



DEAR SIR OR MADAM,

I have pleasure in sending herewith the Annual Report of the Hospital for the year 1931, and beg to tender to you the sincere and grateful thanks of the Committee of Management for the generous support that you have given.

The growth of the Borough of Ealing, the population of which is now over 117,000, has been so rapid that, in spite of every endeavour being made to keep pace with the work at the Hospital. many of the departments have become seriously overcrowded. The Committee have had no alternative, therefore, but to make arrangements to extend the Casualty, X-Ray, Massage and other departments, and the Mayor of Ealing has undertaken to organise a special Hospital Week Appeal from June 17th to 26th for the purpose of raising the sum of £8,000 required, to which I trust you will give your full support.

During the past year many improvements have been carried out, and, apart from the question of congestion, the Hospital has been maintained at a high standard of efficiency. The Committee are gratified to feel that, although the work in the various departments has increased from 12 per cent. to 37 per cent., the nett cost has only increased by 8 per cent. In addition the statistical costs compare very favourably with those of other hospitals of similar size and type.



Report of the Committee of Management.

The Committee of Management beg to submit to the Subscribers, Donors and Friends of the Hospital their Sixtieth

Annual Report for the year ended 31st December, 1931.

The year, the Hospital's Diamond Jubilee, has been marked by continued progress in all departments. The growth of the Borough of Ealing has resulted in increased and exacting calls upon the resources of the Hospital. In spite of the many difficulties resulting therefrom, the Committee are satisfied that a high standard of efficiency has been maintained, and that the Hospital is successfully keeping in step with the advances of medical science.

Medical Staff.—It is with pleasure that the Committee record the appointment of the following additional Honorary Consultants:—Consulting Physician, A. E. Clark-Kennedy, Esq., M.A., M.D., F.R.C.P. (Lond.); Consulting Dermatologist, J. E. M. Wigley, Esq., M.B., B.S. (Melb.), M.R.C.P. (Lond.); Consulting Laryngologist, C. P. Wilson, Esq., F.R.C.S. (Eng.); Consulting Anæsthetist, A. W. Matthew, Esq., M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P. (Lond.); Consulting Dental Surgeon, W. Warwick James, Esq., O.B.E., F.R.C.P. (Eng.), L.D.S., R.C.S. (Eng.).

Dr. George Arthur, who had held office as an Honorary Medical Officer for eleven years, resigned in December. His resignation was accepted with much regret, and the Committee wish to record their great appreciation of his services, so generously given. In Dr. Arthur's place was appointed Dr.

Frank Crosbie.

Dr. E. J. C. Dicks was co-opted a member of the Committee of Management to fill the vacancy caused by Dr. Arthur's

resignation.

Early in the year the Committee felt that owing to the large and increasing number of Road Accidents and Emergencies, a third Resident Doctor was essential, and an additional Resident Medical Officer, who commenced duty on the 1st February, was

therefore appointed.

Dr. Thomas King, Senior Resident Medical Officer, and his colleagues, Dr. J. R. Candy and Dr. R. W. Malim, completed their term of office at the end of the year. The Committee were sorry to lose their services. The present officers are Dr. William Tandy (senior), Dr. R. M. McKeown and Dr. R. T. Simkin.

Extensions.—In view of the serious congestion in the Casualty, X-Ray, Massage and Electrical Departments, and conditions which caused the Committee grave anxiety, immediate enlargement of these Departments became imperative. The opportunity of acquiring adjoining property having arisen, and, as the Hospital had no land available for present or future extension, it was decided to purchase the ground rents and leasehold interests of Nos. 79-80, Mattock Lane, and the ground rents of Nos. 81, Mattock Lane and 3a and 4, Culmington Road.

A scheme of extension which included the purchase of these properties; the conversion of one of the houses for immediate hospital needs; the enlargement of the Casualty, X-Ray, Massage, and Electrical Departments, and the provision of an Out-Patient operating theatre, was prepared, and has been provisionally approved by the King Edward's Hospital Fund for London. The total cost will not exceed £8,700, and a grant of £500 towards the cost has been promised by King Edward's Hospital Fund. Further, the Chairman of the Hospital, Mr. Robert Wilson, has generously given £500, in memory of his wife, towards the cost of providing, in particular, adequate Casualty accommodation.

The Committee felt that if the efficiency of the Hospital was to be maintained they had no alternative but to provide the additional accommodation so urgently required.

Improvements.—Compatible with the necessity for economy many detailed improvements have been effected during the year.

Arrangements were made to give a substantial breakfast to those patients able to take it; the breakfast hour was altered to 8 a.m., patients now being given a cup of tea when awakened at 6 a.m. For a considerable time past butter has been provided for all patients.

It was found that the noise caused by the stone floors in the corridors was very distressing to many patients seriously ill, and rubber flooring was laid down to overcome successfully this serious defect.

A bed pan washing machine was installed in the "Princess Mary" Ward at a cost of £50. This has already proved a great boon to the nursing staff, and it is hoped that funds may be forthcoming to place similar apparatus in the remaining Wards.

Further, a special food trolley was purchased at a cost of £36 for use in the "Walter Davies" Ward. It has proved to be more efficient than the other apparatus in use in other Wards, and enables thoroughly hot meals to be served. It is likewise hoped that it may be possible to equip the remaining Wards with this very desirable appliance.

Necessary expenditure has also been incurred in the purchase of additional surgical instruments and apparatus.

As the hardness of the water was causing trouble, a softening plant was installed at the end of this year in the operating

theatre, and has already proved to be most satisfactory.

After careful consideration, it was decided to discontinue operations on children for tonsils and adenoids in the Out-patient Department, and special accommodation (four cots) was provided in the Hospital for such cases, all of whom are now detained for at least one night. This re-arrangement necessitated the closing of one Private Ward, but it is felt that the improved facilities given to the tonsil cases amply justified this action.

Arrangements have been made to institute a special clinic for the treatment of rheumatism and its allied disorders, under the direction of Dr. E. J. C. Dicks, assisted by Dr. G. H. Gange, and with the co-operation of the Honorary Consulting Staff. The new clinic will be opened as soon as possible, and will be installed in part of one of the houses recently purchased. To many of those who suffer from these crippling diseases this new department should prove a boon, as the careful investigation and treatment which such cases require demand an outlay beyond the means of so many.

These improvements assist in bringing the Hospital to the forefront of efficiency, and the Committee feel that their careful

expenditure on these items is fully justified.

Obituary.—With deep regret the Committee have to record the death of Mr. Walter Dickens, the builder of the Hospital, and a generous worker for charity; also of Mr. Chas. E. Shepheard, a friend of the Hospital for many years. A legacy from

Mr. Shepheard is noted on page 47.

Nursing Staff.—There have been few changes in the Nursing Staff during the year, and the Committee record their appreciation of the work done by the Matron, Miss A. F. Sharp, and also of the high standard of efficiency maintained by the Staff under her care. During the year eight Nurses passed the Final State Examination and twelve passed the Preliminary Examination

Income.—With the exception of the Christmas Dinner Table Collection, no special appeal was made during the year, but, in spite of the difficult times, the revenue was very satisfactory, the total from all sources being as follows:—

The Maintenance Account showed a surplus of £267 5s. 11d., although expenditure had increased as a result of the additional patients treated.

Subscriptions.—Owing to the financial crisis many old friends found it necessary to curtail their Annual Subscription, but others came forward to help, with the result that there was no decrease in the total, the figures being £1,052 11s. in 1931, and £1,052 10s. 6d. in 1930. There is a great need for new Annual Subscribers, as the assured income of the Hospital is so small.

Donations and Receipts from Special Efforts.—These amounted to £4,636 15s. 1d., an increase of £1,588 17s. 5d. over

the ordinary donations received in 1930.

Help Yourself Society.—A donation of £475 was received from the Help Yourself Society, the Hospital having again co-operated in the sale of Help Yourself Annuals, of which 6,558 copies were sold through the Hospital. This was a reduction on the previous year, in spite of the assistance of many additional helpers.

The Hospital Fete.—Organised by an anonymous Committee, this was a great success, and realised a profit for the hospital

of £557 9s. 4d., against £443 17s. 1d. in 1930.

A Christmas Dinner Table Collection was made for the first time, and 26,000 Christmas greetings were sent to the residents of the Borough. Between four and five thousand individual contributions were received, totalling £464 13s. 3d. No less than 200 voluntary workers assisted in this successful effort.

Pound Day, organised again by the Ladies' Linen League and the Matron, proved a record. The gifts in kind weighed over 6,000 lbs., and were valued at £108 2s. 1d. In addition,

the sum of £68 15s, was received in cash.

Church Collections, as detailed on page 43, amounted to £274 10s. 10d, a reduction on the previous year. St. John's Church contributed the substantial sum of £101 0s. 9d.

A Flag Day for the benefit of this Hospital and Hanwell Hospital was organised by the Mayoress of Ealing (Mrs. G. R. Weeks). From this splendid effort Ealing received £167 14s. 8d.

The Hospital Ball and Whist Drive were also organised by the Mayoress of Ealing, and realised the most welcome sum of £124 17s. 2d.

The Northfields Branch of the Hospital Saving Association generously raised the substantial amount of £87, mainly for the

purchase of special surgical apparatus.

The following generous donations were also received:—£300 and £200 anonymously; £52 10s., per Mr. J. J. Green; £50 from Mr. and Mrs. C. H. Robertson; £50 from the Trustees of Bow-

man's Charities; and £50 from the Bernhard Baron Charitable Trust on the birthday of the late Mr. Bernhard Baron.

Sincere and grateful thanks are tendered to all those who so generously contributed to the above efforts, and also to the large number of friends who worked so hard and willingly to ensure their success. The Committee wish to record further their appreciation of the substantial support given by the Directors and Employees of the following companies:—

Entertainments.—A detailed list is given on page 46. In particular it is desired to record the substantial support given

by the Northolt Flower Show and Gala, £60.

Box Collections.—These amounted to £1037 5s. 5d., against £1,097 2s. 8d. Yellow Boxes produced £645 4s., a decrease of £82 1s. 10d., and it is hoped that redoubled efforts may be made in 1932 to increase the receipts. Wooden Boxes, under the able supervision of Mr. A. R. Sadler, brought in £392 1s. 5d., an increase of £22 4s. 7d. Sincere thanks are tendered to Mr. Sadler for work he does in many ways for the Hospital, and to Mrs. Frost, who has so generously come to the Hospital twice weekly for a considerable time past for the purpose of collecting funds from visitors to the Hospital; also to the Yellow Box Supervisors, Road Stewards, Box Holders, and others who have done so much during this difficult year to raise funds. Their help is deeply appreciated.

Contributions on Account of Patients.—A further substantial increase in these receipts is noted, a total of £8,729 2s. 7d. being received, the corresponding figure for 1930 being £7,592 10s. 7d. Included in these amounts are payments from Private Ward patients of £1,675 6s. 3d., against £2,070 5s. 7d. in 1930.

Gifts in Kind.—Many substantial gifts were received, but the list of generous friends is too long to enumerate. Grateful thanks are tendered to those who so kindly sent provisions, flowers, hot water bottles, linen, appliances, cots, tableware and books, etc.

Expenditure.—The full account is shown on page 14—15, and in examining the total expenditure of £18,716 16s. 11d., consideration should be given to the Statistics shown on pages 21 and 22. The Committee have exercised every care in spending funds, and for some years past the cost per bed has compared extremely favourably with that of other similar Hospitals. It is anticipated that the year 1931 will prove to be no exception to this satisfactory position.

Auditor, Mr. G. G. Stickland, F.C.A., for so kindly undertaking

the audit of the accounts.

Patients.—Full Statistics are shown on pages 23 and 24. From this will be noted the continued and striking increase in the work and the additional demands upon the resources of the Hospital.

Special Departments.—The Massage Department, under Dr. J. B. Mason; the Electrical and Sunlight Department, under Dr. E. J. C. Dicks; the X-Ray Department, under Dr. J. Rhynland Parry; and the Pathological Department, under Dr. H. A. Osborn, all show a substantial increase in the work done. Statistics on pages 23 and 24.

Ladies' Linen League.—The Ladies' Linen League issues a separate Report, but as an auxiliary of the Hospital, some mention of the assistance it renders should be made here.

The League has been steadily increasing its membership every year, and it now not only supplies all the linen, blankets, etc., used in the Hospital, but also provides the Nursing and Domestic Staff's uniforms. It has also given a grant of £30 to the Hospital Dressings Association.

The total income of the League for 1931 was £515 8s. Of this, £362 11s. 10d. was from Subscriptions, and £152 16s. 2d. from special efforts, including £73 12s. 3d. from a Caledonian Market. The Hospital Pound Day, one of the League's activities in conjunction with the Matron, has been already referred to.



Conditions Governing the Admission of Patients.

Private Wards.

These wards are for the use of residents in Ealing, Greenford, and Alperton, who are unable to afford Nursing Home treatment.

There is an income limit, and patients suffering from *consumption, mental disorder, infectious or incurable diseases unlikely to benefit by Treatment, or normal obstetric cases, are not admitted.

The charge is 4½ guineas per week. Additional charges are made for use of Operating Theatre, Special Nurses, Radiographic Examinations, etc.

Medical Fees are a matter of arrangements between the Patient and his or her Medical Adviser.

Full details may be obtained upon application to the Secretary-Superintendent or the Matron.

General Wards.

Except in cases of accident, patients are admitted upon the recommendation of a Medical Practitioner. Patients suffering from any of the diseases noted above* are not admitted.

Out-Patients.

Patients may be seen by a Specialist upon the recommendation of a Medical Practitioner. Except in emergency no patient can be treated without such recommendation.
