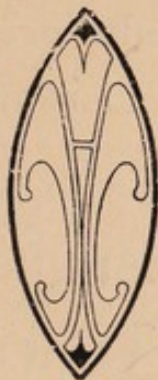

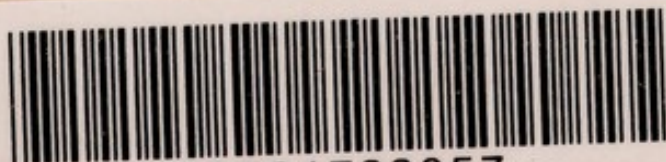

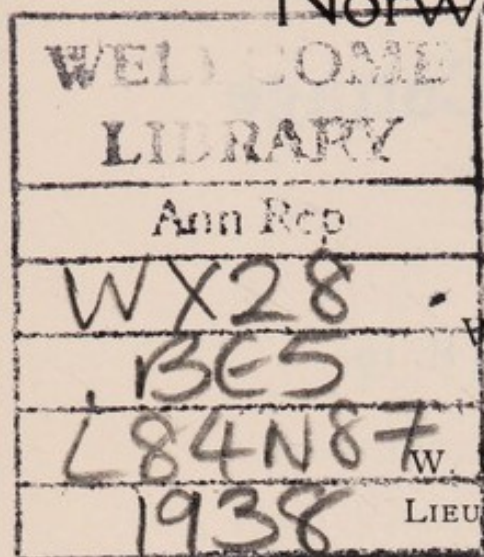

## REPORT

For the year ending 31st December, 1938

---

### Committee of Management.

The Committee of Management beg to submit the Fifty-Eighth Annual Report.

### Hon. Consulting Gynecologist.

The Committee regret to have to record the death of Mr. J. Bright Banister, M.A., M.D., M.R.C.P., F.R.C.S. the Honorary Consulting Gynecologist, who had rendered much valuable service to the Hospital. The position has been accepted by Mr. Frank Cook, B.Sc. (LOND.), M.B., B.S., F.R.C.S. (ENG.), F.C.O.G.

### Inspection of Hospital.

The annual inspection on behalf of King Edward's Hospital Fund took place on the 13th July, 1938, the visitors being Sir Lancelot Barrington-Ward, K.C.V.O., F.R.C.S., and Sir Adrian Pollock, K.C.M.G.

### Hospital Flag Day.

The Flag Day collection for all Hospitals in the Metropolitan Police area which are outside the London County Council area was held on May 14th, 1938. The collection for the Norwood area was again organised by Mrs. Stanley Morter and resulted in the sum of £81. 7. 4 being contributed to the General Fund, of which £67. 19. 9 was allocated to this Hospital.



### Income and Expenditure.

The Income and Expenditure account for the year (pages 14 to 19) shows an excess of Expenditure over Income of £44. 3. 7. This favourable result compared with that of the preceding year is due mainly to an increase of £120 in the amount received from Legacies ; the sum of £101. 19. 6 less expenses received from the Special Appeal ; accumulated interest and dividends, £192 arising from the Dresel Bequest, and to increased contributions on account of services to patients.

### Special Appeal

At the Annual General Meeting on the 15th March, 1938, it was announced that in view of the deficit (£726) in the Hospital finances for the year 1937, a Special Appeal for additional funds would be made to the public. A circular letter was issued by the General Committee dated 28th March, 1938, giving full information as to the services rendered by the Hospital. About 1200 letters were issued and the appeal was advertised in and supported by the local newspaper press. The receipts amounted to £101. 19. 6 less expenses £20 15. 0.

The Committee have the pleasure to Report that a Bequest amounting to £3,656. 15. 8 has been received, per Messrs. Lewis and Payne, being the residue of the estate of Mrs. A. M. L. Dresel deceased in memory of Evelina Louise Devereux, Alice Pawley, Augustus Pawley and Adolphe Dresel. This sum forms an addition to the Endowments of the Hospital, and is invested in approved securities.

### Land, Buildings, and Equipment of Hospital.

The expenditure on Buildings and equipment for the year amounted to £157. 10. 0.

### Establishment.

### **Beds Occupied**

There has been a marked improvement in the number of beds occupied during the year, the average being 26.70 compared with 22.41 for the year 1937. The number of patients admitted was 615 compared with 484 in the preceding year.

### **Patients' Average Costs.**

It is gratifying to be able to record that the average cost of each In-Patient per week for the year 1938 was £3. 15. 2 compared with £4. 5. 7 for the year 1937 a reduction of 10s. 5d. per Patient, while the average total cost of each In-Patient was £8. 13. 8 for the year 1938 compared with £10. 5. 5 for the year 1937, a reduction of £1. 11. 9 per Patient (see Statistical Tables, pages 12 and 13.)

### **Electro-Medical Department.**

The number of X Ray Examinations was 617 in 1938, compared with 489 in 1937, and the number of Physiotherapy patients was 344 in 1938 compared with 340 in 1937.

### **Blood Transfusion.**

The cordial thanks of the Committee are again due to Mr. P. I. Oliver, O.B.E., Honorary Secretary of the British Red Cross Blood Transfusion Service and to their members who have so promptly and generously responded to the calls upon them.

### **Central Funds.**

The Committee tender their thanks for the following grants which form part of the Income of the year :— to King Edward's Hospital Fund £100; to the Alexandra Day Fund £125, and the Hospital Sunday Fund £10. A List of Donations is given on pages 25 and 26.



### **Ladies' Linen League.**

The Committee express their thanks to the Members of the League for their valuable work during the year.

Subscriptions 1937—38 amounted to £65. 12. 4 and 100 articles in kind; the money including £16. 10. 6 from the Stock Exchange Dramatic and Operatic "Help Yourself" Society as our share of their Christmas Charity Fund, and £3. 0. 10 for Sale of Silver Paper, collected and disposed of by Mrs. Martin Lewis.

Keeping a rather larger balance than usual (£27. 17. 11) to be spent later—the Hospital was provided with: 24 scarlet blankets; 12 sister's overalls; 12 sheets; 22 draw-sheets; 74 pillow slips; 48 under-pillow slips; 24 jaconet pillow-slips; 48 ring covers; 59 towels (various); 24 sand-bag covers; 36 tray-cloths; 10 tea-cloths; 48 basin cloths; 2 pairs bed-socks; 12 wringers; 2 hot-water bottle covers; 12 dusters; 27 "many-tail" and 36 triangular bandages; 1 chamois polisher; 24 swabs; 3 gross Cash's names; and tapes, cottons etc. for the sewing-room.

The Monday afternoon meetings continue to get through a lot of useful work, mostly mending and converting; with steady attendances from Mrs. Douglas, Mrs. Reith, Mrs. Horrocks, Mrs. Woods, Miss Turner and Miss Ford. Some members of the 2nd Upper Norwood Ranger Company under Miss D. Mead also give help there on Monday evenings, which is greatly appreciated. And again we must thank Miss Mitting for her usual willing help at home and the number of articles she and her friends and pupils send in.

We are sorry announce the resignation of Mrs. Sidney Ellis from the position of President that she has so ably filled for the last eleven years; and have much pleasure in reporting that Mrs. M. E. Douglas has consented to take her place. We also regret to lose Mrs. L. H. Jones by her removal to Radlett; and welcome Mrs. W. W. Garnham as a Vice-President.

The President, any of the Vice-Presidents, or the Hon. Secretary (addresses on page 4), would all be glad to enlist new members for the Linen League; Subscription 2/6 (minimum) or, at least, two articles in kind.
