Governors of the Nottingham Children's Hospital was held on the 13th May, in the Board Room of the Hospital.





REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT TO THE ANNUAL MEETING.

The Board of Management have much pleasure in presenting their Sixty-Seventh Annual Report on the work of the Hospital for the year 1935.

As will be seen from the Accounts sent out with the Notice calling the Meeting, the year has been a satisfactory one resulting in an Excess of Income over Expenditure of £660 2s. 0d. as compared with a deficit in 1934 of £1,311 1s. 0d. This happy result is mainly due to the receipt of certain exceptional donations as follows:—

The Ladies' Working Party have again rendered great service to the Hospital by making garments for the little patients and also contributing the sum of £24 0s. 0d. to the Funds.

The Pound Day Collection organised by the Ladies' Committee resulted in a sum of £189 15s. 0d. being handed over to the Funds of the Hospital, and the Board are very grateful to Miss Eveline Bright and the Members of the Committee for their valuable help.

The contributions from the Churches and Chapels amounted to £81 17s. 1d.

The Nottingham and Notts. Hospital Saturday Committee have again contributed the sum of £250 0s. 0d. to the Funds.

Messrs. Hubbart, Durose & Pain have again acted as Honorary Auditors of the Hospital and the Board desire to place on record its gratitude to them.

Both Children and Staff alike are indebted to the Honorary Chaplain, the Rev. John Waring, whose kindly sympathy and help have always been at their disposal.

The Board acknowledges gratefully the invaluable services rendered to the Hospital by the Honorary Medical Staff and the Honorary Dental Surgeon.

The Board offers its thanks to the Resident Medical Officers, the Matron and the Staff for the untiring work which they have done during the year.

In conclusion the Board desire to draw the attention of all to the pressing needs of the Hospital and to call for new subscribers to assist in carrying on the great work being achieved by it. The alleviation of suffering and pain at all times arouses compassion, but how much more in the case of little children?

Dr. B. R. B. Truman read the Medical Report which was as follows:—

During the year 1935, 1,146 cases were admitted to the Hospital. There were 470 major operations on In-patients and 31 cases of infectious diseases, and 127 deaths during the year.

In the Out-patients Department there were 48,092 total attendances, made up as follows:—

Dr. Truman pointed out that there was a considerable increase in the number of admissions in 1935 as compared with 1934, and he was pleased to say that the death rate was lower.

In referring to the death rate, Dr. Truman said that it was not unduly high and was lower than it has been, but in his opinion it could be, at any rate, halved. He said that one thing that would help to lower the death rate more than anything else would be if parents or those responsible would send their children to the Hospital in due time, as on looking through the Hospital reports it was found that a large number of children died, say, three hours after admission. This meant that children were rushed to the Hospital in a moribund condition. Dr. Truman pointed out that no child was ever refused admission to the Hospital, and if a child was not brought in until it was practically dving, it did not give the staff a chance. "Valuable little lives may be lost by delay. Twenty-four hours makes all the difference ", he said. He had even known children brought in for emergency operations two days too late, and although the staff did wonders they cannot work miracles, and many more lives would have been spared if people responsible for the children had sent them on, say, Monday instead of Wednesday.

Dr. Truman hoped the press would give publicity to this point, as he thought parents failed to realise the importance of sending their children to the Hospital immediately they became ill. If no serious illness developed, often timely advice could be given as to feeding, clothing, etc. Nothing is trivial which affects a child.

In mentioning the X-Ray Department, Dr. Truman said how glad he was to see that the number of attendances during the year had increased considerably, as it was a very valuable aid to diagnosis, and he hoped this method would be employed even more in the future.

In conclusion Dr. Truman noted that the total number of Out-patients had increased considerably during the year.

Mrs. Cliftton, in moving the adoption of the excellent and highly interesting reports, said what a very great pleasure her year of office as President of such a wonderful Hospital had given her. She said that it was a Children's Hospital second to none for site, building and appointment, and all those connected with the Hospital felt impregnated with the wisdom, experience, kind interest and great generosity of Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Player.

Mrs. Clifton said that children from the poorest conditions in our City and County are admitted to the Hospital and welcomed, and whilst appreciating to the full the loving care they get under the matron, her assistants and nurses, the expert advice of our surgeons and doctors, still, she thought, cures go deeper. In her opinion the days, weeks and sometimes months spent by the children in the beautiful and cheerful surroundings of the Hospital brought to their mental outlook something that had never been there before. The children must appreciate the beauty of order and cleanliness, the comfort and sympathy, and the generous but firm discipline, and leave the Hospital not only cured but better in mind and better able to meet the difficult world.

Mrs. Clifton referred to the happy situation as disclosed in the report read by the Secretary, and wondered whether the expenditure would exceed the income during the coming year, as, she understood, already several hundreds of pounds had been spent on necessary painting and renewals. Mrs. Clifton felt confident that knowing the value Nottingham people placed on its Children's Hospital and their generosity, there would be more exceptional donations forthcoming, and she stressed the importance of extending the subscription list. There is a feeling of dependency in a long and healthy subscription list, and she urged the necessity for everyone to try and obtain more subscribers.

In conclusion, Mrs. Clifton hoped that during next year everything that is good would come to the Hospital. She knew that they were going to have a very charming President who would take the greatest interest in the Hospital.

In rising to second the adoption of the reports, the Lord Mayor stressed the fact that more publicity should be given

to the remarkable work done in the Hospital, and he felt that if this were done there would be no shortage of funds. He also referred to the exceptional donations which had been received during the past year and regretted the fact that every year was not a Jubilee year, and also that Wireless Appeals could not be made more frequently. Nevertheless, he thought there were many untapped sources of revenue that were worth considering by people who had a desire to help to alleviate the suffering amongst the children. Many social functions such as whist drives, bridge drives, garden parties, etc. might be organised which would help to meet the current expenses of the Hospital.

Mr. Player welcomed the presence of the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress and Mrs. Mitchell, and in supporting the adoption of the reports thanked all good friends of the Hospital for their labour and generosity during the year. He referred more particularly to the efforts of the Children's Hospital Cot and Free Medicine Fund who have for many years past been the largest supporters.

Mr. Player was very sorry to report that the Nignogs were not holding a flag day this year. This was through no fault of their own, but circumstances were such that could not be helped. This would reduce the income by about £250 or more.

Mr. Player endorsed Dr. Truman's remarks regarding the necessity of parents bringing their children to the Hospital before it was too late, and thus giving the staff a fair chance to effect a cure. Mr. Player then read a letter received by Matron a few weeks ago which showed what can be done when cases are promptly dealt with. The letter read as follows:—

"Will you please accept this small gift for the amusement of the little patients under your care.

Many years ago, when I was eight years old, I was an In-patient of your valuable Institution, it was the year 1870, I was suffering with Hip joint disease, one of my legs was 3½ inches shorter than the other, but so complete was the cure that I do not know which leg it was that was affected.

I have always felt that I wanted to do something if I possibly could to show my appreciation, though this is totally inadequate, still I hope you will accept it in the spirit in which it is given. Wishing your splendid Institution every success."

In conclusion Mr. Player said how much the services and kindly interest of the Chaplain, Mr. Waring, were appreciated by the Hospital and nurses. He also thanked Mr. Pragnell for his services during the past year, whose work seems to have increased and with it his willingness to do it.

The Reports were then unanimously adopted.

Mr. Watts proposed a Vote of Thanks to the Board of Management, the Trustees, the Hon. Medical Staff, the Hon. Dental Surgeon, the Hon. Chaplain, the Hon. Treasurer, the Hon. Secretary, the Hon. Auditors and the Election Committee for their services during the past year.

This was seconded by Mrs. T. P. Barber and carried unanimously.

Colonel Clifton, in proposing the election of Lady Belper as President for the ensuing year, said how the children would benefit by her charming personality, and her cheerfulness and sympathy would be an asset to the Hospital.

Mr. A. G. Mellors in seconding the proposal, said that the election of Lady Belper as President would be received with acclamation by everyone.
