Annual Report

of the Board of Management for the Year 1927.

The Board of Management have pleasure in presenting a Report for the year ended 31st December, 1927—this being the 152nd Annual Report of the Hospital.

The outstanding feature to be noted in this Report is the steadily increasing amount of work done during the year over that carried out in 1926.

SERVICES RENDERED.

The average stay of each Patient was 27.6 days. After allowing for the extended stay of Orthopædic Patients, the average duration of residence is slightly in excess of a mean average for England.

COST OF TREATMENT.

The average cost of each In-Patient per week is £2 10s. 1d., and of each Out-Patient attendance, 1s.

FINANCE.

The total Ordinary Income amounted to £10,411 13s. 2d., and the Ordinary Expenditure to £15,494 0s. 11d., leaving a balance of £5,082 7s. 9d. as a loss on the year's working.

CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

Progress, which must be deemed most satisfactory, has been made under this heading, and at the end of the year no less than 8,800 friends of the Hospital were on the register as members. The cash received on account in 1927 was £3,060 3s. A full detailed statement is set out and will be found on page 51.

ALTERATIONS AND EXTENSIONS.

As reported in the Statement for 1926, designs for alterations and extensions have since been received and the Assessor appointed by the Royal Society of British Architects gave the premier award to Messrs. Adams, Holden and Pearson, of 9, Knightsbridge, London.

The estimated cost of carrying out the whole work—exclusive of the Private Nursing Home—is £62,000.

The estimate, together with the Architect's Report, received careful attention, and the Board, having received reports from the Finance Committee and the Medical Committee, decided that the necessity for the alterations and extensions, as enumerated in the reports, was proved.

A Special Meeting of the Governors was convened for the 20th July, 1927, to confirm the action of the Board in instructing the House Committee to carry out the plans for the alterations and additions in their entirety and to obtain authority to realise free securities for the purpose of carrying out the work.

The meeting as convened being *ultra vires*, a further meeting was held on the 10th September, 1927, when the following resolutions were passed by the Governors :—

1. That in the opinion of the Governors the provision of new Hospital accommodation is essential.
2. That the Board of Management be authorised to make an appeal to the public to obtain the necessary funds.
3. That the Governors approve of a Scheme for the provision of Hospital accommodation for 160.
- 3a. That the Governors approve of the provision of the Private Nursing Home should the result of the Appeal permit.

4. That the Governors hereby authorise the Trustees to take such action as they, after consultation with the Board of Management, and, if necessary, after application to the Charity Commissioners, may consider necessary to enable them to provide out of the invested funds of the Hospital such sum as may be required to enable the Scheme approved of by the Governors to be proceeded with.

The Trustees now have an application before the Court of Chancery for a decision as to whether they are observing their powers as Trustees of the Invested Funds in handing over the securities for disposal.

The Appeal has been launched and the sum of £8,354 12s. 8d. has been either received or promised.

GENERAL.

The Board record, with the greatest regret, the deaths of Mr. Geo. Holloway, Vice-Chairman of the House Committee and Hon. Auditor for many years, and Col. O. R. Middleton, D.L., J.P., who served the Hospital faithfully as a Member of the Board.

Nurses receiving training at the Hospital were again to the fore in the examinations conducted by the Nursing Council of England.
