Report of the Annual Meeting

The Minutes of the last Annual Meeting were taken as read.

The Honorary Secretary read the Report of the Board of Management.

Report of the Board of Management to the Annual Meeting.

The Board of Management have much pleasure in presenting their Sixty-sixth Annual Report on the work of the Hospital for the year 1934.

As will be seen from the Accounts sent out with the notice calling this meeting, the Income for the year amounts to £11,499 10s. 8d. as compared with £11,565 11s. 4d. for 1933, while the Expenditure has increased to £12,810 4s. 8d. from £11,997 10s. 11d. The excess of expenditure over income for the year is £1,311 1s. 0d. as compared with £431 19s. 7d. for the previous year. The increase in expenditure is mainly due to larger purchases of Drugs and Chemicals, to heavier expenditure on Renewals and Repairs and to increases in Salaries, Wages and Pensions.

From the foregoing it will be observed that a considerably increased income is necessary if the efficiency of the Hospital is to be maintained, and the Board therefore appeal once again to the public to assist them in their efforts to provide the best possible accommodation and attention for the sick children of the City and County. New subscribers are needed, and the Board hope that those who sympathise with the cause will come forward and, if possible, enter into a covenant to subscribe for a period of at least seven years, for by this means the Hospital is enabled to obtain the benefit of Income Tax Relief. A suitable form of covenant is to be found in the Annual Report.

Miss Willoughby and the Ladies' Working Party have again materially assisted the Hospital, not only by the making of garments for the patients, but also by contributing a sum of $\pounds 23$ 14s. 6d. to the Funds.

It is with great pleasure that the Board refer to the help afforded by the Ladies' Committee, by means of whose Pound Day collections the sum of £174 6s. 0d. has been handed over to the Hospital.

The Churches and Chapels have contributed the sum of £102 7s. 8d. to the Funds.

The Nottingham and Notts. Hospital Saturday Committee have contributed £250 to the Funds.

The Board desire to place on record their appreciation of the work of Messrs. Hubbart, Durose & Pain, who have again acted as Honorary Auditors of the Hospital.

The Board deem themselves fortunate in their Honorary Chaplain, the Rev. John Waring. As usual, he has been untiring in his kindly efforts on behalf of children and staff alike.

The Board are happy to record their deep gratitude to the Members of the Honorary Medical Staff and the Honorary Dental Surgeon whose services to the Hospital have again been invaluable.

The Board desire gratefully to acknowledge the help rendered to the Hospital by the Resident Medical Officers, the Matron and the Staff.

It is with deep regret that the Board reports the death of Miss Madeleine Lorsignol, one of the Resident Medical Officers, and deepest sympathy is tendered to her parents. A tablet is being placed in one of the wards in memory of her.

The Board also desire to express their thanks to all subscribers and other helpers of the Hospital who have not been enumerated above.

Finally, the Board of Management desire to draw attention to the deficit of $\pounds 1,311$ 1s. 0d. on the year's working. New subscribers are needed, for our income must be increased. Failing this, the assistance which this Hospital can give to the sick and suffering children of the City and County may have to be curtailed. The Board hope that this appeal will not fall on deaf ears, but will strike a responsive chord in the hearts of those who are concerned with the welfare of children.

MEDICAL REPORT AND STATISTICS FOR 1934

Mr. F. Crooks read the Medical Report which was as follows:-

During the year 1934, 982 cases were admitted to the Hospital. There were 383 major operations on In-patients and 12 cases of infectious diseases, and 111 deaths during the year.

In the Out-patient Department there were 46,798 total attendances, made up as follows:—

Mr. Crooks expressed, on behalf of the Honorary Medical Staff, their appreciation of the way in which the Board of Management continue to do everything possible to provide all necessary facilities for carrying on the medical work of the Hospital. He stated that the Hospital is now well equipped with the most modern methods and equipment for the treatment of children, and recently provisions have been made for more extensive bio-chemical analyses work which is being done by Miss Lander.

Mrs. J. D. Player, in moving the adoption of the Reports, said how much she appreciated the honour which was paid to her last year in her election as President of the Hospital, and her year of office had been a very pleasant one. Mrs. Player also said that it was not always easy for things to go smoothly, but the Matron and her Staff are always ready to meet any emergency, and come through smiling. Whenever she visits the Hospital, she marvelled at the patience and cheerfulness of the little inmates, who, in spite of their uncomfortable positions in the open-air wards, never grumbled, but always seemed to be happy and contented.

Mrs. Player acknowledged the help of Miss Eveline Bright, who has for many years acted as Treasurer of the Pound-Day collection. She also wished to thank the Nig-Nog Club, which continues to raise money by flag days and entertainments; they have already endowed two cots at a cost of £2,000, and they are now giving the money they collect towards the upkeep of the Hospital, which is such appreciated. The Members of the Club, and the Honorary Secretary, Mr. Ghest, have done splendid service in organising the various efforts.

Mrs. Player said that she had received a letter from her old friend Mr. Samuel Thorpe, enclosing a cheque for 100 guineas, as a contribution to the Hospital—another of his generous acts. It will be remembered that he has already endowed two cots.

In rising to second the adoption of the Reports, the Sheriff expressed the regrets of the Lord Mayor in his inability to attend the Meeting. He said that when he and the Lord Mayor receive invitations to functions of this sort they sometimes wonder whether they do any good at all by coming, but on considering that there are many people who are doing this good work quietly, all the year round, it is only right that the civic heads should visit them and see for themselves what is being done, and if their visits were any encouragement, they had very great pleasure in coming.

The Sheriff said there was no doubt that the Hospital is doing a very great work in the City of Nottingham, and that there were hundreds of men and women living healthy lives as the result of treatment they had received when children. He said that the City of Nottingham had a lot to be thankful for—its children, however poor, could go to the Hospital and receive the very best treatment and attention available.

Looking down the Balance Sheet, the Sheriff remarked that it read very much like the reports of the Corporation spending committees, but unlike the Hospital, they have only to ask for money and they get it; but there is this about Nottingham people—if it is for a good cause the money will be forthcoming.

The Sheriff concluded by wishing every success to the Hospital, which had such an influence for good amongst the young children of the City.

Mr. Player, in supporting the adoption of the Reports, wished to make reference to one or two matters therein. Firstly, he did not think that people fully realised the amount of work which is done in the Hospital; he would

like to repeat the figures which Mr. Crooks had read out, in arother form. During the year there were 47,000 attendance at the Hospital, and 3,000 operations were performed. The Out-patient Department attendances average 150 for every working day in the year. In considering the excess of expenditure over income, Mr. Player said that this was rather a serious matter, but this was no excuse for lessening the efficiency of the Hospital.

Mr. Player drew attention to the fact that the Hon. Secretary, Mr. F. Pragnell, was to broadcast an appeal on May 19th on behalf of the Hospital, and in wishing success to Mr. Pragnell, he asked all those who were interested in the Hospital to encourage their friends to send in their pence, shillings, and may be pounds in response to the Appeal.

In commenting on the contribution made by the Nottm. and Notts. Children's Hospital Cot and Free Medicine Fund Mr. Player said this was beyond all praise and he asked Mr. Bosworth, the Chairman of the Fund, to convey to the subscribers at their next meeting the appreciation of the Board of Management of the great effort they had made. He also made reference to the Head Teachers' Association, which had increased its contributions this year, a fact which was very encouraging.

The children were not forgotten on Jubilee Day, and Mr. Player told how the little inmates enjoyed their teaparty given to them by the Matron, and attended by the Hon. Chaplain and Mrs. Waring, with their usual kindness and forethought.

In conclusion, Mr. Player said how much he appreciated the work of the Honorary Medical Staff, and that, but for their splendid services, the Hospital could not be run at all.

The Reports were then unanimously adopted.

Mr. Truman proposed a Vote of Thanks to the Board of Management, the Trustees, the Hon. Medical Staff, the Hon. Dental Surgeon, the Hon. Chaplain, the Hon. Treasurer, the Hon. Secretary, the Hon. Auditors and the Election Committee for their services during the past year.

Mr. Pidgon seconded the resolution, and it was carried unanimously.

In proposing the election of the President, Mr. Player said that this was the most important item on the agenda, and he was very glad to say that Mrs. Clifton have ery graciously given her consent to act as President for the coming year. Mr. Player stated that the association of the Clifton family with the Hospital dated back for more than twenty-five years. Lady Bruce was President in 1910, and was for many years Chairman of the Ladies' Committee, and he felt sure that nothing could be more appropriate and pleasing than the revival of this old association.

Major Barber, in seconding this proposal, said that he had known Mrs. Clifton for a number of years and he felt sure that she would make a very good President.

The resolution was carried unanimously.

Mrs. Clifton, in acknowledging her election as President, said how glad she was to have an opportunity to express her thanks for this honour. She realised that she would have a difficult task in following Mrs. Player, but she was looking forward to her year of office with much pleasure.

FOR PROVIDING CLOTHING FOR THE PATIENTS.

IT is the custom in the Children's Hospital when a patient is admitted to set aside all clothes in which the child arrives, and as long as the child remains in the ward it is clothed entirely at the expense of the Hospital.

Hitherto no provision has been made for procuring a regular supply of clothing, but the Hospital has been dependent on the occasional gifts of friends. This system is found to be entirely inadequate to meet the demand, as a proper stock of clothing cannot be depended on.

The garments chiefly required are :---

Flannel Vests (white).

Flannel and Twilled Calico Night Clothing. Pinafores.

Socks and Stockings.

Knitted Vests. Small White Flannel Jackets. Socks, &c., for Infants.

Suits for Boys up to 14 years of age, and Frocks for Girls of the same age.

Cast-off Clothing is also acceptable.
