposed of, to hold to them, their Successors, and Assigns for ever.

GOVERNORS.

THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, RIGHTS, AND PRIVILEGES.

1. Annual Subscribers of *Three Guineas or upwards* to the Hospital's General Fund, to the Middlesex Branch Hospital and Hulke Endowed Home, Clacton-on-Sea, to the Cancer Wing, to the Cancer Research Fund, to the Reconstruction Fund, or to the Medical School, are entitled to be Governors so long as their Subscriptions are paid.

2. Donors of *Thirty Guineas or upwards*, at one time, are made Life Governors, and at once entitled to all the privileges of Governors. The Endowment of a Bed or Cot (see p. 243) qualifies the donor as a Life Governor.

3. Honorary Governors are appointed, and the propriety of making such appointments is first considered by the Board, and then submitted for the consideration and approval of a Court of Governors.

4. Honorary Governors have, from the day of their appointment, the same rights and privileges in all respects as Life Governors. In cases of Bequests of *Two Hundred Pounds and under Five Hundred Pounds*, one of the Executors under the will is eligible for appointment as an Honorary Governor.

5. All Governors have the right of attending the Courts of Governors, but Governors who are in arrear with their subscriptions are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any Board or Committee appointed in accordance with the Laws of the Hospital, and Governors who are new Annual Subscribers or Donors are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any such Board or Committee unless their subscriptions or donations have been paid at least three calendar months previously, and Governors being Salaried Officers or holding similar offices, or being Students or Servants of the Hospital, are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court, or to serve on any such Committee, and are not entitled to speak, vote, or serve at or on any such Court, Board, or Committee for one year after they have ceased to be such Salaried Officers, to hold such similar Offices or to be such Students or Servants, unless specially authorised so to do by the Board.

6. No Governor is entitled to speak or vote at any Court, Board, or Committee on any question or matter wherein he or she is personally interested.

7. Every Governor has the right of visiting the Wards and other departments in the presence of any one of the Physicians or Surgeons of the Hospital, the Secretary-Superintendent, the Resident Medical Officer or his substitute, the Chaplain, the Lady-Superintendent, or one of the Visiting Governors.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Patients are required to contribute in accordance with their means towards the cost of their maintenance. The amount of a Patient's contribution is agreed upon after enquiries made, either before or after admission to the Hospital, from the Patient or the Patient's relatives or friends; but no distinction is made between those who can and those who cannot afford to contribute.

No letters of recommendation are required for the Out-Patient Department. Patients are required to contribute 1/- at each attendance, but are excused from payment if their circumstances warrant it. Further contributions are invited from those attending the Special Departments.

Patients are received for admission, or for Out-Patient Treatment :—

Admissions—Nassau Street Entrance, 11.30 a.m., on any week-day.

Accidents and Urgent Cases—Nassau Street Entrance, at any time of the day or night.

Medical and Surgical Cases—Out-Patient Department, Cleveland Street, as follows :—

In-Patients are expected to be provided with clean and suitable clothing and change of linen. They also have to provide themselves with washing. In all cases where the Patients are too poor to provide themselves with these articles, they are supplied to them by the Lady Almoner from special funds which she has at her disposal for the purpose.

Any Officer, Sister, Nurse, Servant, or person employed in any Department of the Hospital accepting Money, or Presents of any kind, from a Patient, or relative or friend of any Patient, on any pretence whatever, is liable to dismissal.

The following Cases are not admitted into the Hospital:—

1. Those which are, upon due examination, deemed *Incurable*, as Advanced Consumption, etc.
2. Complaints so tedious of Cure as to preclude for a long time the admission of more urgent cases, as *Chronic Ulcers* of the Legs, etc.
3. Disorders, to the Cure of which other establishments are devoted, as *Persons of Unsound Mind*, etc.
4. Those which are more properly objects for Parochial Relief, as wanting Food and not Medicine.
5. Those whose admission might endanger the other Patients, as persons suffering from *Infectious Diseases*.
6. Complaints likely to be aggravated rather than relieved by confinement within the walls of a Hospital, but such cases, if deemed proper objects, may receive advice and medicine as *Out-Patients*.

Prior to sending up Patients from the Country, the Resident Medical Officer should be applied to, in order to learn whether there is room, and such application should be accompanied by a medical certificate setting out fully the nature of the case.

THE MIDDLESEX HOSPITAL CANCER WING.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

1. Out-Patients suffering from cancer are specially attended at the Out-Patient Department on Wednesdays at 1.30 P.M.
2. No patient can be admitted unless previous application has been made to know whether there be room.
3. Patients to be admitted should be suitably clothed, have a change of linen, and find security (if required) for a future supply, and for their removal if it be found necessary to discharge them.
4. Persons suffering from cancer or cancerous disease are admitted as In-Patients, and may remain "UNTIL RELIEVED BY ART OR RELEASED BY DEATH," unless it be found necessary to discharge them for insubordination or mental derangement.
5. No pauper can be received from any Parochial Institution without the special permission of the Board of Management.

TWO Casualty Medical and Two Casualty Surgical Officers. Four Resident Officers to the Special Departments, Eight Resident House Surgeons, Eight Resident House Physicians, Two Resident Obstetric and Gynæcological House Surgeons, Nine Registrars, Three Resident Anaesthetists, one Resident Dental House Surgeon and one Clinical Research Assistant to the Courtauld Wards, are appointed annually from among the qualified Students of the Hospital.

Two Open Entrance Scholarships of the value of £100 each. 2 Scholarships of £90 and £60 open to Students of Oxford and Cambridge Universities who have completed their Anatomical and Physiological Studies, are awarded at the commencement of the Winter Session. An Entrance Scholarship and the Asher Asher Prize are awarded annually to a Pupil of Epsom College who has passed the First examination for Medical Degrees of the University of London. An Exhibition of £10 10s., is awarded at the end of the second Winter Session for proficiency in Anatomy and Physiology. The Hetley Clinical Prize of £25, the Leopold Hudson Prize of £11 11s., and the Lyell Medal and Scholarship, value £55 5s., are awarded annually. Two Broderip Scholarships, of the value of £60 and £40 respectively, are awarded to Students for proficiency in Clinical knowledge. The Freeman Scholarship, of about £30, is awarded annually to Senior Students for proficiency in Obstetric Medicine. The Murray Medal and Scholarship of £25 is awarded every third year. Research Scholarships and Class Prizes are also awarded.

The Tutors superintend and assist Students in their studies without extra fee, and thus the necessity of obtaining private instruction away from the Medical School is obviated.

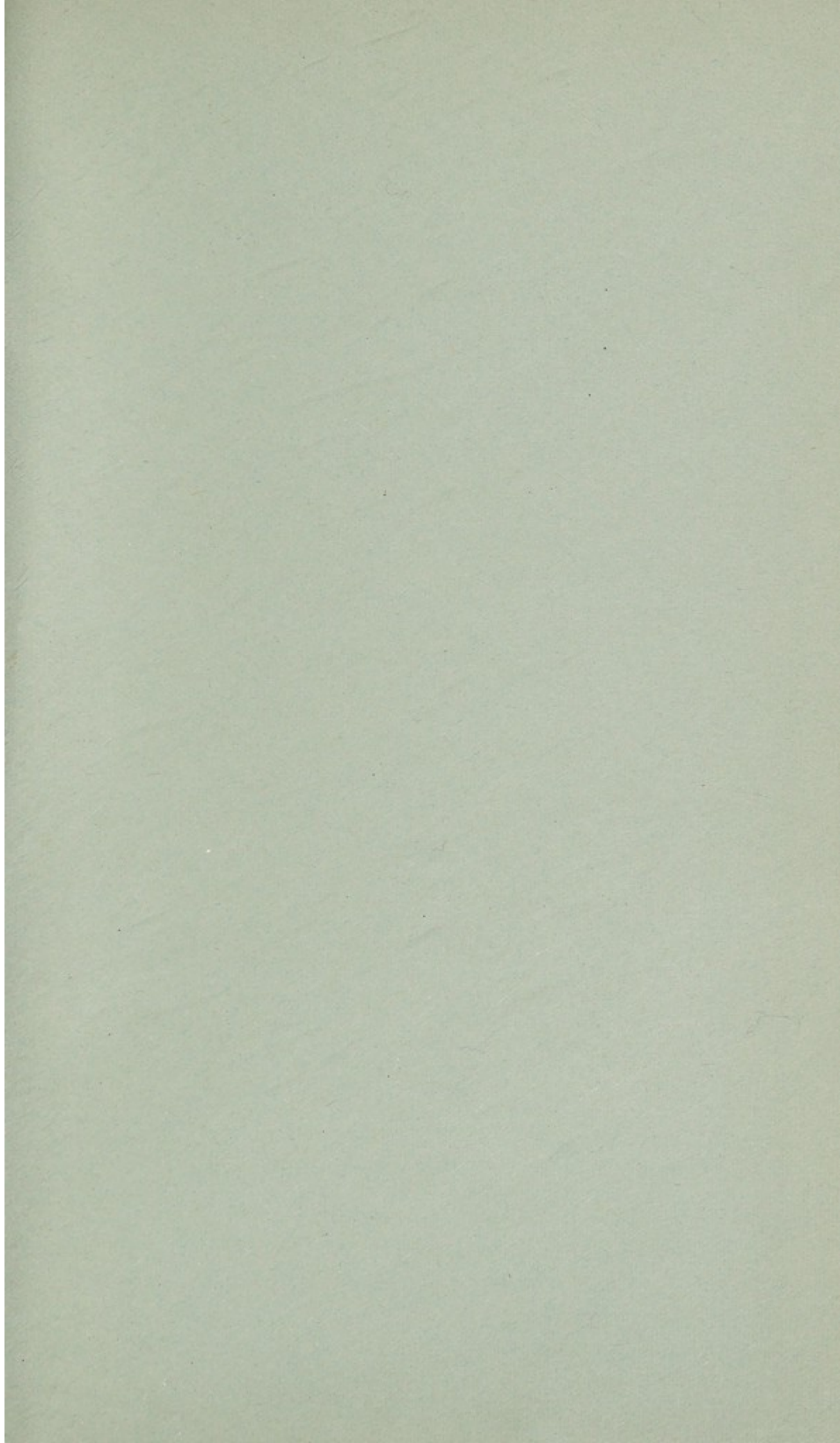
