#### REPORT

#### For the Year Ended 31st December, 1940.

The Council have much pleasure in presenting their Seventythird Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended the 31st December last, and, in doing so, desire again to express their warmest thanks to the Subscribers, Donors, and Contributors generally, and also to all those who have in many ways so kindly contributed to the welfare of the Hospital and its patients during the year under review.

The Report will be found in a much more restricted form than usual, but the Council hope that their supporters will appreciate that this course has been adopted as economy during the National Emergency.

Even with restrictions on the use of available beds, there has been a heavy demand for the Hospital's services. A record number of cases, 2,563, were admitted, as against 2,230 in 1939. Cases sent to other Hospitals numbered 95, and the number of patients transferred to Infield Convalescent Home was 223. There were 46 cases admitted as the result of Motor Accidents, and 91 patients were received under the Emergency Medical Services of the Ministry of Health. In the Out-Patients Department there were 8,153 new casualty cases, and the number of treatments given amounted to 30,429. In addition there were 1,124 cases for Consultations, 4,773 patients for examination and treatment in the X-Ray Department, 371 Massage patients, and 163 new cases at the Radium Clinic.

On requests from the Hon. Staff, the Hon. Dental Staff carried out much good work for the patients in Hospital.

The Nursing Home had 323 new patients, of whom 69 were Maternity cases, and the average number of beds occupied daily was  $10\frac{1}{2}$ .

The total receipts for General Maintenance were £26,574 9s. 1d., and the payments amounted to £25,336 5s. 8d. The Contributory Scheme provided the major part of the receipts by the sum of £19,870, and the sum of £1,518 was received from the Ministry of Health for cost of providing Casualty Services under the Emergency Medical Services Scheme. Receipts increased by £2,810 over 1939, but payments were £4,678 more, due to heavy increases in costs of Coal, Provisions, Repairs and Renewals (which included over £2,000 for replacement of X-Ray Plant and a Refrigerator, which was installed during the year).

Alexandra Rose Day provided a record profit of  $\pounds 267$  13s. 9d. Sales of Silver Paper realised  $\pounds 13$  12s. 1d. Due to the many other appeals now prevalent, Subscriptions, Donations, Church Collections, and Entertainments have all shown substantial reductions.

Special Gifts included in the General Account were £40 2s. 2d. as a result of special effort by H.M. Submarines building at Barrow, £40 0s. 0d. from the Iron Trades' Employers' Insurance Association Ltd., £34 14s. 0d. from "Gracie Fields" Special Broadcast Appeal, £15 14s. 5d. from the Millom Police and Special Constables (part proceeds of effort), and £15 from the Christian Brotherhood Spiritualistic Mission (3 special collections).

The Nursing Home receipts were  $\pounds 2,916$  9s. 10d., Payments  $\pounds 1,609$  0s. 3d., and the sum of  $\pounds 1,070$  was transferred to the Interest Equalisation Account towards payment off of loans. The outstanding loans on the Nursing Home are now  $\pounds 1,628$ , and there is a further balance due to the Bank of  $\pounds 916$  12s. 1d. The Home has paid off 3/5ths of the original loan in four year's working.

The Endowments Account is increased to  $\pounds 6,657$  by the following Legacies :—The late Mr. Thos. Buttle  $\pounds 10$ , and the late Miss M. M. Barton  $\pounds 6$  18s. 11d.

At the year end, the Building Account shows a Bank Credit of  $\pounds$ 415 13s. 6d., together with the sum of  $\pounds$ 23,725 19s. 1d. invested in Government Securities. The gifts included the magnificent one of  $\pounds$ 17,117 so kindly given by Messrs. Vickers-Armstrongs Ltd. towards the cost of building a new Out-Patient Department and Fracture Clinic, and the sum of  $\pounds$ 1,400 provided by the 1940 efforts of the Barrow Hospital Saturday Demonstration.

The Prichard Ward Building Account Credit Balance is  $\pm 677$  10s. 6d., with a further  $\pm 1,277$  6s. 3d. invested in  $3\frac{1}{2}$ % War Loan.

The total amount available for building purposes when building operations are possible is therefore  $\pounds 26,096$  9s. 4d.

The Ladies' Linen League provided all Bedding and Linen required for Patients and Staff, and Casement and Black-Out Materials for both Staff Homes. The number of articles provided in 1940 was 1,040, of a value of  $\pounds 299$  15s. 10d.

The Hospital Women's Committee raised by special efforts and a Flag Day at Millom, the sum of  $\pounds 42$  for the Operating Theatre Account, and the Council were enabled to replenish Theatre Equipment from this Account at a cost of  $\pounds 74$ .

Improvements effected during the year, in addition to the new Refrigerator and replacement of X-Ray Plant, were that the task of installing additional wash-basins in the Wards, Side-Wards, and Balconies was completed, and this has been a great boon to the Stafi.

The Council regret to record the death during the year of Dr. J. A. Reed, O.B.E., an Hon. Surgeon for over 30 years, a valued member of the Council, and one of the Trustees of the Hospital.

As Mr. Ramsden had resigned as a Trustee, the two vacancies were filled by the appointment of Mr. G. C. Minhinnick, J.P., and Dr. Livingston.

Changes on the Council arose through the resignations of Messrs. A. Crawford (after 16 years service as a representative of the Shipbuilding Dept. of Vickers-Armstrongs Ltd.), W. Bartley, and W. Raybould, to all of whom the Council extend their thanks for good services. Vacancies were also caused by the election of Mr. Minhinnick and Dr. Livingston as Trustees. The vacant seats were filled by the appointments of Messrs. S. Heddles, J. Denny, R. Young, J. Alexander and Dr. J. Campbell Miller.

There were no changes in the Honorary Staff during the year, but Dr. Campbell Miller returned from Army Medical Services and resumed duty as Hon. Surgeon in the Out-Patients Department. Drs. Ronald, J. Magill, and Morrison remain in the Services, as does Mr. Thurston Ireland, Jr., a member of the Hon. Dental Staff.

The sum of f728 has been paid during the year to other Hospitals in respect of treatment given to our contributors or their dependants. The Council desire to again emphasise that treatment at other Hospitals can only be allowed if application has been made on the appropriate contributor's certificate, and consent to same has been given by the Honorary Staff of the Hospital. Prior arrangements by Patients, Doctors, or Specialists are not allowed, and no responsibility will be accepted for the maintenance charges of any contributors violating this regulation.

Contributors genuinely unemployed are entitled to all benefits on payment of arrears from date of last employment (a certificate must be produced from last employer that contributions were paid to last day of employment), but the Council strongly advise that any contributors becoming unemployed should pay on a Direct Contributor's Card (obtainable at the Hospital) during period of unemployment, and thereby avoid any arrears. The rate of contribution for the unemployed is 2d. per week, and this same rate applies to the Wives of Contributors called to the Services, Old-Age-Pensioners who have retired from work, and Widows.

The Council, in concluding their report, desire to express their warmest thanks to the Hon. Medical, Surgical and Dental Staffs, the Radiologist, the Resident Medical and Surgical Staff, the Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Solicitor, Hon. Auditors, the Matron and the Staff generally for the continued valuable and greatly appreciated services rendered to the Hospital.

The Out-Patient Department rendered 30,429 treatments, an increase of 1,314 on the figures of 1939.

The number of In-Patient Operations is 1,249 an increase of 16 on the previous year.

The Out-patient Operations numbered 492, a decrease of 66 on last year's figures.

Details of the work accomplished in the various Departments of the Hospital are given on later pages, and we hope that this will be of interest.

#### NORTH LONSDALE HOSPITAL.

FREE TREATMENT is given not only to all workmen and employees under Scale of Income Limits, resident in Barrow, North Lonsdale or Millom, who are or become contributors to the above Institution, but also to their wives, children or other direct dependents.

Shop Assistants, Domestic Servants, and others who are in employment do not, however, come within the definition of "dependents."

#### HOW TO BECOME A CONTRIBUTOR.

Any workman or employee who pays THREEPENCE (or TWOPENCE if not married and under 21 years of age) per week, becomes a Contributor. This amount must be paid through the employers or funds of the works or trade at which the Contributor is employed. If this is not possible, then it may be sent by post to the Secretary, or paid direct to the Dispenser at the Hospital between the hours of 8-30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays; also 6-30 p.m. and 7-30 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays, and 8-30 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturdays.

#### THE BENEFITS TO WHICH A CONTRIBUTOR AND HIS DIRECT DEPENDENTS ARE ENTITLED.

Admission to the Hospital as an In-Patient or to treatment in the out-Patients' Department, treatment of the EYES, and X-RAY TREATMENT if under Income Limits FREE OF ANY FURTHER CHARGE. Contributors over Income Limits are required to pay for their Surgical or Medical Treatment only a sum to be agreed upon between the member of the Hon. Staff in charge of the case and the patient, or in the X-Ray Department to the Radiologist. Maintenance is free. Arrangements have been made for the efficient treatment of diseases of and accidents to the eyes, and two small wards have been set aside for the indoor treatment of these cases. The Council have a new EYE MAGNET for extracting metal or similar foreign matter from the eye, and also modern X-Ray and Electrical Apparatus. The Council, as far as possible, have also made provision for outside institutional treatment, the patients merely paying their railway fares. Application for Recommends for outside Institutional treatment should be made to the Secretary. Recommends for outside Institutions, subject to the approval of the Hon. Staff, are issued for two months only in the first place, and application should be made for their renewal if longer treatment is required. All Recommends are issued subject to the Regulations governing this Hospital.

The Hospital has the advantage of the services of a large staff of Surgeons, who number no less than 14. The Council hope that all workmen and employees will become Contributors to the Hospital, and so be able to obtain, if required, the benefits set out above.

Further particulars may be obtained on application to the Secretary at the Hospital.

#### TREATMENT OF PATIENTS.

Accidents and urgent operations are attended to at any hour (day or night).

Out-Patients are attended to daily (Sunday excepted) at 9 a.m. It is required of all patients admitted into the Hospital that their relatives or friends provide them with a change of linen,

#### NOTICE TO VISITORS.

and a comb, towel, soap and tooth brush.

Considerable inconvenience having arisen in consequence of the abuse of the privilege allowed to relatives and friends to visit patients in the Hospital, attention is called to the following Rules regarding the admission of visitors. The Nurses and other Officers of the Institution have received instructions to see that the same are strictly adhered to.

1.—No visitor who has been in contact with any infectious case is allowed to visit the Hospital.

2.—Relations and friends may visit patients on Tuesdays and Fridays from 6-30 to 7-30 p.m., and on Sundays from 2 to 3-30 p.m.

3.—No visitor shall be admitted on any other day without the special leave of the House Surgeon or (in his absence) the Matron.

4.—No more than four persons can be allowed to visit a patient on the same day (two at a time).

5.—Children under 14 years of age shall not be allowed in the Childrens' Ward on Visiting Days, except under special circumstances, and then only be permission of the House Surgeon or Matron.

6.—Visitors are requested not to remain long with a patient, nor to sit on the patient's bed; and they are strictly prohibited from entering other Wards.

7.—Visitors bringing to the Patients, without permission, sweetmeats, fruit, liquids, or eatables of any kind or description, will be refused the privilege of again visiting the patient.

8.—Visitors are requested to come clean and tidy in their person and dress.

9.—All or any of the Wards may be closed to Visitors at the discretion of the Matron, or Sister in charge of a Ward.

#### NORTH LONSDALE HOSPITAL PRIVATE NURSING HOME, ALBERT STREET.

On January 1st, 1940, there were 7 patients in the Home. During the year 323 cases were admitted, making a total of 330 as against 324 in the previous year. Of these 305 were discharged cured or relieved, 16 died (1 within 24 hours of admission), and 9 remained in the Home on January 1st, 1941.
