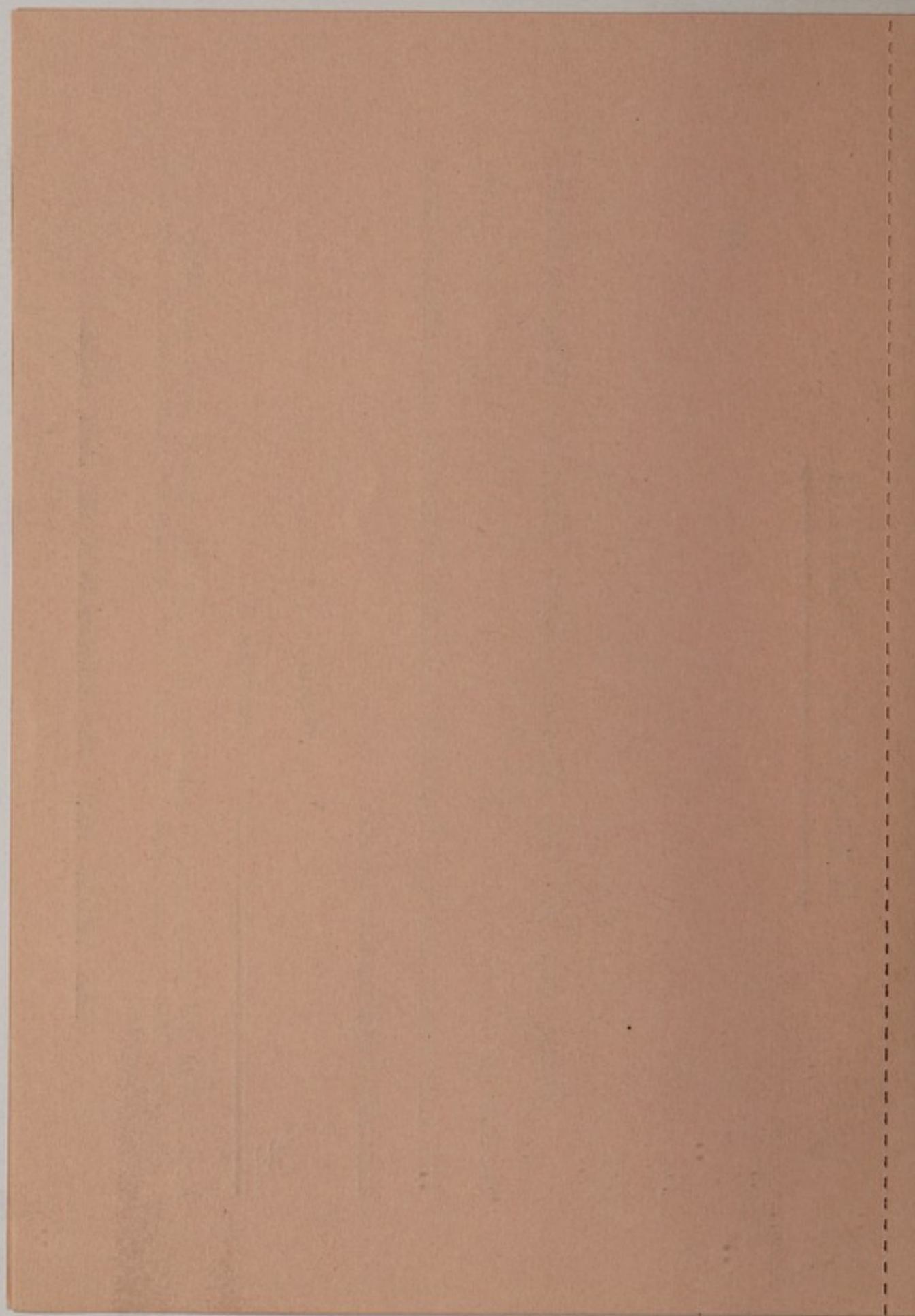

REPORT for the YEAR 1939.

The Management Committee have the pleasure to present their Report for the year 1939.

Deaths

It is with deep regret that the Committee record the deaths of Lt.-Col. W. Adam, Mr. A. L. Bostock and Mr. T. Lucas. Col. Adam was a Trustee and a member of the Management Committee from 1921 until his death and Chairman of the House and Finance Committee for eight years. Mr. Bostock was Honorary Dental Surgeon for twenty-nine years and Honorary Consultant from 1930 until his death. Mr. Lucas was a member of the Management Committee for three years.

Personnel

The Committee have been pleased to welcome Mr. C. C. Amphlett Morton and Mr. W. J. Cain.

Dr. J. Stainton Price and Dr. E. Mitton have been elected Honorary Anaesthetists.

In place of Mr. F. W. Barnett, Mr. C. M. Smith, late Assistant Superintendent of the Royal Southern Hospital, Liverpool, was appointed House Governor and Secretary, taking up his duties in April.

Mr. J. O. Robins, of the North Staffordshire Royal Infirmary, was appointed Assistant Secretary in May.

Statistics

The Committee are glad to record that the work of the Hospital has again maintained its high standard and would refer supporters to the detailed Statistics appearing in Pages 10 to 13.

Improvements undertaken

Efforts have been made to improve the services offered to patients in various directions. The Pathological Laboratory was completely re-equipped and a full-time technician appointed in June; the number of examinations undertaken during that time has fully justified this expenditure. The amount of work performed in the Massage Department rendered imperative the engagement of an Assistant Masseuse. The Iron Lung, provided by the generosity of Lord Nuffield, was received during the year, but its use has so far been unnecessary. One of the steam boilers required renewal and the opportunity was taken of improving the laundry and kitchen services by installing a larger boiler. The administration of the

Hospital has been facilitated by the completion of the new Office Block, and by the provision of a new telephone system.

Financial Position

In view of these improvements it is not unexpected that the expenditure should show an increase, which has amounted to £1206. Full details of the accounts appear in the Financial Report on Pages 15 to 17. Here your Committee desire to acknowledge the generous support they have received, which has been the means of maintaining the income despite the difficulties of the times.

In particular they wish to express their sense of obligation to those manufacturers of the district who have agreed to subscribe the equivalent of 25% of their employees' payments to the Contributory Scheme. The income from this source in 1939 amounted to £1033, and it is intended to extend the appeal to all employers. There is no doubt that the general acceptance of the principle will help to solve the financial difficulties which confront the Hospital.

Acknowledg- ments

They desire also to thank Viscountess Cobham and the members of the Ball Committee whose organisation was responsible for a profit on the Ball of £230; Mr. Ren Tipler and his colleagues on the Carnival and Entertainments Committee for the receipt of £350; the ladies who organise and carry out the work of the Linen Guild, Alexandra Rose Day and Pound Days; and the voluntary collectors.

Contributory Scheme

The work of the Contributory Scheme has proceeded smoothly throughout the year. A further record has been achieved by Mr. Joseph Wright and his colleagues on the Contributory Scheme Committee in raising the income for 1939 to £10,855. The value of membership of the Staffordshire, Worcestershire and Shropshire Group of Contributory Schemes has been demonstrated in many ways, while relations with other Schemes have been particularly happy. It was unfortunate that the Annual Congress of the British Hospitals Contributory Schemes Association was cancelled owing to the trend of international affairs during the summer.

Trustees

Your Committee have given careful attention to the situation created by the resignation of the Trustees. In this connection it will be remembered that plenary powers were granted to the Committee

at the last Annual Meeting. The matter has proved very difficult of solution, as the legal position is complicated. In addition the opportunity was taken of revising the Rules. When the Committee are in a position to do so, a Special General Meeting will be called to pass the necessary resolution as to Trustees, while the new Rules will be submitted at the Annual Meeting.

War Measures Upon the advent of War, your Committee put into operation emergency measures already decided upon, and reviewed all stocks of essential materials. The Ministry of Health called on the Hospital to increase its available accommodation to 216 beds, and a First Aid Post was established in the Out-patient Department. During the summer an appeal for 500 volunteers for blood transfusion was launched and these were quickly forthcoming. All branches of the Hospital service are ready to play their part should any catastrophe come upon us.

Conclusion In the meantime the work continues without reference to the world situation. That political events will have their effect upon our finances is undoubted, and the most earnest appeal is therefore addressed to all supporters to maintain their interest and so collaborate with the Hospital authorities in their work of healing. To the Honorary Medical Staff, the Matron, the House Surgeons and the other paid officials the Committee owe a debt of gratitude for their loyal devotion during a most difficult year and look to them and to all sections of the community for the insurance of successful progress in the years which lie ahead.

Many items of surgical goods and drugs rose in price towards the end of the year, and the cost of the Pathological Laboratory re-organised during the year on a full-time basis, was £300. Salaries and Wages contain the first full year's charge of £214 for the Hospital's contribution under the Federated Superannuation Scheme in addition to the normal annual increases.

Contributions to other Hospitals are those made under reciprocal arrangements with other Contributory Schemes and a corresponding amount of income is included under the heading of "Receipts for Services rendered—Patients." Repairs and Renewals include £224, the cost of Air Raid Precautions, black-out, etc.

Our investments have been increased by £1000 and equipment by £275, while, out of current income, buildings and plant have been maintained at a high level of efficiency.

Evidence has already been received of the adverse effect which the War is having on expenditure. It is no longer possible to enter into long-term contracts, while many items in daily use have greatly increased in price : all rationed foods, many important drugs, dressings, instruments, X-ray films, fuel and stationery are among the goods for which the Hospital has to pay considerably more, while the increase in wages is inevitably passed on by contractors for repairs to property and renewals of furniture, bedding and similar articles. Your Committee are endeavouring to offset these costs to some extent by purchasing in larger quantities and by restricting orders to the minimum needs of the Hospital, but even so, it is inevitable that expenditure will show an increase during 1940. How far the Government will be successful in its attempt to control prices remains to be seen, but cost of living index figures, even by the end of 1939, showed a rise of 19 points on the year, equal to a 12% increase in prices. Your Committee intend, therefore, to devote every effort to augmenting income and will look to the public to provide the means to continue its work.
