

During the year, the health of the Staff has, on the whole, been good.

Constitution.

The South Rotherham and Kiveton Park District Isolation Hospital Committee is constituted under the provisions of the Isolation Hospitals Act, 1893, by an Order made by the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire dated the 21st day of July, 1897. The constitution of the Committee was modified by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 7) Act, 1911; also by the Ministry of Health Provisional Order Confirmation (Sheffield Extension) Act, 1921; and again by the West Riding of Yorkshire (Maltby Urban District) Confirmation Order, 1924.

Hospitals.

The Institutions maintained by the Committee comprise a General Infectious Diseases Hospital at Swallownest, near Sheffield, and a Smallpox Hospital at Brampton-en-le-Morthen.

The Hospital at Swallownest was erected between May, 1902, and June 1904, by Mr. Thomas Roper, at a cost of £12,678, on a site containing four acres, to plans prepared by Mr. J. D. Webster.

An additional piece of land containing approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ acres was purchased in 1927 for contemplated extensions.

The premises at Swallownest took the place of a wooden structure belonging to the Rotherham R.D.C., and used for the reception of persons suffering from infectious diseases.

The accommodation at Swallownest was increased in the year 1926 by the erection of a 10-bed cubicle block, by Mr. W. Memmory, at a cost of £3,351, to plans prepared by Mr. J. Haslam.

Further additions were made by Messrs. Bramwell, Lighthall and Co., Ltd., to the Administrative Block at the same time, at a cost of £1,825, under the superintendence of the same Architect, for the accommodation of extra staff.

In 1929, a small addition was made to the Administrative Block in the form of a food pantry, and the Porter's Lodge was enlarged, at a cost of £818, to plans prepared by Mr. F. W. Chapman.

The Smallpox Hospital at Brampton-en-le-Morthen was constructed in 1908 on a site containing 2 acres.

This Hospital consists in part of the wooden structure originally forming the Infectious Diseases Hospital of the Rotherham R.D.C., from whom it was purchased.

The removal of this building from Swallownest and its re-erection with additions was carried out by Mr. E. Martin, under the supervision of Mr. J. E. Whitehead. With land, this Hospital cost £2,007.

An Isolation Block was added in 1928, at a cost of £60.

Accommodation.

The accommodation of the Hospitals according to the standards of the Ministry of Health is as follows:—

SWALLOWNEST.—Scarlet Fever Block ... 20 beds.

Typhoid Fever Block ... 8 beds.

Isolation Block ... 4 beds.

Cubicle Block ... 10 beds.

BRAMPTON.— Smallpox ... 12 beds.
