REPORT

The Council of Management have pleasure in submitting their Report for the year 1940.

The year has been an eventful one and it would seem that the Hospital is entering upon its second century of service to the community in the same manner as it did its first. The long awaited Maternity block has been completed and temporarily handed over to the Hertfordshire County Council to provide them with facilities for maternity work for the mothers evacuated from the East End of London. Thus has the tradition established by Dr. Frederick Hawkins in 1840 been preserved.

The other outstanding event is the gift from the Workers' Hospital Fund of a Mobile X-Ray unit and a thoroughly up-to-date anæsthetising apparatus. Both these were urgently needed and are being put to full use and the Council wish to

record their grateful thanks to the Fund for their generous gift.

Dr. A. H. Foster has now retired from the Honorary Medical Staff. The Council wish to thank him for his great help for so many years and to welcome him to the Honorary Consultant Staff. His place as Senior Medical Officer has been taken by Dr. H. R. Grellet.

With regard to the financial position, the General Fund, as will be seen from the Accounts, has improved. As for the Building Fund, from recent calculation it is estimated that the cost of the extensions will be £37,200. Of this amount about £13,000 has been raised by the sale of securities (notably of the War Loan, given by the late Miss Hilda Seebohm) and by transfers from the General Fund, leaving an amount of £24,200 to be found. Arrangements are being made for this sum to be raised by a loan on the security of the agreement with the Herts. County Council under which the County Council makes annual payments to the Hospital which will be used to liquidate the loan over the period covered by the agreement.

When the Hertfordshire County Council terminate their present occupation of the Maternity Wards the cost of furnishing will have to be provided by the Hospital. The Council would, therefore, be grateful for donations for this purpose and also to help pay off the loan as quickly as possible.

The Council is more than grateful to all those who, in spite of the difficulties caused by the War, have continued to give the Hospital their generous support.

The number of In-patients admitted during 1940 was 1,332. Of these 72 were War Casualties and 56 were Road Accidents. The latter cost the Hospital £529 2s. 6d. and of this amount £117 16s. 7d. has been recovered while 21 cases are still unsettled. There were 616 operations in the Theatre and 311 patients were X-Rayed. The average weekly cost of each In-patient was £3 4s. 3d.

In the Out-patients Department 2,396 patients were treated, of whom 97 received Ophthalmic treatment; 56 were Road Accident Cases; and 184 were War Casualties. 227 minor operations were carried out in the Surgery and 1,042 patients were X-Rayed. The cost of each Out-patient was 7/-.

The Hospital has lost two old friends during the year. In February Miss Grace Hall, who was Matron of the Hospital from 1894 to 1918, passed away, and in the next month Mr. G. W. Russell, one of the oldest Vice-Presidents, died. Both will be very much missed.
