OBJECTS OF THE INSTITUTION.

1. To provide for the medical and surgical treatment of the children of the poor during sickness, and for the maintenance of those whom it is desirable to admit in the Hospital.
2. To provide for the medical and surgical treatment of certain forms of disease peculiar to women, and to promote the advancement of medical science with reference to the above-mentioned diseases.
3. To diffuse among the operative classes accurate information on subjects relating to hygienic management of children during their earlier years, and to assist in the education and training of women in the special duties of children's nurses.

Regulations for the Admission of Patients.

The Hospital is entirely free, no recommendation of any kind being required.

Males to the age of twelve years are admissible as In-Patients, and to the age of fourteen as Out-Patients. Females are admissible in either department to the age of 14 years. Under special circumstances, at the discretion of the Medical Board, females beyond that age are admissible for treatment of diseases peculiar to their sex.

Cases which become chronic, or which may otherwise prove unlikely to be benefitted, either in the Hospital or Dispensary are not retained.

OUT-PATIENTS.

Out-Patients are admitted to the Dispensary on all the days of the week (Sundays excepted), from 8-30 to 10-0 a.m. The Members of the Honorary Medical Staff are in attendance in the Out-Patient Department as follows:—

PAYING PATIENTS.

Women suffering from certain forms of disease peculiar to their sex, and children requiring either medical or surgical treatment, are received into the Hospital as "Paying Patients."

Women Paying Patients occupy a Special Ward, and are required to pay a fee of not less than three guineas weekly.

Children Paying Patients are placed in the general Wards suitable for their diseases, and at least one guinea weekly has to be paid for them.

Paying Patients are received into the Hospital on a written order of admission from the Honorary Physician or Surgeon, who will supervise the treatment, or by the House Surgeon, subject to the subsequent approval of such Physician or Surgeon.

Report of the Committee of Management

For the Year ended December 31st, 1927.

THE Committee of Management have pleasure in presenting to the Governors, Subscribers and Friends, their Seventy-second Annual Report, together with the Treasurer's Annual Statement of Accounts for the year ending December 31st, 1927, and in conveying to them their appreciation of the generous support accorded to the Hospital during the year.

The work of the Hospital has been carried out efficiently in all departments, and notwithstanding the difficulties and drawbacks of the present building, the year has been one of progress.

The Committee report with sorrow the death of Mr. Frederick A. Southam, M.A., M.B., F.R.C.S. Mr. Southam was Hon. Surgeon from March, 1883 to February, 1886, and Hon. Surgeon for Diseases of Children from that date to October, 1903 when he was appointed Hon. Consulting Surgeon, which position he held to the date of his death. The Committee deplore the loss of a valued colleague and place on record their high appreciation of the services rendered by Mr. Southam to the Hospital.

Mr. Richard Hope Miller, of Knutsford, was appointed a member of the Committee of Management in July last.

The Committee desire to express their gratitude to the Ladies' Committee for the valuable assistance they have given in the domestic arrangements of the Hospital, and for the support accorded in the collection of funds for the new Hospital. The Committee also tender appreciated thanks to Miss Craven of Broughton Park, for holding an American Tea, and Mrs. F. Heywood of Broughton Park, for holding a Jumble Sale which realised £40 7s. 3d. and £38 10s. 0d. respectively, for the Building Fund.

The Committee desire to thank all Subscribers, Donors, Friends and various Committees of Funds, for their support to the Hospital and Building Fund, without which voluntary Hospitals would be unable to carry on. A list of donors will be found on pages 22 to 41 of the Report.

In addition, a bequest of £200 has been received from the Trustees of the late Henry Woodhead, Esq.

The response to the Appeal for the Building Fund has not been very encouraging, and the Committee trust that the public realise the urgent necessity for a new Hospital and that their willing co-operation is needed to make this an immediate factor.

The Committee have decided, with the approval of the Charity Commissioners, to provide medical and surgical treatment of all cases in the new Hospital, in addition to the provision for the treatment of Women and Children as in the present Hospital.

The need for a General Hospital on the north side of the City has become an urgent necessity, and it is hoped that the response to a further appeal for this object will be sufficiently successful to enable the work to be proceeded with at an early date.

The amount now standing to the credit of the Fund is £41,547 3s. 6d., in addition to which promises amounting to £3,032, have been received.

The internal decoration of the Hospital has received attention, and the brighter conditions have added materially to the comfort of the staff and patients.

The Committee have appointed Mr. Donald McKay Sutherland, M.D. (Manch.), F.R.C.S. (Eng.), as Honorary Assistant Surgeon for Children.

In January last, Dr. Mary Stirk was appointed Senior House Surgeon in place of Dr. D. Hepburn Craig, and Dr. F. H. Bowden as Junior House Surgeon in place of Dr. Stirk. In July, Dr. Bowden succeeded Dr. Stirk as Senior House Surgeon, and Dr. Margaret Dyson was appointed Junior House Surgeon in place of Dr. Bowden.

The Committee of the Linen Guild tender thanks to all who have subscribed or given help in goods or clothing to the Guild during 1927. They would like to make special mention of the kindness of Mrs. R. S. Boddington and Mrs. Dafforn in holding an American Tea which realised £47. An appeal is made for additional subscribers and workers and the Secretary, Mrs. R. S. Boddington of Ashford, Wilmslow, will be pleased if names and addresses of any ladies likely to be interested in helping could be sent to her.

The children thoroughly enjoyed the visit of Father Christmas who visited the Hospital (through the kindness of Messrs. Lewis's) in addition to the Christmas Trees which were placed in the wards.

Thanks are due to the Radium Institute for the help that has been given in cases requiring radium treatment, not only for the services that have been rendered by Members of the Staff, but also for having provided the necessary radium.

The Committee desire to express their appreciation of the excellent services so freely rendered by the members of the Medical Staff, and their satisfaction at the manner in which the Lady Superintendent and the Nursing Staff have performed their duties.

Report of the Medical Board for 1927.

THE number of In-patients treated during the year was 1,110, a decrease of 68 compared with the year 1926.

Operations were performed in the Hospital to the number of 782, a small decrease on the previous year's figures. In the Out-patient Department 131 operations were performed, an increase of 27 as compared with the year 1926.

The number of consultations in the Out-patient Department was 22,993 an increase of 2,538.

Dental Treatment was given to 383 patients, and X-ray treatment to 100 patients.

The Massage Department reports a small increase in the number of patients treated during the year. 245 patients received 5,907 treatments.

The Artificial Sunlight apparatus continues to be used with excellent results. 3,384 treatments have been given during the twelve months.

Mr. D. M. Sutherland joined the Board during the last month of the year.

The Medical Board has pleasure in expressing again its satisfaction with the nursing and general arrangements of the Hospital, so far as these are possible in the present building.

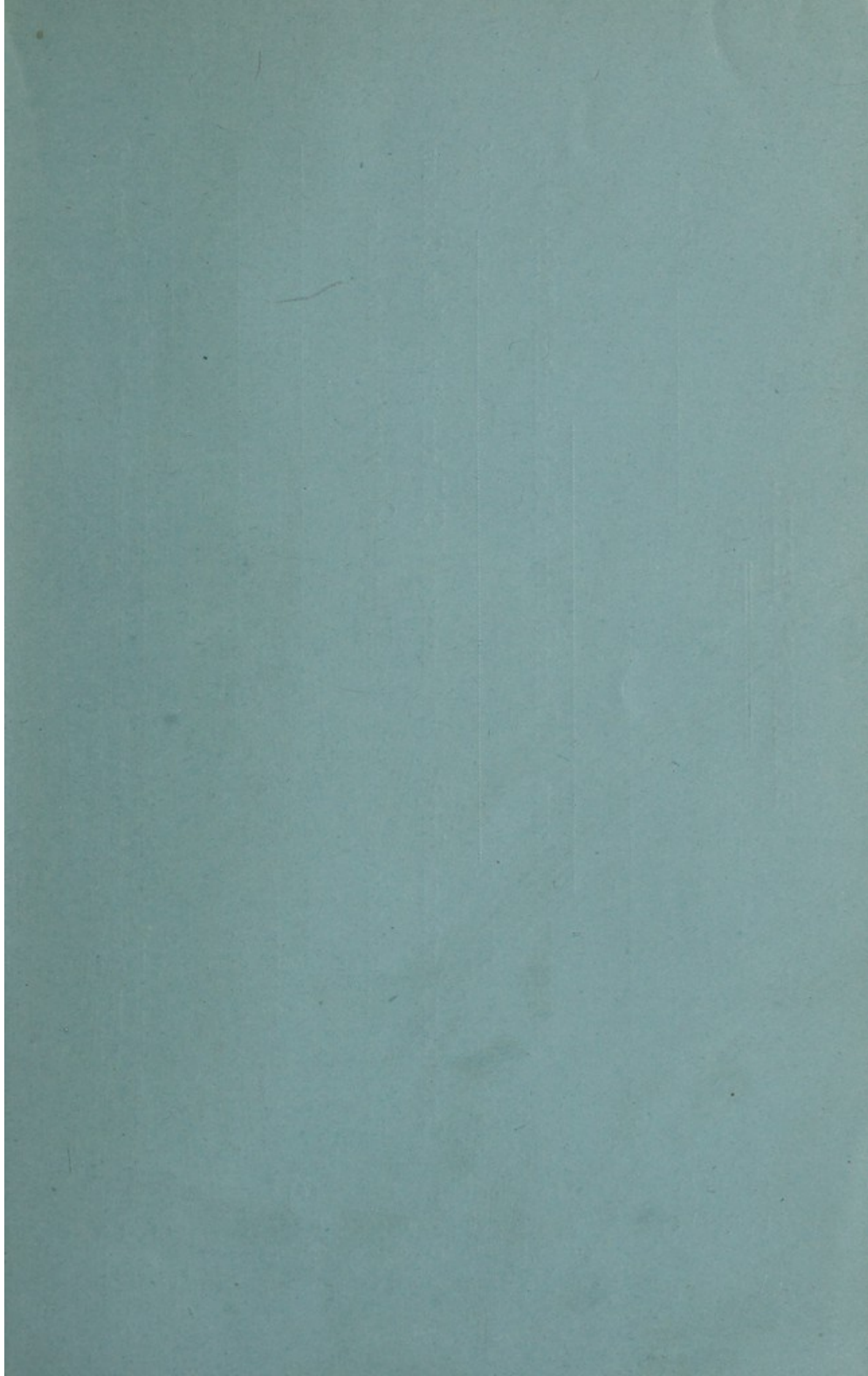

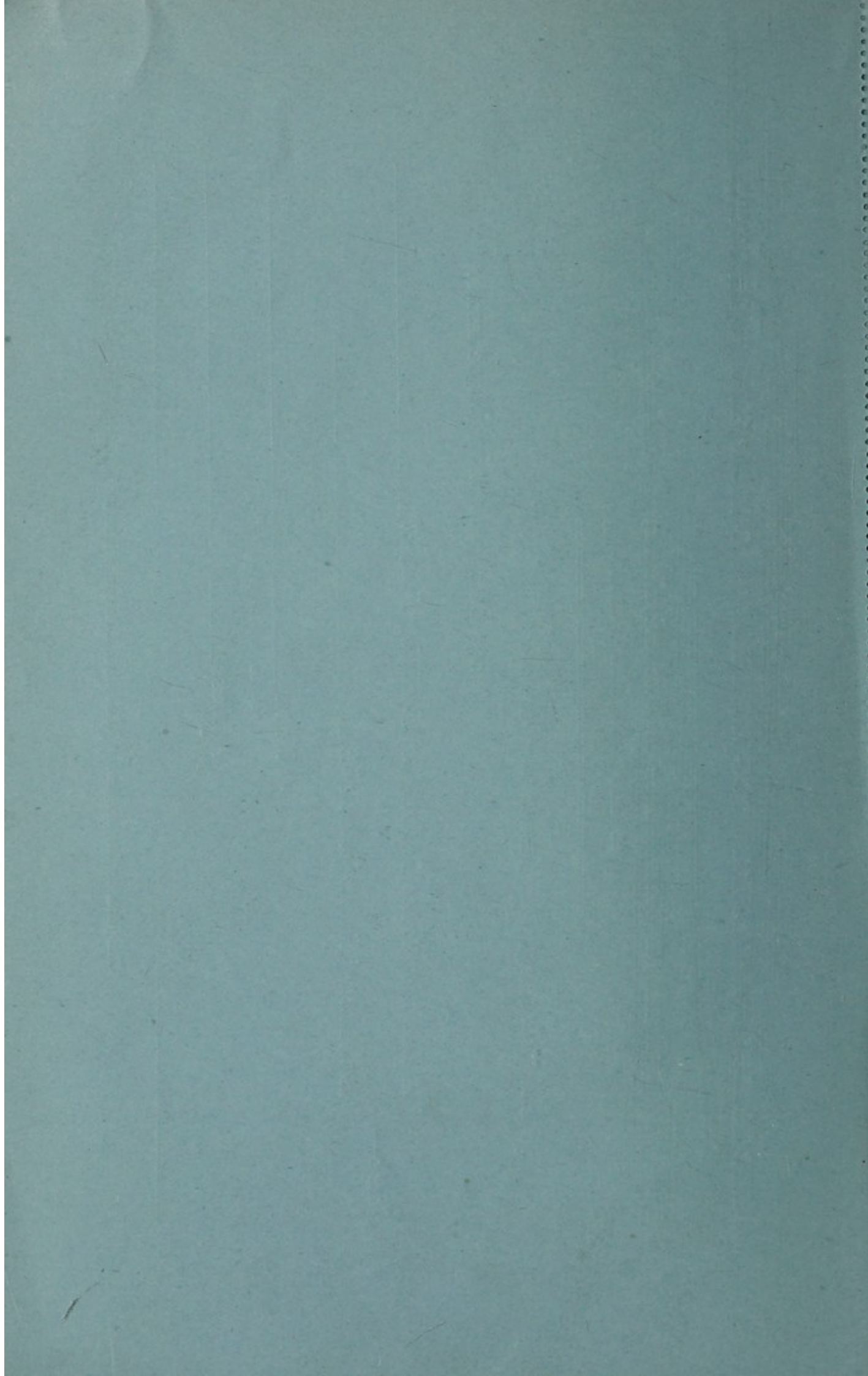

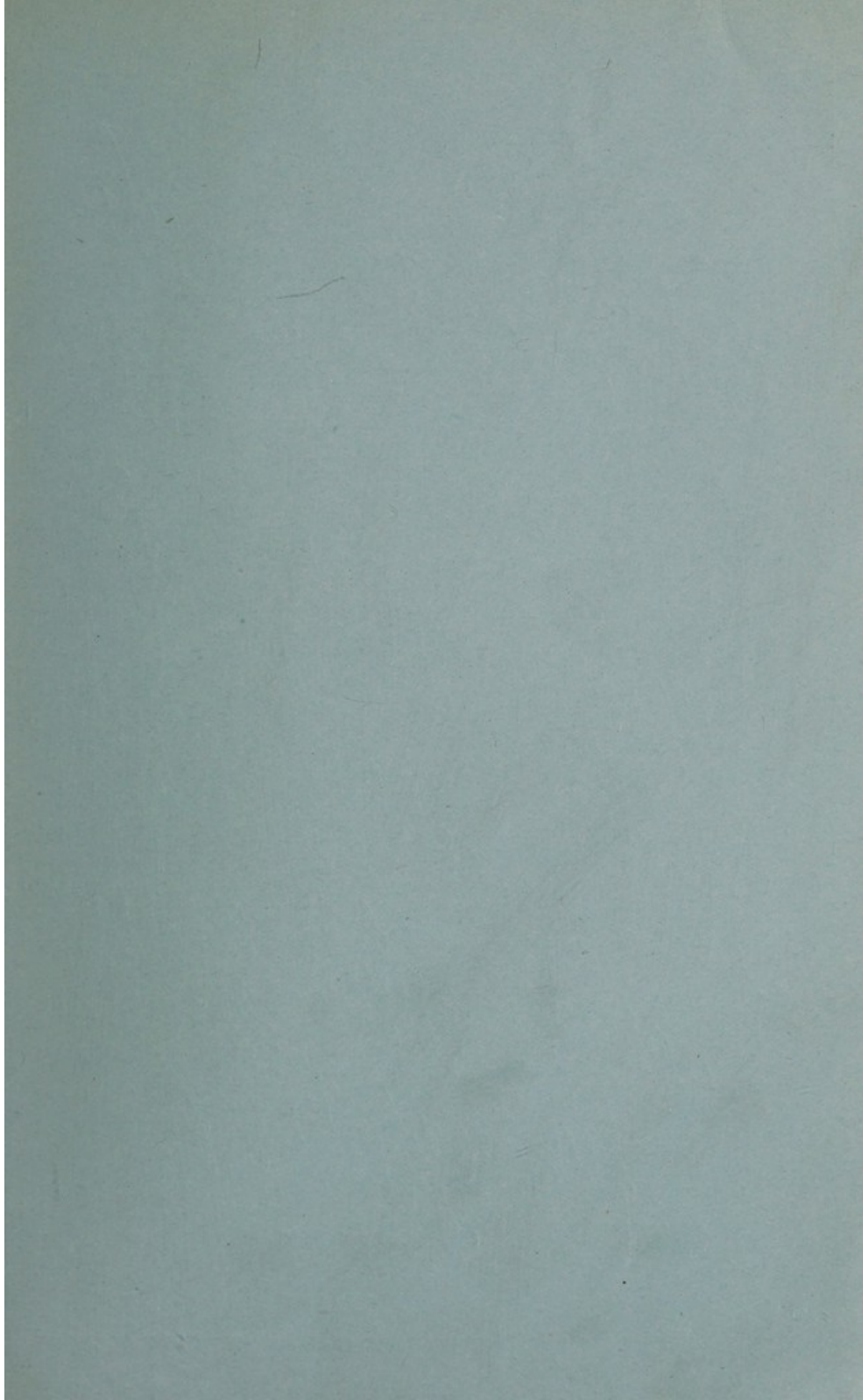
