# Report of the Board of Management 1938.

To THE GOVERNORS,

The Board of Management has pleasure in submitting to the Governors the One Hundred and Seventh Annual Report of the Infirmary.

#### BUSINESS DEALT WITH BY THE BOARD.

December 31st, 1938, marked the end of the first full year's working of the Contributory Scheme and your Board records with gratitude and satisfaction that its confidence in the success of the project has proved well-founded. For the whole year the sum of £20,718 was passed to the Infirmary funds by the Executive Committee of the Scheme—further reference to this will be made later in the Report. The thanks of the Board are given sincerely to the Scheme Committee, its officials, the many voluntary helpers and most important of all, the contributors themselves for the organisation and standardisation of income from this source.

The knock-out competition promoted by the Golf Clubs for the Cup which was generously given by Mr. Lawrence Crowther last year, resulted in £44 17s. 6d. being credited to the General Account. Your Board expresses its gratitude to all those who have helped to make this first event a success and hopes the competition will go from strength to strength.

The Rover Scouts, the Huddersfield Branch of Toc H, and many volunteers have once more done great service in the provision of donors for blood transfusions and your Board is very grateful for this generous help. Despite the good work done by these Associations and volunteers, the Infirmary list of donors still requires extension in order to meet the demands made upon it and your Board asks the public to co-operate in this vital service.

The Huddersfield Law Society has again given invaluable help in difficult cases falling under the Road Traffic Act and the Hospital has received payment in many cases only due to the good offices of the Society. Your Board's thanks are very freely given for the Society's gratuitous assistance.

Plans for the provision of a New Maternity Wing have been considered and it is hoped to commence operations at an early date.

Your Board places on record its appreciation of the kind services of the Press. The Proprietors of the Huddersfield "Examiner" particularly, have been ever ready to assist in any way they can and to co-operate in all your Board's endeavours.

On the 31st of July, Mr. C. D. Pye-Smith retired from the Office of Honorary Surgeon under the Laws of the Hospital. Over the long period of nineteen years Mr. Pye-Smith had always given of his best both as regards his professional services and his association with the Board of Management. Fortunately his connection in this latter regard is not severed, as, in the capacity of Honorary Consulting Surgeon, his membership is retained. Your Board expresses to Mr. Pye-Smith its sincere thanks and appreciation for his long and valued services. As a result of Mr. Pye-Smith's retirement and Mr. Barclay's consequent promotion, Mr. E. S. Bolton, M.A., M.B., F.R.C.S., Edin., was appointed Honorary Assistant Surgeon.

The record of work accomplished is one of continued progress in spite of the fact that your Board was reluctantly compelled to sanction the closing of 68 beds for a period of three months. This step was taken to allow of the fitting in of the Nursing Staff holidays, as, in common with most other Hospitals, the Infirmary suffered from a shortage of Probationers which rendered no easier an already difficult task. This shortage still continues, but it is hoped that arrangements which have now been made will obviate the closing of beds during 1939.

Finally, your Board records its deep thankfulness that the emergency measures taken as a result of the Crisis in September, did not need to be put into operation and it is hopeful that so much happier a state of affairs will ensue in 1939 that your Hospital may proceed with its normal work quietly and efficiently.

#### WORK OF THE YEAR.

The number of persons treated in all Departments of the Infirmary was 32,037, an increase of 1,106 over the previous year's figure. In-patients totalled 4,756 and Out-patients 27,281. The number of beds equipped was 302, but of these the average of 276 only was available owing to the closing of wards for infectious diseases, annual cleaning and the steps previously referred to which your Board had to take to meet the Nursing difficulty. The average number of beds occupied daily was 236.99, or 86% of the available number. The average number of days each patient was resident was 18.19. Deaths occurring from all causes during the year totalled 328, but of this number 113 took place within 48 hours of admission. The percentage of deaths to the total number of In-patients was 6.9, but subtracting those deaths occurring within 48 hours of admission, the percentage was reduced to 4.5.

The Massage Department continues to record an increasing number of treatments and during the year a total of 79,503 such treatments were given compared with 72,475 during the previous year. The number of patients passing through the Department totalled 3,147 and the attendances numbered 59,468, or 7,218 more than in 1937. The figures are striking testimony to the value of this Special Department.

A slight increase in the work done is shewn by statistics relating to the Pathological Department. The number of specimens examined was 11,703 and the number of post-mortem examinations conducted by the Pathologist was 100.

Of the total receipts, £532 was the amount received from Insurance Companies.

#### FINANCIAL.

#### General.

The total expenditure of £46,156 3s. 4d. exceeded the total income of £45,831 8s. 11d. by £324 14s. 5d. Economies have been effected wherever possible, but the increased cost of nearly all commodities throughout the year has caused your Board serious concern.

#### Income.

The total income for the year was £45,831 8s. 11d. and exceeded the 1937 total by £5,148 1s. 6d. Annual subscriptions shew an increase of £104 5s. 1d., and in thanking those subscribers who have entered into a seven year deed of covenant your Board once more urges others to adopt this plan which means so much more to the Hospital at no extra cost to the subscriber.

When your Board primarily had before it a draft Contributory Scheme for Huddersfield, it was known that with the growth and success of such a Scheme, income from other sources would necessarily diminish. Receipts from patients on account of services rendered shew the biggest direct reduction, but income under certain other headings is also found to have been reduced. This means, of course, that certain monies have been diverted and have gone to swell the increased revenue from workpeople through the Contributory Scheme. From the Scheme, the monthly grants during the year totalled £20,718—good testimony, after such a short period of operation, to the efficiency with which the Scheme is conducted.

The income from donations was £2,930 9s. 11d., £410 6s. 0d. less than in 1937. There being no control over receipts under this heading, fluctuations of greater or lesser degree are to be expected.

The Annual Charity Football Match took place at the Leeds Road Ground between Huddersfield Town and Partick Thistle. Although the Town team was victorious, the inclement weather had a severe effect upon the gate receipts. Nevertheless £118 was passed to the Infirmary account for which your Board is grateful.

The "Examiner" Inter-Club Tennis Tournament increases in popularity year by year and the organisers, together with the Proprietors of the Huddersfield "Examiner" are congratulated upon their efforts. It is entirely due to them that in 1938, £117 13s. 10d. was received as a result of the Tournament.

#### Expenditure.

Earlier in this section of the Report reference was made to the higher cost of commodities and the increases in almost all items of expenditure, are due to this. Provisions, Surgery and Dispensary and Domestic headings account for approximately £2,600 of the additional expenditure and a revision of certain Nursing and Domestic salaries' scales has resulted in an increase of £1,400 under this heading.

The total expenditure of £46,156 3s. 4d. is £3,344 9s. 4d. more than in 1937, but this is mostly due to factors over which your Board has had no control and which have caused it grave concern.

#### Building and Extension Fund.

The Contributory Scheme Carnival held in June proved a great success and cash totalling £7,557 7s. 6d. was allocated to this fund. In addition many friends of the Hospital entered into deeds of covenant for the payment of subscriptions to the account over a period of seven years. At the expiration of this period a total of £11,231 will have been received under covenant alone as a result of the Carnival.

Your Board is grateful too, for the Huddersfield Corporation's grant of £1,500 and a donation of £1,000 from "An Old Resident."

It is with pleasure and confidence that your Board looks forward to increased help in liquidating the building fund debt to the general account. It must not be overlooked that the provision of a New Maternity Unit will compel further outgoings from this fund.

#### Private Patients' Department.

The Private Patients' Department at Green Lea continues to prove its usefulness to those persons for whom the Scheme was intended. £900 was transferred from the Private Patients' Department account to the general account during the year, but once again your Board points out that no administrative or capital charges have been debited to the Department.

#### THE LADIES' COMMITTEE.

The congratulations of your Board are again due and are unstintingly given to the Ladies who continue year by year to work with great enthusiasm on behalf of the patients. The articles supplied totalled 473, but, in addition to these the Ladies' Committee has given a Dinner Trolley, a Toilet Trolley and a Sorbo Bed, as well as many items of comfort for the Patients. Your Board records its appreciation for those useful additions. To Mrs. Tinker and her helpers your Board extends grateful thanks. Once more the Egg Collection was organised entirely by them and the collection in 1938 totalled 54,427. This result is particularly pleasing in view of the low figure of 1937 which was due to circumstances which rendered ineffective to a large degree the efforts of the organisers.

#### THE NURSING STAFF.

Seven Nurses entered the Preliminary State Examination during 1938 and all passed. In the Final State Examination 31 entered and 28 passed and in addition three Nurses passed the Examination of the Central Midwives' Board. Twelve Nurses entered the Test Educational Examination and of this number two failed and one was referred.

Medals for general efficiency following the final Hospital Examination were awarded as follows:—

Gold Medallist—Nurse N. Burrow.
Silver Medallist—Nurse I. Emslie.
Bronze Medallists—Nurse E. A. Balfour and
Nurse D. Weatherhead.

Senior Probationer A. M. Freeborn was awarded the Book Prize. The Honorary Medical Staff again offered special prizes for the best practical Nurses and these were awarded as follows:—

Senior Prize—Nurse E. M. Starrett. Junior Prize—Probationer E. M. O'Brien.

During the year 21 Pupils were admitted to the Preliminary Training School of whom 17 passed forward to take up their duties in the Wards.

The Infirmary Tennis Tournament for the Nursing Staff was won by Sister E. Chambers, and during the latter part of the year Miss Baines arranged a Badminton Tournament which was very much enjoyed.

Dealing further with the social side, members of the Nursing Staff enjoyed a Garden Party at Thorpe Grange on June 23rd and 24th, at the kind invitation of the Archdeacon and Mrs. Baines, whilst during the month of July, Mrs. W. A. Crowther arranged for outings for the Nurses to Scarborough, Rippon and Fountains Abbey. Your Board appreciates very much the kindness shewn by many friends in arranging such social activities for the Nursing Staff.

#### THE BOARD.

The following Members retire in accordance with the Rules and the Board records its sincere thanks for the work which has been performed by these Members on behalf of the Infirmary:—

It is with very great regret that your Board records the loss, through death, of Mr. William Shires and Mr. R. C. Hamilton. Mr. Shires had been associated with the Infirmary since 1920 and your Board will feel his loss acutely. #### ALMONER'S REPORT, 1938.

During the year, one hundred and fifty-eight patients have been referred to the Almoner's Department by the Medical Staff for arrangements to be made for Convalescent treatment. They have gone to Homes at Southport, Meltham, St. Annes, Scarborough, Woolton, West Kirby, Buxton and Harrogate. Fifteen children went to the Children's Convalescent Home on Lindley Moor. We are very sorry that this Home is closing down at Easter as we shall miss it very much, especially for the younger children. In order to raise the money for the cost of the Convalescent treatment, the Almoner has enlisted the co-operation of the Huddersfield and District Contributory Scheme, the Approved Societies, the Colne Valley Loom Fund, the Clergy, the Public Assistance Committee, and the United Services Fund. The remainder was paid by the Infirmary Convalescent Fund and contributions from the patients themselves.

Twenty-nine grants were made from the Samaritan Fund to help patients to pay their fares in order that they could attend regularly for treatment, and thirty-seven patients were given extra clothing and nourishment.

Help has also been given in the home when the patient has been unfit to do her housework and who has not had a relative or friend who could come to her assistance.

One hundred and twenty In-patients and one hundred and twenty-six Out-patients who had been injured in motor accidents were treated at the Infirmary during the year. The Almoner deals with the collection of payments authorised under the Road Traffic Act, and £557 0s. 0d. was raised from this source during the year.

Very hearty thanks are due to the voluntary agencies and private people who have given such willing co-operation in the work of the Department during the year. These include the District Nurses in various areas, the United Services Fund and Royal Naval Benevolent Fund, the Law Society, the Colne Valley Loom Fund, the Brighouse Social Welfare Fund, the National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children, and the Clergy and Ministers of all denominations.

#### CONDITIONS.

IN-PATIENTS. Persons requiring treatment must attend the Out-patient Department, if able to do so, and consult a Member of the Honorary Medical Staff, who will, if necessary, make arrangements for admission. Those who are too ill or physically unable to carry out the foregoing arrangement should get their own Medical Adviser to communicate with the Resident Surgical Officer, who will arrange for admission if necessary.

On no account should patients arrive at the Hospital (except in the case of accident) without having been notified to do so.

OUT-PATIENTS. Out-patients must attend the Physician or Surgeon who first received them under his care, on the day of his attendance at the Hospital. Bottles or containers for the medicines or lotions are supplied by the Hospital at a small charge.

ENQUIRIES. Enquiries by telephone respecting In-patients should be made between 10 and 12 a.m. Not more than one enquiry should be made on any day, unless the Patient is notified as being in a critical condition. Telephone No. 2866.

VISITORS. Visiting days are:—Tuesday, 2-30 to 3-30 p.m. Saturday 2-30 to 3-30 p.m., Sunday 2-30 to 3-30 p.m. Only two friends are permitted at the bed-side at one time, and not more than four visitors on one visiting day. Visiting Cards are granted to relatives and must be produced when visiting.

SPECIAL NOTICE. The Hospital is entirely dependent on voluntary support, and the Board of Management strongly urges and invites Patients to contribute towards their maintenance and attention, such sums as they feel able to give. Such contributions, large or small, from those who can give assistance, are the means of helping others less fortunately situated to recover their health and strength. The right to refuse admission on financial grounds is reserved to the Board of Management.

Recommendation forms are not available for massage treatment or X-ray examinations. Treatment in these cases is provided on the recommendation of the Honorary Medical Staff, or in case of persons not being Hospital Patients, on payment of the small fees arranged. Information relating to these fees may be obtained from the Secretary or in the case of massage at the Orthopædic Clinic.

#### PRIVILEGES OF SUBSCRIBERS AND DONORS.

A<sup>N</sup> Annual Subscription of two guineas or more shall qualify the subscriber to be a Governor during the period for which the subscription is paid.

The Clergyman or representative of any place of worship wherein a collection of not less than four guineas is taken for the Infirmary shall be a Governor for one year following payment.

A Corporate Body, Society, or other Collective Body subscribing not less than five guineas annually shall be entitled to nominate in writing a representative as a Governor during the period for which the subscription is paid.

A donor of forty guineas or more at one time shall be a Governor for life.

A Testator who shall bequeath a sum of at least one hundred pounds to the Infirmary may by his Will nominate some person to be a Governor for life from the date of payment of the legacy. In the absence of any such nomination the Executor or Executors may, with the approval of the Board of Management, nominate some person to be a Governor for life.

A Corporate Body, Society, or other Collective Body making a donation of one hundred pounds or more at one time shall be entitled to nominate in writing a representative to be a Governor for life.

All donors making a personal gift of five hundred pounds and upwards shall be Honorary Vice-Presidents for life.

A donor of one thousand pounds to the Infirmary's Endowment Fund shall have the right to affix a name to one of the beds for adults in perpetuity, and a donor of five hundred pounds to the same Fund shall have the right similarly to name a cot in the Children's Ward.

All the annual subscriptions are considered as becoming due on the first of January in each year at which time the current year commences.

# Report of the Managing Committee

# Meltham Mills Convalescent Home

For the year ending the 31st December, 1938.

The Managing Committee beg to present this, their Sixty-seventh Annual Report, together with a Statement in detail of the Receipts and Expenditure for the year ended the 31st December, 1938.

On the 1st day of January, 1938, there were four patients remaining in the Home, since that date 105 have been admitted, 38 Males and 67 Females (of these 12 were sent by the Board of the Huddersfield Royal Infirmary and 93 on the recommendation of the members of the Managing Committee) the total number of patients being 109.

107 Patients have been discharged leaving two in the Home on the 31st December, 1938. Each Patient stayed an average of twenty-eight days.

The Patients average gain in weight was from 7 lbs, to 8 lbs. each.

The Committee express their thanks for gifts received from Mrs. T. J. Hirst, Mrs. E. L. B. Lart, the Huddersfield and District Egg Committee per Mrs. E. L. Fisher and the Red Cross Society.

The Committee also express their thanks to the Ladies' Advisory Committee for their valuable assistance to them during the year.
