SIR JOHN BLAND-SUTTON,



On the 20th December, 1936, passed away, in his 82nd year, one of the greatest of all the sons of The Middlesex Hospital. One of the most famous surgeons of the day, Sir John Bland-Sutton was also known to the scientific and medical world as anatomist, pathologist and anthropologist. He brought to every interest an original, curious, keen and penetrating mind.

It does not often happen in the history of a Medical School that it can claim for its own a man of the calibre and genius of John Bland-Sutton. Not since the days of Charles Bell, though the roll contains such names as Hulke, Powell, Morris, Fowler and many others, has there been one who left his mark on the history of his generation as he did. John Bland-Sutton was a Middlesex man from beginning to end, from 1878 when he joined as a student to 1936 when he was borne in honour from the Hospital Chapel where, less than a twelve-month earlier, his closest and dearest friend, Rudyard Kipling, had lain in state before him.

It is not of the innumerable honours heaped upon him by the outside world that we think today, but of his many and great gifts to his Hospital and School, in which his interest never failed. He responded to their every need with unbounded liberality, and his gifts were ever-increasing as his resources grew. Interests so wide apart as playing fields for the students, the decoration of the lovely Hospital Chapel, the periodic appeals for maintenance or extension, all found him an eager and generous giver. His "Ashes" rest in the Museum of the Pathological Institute which he planned and provided and which for all time bears his name.

His successors as well as his friends and colleagues on the Board and Honorary Staff will draw inspiration from his memory.

FOREWORD

BY THE CHAIRMAN,

H.R.H. PRINCE ARTHUR OF CONNAUGHT, K.G., P.C.

My Lords, Ladies and Gentlemen,

The year 1936 has been one of great progress, in the Hospital, in the Medical School, and in the Research Departments. In the Hospital we have experienced the full effect of the additional beds we have opened in the last two years. It has, as you will see, inevitably increased the expenditure of the Hospital, and it is essential that we should seek to increase our assured income. I will return to that presently, but first would draw your attention to some of the work which amply justifies our forward policy.

The Courtauld Clinical Unit, in which the Professors of the Departments of Pathology, Biochemistry and Physiology work side-by-side with members of the Honorary Medical Staff, has produced already work of importance. Cases of obscure disease are, with the ready co-operation of the London County Council, collected, treated and studied in the light of the latest laboratory and clinical knowledge, equally to the advantage of the patients and the advancement of medicine.

Again, our Fracture Clinic, under the supervision of the Orthopaedic Surgeons, and in association with their new Wards, has allowed us to follow these cases through, from the first setting of the fracture to the final discharge from the Electro-Therapy and Massage Departments, under the one control. In a few of the larger Hospitals this system, advocated by the Ministry of Health, is in operation. We, until the new Hospital was built, had to work under conditions far from ideal, with control and supervision inevitably divided. To-day the skill of our surgeons and the resources of the new Departments will save many work-hours of disability, on average, for each patient, with a consequent increase in health and happiness, and a saving in unemployment and sickness charges to the nation, which is difficult to estimate but must, as the system spreads over the country, in the aggregate be enormous.

Or take our Cancer Wing, with its 90 beds for the treatment of this mysterious and terrible disease. The Middlesex is unique in that it has both Cancer Research Laboratories and a Medical School in connection with the Wing which is in itself a Cancer Hospital. At the northern end is now being built a remarkable new Department, the Meyerstein Institute of Radio-Therapy, which will be second to none in Europe. Such is the progress which has been made in treatment that we have been compelled to make a break with the past, and turn the Wards we used to reserve for incurable cases into operation wards. When we have treatment to offer which may arrest or cure in early stages of the disease, it would be as wrong to fill any beds in our Cancer Wing with inoperable cases as it would be to admit chronic cases into the general Hospital wards.

The demands on the services of the Hospital are growing more and more insistent, and the pressure upon the Board to open more accommodation increases almost daily.

The reasons for this are :—

The Hospital provides a better service in all Departments than ever before.

It provides better scientific services in the Courtauld and Bland-Sutton Institutes.

It has a superlatively good Department of X-Ray Diagnosis.

It has one of the best and largest Massage Departments in the country.

It has new airy and roomy Out-Patient Clinics.

It has a Wing for Private Patients which has earned an excellent reputation.

It will shortly open an Institute of Radio-Therapy second to none in Europe.

These improvements, and many others with which your Board is constantly preoccupied, cost money to maintain, and the cost per bed is naturally increased. That increases the total amount to be raised. But

in addition we have, as I have already pointed out, opened new services, such as the Fracture Clinic and Fracture Wards, and the splendid Courtauld Research Wards, and increased the accommodation for the treatment of Nervous Diseases, and Diseases of the Skin.

Twelve years ago, before the Reconstruction of the Middlesex was begun, the annual expenditure of the Hospital, and the Cancer Wing was £106,000. To-day it is approximately £186,000. Yet I can assure you that the Hospital has never been managed with greater care for economy. Economy committees investigate the cost and management of every Department.

But with all our care, and with every effort on the other hand to increase our annual income, there still remains a large sum—and it will be larger if we are to open all the accommodation which the site provides—to be raised each year over and above what experience has shown is to be expected from ordinary sources of income. It is therefore necessary, first, to widen the basis of support by getting more annual subscriptions, and, secondly, to secure endowments for existing services and for extensions. I regard endowments as essential, for it is imperative to narrow the gap between assured and precarious income.


The multitude of small gifts and the many great ones which went to the building of our magnificent new Hospital are a superb proof of the vitality of the voluntary spirit in this country. However good may be the rapidly improving Municipal health services, we must always have and conserve independent institutions in which Teaching and Research go hand-in-hand with Treatment, and the new methods of Prevention are studied at least as closely as those of Healing. Those gifts and sacrifices out of which grew the great new Middlesex will be, I hope, an encouragement and an incentive to others to provide further endowments and new annual subscriptions.

I trust that all who hear or read my words will have it on their conscience to consider how they may best help us, and bring others to help us, to further this great cause.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF THE GOVERNORS OF THE MIDDLESEX HOSPITAL FOR 1936.

The Hospital, in common with so many other Charitable, Philanthropic, and Scientific Institutions, suffered, in this year, the loss of a great and good Patron through the death, universally sincerely mourned, of His Majesty, King George V. He had taken a more than formal interest in it, and as its reconstruction proceeded visited it more than once to see how the latest ideas in Hospital planning were taking shape. Particularly were he and Her Majesty, Queen Mary interested in the visits which they paid to the new Nurses Home, and to the Woolavington Wing for private patients.

His successor to the Throne, now Duke of Windsor, had, as Prince of Wales, also visited the Middlesex more than once, and had attended a Scientific evening, given when the closing of wards of the old Hospital, before its demolition, allowed us to stage a remarkable exhibition of the then latest developments of X-Ray, Electro-therapeutic, and other medical and scientific apparatus.

Towards the close of the year, upon his succession, His Majesty King George VI signified his gracious pleasure in continuing that Royal Patronage which has remained unbroken since the foundation of the Hospital.

King George VI has become Patron of a Hospital with which he is particularly connected, for it was he, as Duke of York, who laid the foundation stone of the new Hospital, and he who, accompanied by Her Majesty the Queen, graciously performed the opening ceremony in 1935, ten years after the huge task had been undertaken.

The Board accepted in January with deep regret the resignation by Mr. F. Cavendish Bentinck of the position of Vice-Chairman, which he had filled with such conspicuous ability and success since 1916. The Chairman, His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, in accepting Mr. Bentinck's resignation, expressed the deep regret of the Board that he should have found it necessary to lay down the burden of that constant attention to the work of the Hospital which the position of Vice-Chairman entails. The Board were at least happy to know that he would retain the seat which he had first taken in 1895.

The Right Honourable The Earl of Athlone, who attended the meeting specially to bid farewell to Mr. Bentinck, endorsed, from his own experience as Chairman all that Prince Arthur of Connaught had said of the judgment, foresight, and infinite pains which Mr. Bentinck had brought to his exacting task.

The Chairman then proposed, and it was unanimously approved, that the Hon. T. B. Money-Coutts be elected to the Vice-Chairmanship.

It was a very great pleasure to everyone connected with the Hospital to learn of the Knighthood conferred upon Mr. A. E. Webb-Johnson in this year. Apart from his services to the Hospital as a Surgeon on the Honorary Staff, he has served on the Rebuilding Committee since its inception, and has been Chairman of the Plans Committee throughout the reconstruction of the Hospital. He has, besides these great services, interested many men of wealth and good-will in the Hospital and its Medical School, of which he was Dean and is now Honorary Treasurer. He has found time too for many public services, having been a member of such enquiries as the Athlone Commission on Post Graduate Education. This public recognition of his services could not have been better earned.

A serious loss which the Hospital sustained in this year was the resignation, under the age limit Law, of the Senior Physician, Dr. R. A. Young.

Dr. Young's association with the Hospital began in 1889, when he won distinction as a student in the Medical School. In 1902, after holding numerous positions in the Hospital, he was elected Assistant Physician, and in 1918 Physician. In 1922 he was made a Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire. Apart from his great services to the Middlesex Hospital, Dr. Young has filled important positions at other Hospitals, and in the Medical world, and is the author of many distinguished publications.

Dr. G. E. Beaumont was subsequently elected to fill the vacancy on the Senior Staff, and Dr. H. L. Marriott was elected Assistant Physician.

In April the Rev. Richard Stott resigned from the Chaplaincy of the Hospital, and the Rev. L. H. Yorke was appointed to it.

In October Mr. Cable, Chief Accountant, resigned after 10 years of admirable work on appointment as Secretary of the Chelsea Hospital for Women on which the Board congratulated him. Mr. A. J. Howie was appointed to succeed him.

Our many friends, both individuals and organisations, have again given us splendid support this year, and to each and all of them our warmest thanks are due.

Had it not been for our great benefactor, Mr. E. W. Meyerstein, who initiated the "booklet" scheme and who with extraordinary generosity bought up the balance of the first edition of these booklets at a cost of just over £20,000, our year's workings would have shown a heavy deficit.

We are also indebted to him for the magnificent gift of the Meyerstein Institute of Radio-Therapy which is now nearing completion and which when opened will be second to none in Europe.

We greatly regret to have to report the death of Miss Fanny Marriage, who for so many years raised considerable sums towards the maintenance of the bed that bears her name. It is a fitting tribute to Miss Marriage that her many friends, who subscribed through her, have agreed to continue their support in her memory.

The Seven-a-Side Rugby Finals of which the greater part of the proceeds were again given to the Hospital yielded the record sum of £1,364, and our thanks are due to our friends of the Middlesex County Rugby Football Union for the continued generosity they have shown to us.

The Ladies' Association had a most successful year in all its branches and both membership and friends have been increased. 300 guineas were subscribed towards the endowment of the Association's bed and the Middlesex Mice (the children's branch), which have had a wonderful success gave 100 guineas towards their cot. The Work Society made over 2,000 garments for poor patients. The total amount raised in the year was £780.

The work of the Library has been still further extended and has received visits from the Librarians of Municipal and Voluntary Hospitals wishing to gain information for their own Libraries.

Our warmest thanks are due to all the ladies who work so hard to make the Association such a signal success, and especially to Mrs. G. Vaughan Morgan who for eight years has held the position of Chairman. To the regret of all she has now resigned and has been succeeded by Lady Wraxall whom we cordially welcome. The resignation of Miss Abercrombie from the Ladies' Work Society after many years is another great loss to the Association. In recognition of her services Miss Abercrombie has been appointed an Honorary Life Governor by the Court of Governors.

Year by year the All Help League is forming a stronger link between the Hospital and its ex-patients. There are 3,225 active members who express their practical interest in the Hospital by means of subscriptions, boxes and collections of tinfoil realising £1,241 9s. 5d.

A new enterprise was a Garden Party held in July in the Hospital Gardens. Lady Violet Astor performed the opening ceremony, supported by members of the Board. Much interest was shown and the nett profit of £313 10s. 6d. was most encouraging.

Besides this the League completed the endowment of a Cot in the Children's Ward thus raising in two years the required 500 guineas.

The junior branch of the League—The Crusaders—continues to develop, these little patients having collected a further £67.

The total receipts from these various activities amounted to £1,836 2s. 3d. showing a substantial increase of over £450, largely due to the untiring energies of Mr. F. F. Taylor and his Committee.

We are grateful to the Bernhard Baron Trustees for allocating to the Hospital £25,000 over a period of five years.

The Students' Annual Variety Concert was again a great success and over £490 0s. 0d. was raised for the Hospital.

Mrs. Baer again organised the Annual Ball, and her great energy and organising powers resulted this year in the raising of a record sum, £1,389 2s. 9d.

The Dressmakers' Association and the Bond Street Association continue to subscribe most generously to the endowment of their two wards. In April, the Bishop of Willesden performed a Dedication Ceremony in Bond Street Ward.

The collection on Alexandra Rose Day was as usual outstandingly successful and we thank the ladies who organised the event with such efficiency.

During the year it was decided to reorganise the Departments of Massage and Medical Electricity into one unit, the Department of Physical Medicine. The appointment of an Honorary Director was approved by the Board on the recommendation of the Medical Committee and Dr. F. D. Howitt, C.V.O., M.D., M.R.C.P., was invited to take and has accepted this position.

The Infant Welfare Department has been reconstructed during the year and the new accommodation came into use in November. The more satisfactory quarters make for happier working conditions, and the furniture and equipment, given by Miss Pemberton in memory of her sister, once a voluntary worker, has added greatly to the comfort of the mothers and children. Miss Kendall was appointed Health Visitor to the St. Marylebone Borough Council earlier in the year and we welcome Miss Bathgate in her place as Assistant Superintendent. Our voluntary workers have again been of the greatest service and we have been honoured this year by student health visitors from the College of Nursing, who have attended for experience in practical work. The total children on the books in 1936 number 695 and the total attendances 6,656. The home visits have again been in the neighbourhood of 2,000.

The Convalescent Home at Clacton has received 1427 patients this year, 711 direct from this Hospital. The House Committee held a meeting at the Home, and Members of the Board paid it frequent visits of inspection. It is no less up to date and well equipped than the parent hospital and plays an essential part in the recovery of many of our patients.

Other convalescent homes and the Schiff Home of Recovery have received 514 adults and 144 children from the Middlesex Hospital, and 77 adults and 18 children were admitted to Sanatoria.

We greatly regret that Miss H. M. Price has been compelled after a long illness to give up her post as Lady Almoner, which she has held since 1914. The foundation and development of the department to its present state of efficiency has been very largely due to her energy and skill, and her resignation is a great loss to the Hospital she has served so well. Miss W. M. Dover has been appointed as her successor.

The aid of the District Nurses' Association was obtained for 190 adults and 144 children, 1,256 surgical appliances were supplied to in- and out-patients.

The St. Patrick's Benevolent Society, The Central Association for Dental Welfare and other Societies have earned our thanks by the number of home visits to and reports on our patients which they have made.

Expenditure incurred in assisting patients with convalescence, surgical appliances, fares and in other ways to the extent of £4,675 4s. 2d., has been met in part by direct contributions from patients, through mutual aid societies and by the Dresden and Samaritan Funds.

Out-Patients.—59,862 new out-patients were recorded this year and attendances amounted to 287,935. Owing to the steady growth of this department it became necessary in the early part of the year to appoint a second Casualty Medical Officer and Assistant Resident Medical Officer.

In-Patients.—Lack of funds has again this year prevented the opening of the Hospital to its full extent of 700 beds. The complement at the service of the public amounted to 592 beds, including the Woolavington Wing. The number of patients admitted was 9,821, their average stay 20.8 days. The average of daily bed occupancy was 560.8, and the average cost per week £5 3s. 9d.

Altogether every aspect of the Hospital's work shows an increase in quantity, quality, and consequently in cost. As we have pointed out before, the best costs more than the second best, whilst nothing less than the best will do for the Hospital.

The Board will do their utmost to increase the subscription list, and the essential endowment fund, and look to every friend of the Hospital to use his or her own best endeavours to this end.

The term that has just ended completes the first year's work of our second Centenary. Many honours and awards have befallen the School this year. His Majesty The King has conferred a Knighthood on Mr. Alfred Webb-Johnson. This honour does indeed bring happiness to his colleagues. There are a score of reasons why this honour is deserved. No living man has done more for this Medical School than he, and in addition to this honour Her Majesty Queen Mary has appointed him one of the Surgeons to her Majesty's Household.

The Centenary celebrations of the University of London are just completed, the most important feature of which was the conferment of Honorary Degrees on some distinguished men. On this occasion the Degree of Doctor of Laws *Honoris Causa* was conferred upon the Chairman of our School Council, Mr. S. A. Courtauld.

Then two Academic distinctions won by students of this school are of outstanding importance. In the May examinations of the M.B., B.S. degree of the University of London, the Gold Medal was awarded to J. C. B. Bone. The other is the award of the Begley Studentship to R. S. Lawrie. This award is made by the Conjoint Board to the best candidate in Anatomy from all over the country. The award is made only once in three years. Congratulations to the recipients and some pride in our teaching are quite justified when we can produce the best candidate in a final as well as an intermediate examination.

Seven old Middlesex Students have obtained the Doctorate of Medicine in the University of London; they are:—N. F. MacLagan, E. G. Wilkins, C. James, H. M. Royds Jones, J. O. F. Davies, J. T. R. Lewis, and T. J. Evans. While six men have been admitted Members of the Royal College of Physicians:—K. Robson, A. Wilcox, J. Lovibond, A. M. Gill, J. E. G. Pearson, and L. C. Martin.

The Rockefeller Foundation elected one of our Surgical Registrars, P. B. Ascroft, to a student scholarship, to enable him to spend a year visiting the United States of America; there to study one of the most modern developments in Surgery.

I am pleased to report the appointment of Dr. F. R. Selbie to the Bland-Sutton Institute of Pathology as an additional Cancer Research Worker. Mr. C. L. Foster, B.Sc., has been appointed part-time demonstrator in Biology, Mr. W. F. Floyd, B.Sc., A.Inst.P., junior demonstrator in Physiology, Dr. E. O. Harris and Dr. P. A. Robinson, senior and junior demonstrators respectively in Anatomy.

It is with the deepest regret that I report the death of Dr. W. H. Mason, late of the Bland-Sutton Institute of Pathology and an old student of the Medical School. Dr. Mason's services to the Medical School were invaluable and by his death we have lost a much-liked colleague.

One of the criteria of an education, is that which a man is able to accomplish afterwards. It is pleasing therefore to note that St. Mary's Hospital, Paddington, have appointed D. H. MacLeod to its Honorary Staff. MacLeod has also joined the Staff of Queen Charlotte's Hospital, and goes with our best wishes for his future. Similar sentiments can be expressed about M. Kremer, one time Medical Registrar and Demonstrator in the Department of Physiology; we congratulate him on his appointment as Assistant Physician to Out-Patients at Hampstead General Hospital.

In my report of last year I summarized the changes then made in our Scholarships, how we had instituted two new ones in order to give greater opportunities to our own students during their later or clinical years; and everyone will remember that our friend Mr. Edward Meyerstein gave the School £3,000 with which to endow one of these. It was only a few months later that he doubled that gift so he has now endowed both these valuable scholarships. Mr. Meyerstein has put the School deeply in his debt not only by his gifts but even more by the warm interest that he shews in the welfare of the School, now that he serves as a member of the Council where his experience and advice are generously given and very much appreciated.

Among the gifts received by the School this year is a new prize—the Charles Bell Prize in Anatomy. This annual award has been endowed by the gift of Captain A. J. Bell, great grand-nephew of our Founder, Sir Charles Bell.

An old Middlesex student, Dr. T. H. Sanderson-Wells, has given a sum of money, the income from which will become available for the endowment of a Lecture. It is anticipated that the Sanderson-Wells Lectures of the future will make valuable contributions to Medical knowledge.

The report on the first year's work of the Clinical Research Unit was recently received and showed that progress of a promising nature had been achieved.

During the year, an important step forward in the corporate life of the School has been made. This April some 35 students went into residence in the College of the Hospital. The advantages to students are obvious; to mention only one point:—Oxford and Cambridge provide colleges in which undergraduates can live, while undergraduates of this University so often have to live alone in lodgings if their homes are not within easy reach of their work; thus they miss that opportunity for social interchange of ideas that forms so important a part of a University life and education. It was Mr. Meyerstein who realised these things, and made this advance possible.

The Hospital and Medical School now occupy the whole of the island site. The building at the corner of Union Street and Nassau Street has been purchased and converted into a very useful extension of the departments of Anatomy, Physiology and Physics.

GOVERNORS.

THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, RIGHTS, AND PRIVILEGES,

1. Annual Subscribers of *Three Guineas or upwards* to the Hospital's General Fund, to the Middlesex Branch Hospital and Hulke Endowed Home, Clacton-on-Sea, to the Cancer Wing, to the Cancer Research Fund, to the Reconstruction Fund, or to the Medical School, are entitled to be Governors so long as their Subscriptions are paid.

2. Donors of *Thirty Guineas or upwards*, at one time, are made Life Governors, and at once entitled to all the privileges of Governors. The Endowment of a Bed or Cot (see p. 000) qualifies the donor as a Life Governor.

3. Honorary Governors are appointed, and the propriety of making such appointments is first considered by the Board, and then submitted for the consideration and approval of a Court of Governors.

4. Honorary Governors have, from the day of their appointment, the same rights and privileges in all respects as Life Governors. In cases of Bequests of *Two Hundred Pounds and under Five Hundred Pounds*, one of the Executors under the will is eligible for appointment as an Honorary Governor.

5. All Governors have the right of attending the Courts of Governors, but Governors who are in arrear with their subscriptions are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any Board or Committee appointed in accordance with the Laws of the Hospital, and Governors who are new Annual Subscribers or Donors are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court or to serve on any such Board or Committee unless their subscriptions or donations have been paid at least three calendar months previously, and Governors being Salaried Officers or holding similar offices, or being Students or Servants of the Hospital, are not entitled to speak or vote at any such Court, or to serve on any such Committee, and are not entitled to speak, vote, or serve at or on any such Court, Board, or Committee for one year after they have ceased to be such Salaried Officers, to hold such similar Offices or to be such Students or Servants, unless specially authorised so to do by the Board.

6. No Governor is entitled to speak or vote at any Court, Board, or Committee on any question or matter wherein he or she is personally interested.

7. Every Governor has the right of visiting the Wards and other departments in the presence of any one of the Physicians or Surgeons of the Hospital, the Secretary-Superintendent, the Resident Medical Officer or his substitute, the Chaplain, the Lady-Superintendent, or one of the Visiting Governors.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Patients are required to contribute in accordance with their means towards the cost of their maintenance. The amount of a Patient's contribution is agreed upon after enquiries made, either before or after admission to the Hospital, from the Patient or the Patient's relatives or friends ; but no distinction is made between those who can and those who cannot afford to contribute.

No letters of recommendation are required for the Out-Patient Department. Patients are required to contribute 1/- at each attendance, but are excused from payment if their circumstances warrant it. Further contributions are invited from those attending the Special Departments.

In-Patients are expected to be provided with clean and suitable clothing and change of linen. They also have to provide themselves with washing. In all cases where the Patients are too poor to provide themselves with these articles, they are supplied to them by the Lady Almoner from special funds which she has at her disposal for the purpose.

Any Officer, Sister, Nurse, Servant, or person employed in any Department of the Hospital accepting Money, or Presents of any kind, from a Patient, or relative or friend of any Patient, on any pretence whatever, is liable to dismissal.

The following Cases are not admitted into the Hospital:—

1. Those which are, upon due examination, deemed *Incurable*, as Advanced Consumption, etc.
2. Complaints so tedious of Cure as to preclude for a long time the admission of more urgent cases, as *Chronic Ulcers of the Legs*, etc.
3. Disorders, to the Cure of which other establishments are devoted, as *Persons of Unsound Mind*, etc.
4. Those which are more properly objects for Parochial Relief, as wanting Food and not Medicine.
5. Those whose admission might endanger the other Patients, as persons suffering from *Infectious Diseases*.
6. Complaints likely to be aggravated rather than relieved by confinement within the walls of a Hospital, but such cases, if deemed proper objects, may receive advice and medicine as *Out-Patients*.

Prior to sending up Patients from the Country, the Resident Medical Officer should be applied to, in order to learn whether there is room, and such application should be accompanied by a medical certificate setting out fully the nature of the case.

THREE Casualty Medical and Two Casualty Surgical Officers. Six Resident Officers to the Special Departments, Eight Resident House Surgeons, Eight Resident House Physicians, Two Resident Obstetric and Gynæcological House Surgeons, Twelve Registrars, Three Resident Anæsthetists, one Resident Dental House Surgeon and one Clinical Research Assistant to the Courtauld Wards, are appointed annually from among the qualified Students of the Hospital.

The Freer Lucas Scholarship and the Asher Asher Prize to a Pupil of Epsom College who has passed the 1st M.B., Examination. The Colin Mackenzie Prize value £10 10s., Anatomy and Physiology. The Hetley Clinical Prize of £25, the Leopold Hudson Prize value £11 11s., Surgical Pathology and Bacteriology, the Kingston Fowler Prize value £15, Pathology, Bacteriology, and Morbid Histology. The Lyell Medal and Scholarship value £55 5s., for proficiency in Surgical Anatomy and Dissection, etc. Two Broderip Scholarships, value £60 and £40 respectively, for proficiency in Clinical knowledge. The Freeman Scholarship value £30, Obstetric Medicine. The John Murray Medal and Scholarship value £25, Theoretical and Practical Medicine, awarded every third year. Numerous Research Scholarships and Class Prizes are also awarded.

The Tutors superintend and assist Students in their studies without extra fee, and thus the necessity of obtaining private instruction away from the Medical School is obviated.
