

REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1946.

The Board of Management have pleasure in submitting to the Governors and Subscribers the 71st Annual Report and Accounts for the year 1946.

THE WORK OF THE YEAR.

A measure of the value of a hospital to the surrounding community is the number of patients who seek its aid. Although the number of in-patients shows a slight decrease, the number of outpatients' attendances continues to grow. The closing of a number of beds in the latter half of the year accounts for the smaller number of in-patients. Thus there is an abnormal pressure upon the available beds, and also upon a greatly depleted nursing staff.

The major problem has undoubtedly been the adverse staff position to which attention has been drawn in previous years and, unfortunately, there is no prospect of any great improvement in the near future. An acknowledgement of the zealous work of the nursing staff appears later in this report.

FINANCE-ORDINARY INCOME.

A very encouraging increase in the ordinary income is disclosed in the accounts. The total for the year was £38,370 16s. 0d., compared with £35,410 10s. 2d. in 1945. It will be seen that the Contributory Scheme and entertainments account for the increase, offset, however, to a considerable degree, by decreases in other items.

ORDINARY EXPENDITURE.

Unfortunately a rather formidable rise in the ordinary expenditure has to be recorded. This amounts to £8,766 14s. 6d., the respective totals for 1946 and 1945 being £44,022 18s. 2d. and £35,256 3s. 8d. Once again salaries and wages account for a great portion of the increase, with surgery and dispensary, fuel and

highting, decorating, and payments on behalf of members of the Workpeople's Scheme as contributory factors. It may be mentioned here that all grades of the staff, in keeping with those of other hospitals, now come within the recommendations of various authorities concerning conditions of service and rates of salaries and wages.

For the first time for a number of years, 1946 shows an excess of total expenditure over total income of £4,848 1s. 5d. The outlook for 1947 is far from bright, and is a matter of anxiety to the Board of Management.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

A number of changes occurred during the year.

Dr. Norman G. Meade resigned the appointment of Honorary Radiologist, which he had held for no less than 20 years. The Board desire to place on record their warm appreciation of the excellent work performed by him during his long term of office. Under his able guidance the X-Ray Department developed into a most important unit, and many thanks are due to him for his valuable services and helpful co-operation at all times.

Mr. A. B. King, Assistant Honorary Surgeon, left the district during the year. Mr. King, following his appointment to the staff in 1940, served with H.M. Forces for some years and on his return actively participated in the work of the hospital.

Dr. W. G. Brander, Honorary Physician, after a too short connection with the hospital (he was appointed in April, 1946) also left the district at the end of the year to take up another appoinment. During the few months he was with us, Dr. Brander took a most energetic interest in all hospital matters. It is particularly regrettable that Dr. Brander was not able to continue the long association which his father, the late Mr. H. S. Brander, had with the hospital.

Dr. J. D. McCulloch, Honorary Consulting Ophthalmic Surgeon, retired from practice in October. His services were always available when required and his helpful advice greatly appreciated.

It is a matter of considerable regret to the Board that the above gentlemen are no longer with us, but they take with them our best wishes for the future. Mr. R. I. T. Lloyd, M.B., Ch.B., F.R.C.S., a member of the staff of the Royal Eye and Ear Hospital, Bradford, was elected to fill the vacancy of Honorary Consulting Ophthalmic Surgeon.

Early in the year the Board created the appointment of Honorary Surgeon for Diseases of the Ear, Nose and Throat, Mr. Donald Watson, M.B., Ch.B., F.R.C.S., being the first holder of the office. Mr. Watson is well known in his sphere and the innovation has proved a distinct success.

The appointment of Honorary Dental Surgeon was filled by the election of Mr. J. J. Platt, L.D.S., R.C.S. Mr. Platt was later recalled into the Army and his duties are kindly being carried out by Mr. E. W. Wright.

Thanks are again due to Dr. J. P. Berry for undertaking the duties of Honorary Physician prior to the appointment of Dr. Brander.

The work of the Honorary Medical Staff has been greatly assisted by the increase in the number of Resident Medical Staff from two to four.

NURSING STAFF.

Throughout the year the nursing staff have lived up to the high ideals of their profession and by their splendid work under conditions of great stress fully earned the gratitude of the patients and Board of Management. The strain under which the staff had been working for a considerable period made it necessary for a number of beds to be closed in August. This step was taken with great reluctance on the advice of the Honorary Medical Staff and not at the request of the nursing staff, whose valiant efforts to cope with the work are deserving of the highest praise.

A high tribute is also due to the local nurses and members of the St. John Ambulance Brigade and Civil Nursing Reserve who answered the appeal for help. But for their timely services further beds would certainly have been closed, and their continued assistance is greatly valued.

For the sake of patients and staff alike, not only in this, but in other hospitals, it is hoped that the flow of new entrants to the profession will grow, as only by this means can the position be remedied.

NURSES' PRELIMINARY TRAINING SCHOOL.

It may be mentioned here that the rule of the General Nursing Council that hospitals undertaking the complete training of nurses shall possess, or be associated with, a Preliminary Training School, comes into force on 1st June, 1947. It is fortunate that the Board anticipated this step by making an arrangement with the Royal Halifax Infirmary in 1943, which has proved most successful.

State Examination Results :-

Preliminary Examination-4 new entrants. All passed.

Final Examination-11 new entrants. 5 passed, 6 failed.

On 28th October, Lieutenant-Colonel W. Scatterty, M.A., M.D., D.P.H., J.P., Honorary Consulting Physician, made the presentations at the Second Annual Distribution of Prizes from the Dr. J. Nicholson Dobie Memorial Nurses' Prize Fund.

The function was attended by many members of the staff and guests, with His Worship the Mayor (Alderman G. H. Norton, J.P.), the President of the hospital, in the chair.

The Nursing Staff at 31st December comprised:—Matron (Miss Smeeton); Assistant Matron-Sister Tutor (Miss Grunwell); Deputy Assistant Matron (Miss Wood); Night Sisters (Miss Swinbank and Miss Copeland); Radiographers (Miss Houston and Miss Tordoff); Physiotherapists (Miss Claridge and Miss Dean); 5 Sisters, 8 Staff Nurses, and 31 Student Nurses (Student Nurses should number 40), 1 male assistant nurse and a number of volunteer and salaried pant-time nurses and assistant nurses.

The Board welcome the return of Sister Colman-Turner after an absence of 7 years in the Army Nursing Service, and congratulate her on having attained the high rank of Lieutenant-Colonel in the Territorial Army Nursing Service (R.) during her service in India.

DOMESTIC STAFF.

In February, Miss M. Preston, who already possessed a wide experience in catering, was appointed housekeeper.

Although wages were greatly increased early in the year, as recommended by the National Joint Council for Staff of Hospitals, it has remained impossible to obtain resident domestic staff, and it has been far from easy to carry on with the help of daily workers. The Board have decided to accept girls from the Continent to help the situation.

Staff at 31st December:-

Male Staff—Engineer; Theatre, Hall and Night Porters; three Handymen; and two Ambulance Drivers.

Female Staff—Housekeeper (Miss Preston); Cook; Seamstress; 7 resident Maids (should be 16); Resident Laundress and 5 Laundry Workers, and 26 Daily Workers.

AMBULANCE SERVICE.

The Board wish to express their gratitude to those members of the St. John Ambulance Brigade, and others, who so kindly continue to act as ambulance attendants. It would prove very helpful, however, if the number was larger, so that an attendant was always available for night calls.

HOSPITAL LIBRARY.

The Hospital Library Depot in Leeds, and local donors, are heartily thanked for their gifts of books. Further gifts will be welcomed, as the more popular books are badly worn, the most common requests being for thrillers, "Westerns," and love stories. 1,857 books were circulated during the year.

An efficient library service is of inestimable value to those in hospital, and on behalf of the patients and themselves, the Board thank the Honorary Librarian, Mrs. B. P. Matthews, and Mrs.

Leonard Briggs, Mrs. Frank Hartley, and Miss June Briggs, for so diligently carrying out their self-imposed task of bringing some cheer into the lives of the patients.

LINEN GUILD, EGG COLLECTION, "POUND" DAY.

Very valuable help was again forthcoming from these annual collections, and the Board wish to express their thanks to the Ladies' Committee for all their work in organising these special efforts. Similar thanks are also due to all the district organisers and collectors, without whose assistance such collections would not be possible; and lastly, but not least, to the hundreds of contributors for their generous support.

FRIENDLY SOCIETIES' GALA COMMITTEE.

Hearty congratulations are due to the Gala Committee upon being able to hand to the hospital the really handsome sum of £1,100, in view of the weather conditions which prevailed on "Gala" Day. The enthusiasm of the Committee, and its large band of helpers, is unexampled, and the Board of Management are sincerely grateful to all.

The hospital has now received from the Gala Committee the fine total of £32,748, or an average of practically £470 per year since the Gala was founded in 1877. Such figures are, in themselves, a striking tribute to the hundreds of workers, past and present, who have supported the efforts of the Committee over the long span of 70 years.

CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME OF THE WORKPEOPLE'S COLLECTION COMMITTEE.

Once again it gives the Board of Management great pleasure to record another remarkable increase in the amount received from the Workpeople's Collection Committee, the total being no less than £20,836 18s. 2d. To have accomplished such a sum, which is an all-time record, and an increase of £3,745 7s. 7d., is certainly a great achievement, in which the contributors, the Committee and the Secretary and his Assistant, can take pride.

To all concerned, including those employers who so generously supplement their employees' contributions, the Board wish to offer their heartfelt thanks. It has been mentioned in previous reports that but for the Contributory Scheme the hospital would have been in financial difficulties, and this is more true to-day than ever, in view of the large increase in the expenditure which has taken place in recent years. The Board are conscious of the extent to which they are indebted to this Committee for the progress made by the hospital.

HOUSE-TO-HOUSE COLLECTION.

This collection, unfortunately, shows a decrease, due partly to the weather conditions during the period of the collection. It

should also be noted that the Silsden collection is included in the donation of £100 from the Silsden Gala Committee. By their hard work, the organisers and collectors raised the splendid sum of £574 3s. 4d., and to them, and to the many generous contributors, the Board tender their thanks and appreciation.

CHRISTMAS.

Welcome support was again accorded to the Matron's Christmas Fund Appeal. As usual, it was possible to provide each patient and member of the staff with a gift and also Christmas fare and entertainments, whilst the Workpeople's Collection Committee also presented a gift to each patient. His Worship the Mayor and the Mayoress (Councillor A. W. Tack, J.P., and Mrs. Tack), accompanied by the Deputy Mayor and Mayoress (Alderman J. Denby and Mrs. Denby) visited the hospital during the day. Thanks are expressed to all who helped to make Christmas a happy time for those in the hospital.

GIFTS.

The members of the St. John Ambulance Brigade and others, who help to relieve the nursing situation, the Hospital Car Service and Ambulance Attendants, and many others who do all they can to help the hospital to meet the demands made upon it.

CONCLUSION.

Many people will be aware of the main provisions of the National Health Service Act which was recently placed on the Statute Book. It is some gratification to the Voluntary Hospital Authorities of the country that a larger measure of local autonomy is to be permitted than was originally anticipated.

Whilst the whole of the country is to be divided into a number of regions, each with its Board of Control responsible for the health services generally, there will be Local Hospital Management Committees for the day-to-day administration of hospitals.

No definite date has yet been fixed for bringing the new scheme into operation, but 1st April, 1948, has been mentioned. On this point, however, we must await the decision of the Minister of Health, who is at present in negotiation with the Medical Profession.

There is some evidence that in one or two directions the feeling is growing that there is not now the same necessity, as formerly, to support the hospital.

This is much to be regretted, as it cannot be too strongly emphasised that until the new scheme is in operation, it is essential that the income should be maintained at a high level. Costs are mounting rapidly, and as mentioned under Finance, the future financial position of the hospital is causing some concern to the Board. We appeal, therefore, to every member of the public to help in whatever direction lies in their power.





ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

---0---

Forms of Recommendation have been supplied to all the Medical Practitioners in the District.

Patients seeking admission to the hospital are required (Accidents excepted) to obtain a form of recommendation, which they must take to the Office of the Secretary at the Hospital, and if entitled to free treatment as a member of a Contributory Scheme, to submit a "Voucher" from their Employer.

Between the Hours of 9-0 a.m. and 5-30 p.m. Monday-Friday; Saturday, 9-0 a.m. to 12 noon.

If the Patient is unable to go to the Office, it is desirable that an adult member of the Patient's family should be the messenger.

Accident and Emergency Cases are admitted at any time, and if entitled to a voucher of a Contributory Scheme should present it as soon as possible after admission.

AMBULANCE.

The hospital provides an ambulance for the use of patients from all parts of the hospital area, with the exception of Street Accident Cases, for which the Local Authorities are responsible.

The ambulance is garaged at the hospital and application should be made to the hospital, Keighley 3708/9.

The ambulance is available only if other means of conveyance are not suitable and the ambulance is definitely necessary.

The service is free to members of the Contributory Scheme within the area served by the Victoria Hospital, on production of a voucher.

REGULATIONS FOR VISITORS.

 Relations and friends of patients, on production of the official visiting cards, may visit them on the following days—Sundays, Tuesdays, and Saturdays, from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Children under 12 years of age cannot be admitted to the Wards except in cases of dangerous illness and at the discretion of the Matron.

- 2.—Each patient is allowed TWO VISITORS ONLY on each day, and each visitor is allowed to see one patient only. Ward to ward visiting is NOT allowed.
- Families amongst whose members any infectious disease prevails are NOT to visit the Hospital.
- 4.—In cases of emergency, the friends of the patient will be communicated with.
- 5.—Each patient must be provided with a pair of slippers, soap and towel, a comb and brush, and a change of linen each week; these to be brought by their friends on visiting days.
- 6.—Friends of patients shall not bring into the Hospital any kind of Medicine, Provisions or Liquors, except Fresh Eggs, Wholesome Fruit, Biscuits and Jam.
- 7.—Visitors must comply with these rules, otherwise they will not be admitted.

PRIVATE WARDS. ACCOMMODATION AND FEES.

General Medical and Surgical Wards.

Single-bedded rooms:

4 at 3 guineas per week.

1 at 5 guineas per week.

2 at 7 guineas per week.

Two-bedded rooms:

6 beds at 4 guineas per week.

The fee for a room for short periods is £1 1s. 0d. per day.

Plus 15% Surcharge.

Private Maternity Unit.

Single-bedded rooms:

4 at 7 guineas per week.

Two-bedded room:

2 beds at 5 guineas per week.

Plus 15% Surcharge.

A Booking Fee of £1 1s. 0d. is payable, which will be deducted from the fees due on discharge from hospital.

Special nurses and any expensive drugs, dressings, stimulants, etc., ordered by the medical officer in charge are additional charges.

Fees for the following are also additional:-

X-Ray and Pathological examinations.

Use of Operating Theatre (Fee £1 1s. 0d., Children, Tonsils and Adenoids, 10s. 6d.)

All the above fees are payable to the hospital.

The above terms do not include any fees that may be charged by medical practitioners attending a patient which shall be fixed by private arrangement between the patient and the medical practitioner.

The private medical attendant of a general medical or

surgical case may attend in consultation.

Patients in the Maternity Unit shall be under the care of their private medical attendant.

Specialists may be called in for consultation, but no surgical operation (at which the private medical attendant, if he so desires, may be present) shall be performed except by an Honorary Consulting or Acting Surgeon, who may charge for his services.

OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENTS.

Times of attendance for NEW Patients.

Sundays and Bank Holidays excepted, but accident and emergency cases can receive treatment at any time.

All patients should bring a note from their own doctor giving details of their case.

If treatment is required under the terms of a contributory scheme, patients must present a voucher.

OPHTHALMIC DEPARTMENT.

Monday 1—2 p.m.

PHYSIOTHERAPY DEPARTMENT.

Men—Monday 11-30 a.m. Women—Thursday 2-0 p.m.

X-RAY DEPARTMENT.

Monday to Friday ... 8-30 a.m. to 5-0 p.m. Saturday ... 8-30 a.m. to 12-30 p.m.

With the exception of casualty and urgent cases, who should proceed direct to the hospital, applications for appointment for examination or treatment should be forwarded to the X-Ray Department, and appointment cards will be sent by return of post.

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1946.

Further progress has again marked the past year. This is manifested both on the Finance and efficiency sides of the Contributory Scheme organisation.

During the year, 76 new contributing groups have been enrolled. Contributions from workpeople and Donations from Employers have both increased. The number of firms and individual members are considerably larger than ever before. The amount handed to the Hospital has created a new high record.

The following figures show the progress during the past thirteen years:—

FINANCE.

The total income for the year has been £22,113 7s. 5d., and the expenses £1,276 9s. 3d., the balance handed to the Hospital being £20,836 18s. 2d. This is an increase of £3,745 7s. 7d. over last year, which was itself a record.

SCHEME FOR INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS.

This method, which enables Individuals not connected with a contributing group to be members of the Scheme, has raised a total of £962 14s. 8d. The income from sale of Hospital Stamps through Depots being £382 8s. 3d., and from Individual members through the Office £580 6s. 5d. These, together, show an increase of £176 0s. 2d. over last year.

DONATIONS FROM EMPLOYERS.

The appeal to employers to supplement the contributions of their workpeople was made in December again, jointly with the Hospital Board of Management. This has met with a very generous response. New Donors have come forward, and others have increased the amount of their gifts. The total this year is £1,486 11s. 7d., which is an increase of £231 14s. 3d. on last year. It is of interest to note that last year we reported an increase of £232 14s. 1d., which means that in the two years of the joint appeal there has been a total increase of £464 8s. 4d.

A deep sense of gratitude is felt and hereby expressed to these very generous friends of the Hospital.

RECIPROCAL ARRANGEMENTS.

The arrangements in force with other Hospitals for the payment of 10/- per in-patient day and 8/- per out-patient case for the treatment of our voucher patients has operated satisfactorily during the year. This is one of the benefits under the Scheme which, though costly, enables contributors who reside outside our area to receive treatment at their own Hospitals, or our own area contributors who may either be away from home at the time of requiring treatment, or have to receive treatment at some of the larger or specialist Hospitals in Leeds, Bradford, or elsewhere.

Under this arrangement, a sum of £4,273 5s. 7d. has been paid. On the other hand, a sum of £831 16s. 0d. has been received from other Schemes in respect of their members who have received treatment at our Hospital. The difference in payments over receipts is £3,441 9s. 7d.

Also benefits under the Scheme include a proportion of the cost of the Ambulance Service, which this year shows a nett cost of £893 16s. 10d. A total amount of £63 6s. 0d. has been paid for aftercare treatment.

OUR SINCERE THANKS are accorded to

ALL OUR HELPERS in various ways, who render valuable service in making the work of the Committee run both smoothly and efficiently. Especially we would mention Employers, Work Managers, Cashiers, Collectors, our friends in each business who have the care and responsibility of issuing treatment vouchers. The present vouchers need careful completing, and the questions filled in, "Yes" or "No." To all our helpers who serve as Depots both in Keighley and the villages.

To the Staff of Martins Bank, Limited, the Press (particularly the "Keighley News"), and the Auditors, Messrs. Allan Bradley and Thompson.

Also to the WHOLE OF THE HOSPITAL STAFF, who have rendered valiant service under difficult circumstances. Their skill and kindly attention has called forth the highest praise and heartfelt appreciation.

The 4d. per week (1946) Contributory Scheme

FOURPENCE OR MORE PER WEEK REGULARLY FOR

- (A) ALL WHO ARE COMPULSORARILY INSURED UNDER THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, OR
- (B) THOSE WHOSE WAGES DO NOT EXCEED AN AVERAGE OF £420 PER YEAR.

THREEPENCE PER WEEK FOR WORKERS UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE.

The arrangements for Old-Age Pensioners not working, and Widows not in employment remain as before. For those who wish to contribute to the Scheme, the Contribution rate is Twopence per week or 2s. 2d. per quarter.

The following Benefits are now included in the new Scheme, and are provided to contributors and their strict dependents within the meaning of the Scheme:—

- 1. FREE In-Patient Treatment in the General Wards of Victoria Hospital.
- 2. FREE Out-Patient Treatment at Victoria Hospital as General Patients. This includes X-Ray Examinations and Treatment, Sunlight, Diathermy, Massage and Opthalmic Treatment, and Radium Treatment by arrangement with Victoria Hospital.
- 3. Responsibility for the payment of Maintenance Charges at agreed rates in ALL Outside Hospitals for usual "Voluntary Hospital" cases.
- NOTE.—This provides a solution for those workers whose place of residence and place of employment are in different Hospital areas. As part of a mutual arrangement between Hospital Contributory Schemes, it is expected that ALL WORKERS will contribute to their works' Scheme in the area where THEY ARE EMPLOYED. The Voucher they receive will entitle contributor and dependents to treatment benefits both at our own Hospital and also where THEY RESIDE.

- 4. Private Wards in Victoria Hospital. A rebate of 25% is allowed on the Ward and Operating Theatre Fee charges to persons entitled to use a scheme Voucher occupying £3/3/0 or £4/4/0 per week Private Wards. All other charges, including X-Ray, Pathological Examinations, and the Fee of Physicians or Surgeons are full. (This provision is subject to the desired accommodation being available at the time required).
- 5. Facilities for Free Post-Hospital Attendance on In-Patients by Nurses of the various District Nursing Associations for patients recommended by a member of the Honorary Staff of the Hospital. This only applies to cases immediately discharged from Hospital.
- 6. FREE Ambulance Service within the area served by Victoria Hospital for Stretcher Cases unable to use normal means of conveyance, on the recommendation of a Medical Attendant.
- 7. FREE Convalescent Home Treatment to all contributors and their dependents, on the recommendation of their Doctor, subject to suitable accommodation being available, and the patient is not already provided for by membership of a Society.

NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS.

- A. To receive these benefits, contributors must either be compulsorily insured under the National Health Insurance Act, or not receiving wages exceeding an average of £420 per year.
- B. The Meaning of "Dependent." Contributors can only obtain Vouchers for themselves and such other persons who are strictly dependent on them. Such dependents must be members of the family of, and normally resident with, the contributor, and must not be receiving wages either for whole or part-time employment, or engaged in any business for profit. Dependents, as here defined, are normally deeemed to be dependent on the head wage-earner of the family.
- C. When Treatment is required, if eligible, obtain a Hospital Voucher from the place where you contribute, which must be taken to the office at the Hospital. It is not sufficient merely to state you are a contributor, or to assume that the Hospital will know.
- D. Applicants for Vouchers must have complied regularly with the contribution rate of the Scheme, when working, and must be in benefit at the time of asking for a voucher. The only exception permissible is when the applicant has been TOTALLY unemployed since they left off contributing.
- E. The Scheme does not provide free benefits to persons undergoing, or in need of Hospital Treatment at the time of joining. The Waiting period is three months, with the following exception, "where a person entering into employment, or a new place of employment, joins the Scheme on engagment."

- F. Patients (emergency cases excepted) are treated only through a recommend from their Doctor.
- G. 1. The Scheme does not cover for Treatment for which any Public Authority is responsible, or which is obtainable under the National Health Insurance Act, or through an Approved Society.
 - 2. Any case for which payment is received under the Road Traffic Act.
 - 3. The Scheme does not render financial assistance in respect of maintenance of treatment of war disabilities for which the Ministry of Pensions is responsible. Persons suffering therefrom may receive free treatment on application to the local office of the Ministry.
 - 4. Or to which the following rule may apply, "No person shall be eligible for admission who is suffering from any incurable or infectious disease, or of unsound mind. Any person who, after admission shall develop any infectious disorder, or prove to be incurable, shall be removed as soon as possible."
- H. The St. Luke's Hospital, Bradford, may be used only by residents within the Bradford City Boundary. When this Hospital is used by persons working in our area and contributing to this Scheme, we grant the same benefits as are in force with the Bradford Contributory Scheme.

Individuals not connected with a Contributory Group, may contribute to the Scheme by:—

- 1. Subscribing on the basis of 4/4 per quarter, through the Office or authorised Depots.
- Purchasing Hospital Stamps value 4/4 per quarter, through various Depots.

The Scheme does not provide free benefits to persons, undergoing or in need of Hospital treatment at the time of joining or re-entering after a lapsed period.

Under normal circumstances, members become eligible for benefits one clear quarter after the first payment.


