# REPORT OF COMMITTEE, 1936.

---

THE Committee of Management have pleasure in presenting the Fourteenth Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended December 31st, 1936.

It has been a busy year at the Hospital and the number of patients treated shows a considerable increase on any year since its foundation.

Statistical Tables and the Medical Report follow.

## FINANCE.

The financial position is still satisfactory.

The increase in the number of patients' days, which is a record, accounts for the reduction in cost.

Subscriptions, unfortunately, show a slight falling off.

The Committee record with deep regret the death of the Rt. Hon. Lord Wargrave, P.C., a Vice-President, and generous supporter of the Hospital, and also of Mrs. Robert Fleming, who always took a great interest in the Hospital and supported it in so many ways.

On retiring from practice in July, Dr. W. L. Wainwright resigned his membership of the Honorary Medical Staff. It is a cause of great regret to everyone connected with the Hospital. The Committee desire to place on record their high appreciation of his

work and his many services to the Hospital since its foundation and they have appointed him a member of the Hon. Consulting Staff.

#### ROYAL BERKSHIRE AND ASSOCIATED HOSPITALS CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

Of the Patients treated in the Hospital, 180 were members of the above scheme, 123 from Henley and 57 from other places. The great success of this Scheme depends very largely on voluntary effort and the Committee cordially thank those ladies and gentlemen who give so much of their time to this good work.

#### MOTOR ACCIDENTS.

During the year 26 cases were brought to the Hospital, of these, 11 were detained. The cost was mostly covered by insurance and by membership of contributory schemes.

#### LIGHT SIGNALS IN PLACE OF BELLS.

Through the kindness and generosity of Sir Ernest Cain, Bt., the above system has quite recently been installed. The Committee much appreciate the great benefit it will be to the Hospital and warmly thank him for it.

#### THE LADIES' SUPPLY LEAGUE.

Again the Committee tender their sincere thanks to the members of the above for their useful and valuable help.

The report and accounts follow.

#### ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The efficient, loyal and devoted services of the Matron (Miss E. M. Davies) and her Nursing Staff has again earned the cordial thanks of the committee and the gratitude of the many patients who have passed through the Hospital during the year.

The Committee also record their appreciation of the loyal services of the Domestic Staff and other workers at the Hospital.

Again it is a pleasure to record with appreciation and gratitude the zeal and devotion of the Hon. Medical Staff. The Committee, on their own behalf and that of the subscribers, tender their warmest thanks to the Hon. Medical Local Staff for their work ; to the Hon. Consulting Staff (Dr. Gordon Lambert, Mr. J. Leonard Joyce, Mr. C. B. Baxter, Mr. Leslie Powell and Mr. G. T. Willoughby Cashell) for their valuable aid at all times ; to the Hon. Dental Surgeon (Mr. P. T. Pearce), the Hon. Masseuse (Miss Couchman) and to the Clergy and Ministers of the Town and district for their help and support.

Finally, the Committee wishes to thank all who have in any way assisted the Hospital during the year, either financially, by personal service, or by gifts in kind, and hope that the generous support may be continued.

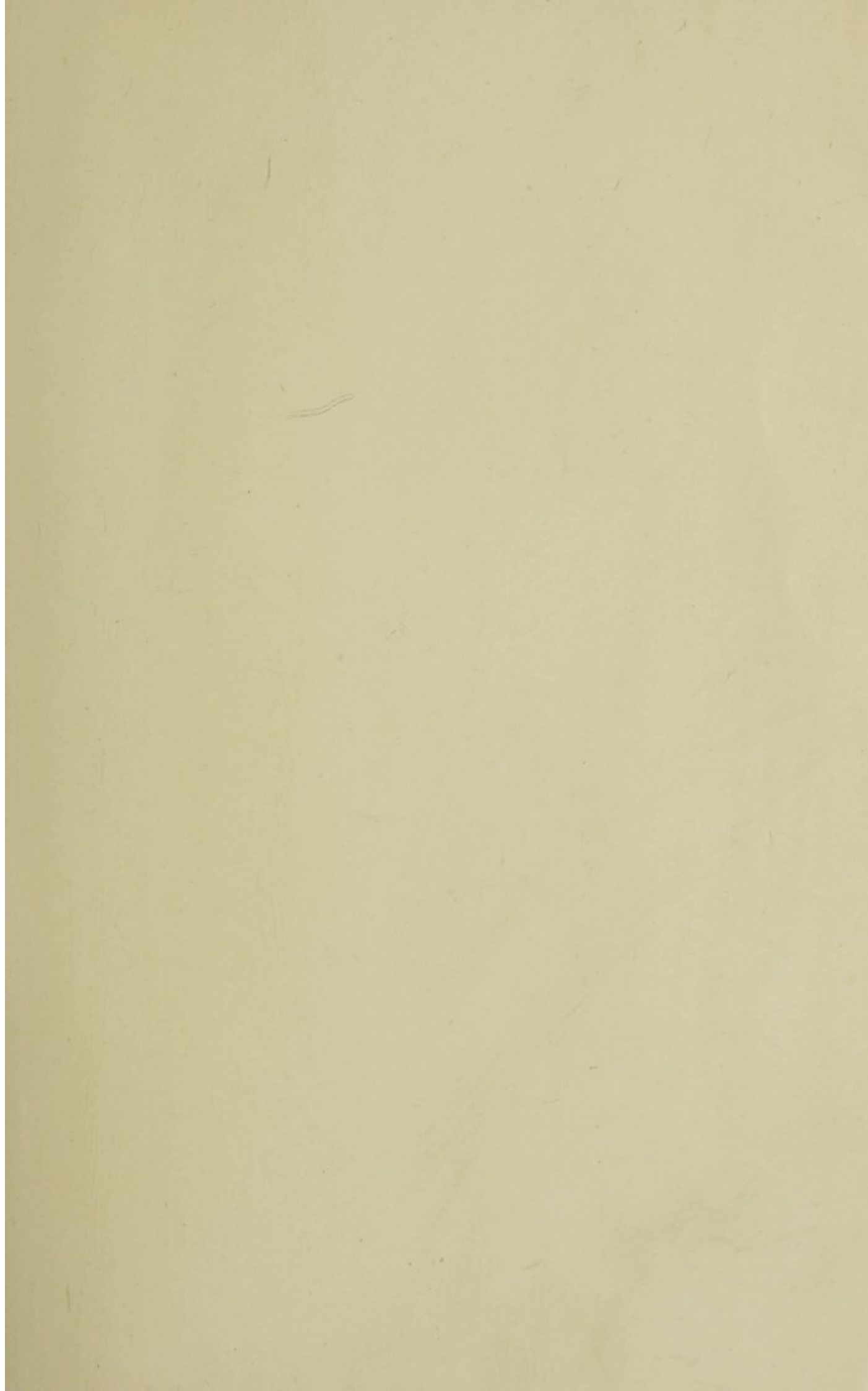
