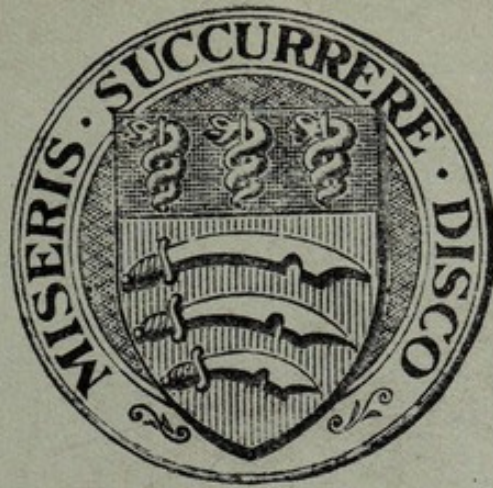

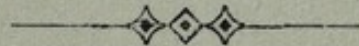

No letters of recommendation are required for the Out-Patient Department. Patients are required to contribute 1/- at each attendance, but are excused from payment if their circumstances warrant it. Further contributions are invited from those attending the Special Departments.

In-Patients are expected to be provided with clean and suitable clothing and change of linen. They also have to provide themselves with washing. In all cases where the Patients are too poor to provide themselves with these articles, they are supplied to them by the Lady Almoner from special funds which she has at her disposal for the purpose.

Any Officer, Sister, Nurse, Servant, or person employed in any Department of the Hospital accepting Money, or Presents of any kind, from a Patient, or relative or friend of any Patient, on any pretence whatever, is liable to dismissal.

The following Cases are not admitted into the Hospital:—

1. Those which are, upon due examination, deemed *Incurable*, as Advanced Consumption, etc.
2. Complaints so tedious of Cure as to preclude for a long time the admission of more urgent cases, as *Chronic Ulcers* of the Legs, etc.
3. Disorders, to the Cure of which other establishments are devoted, as *Persons of Unsound Mind*, etc.
4. Those which are more properly objects for Public Assistance, as wanting Food and not Medicine.
5. Those whose admission might endanger the other Patients, as persons suffering from *Infectious Diseases*.
6. Complaints likely to be aggravated rather than relieved by confinement within the walls of a Hospital, but such cases, if deemed proper objects, may receive advice and medicine as *Out-Patients*.

Prior to sending up Patients from the Country, the Resident Medical Officer should be applied to, in order to learn whether there is room, and such application should be accompanied by a medical certificate setting out fully the nature of the case.

REPORT

BOARD OF THE GOVERNORS
 OF THE
MIDDLESEX HOSPITAL for 1937.

OUR CHAIRMAN.

The prolonged illness of our Chairman, H.R.H. Prince Arthur of Connaught has been a cause for deep concern to all those connected with the Hospital, and his inability for some months to preside over our activities has been a serious loss. We wish him a complete and speedy restoration to health.

THE WORK, NEEDS AND STATISTICS OF THE HOSPITAL.

EXPANSION OF THE HOSPITAL.

Before presenting an account of the year's activities, we wish to show by means of the following figures the remarkable growth of the Hospital's services to the public since the great undertaking of rebuilding was launched.

The costs have risen from £100,000 to £180,000 during these 13 years.

THE WORK OF THE HOSPITAL.

The year 1937 was again one of progress. As medical knowledge expands new departments are created and existing departments remodelled, to put this knowledge at the service of our patients.

The Meyerstein Institute of Radio-Therapy.

The most notable achievement of the year is the completion of the Meyerstein Institute of Radio-Therapy, which we owe to the munificence of Sir Edward Meyerstein. This institute, which has now been open and in full working order for some months, contains the most perfect equipment yet invented for the treatment of cancer by radium and X-rays. Beds which were closed during the reconstruction of the wing, have now been re-opened, both for general and paying patients, and the block has now become a self-contained unit which, your Board is fully convinced, is second to none in Europe.

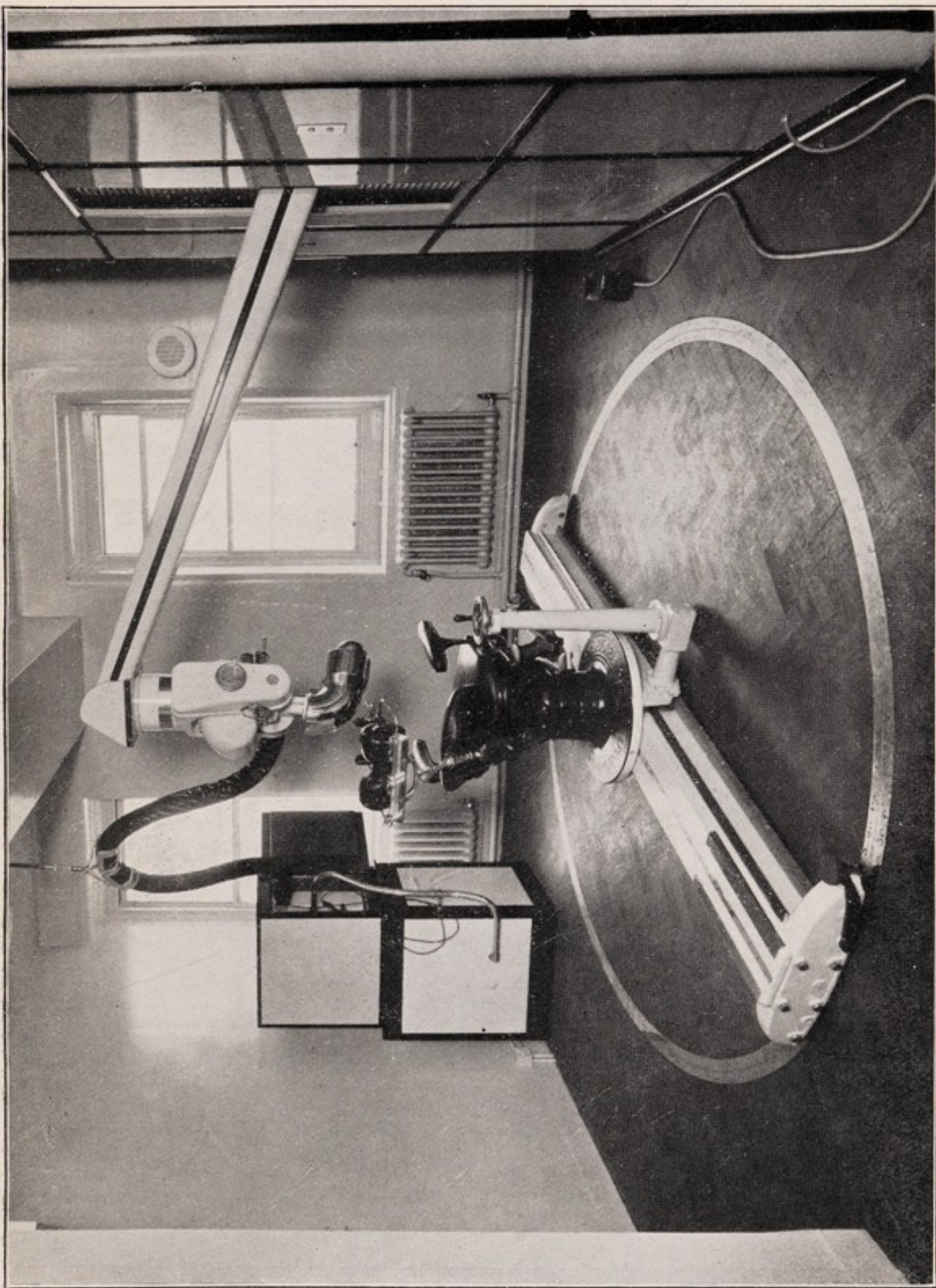
The Collins Diagnostic X-Ray Dept.

Clinicians tend to lean more and more upon photographic diagnosis. It saves time, it checks the margin of human error. From outside as well as from the Hospital staff demands for X-ray diagnosis multiply; and so, of course, does the expense.

The Nursing Staff.

The position and conditions of the nursing profession have during the past year been a subject of much public discussion. An Inter-departmental Committee under the Chairmanship of the Earl of Athlone, past Chairman of this Hospital, has been set up by the Ministry of Health to consider these questions. Our Lady Superintendent is the only matron sitting upon the Committee.

It has appeared to us that certain prejudices exist in the public mind which have little or no foundation in fact, certainly none in so far as this Hospital is concerned. It is not to be denied that the profession is a hard one, calling for high qualities in those who undertake it. It is one, however, of absorbing interest and has many advantages which are apt to be overlooked.

It is probably the only profession in which the learner is fed, housed and paid during training, while after qualification it offers considerable opportunities of advancement in a sphere where important posts are many and candidates comparatively few. It has also a contributory pension scheme, of which the benefits are high in proportion to the premiums.

The welfare of its nurses has always been a special preoccupation of this Hospital.

Owing to the generosity of an anonymous donor we have a Nurses' Home accommodating our whole staff of 370 nurses. Separate rooms, a ballroom-lounge, library, swimming bath and tennis court give our nurses opportunities for rest and recreation which are so necessary and often so hard to come by in London.

A further splendid gift of £50,000 by the same anonymous donor has this year enabled us to begin the extension of the Home to accommodate another hundred nurses. This great benefaction will enable us to fulfil two long-cherished ambitions. We shall be able to house sufficient nurses to open the Hospital to its full extent when funds are available. We also hope to introduce a forty-eight hour week for the nursing staff. It is a profound pleasure to announce the imminence of so desirable a reform, and we renew our thanks to the benefactor whose generosity has made it possible.

Department of Psychological Medicine.

At the December Court of Governors it was decided that a new department of Psychological Medicine should be opened.

Since 1923 this Hospital has devoted a ward, generously supported by Woodside Hospital, to the care of borderline cases with the object of linking up this Mental Hospital with the Neurological Department of the General Hospital. With the spread of this important work of psychotherapy it has seemed desirable that the labours over 15 years of the pioneers in this line should be formally recognised by the institution in the Middlesex Hospital of an autonomous department of Psychological Medicine. We offer our deep thanks to all those Physicians, Neurologists and Psychologists of Woodside and this Hospital whose steady work has earned this public recognition.

Infant Welfare.

The Infant Welfare Department has now completed its first year in its reconstructed quarters and there is general agreement that the changes have added greatly to the comfort of the mothers and babies. The Staff has remained unchanged during the year and our voluntary workers have once again been of the greatest service. A course of lectures in cooking and nutrition was begun in the latter part of the year by Mrs. J. K. Hasler, B.Sc., and this has been much appreciated by the mothers who have attended.

The total children on the books in 1937 numbered 547 and the attendances 6,187. There is a definite reduction on the figures in 1936 which must, in part, be explained by the slowly changing character of the neighbourhood. Many blocks of dwelling houses have been pulled down and in some instances factories and warehouses substituted. Some visits have again been paid by mothers to the Department outside clinic hours in search of special advice and information.

The Middlesex Branch Hospital and Hulke Endowed Home at Clacton-on-Sea.

Our Convalescent Home is one of few where surgical dressings are available and where doctors are in constant attendance. We are thus able to care for a wider field of convalescent patients than the majority of similar institutions.

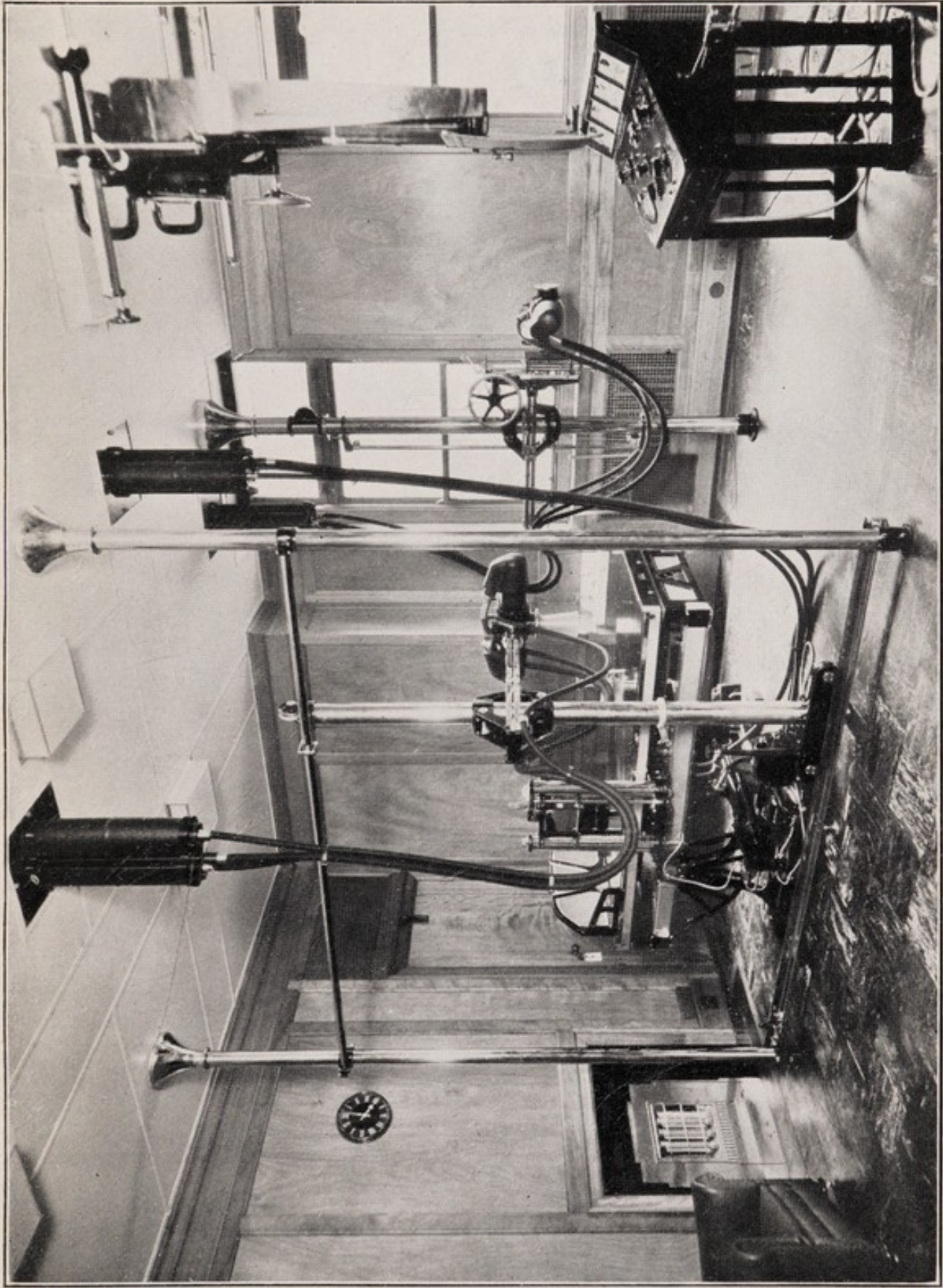
The total number of patients received in the Home was 1,370, of whom 551 were sent direct from this Hospital. The Hospital and Home are kept in constant touch with each other by means of regular visits of inspection by members of the Board.

Lady Almoner's Department.

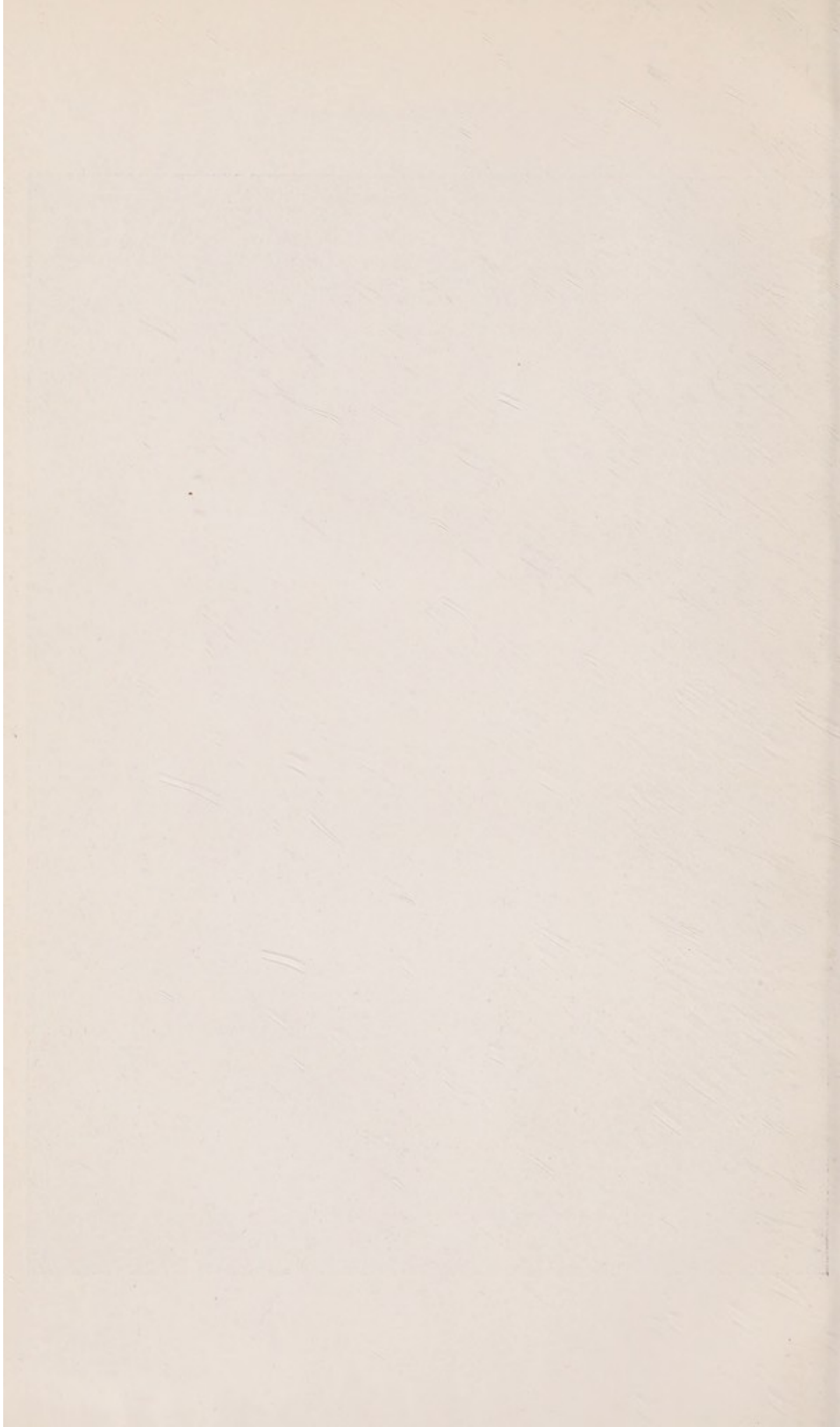
Other Convalescent Homes and the Schiff Home of Recovery have received through this department 659 adult patients and 113 children. 68 adults and 8 children were admitted to Sanatoria.

The aid of the District Nurses' Association was obtained for 295 adults and 95 children.

1,262 surgical appliances were supplied to in- and out-patients.

The St. Patrick's Benevolent Society, London Midland and Scottish Railway Fund, Marks and Spencer and various Hospital Contributory Funds have given us their usual welcome assistance and financial grants.

The Central Association for Mental Welfare, the Charity Organisation Society and the Jewish Board of Guardians have also earned our thanks by the number of home visits and reports on our patients they have made.

Expenditure incurred in assisting patients with convalescence, surgical appliances, fares and in other ways to the extent of £5,579 has been met in part by direct contributions from patients, through mutual aid societies and by the Dresden and Samaritan Funds.

Out-Patients.

64,668 new out-patients were recorded this year and attendances amounted to 295,099. This again shows a substantial increase on last year.

In-Patients.

The complement of beds at the service of the public was 602 (including the Woolavington Wing), except for a short period when a few beds were closed during the reconstruction of the Meyerstein Institute. Lack of funds still prevents the opening of the Hospital to its full extent of 700 beds.

The number of patients admitted was 9,499, and their average stay was 21.23 days. The average daily bed occupancy was 550.88, and the average cost per week £5 4s. 1d.

SERVICE, APPEALS AND FUNCTIONS.

Our friends have again given us wonderful support this year. It is thanks to their individual and combined efforts that we are able to continue our service of health to the community. Every year the cost of maintenance increases and every year we call on our friends to help us meet this increase.

The Ladies' Association.

The Ladies' Association, under Lady Wraxall's chairmanship have continued their splendid and invaluable work, and their membership has again increased, as has that of the Middlesex Mice, the Children's Branch of the Association. The former presented 300 guineas for the endowment of their bed and £50 for equipment at the Convalescent Home at Clacton. The latter have given £175 towards their cot, and are now within £50 of completing the endowment. These are truly remarkable achievements.

The Work Society has worked assiduously and has made 2,455 garments. A notable gift of 30 children's jackets came from Mrs. Ernest Ward and her helpers.

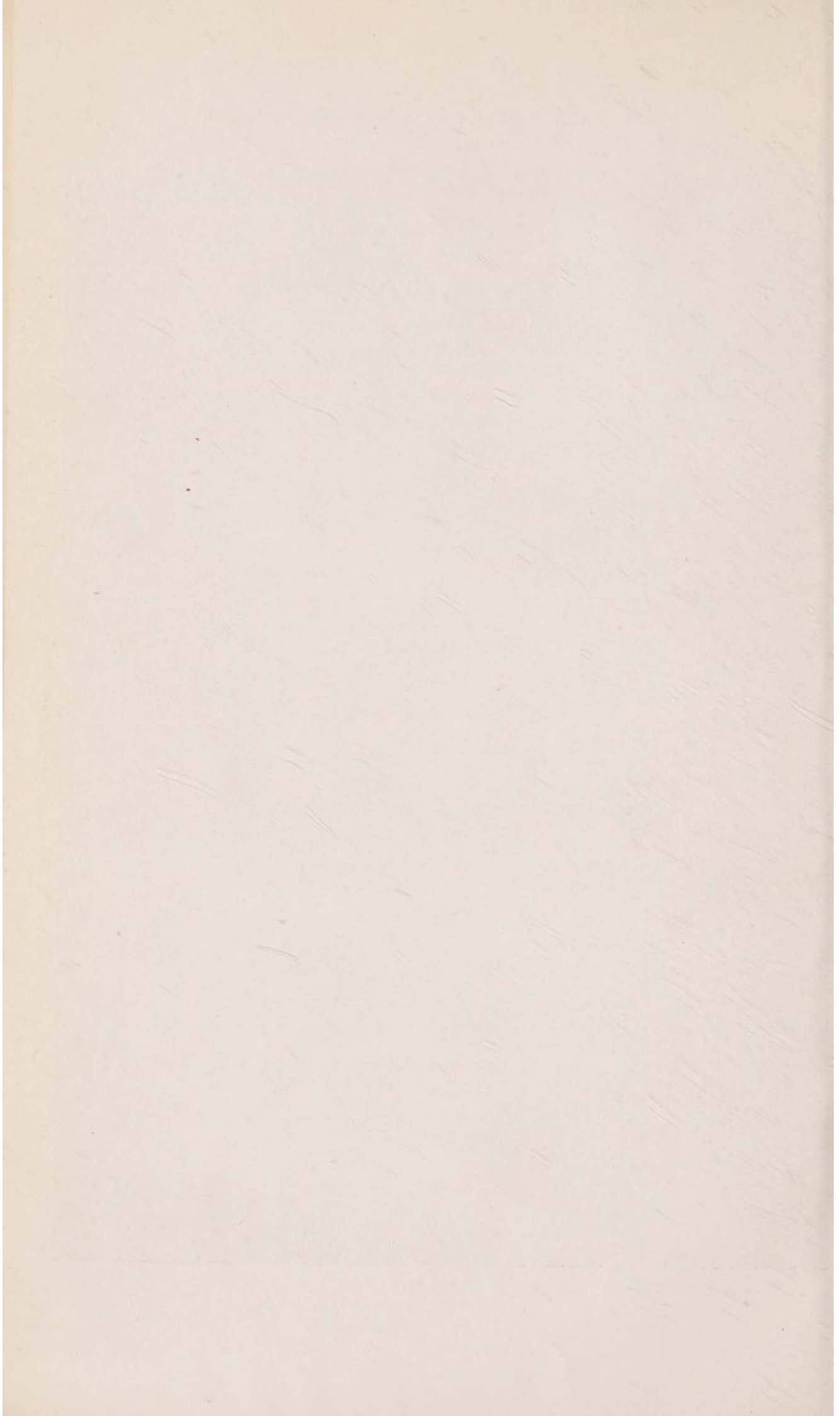
Mrs. Leveson Gower has taken over the Ward Visiting Branch this year and we are very pleased to welcome her to the Association.

We are most grateful to Mrs. J. Hambro for her care of the Garden Court and for the special planting she undertook at the Coronation.

The fame of the Library continues to spread, visitors coming from the Continent and from the New World to study our methods

with a view to opening similar organisations in their own countries. Mrs. Beddington, as Head Librarian, was invited to open the first Hospital library in Belgium. Library services were also made available to the Woolavington Wing and have proved extremely popular. The total number of books issued was 24,933.

The Ladies' Ambulance Branch has continued its important service to the Hospital.

We extend a warm welcome to the Marchioness of Cambridge who has undertaken the chairmanship of the Middlesex Mice.

It is not generally realised that the Hospital possesses a stamp collection which is in charge of the Children's Branch. An opportunity is thereby offered to stamp collectors to make their contribution to what, we believe, will be a considerable asset in the future.

The Second-hand Department, under Mrs. Pearce-Gould, raised £879 during the year.

A splendid individual effort is that of Miss McCulloch who has contributed £13 13s. 8d. from the sale of her home-made marmalade, and who has helped us in this way since the foundation of the Association.

To the Chairman, Lady Wraxall, and to all the generous and self-sacrificing ladies who spare no effort to make this great Association what it is, the warmest thanks of the Hospital are due, and we offer them most cordially.

A New Sports Ground.

Sir Edward Meyerstein's great gift of his Institute of Radiotherapy has already been mentioned. He has also given us a fine new Sports ground for the students of the Medical School, which will be an inestimable boon to them.

Birthday Card Greetings.

To Sir Edward we also owe the initiation of the Birthday Card Scheme. Most people like to mark their birthday by some small celebration and many people like to feel that it is a day of happiness for others as well as themselves. We therefore ask those who have reason to be interested in the Hospital whether they and their friends would like to mark their birthdays when they come

round by some small donation to the Hospital. This idea has proved attractive to many, and by the end of the year, four months after the scheme originated, £286 had been received.

Portrait of the Earl of Athlone.

A long friendship between one of the surgeons of the Hospital and Mr. Frank Hodge, the well-known artist, led this year to the latter most generously presenting a canvas to the Hospital. This canvas was purchased from the Hospital by Mr. G. Vaughan-Morgan for 200 guineas, on condition that our former Chairman, the Earl of Athlone, should sit for his portrait. Lord Athlone's consent was readily obtained, and his portrait was presented to the Hospital by Mr. Vaughan-Morgan at an unveiling ceremony which Lord Athlone graciously attended.

We would like to thank the Earl of Athlone for so kindly consenting to his portrait being painted and to Mr. Hodge and Mr. Vaughan-Morgan for their splendid gifts.

Ice Hockey Match.

In February, thanks to the generosity of the directors of the Empire Stadium, Earls Court, an Ice Hockey and Skating Gala was given in aid of the Hospital. Our President, His Grace the Duke of Northumberland, was present and made an appeal for the Maintenance Fund. This was the first time that His Grace had presided at a Hospital function since he became President, and it was a great pleasure to us to be able to welcome him.

Bond Street Association.

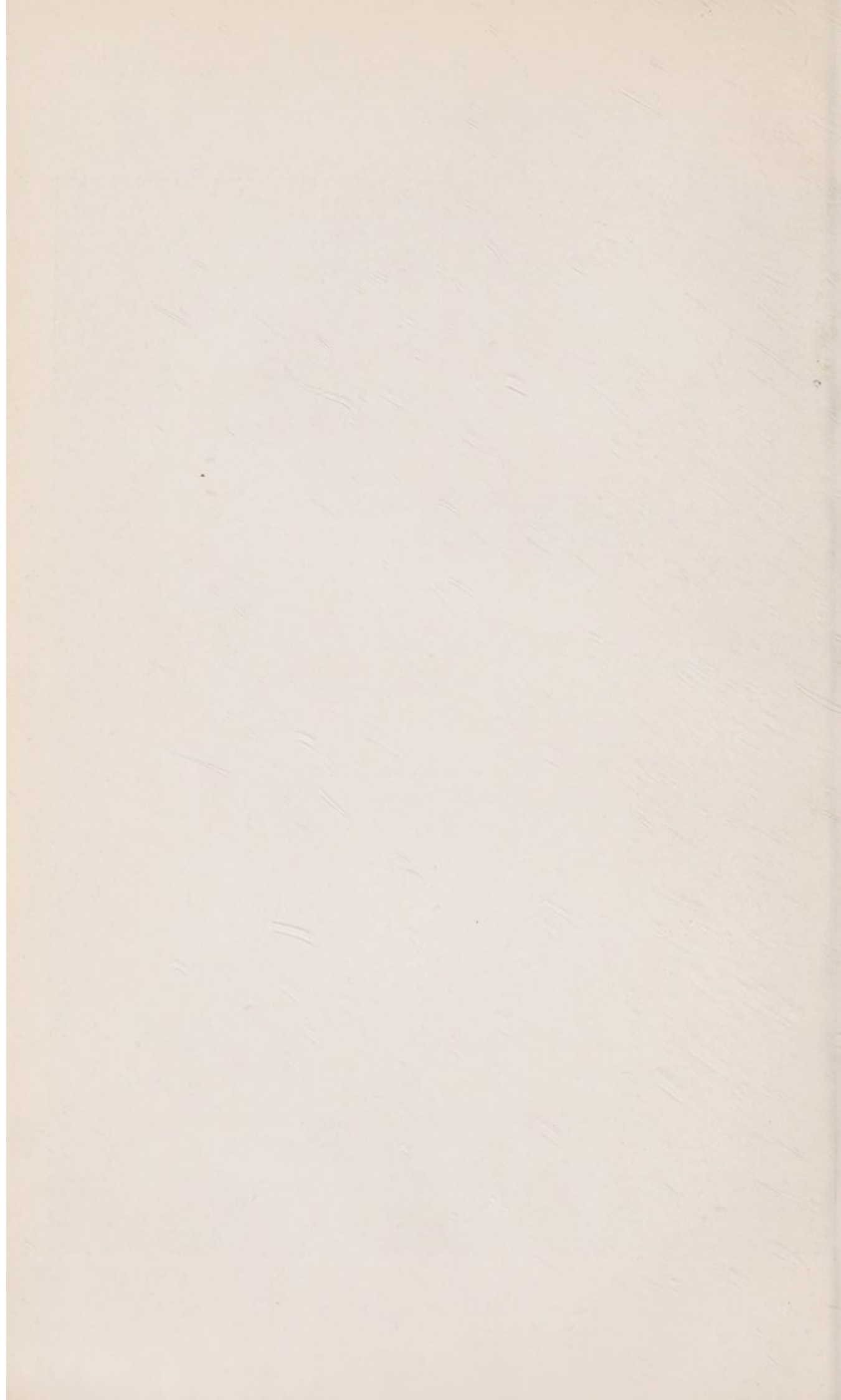
A new departure this year was a Sale organised by the Bond Street Association in support of the Ward named after them. This was conspicuously successful and raised £441 12s. 8d. It is hoped this will become an annual event and as it becomes better known, will raise an annually increasing sum.

Dressmakers' Association.

A cheque for £1,500 was received this year from the Dressmakers' Association towards the endowment of the Ward that bears its name. We are most grateful for the help this Association continues to give us.

The All Help League.

By means of the All Help League thousands of ex-patients are kept in touch with the Middlesex, and by their various activities they created a new record by contributing an income of £1,852 towards the Hospital's maintenance. This satisfactory result was due to increased membership, £1,400 being received by subscriptions, boxes and sale of tinfoil. The "Daily Mirror" Token Scheme added a further £150.

This year the Crusaders' Christmas Party was held at the Polytechnic. Dr. and Mrs. Moncrieff acted as host and hostess and thanked the children for their splendid efforts during the year. Their total box collections amounted to £98.

The League launched a special Coronation appeal in the form of a "Crown" collecting card. The gifts were received and personally acknowledged by The Hon. Mrs. David Bowes-Lyon. The sum realised, £307, quite surpassed the expectations of the Committee, to whom grateful thanks are due for all their activities under the able chairmanship of Mr. F. F. Taylor.

Alms Box Department.

A total of £1,876 7s. 2d. was raised from Alms Box collections both inside and outside the Hospital.

The Seven-a-Sides.

The Middlesex County Rugby Football Union again gave the greater part of the proceeds of the "Seven-a-Side" Finals at Twickenham to the Hospital. This amounted to £1,473 11s. 8d., yet another record.

Rose Day.

The Alexandra Rose Day was again, thanks to the ladies who so kindly gave their services, a conspicuous success.

Flag Day.

The Hospital participated in the Combined Hospitals Flag Day, and in spite of the shortness of the time at our disposal and the smallness of the area allocated to us, £370 9s. 8d. was raised.

A Flag Day was also held at Clacton which, thanks to the efforts of the Nursing Staff and others, produced a total of £50.

Variety Concert.

We are most grateful to the honorary secretaries and the artistes of the Students' Annual Variety Concert for the excellent performance they gave and for the splendid financial benefit to the Hospital which resulted from it.

Friends of Miss Fanny Marriage.

£59 5s. 6d. has been subscribed this year in memory of the late Miss Fanny Marriage, who for so long organised support for the Hospital. We are most grateful to her friends who continue to help the Hospital which was so dear to her.

The Zunz Bequest.

A capital grant of £20,000 for the upkeep in perpetuity of the Annie Zunz Wards was received from the Trustees of the Zunz Bequest.

APPOINTMENTS AND RETIREMENTS.**The Board.**

Two new members have joined the Board. Captain Simon Whitbread succeeds his father, who has been a member of the Board since 1907, and who has now retired to our very great regret.

Captain Whitbread is continuing the close and ancient association of his family with the Hospital which started when Mr. Samuel Whitbread endowed a Ward for the treatment of Cancer Patients in 1792.

To Mr. Arthur Bull we also extend a warm welcome on his joining us.

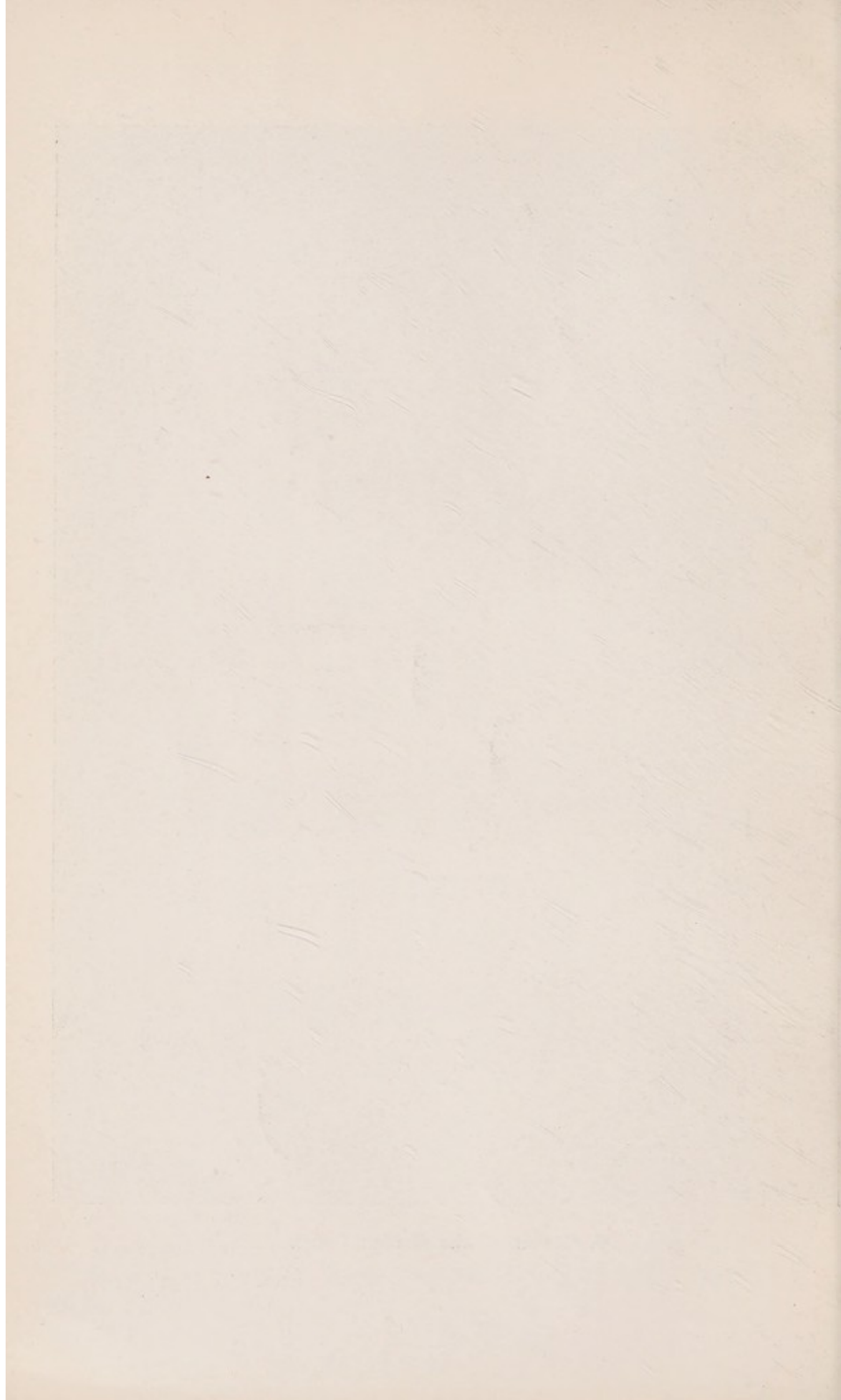

The Hospital has sustained a severe loss in the retirement of three members of the Honorary Staff: Mr. Sampson Handley, Surgeon; Mr. F. J. Cleminson, Aural Surgeon; and Mr. Victor

Bonney, Obstetric and Gynæcological Surgeon, who have joined the Consulting Staff. The consequent vacancies on the Senior Staff have been filled by Mr. Turner Warwick, Mr. C. P. Wilson, and Mr. L. C. Rivett, and the following new appointments to the Honorary Staff have been made: Mr. P. B. Ascroft, Mr. J. P. Monkhouse, and Mr. W. R. Winterton.

Mr. Handley was appointed Assistant Surgeon in 1905, and since 1928 has been Senior Surgeon. To his untiring labours the Hospital largely owes the position it holds to-day in Cancer Treatment and Research.

Mr. Cleminson has held his position since 1921 and to his work is chiefly due the foundation and endowment of the Ferens Institute of Otology. In recognition of his great services in this direction he has been appointed Director of Research of that Institute.

Mr. Bonney joined the Honorary Staff in 1908. His services to the Hospital and the Medical School have during that period been invaluable, while his researches in obstetrics and gynæcology have brought him a world-wide reputation.

APPEAL.

The continual expansion of the Hospital's activities, the rapid increase in the facilities it offers for the treatment of every form of sickness and the ever-mounting cost of modern medical methods threaten each year to outstrip the means of the Hospital. Each year that threat becomes more menacing. Results have amply justified the progressive policy of the Hospital, which has become one of the finest institutions both for medical research and the treatment of disease in Europe. But if we are to continue our advance or even to hold to the position we have gained, **increased funds for maintenance must be obtained**, the gap between income and expenditure must be bridged.

We do appeal most earnestly for new supporters, and we look to all our present loyal friends to help us find them.

It is difficult to compress into a report of reasonable length, all the manifold activities of a School like ours.

During the past year we have experienced severe losses.

On the 20th December, 1936, a very great man passed from our midst, ripe in years, rich in experience and honoured by as many as eight Universities. John Bland-Sutton entered the Medical School as a perpetual student on the 25th April, 1878, and for the following 58 years he laboured for and loved his old School. His material gifts to the School were great, his contribution to the then Athletic Ground, the many embellishments of the Chapel; these gifts culminated in the provision of the Institute of Pathology which bears his name and which will remain for all time a memorial to his generosity and evidence of his foresight for the needs of a Medical School in the 20th Century. His intellectual gifts to his Alma Mater were even greater; as an Anatomist, Anthropologist, Pathologist, and a great Surgeon of daring and dexterity, he was recognised throughout the scientific world. Honoured by lay and medical bodies alike. We at Middlesex are proud that he desired to rest for all time in the Bland-Sutton Institute of Pathology.

William Lang has recently died. He was appointed to the Staff of the Hospital as Ophthalmic Surgeon as long ago as 1881. Under the influence of his work, the department grew steadily. His teaching

was appreciated by many generations of students and his personality endeared him to all who knew him. He lived many years after resigning from the active Staff. Unhappily, the later years of his life were saddened by much personal grief.

With other Schools of the University of London we have to bear the loss of our Principal Officer, Sir Edwin Deller. With the whole University we deplore his death by an accident, most tragic.

On June 1st, 1937, Charles Shorney Webb died in the Hospital. As a student of the School he had a most promising academic career and was elected to the Honorary Staff while still serving as a surgeon with the British Expeditionary Force. Shorney Webb took a great interest in the Students' welfare, both in their teaching and their games. Illnesses cut short the career of a capable surgeon and a lovable colleague.

Illness, too, caused the death of Dr. W. H. Mason, a young and responsible scientific worker. Though for years he knew he could never get well, he pursued his studies and daily work with a quiet and cheerful courage, which all who knew him must admire, and will long remember.

A fatal ski-ing accident caused the death of Ernest Frye, a student of the School, who joined from Cambridge only two years previously, and who had already won for himself much affection in the School.

The march of Time lays its hand on our teaching staff, and this year both Dr. R. A. Young, who was Senior Physician, and Mr. Sampson Handley, who was Senior Surgeon, have joined the Consulting Staff.

The year 1889 saw Robert Arthur Young enter the School as a scholar. He immediately shewed scientific ability by becoming a Bachelor of Science in Physiology, indeed he was subsequently Lecturer in that Department for seven years. In 1902 he was appointed to the Honorary Staff, at a time when this School was by no means always able to furnish successful candidates from among its own students. Thus for 47 years Dr. Young has faithfully served this School and Hospital in various capacities. Both as teacher and physician he attained to that success which is most worth having, namely the approbation of his contemporaries and the respect and admiration of his Juniors. Possibly he will be best remembered as a wise Physician, who having been trained in the old School of Clinical Masters, continually acquired all that is best of the ancillary services of modern medicine.

We welcome Dr. H. L. Marriott as an Assistant Physician. He was well known as an able and successful Resident Medical Officer. His capabilities will now have a wider sphere.

It was to Guy's that we were indebted for Mr. Sampson Handley, for it was in that School that he laid the foundations of his reputation as an Anatomist and Surgeon. When he joined the Staff here in 1905, his name was already becoming known for his research work in Cancer.

This subject has occupied his interest throughout his career and the results of his labours have properly won him a world-wide reputation. His name is a household word in the literature of the subject. His wards and lecture theatre have been the Mecca of students and of surgeons of every nationality. We owe to him the establishment of the Middlesex Hospital Press; having obtained its original endowment he himself worked constantly in order that the Press should fulfill the objects for which it was founded. He has two sons at this School and we could not wish them more or set them a greater ideal than that they should follow their father.

Mr. P. B. Ascroft has been elected Assistant Surgeon to the Hospital. Ascroft has had a brilliant undergraduate career here; among his many prizes was the Gold Medal in the Master of Surgery Examination of the University of London. He has only recently returned from the United States which he visited as the holder of a Rockefeller Travelling Fellowship.

During the year the Board decided that the Head of our new and enlarged department of Physical Medicine should be a member of the Honorary Staff. This department includes a large Massage School and extensive facilities for treating patients by physiotherapy. We welcome Dr. Frank Howitt to this appointment.

Honours and distinctions have again fallen to many Middlesex men; Surgeon Rear-Admiral P. T. Nichols has been appointed Medical Director General of the Navy. Sir Louis Barnett is now President of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons. Dr. Daniel T. Davies has been appointed Physician to His Majesty's Household. Dr. E. A. Cockayne has been elected Bradshaw Lecturer for 1937; and Mr. Philip Wiles delivered a Hunterian Lecture before the Royal College of Surgeons. From the many other awards and distinctions, which time does not permit to detail here, I cannot omit such a Prize as that awarded to Professor E. L. Kennaway by the Union Miniere du Haur Katango for his Cancer Researches. Such recognition of his work is greatly appreciated here.

Our long association with Bolingbroke Hospital is continued by the recent appointment of Mr. E. G. Muir. From among our Registrars, five have been elected to the Honorary Staff of other Hospitals. Dr. Lee Lander has been appointed Assistant Physician at the Royal Free; Mr. W. R. Winterton has joined the Staff of Queen Charlotte's as well as the Hospital for Women, Soho Square. In June, Mr. O. V. Lloyd-Davies was appointed Honorary Surgeon to the Connaught Hospital. Mr. R. C. Tatham has gone to the Royal Infirmary, Hull, where he becomes a colleague of Dr. D. I. Muir. Mr. D. G. Walker, Dental Registrar, has been elected to the Staff of the Royal Dental Hospital, Leicester Square. We congratulate them and wish them success; and may reflect that such a list is a matter of real satisfaction.

It follows on from this line of thought that academic distinctions have been numerous. The Fellowship of the Royal College of Physicians has been conferred on Dr. Graham Hodgson, Dr. Frank Howitt, and Professor E. L. Kennaway ; The Doctorate of Medicine of the University of London has been awarded to A. M. R. Cann and J. Sakula ; while the following have obtained the Membership of the Royal College of Physicians :—Dr. Noel Harris, Dr. M. McGeorge, Mr. G. D. Hadley, Dr. J. Sakula, Mr. P. H. Sandifer, and Dr. A. L. Banks.

In the December examination for the Master of Surgery of the University of London there were three successful candidates ; two were Middlesex men :—Mr. J. B. G. Muir and Mr. John Howkins. Muir was awarded the Gold Medal, and it is rather a striking fact that his brother also obtained the Gold Medal in 1932. I believe that two brothers have never before won this high distinction. Fellowship of the Royal College of Surgeons has been attained by:—Messrs. I. G. Williams, John Howkins, C. J. B. Murray, A. S. Till, and D. W. Asheroft.

It is a pleasure to record that the Fellowship of the College of Obstetrics and Gynæcology has been conferred on Mr. Frederick Roques.

It is encouraging to note that an increasing number of undergraduates are taking their M.B., B.S., London, though the number still falls far short of what it should be ; so much the greater credit to those who have obtained distinctions :—S. Marinker in Surgery, H. N. G. Hudson and E. Samuel in Pathology, and M. S. Campbell and F. H. Scadding in Medicine.

The Sir William Dunn Exhibition in Anatomy awarded by the University of London to the best candidate from all the Schools of the University, has again been brought to Middlesex ; this year by J. W. Paulley.

The Medical School has received a gift of a new and beautiful Athletic Ground. That inestimable benefit to present students and enduring advantage to succeeding generations has been given to us by Sir Edward Meyerstein. He has done great things for this School, for, in addition to his great benefactions to the Hospital, Sir Edward has enriched the School by giving a residential college, which is greatly appreciated by students, by endowing two Scholarships and a prize in Radiology. The ground is at Chislehurst and is over 18 acres in extent, with attractive trees, moreover, most important of all, the soil is sand and gravel. So there are good reasons to hope that fewer matches in the future will have to be scratched owing to the wet state of the ground. Certainly the Hockey Club will now have a home pitch on which they can play. The Cricket Boundary can be a long one and during this winter we shall make a new cricket square.

Sir Edward has promised to be Chairman of the Ground Committee so we shall have the advantage of his advice as we go along. We are

deeply grateful to him and ask him to accept our sincere thanks. All his gifts to Middlesex have been of great value to Medicine and to a Teaching School, but he wins the hearts of the students themselves in making a gift so particularly their own.

Rudyard Kipling died in the Hospital at the end of last year; some of us remember with gratitude the Address he gave to the Students 29 years ago. Now, the School has received from an anonymous donor a sum of money which is to create a fund to be known as the "Rudyard Kipling Fund." The purpose is to help financially students of the Medical School, or recently qualified Middlesex men, who might otherwise have to abandon their careers. A more signal memorial is difficult to conceive. In the future a few men, though their names will never be disclosed, may owe their start in life to this benefaction. No doubt, too, this Fund will attract donations to itself by its very worthiness.

A new prize has been endowed by Miss Elizabeth Temple Frere. She is the grand-daughter of Dr. Temple Frere, who was the first Dean of our Medical School, and Physician-Accoucheur to the Hospital. It is in his special subject that this prize is awarded.

It was a generous act of Sir James Dundas-Grant to present his Library to the School. It is housed, of course, in the Ferens Institute, the only special centre in this country for research in Otology. This gift adds considerably to the value of that department and will be much used.

Our Cancer Research Funds continue to receive support from various quarters. We are most grateful to the British Empire Cancer Campaign for their continued grant and to the Medical Research Council, who support much original work here.

The School is now giving practical attention to its older buildings which at present provide such inadequate accommodation. We have spent much time and a great deal of thought on some very necessary extensions and the rebuilding of certain departments. The Board have recently approved plans which envisage doing this on the island site, and, by proceeding in three sections, hope to reduce to a minimum the disturbance of School routine. We are now busy with the working drawings for the first section, and this will involve the demolition of no more than the Old Lecture Theatre, yet the erection of an invaluable new block of buildings in its place.

If we can find the necessary money with which to carry out this work, the Council of the Medical School are satisfied that the present teaching facilities will be improved and will provide greater opportunities for the advancement of medical science and indeed the prevention and cure of disease.

Eight Resident Officers to the Special Departments, Eight Resident House Surgeons, Eight Resident House Physicians, Two Resident Obstetric and Gynæcological House Surgeons, Twelve Registrars, Three Resident Anæsthetists, one Resident Dental House Surgeon and one Clinical Research Assistant to the Courtauld Wards, are appointed annually from among the qualified Students of the Hospital.

The Freer Lucas Scholarship and the Asher Asher Prize to a Pupil of Epsom College who has passed the 1st M.B., Examination. The Colin Mackenzie Prize value £10 10s., Anatomy and Physiology. The Hetley Clinical Prize of £25, the Leopold Hudson Prize value £11 11s., Surgical Pathology and Bacteriology, the Kingston Fowler Prize value £15, Pathology, Bacteriology, and Morbid Histology. The Lyell Medal and Scholarship value £55 5s., for proficiency in Surgical Anatomy and Dissection, etc. Two Broderip Scholarships, value £60 and £40 respectively, for proficiency in Clinical knowledge. The Freeman Scholarship value £30, Obstetric Medicine. The John Murray Medal and Scholarship value £25, Theoretical and Practical Medicine, awarded every third year. Numerous Research Scholarships and Class Prizes are also awarded.

The Tutors superintend and assist Students in their studies without extra fee, and thus the necessity of obtaining private instruction away from the Medical School is obviated.

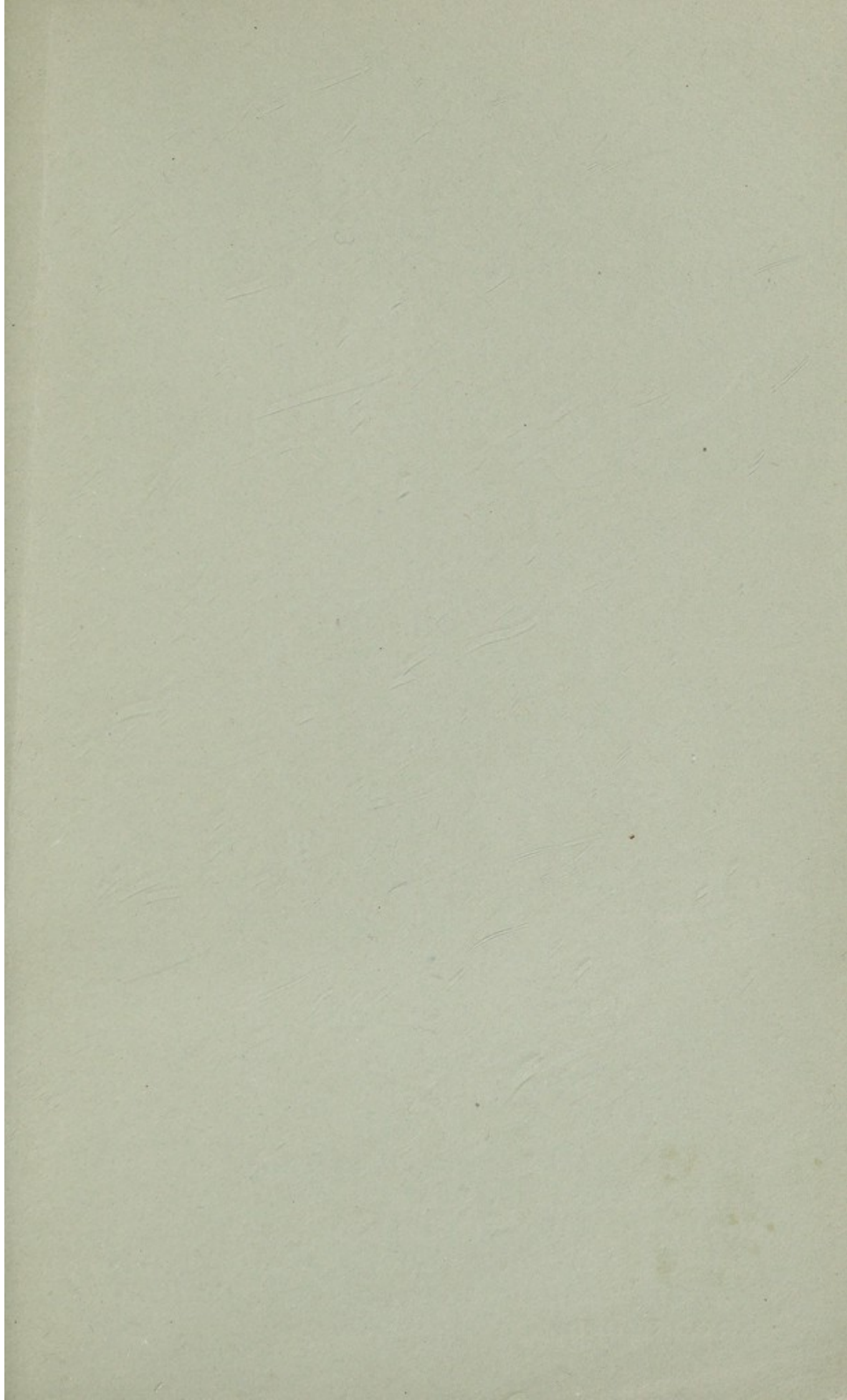
