There were 168 cases of Smallpox admitted during the year, as follows:—

Of these cases 20 were sent to Wath Smallpox Hospital and 12 to Rawmarsh.

The majority of the Smallpox cases were of a mild nature, a few, however, were bordering on the severe type.

There was no case of Smallpox in a vaccinated person under 25 years of age.

Smallpox has apparently become endemic in the district now, so that an increase in the accommodation at Brampton is called for.

In spite of a very busy year the health of the Staff at the Hospitals has been very satisfactory.

Constitution.

The South Rotherham and Kiveton Park District Isolation Hospital Committee is constituted under the provisions of the Isolation Hospitals Act, 1893, by an Order made by the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire dated the 21st day of July, 1897. The constitution of the Committee was modified by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 7) Act, 1911; also by the Ministry of Health Provisional Order Confirmation (Sheffield Extension) Act, 1921; and again by the West Riding of Yorkshire (Maltby Urban District) Confirmation Order, 1924.

Nursing Costs.

The total number of patients admitted during the year (including Smallpox cases) was 593, as compared with 373 in 1929, 306 in 1928, and 306 in 1927.

The cost per patient per day for the year ending 31st March, 1931, was 9s. 4½d., compared with 9s. 10½d. in 1930, 12s. 0½d. in 1929, 13s. 11½d. in 1928, and 14s. 1½d. in 1927.
