Report of the Board of Management 1940.

TO THE GOVERNORS,

The Board of Management respectfully submits to the Governors the One Hundred and Ninth Annual Report of the Infirmary.

Reference was made in the last Annual Report to the great part which voluntary Hospitals were having to play in the Emergency Medical Service Scheme organised by the Ministry of Health and that your Infirmary had been placed in the IA category.

The task of adequately preparing the Hospital and its Staff to meet emergency has been proceeded with with all speed and your Board is satisfied that the steps taken will ensure that the organisation and arrangements in the unfortunate event of aerial attack will not be found wanting. In its sympathy with, and concern for, the public in need of Hospital treatment, your Board was gratified to receive the Ministry's authority modifying, to some extent, the restrictions upon the admission of normal civilian patients. The result is that a rather higher figure for the average daily number of beds occupied is able to be shewn. The difficulties which every member of the public has had to face have been shared by the Infirmary. Rising costs and the difficulty in obtaining commodities have caused your Board serious thought.

At several times during the year it was felt that December 31st would shew an alarming excess of expenditure over receipts. The two items respectively were £55,776 6s. 0d. and £53,217 3s. 2d., or a deficiency of £2,559 2s. 10d. That this deficiency is not greater is largely due to grants which have been made by the Ministry of Health in payment for keeping beds empty for emergency and the treatment of Service sick. Special reference must be made to the way in which subscribers and friends of the Hospital have kept up and even in many cases increased their loyal support and enabled your Board to continue with the vital work.

This help has not been confined solely to financial aid, as instanced by the Blood Transfusion Service. As a result of appeals made, this service has been extended. An emergency list of donors is being added to almost daily, and your Board wishes to express its gratitude to all those who have so loyally given in their names and to the Rover Scouts and the Huddersfield Branch of Toc H for their excellent help in the organisation.

Whilst major attention has necessarily been given to the work which the Hospital may have to undertake in emergency, there has been no neglect of normal policy. Some sixty fewer motor accident

cases were admitted as compared with the previous year, and in difficult cases the Huddersfield Law Society was again most helpful in obtaining payment under the Road Traffic Act. Your Board thanks the Society for its continued good work.

On many occasions during the year the Proprietors of the Huddersfield "Examiner" have shewn their interest in the Infirmary and sympathy with its work, and the help they have given is very much appreciated.

Close co-operation, both in emergency and normal policy, has taken place between the Honorary Medical Staff and your Board, and adequate arrangements have been made for carrying out the medical work of the Hospital despite a depleted Staff. In the absence of Mr. Barclay on War Service, Mr. A. Latimer Walker, with the co-operation of the Corporation Education Committee, has been appointed to act as temporary Orthopaedic Surgeon. Doctor G. Crompton and Doctor G. H. A. Graetz were elected by ballot to fill the two vacant offices of Temporary Honorary Anaesthetist during the time members of the permanent Anaesthetic Staff are serving with H.M. Forces. Doctor Jane C. Miller has been appointed temporary assistant to Doctor Affleck in the Medical Department.

Consequent upon the retirement in the latter part of 1939 of Mr. Albert Moorhouse, who for so many years had been Assistant Secretary, Mr. A. H. Binns, of Bradford Royal Infirmary, was appointed, and commenced his duties in May.

Finally your Board earnestly appeals for a continuance of that friendly and sympathetic help from all our friends which was manifested during last year, and expresses the hope that the crisis through which the whole country is at present passing may come to a speedy and successful conclusion.

WORK OF THE YEAR.

The number of persons treated in all Departments of the Infirmary was 30,994, an increase of 1,189 over the figure for 1939. In-Patients totalled 4,201 and Out-Patients 26,793. The number of beds equipped was 302, but of these an average of 284 was available owing to the closing of wards for infectious diseases and cleaning. The average number of beds occupied daily was 230.91, or 81 per cent. of the available number. The average number of days each patient was resident was 20.12. Deaths occurring from all causes during the year totalled 311, but of this number 101 took place within 48 hours of admission. The percentage of deaths to the total number of In-Patients was 7.4, but subtracting those deaths occurring within 48 hours of admission the percentage was reduced to 4.9.

In the Massage Department, 67,857 treatments were given, compared with 76,817 during the previous year. The number of patients passing through the Department totalled 2,822, and the attendances numbered 49,444. The total number of specimens

examined in the Pathological Department was 12,148, and the Pathologist conducted 106 post mortem examinations. The following figures refer to cases admitted as a result of motor accidents :—

Of the total receipts, £735 was the amount received from Insurance Companies during the year.

FINANCIAL.

General.

The total expenditure of £55,776 6s. 0d. exceeded the total income of £53,217 3s. 2d. by £2,559 2s. 10d.

Income.

The total income for the year was £53,217 3s. 2d., which is £5,965 9s. 1d. in excess of the 1939 total. Annual subscriptions shew a welcome increase, which is largely due to the response to a special appeal issued by the Board for increased help during the period of the War. Donations maintain a steady level. The Huddersfield and District Hospitals Contributory Scheme continues its excellent work, and during the year £20,937 5s. 0d. was the total of the monthly allocations, and, in addition, £382 13s. 7d. was passed to our funds from other Schemes. The Management Committee of the Scheme helped further by issuing a special appeal for funds to defray the cost of installing a new X-Ray Transformer costing £600. Our best thanks are freely given for this action.

Rose Day receipts of £755 1s. 4d. exceeded the previous year's high figure by £171 7s. 2d. In according its sincere gratitude to all those persons who so willingly give their help year by year, your Board is heartened by the success in spite of obstacles. The Ministry of Health payment for beds kept in reserve and for the treatment of Service sick totalled £7,556 19s. 4d.—a grant for which your Board is grateful. Two important events were not held. The Annual Ball, which was also cancelled in 1939, and the Annual Charity Football Match. The members of the Charity Cup Committee are regretful of the necessity of not holding this latter, but felt that the high expense involved in the promotion would not have a proportionate return. The "Examiner" Inter-Club Tennis Tournament was again held despite great difficulties, and the exceptional hard work which the Tennis Tournament Committee exercised in making it a success is reflected in the total of £87 being received. Your Board cordially thanks the Proprietors of the Huddersfield "Examiner" for the big part played in making this possible.

Expenditure.

The total expenditure of £55,776 6s. 0d. exceeds the 1939 figure by £6,786 6s. 11d. An expected increase is shewn under most items of expenditure due to much higher costs. The increase in the item for salaries and wages is due to a higher Nursing Staff scale and cost of living bonus for certain other employees. Under Extraordinary Expenditure is an item of £2,625 2s. 2d., which represents payment for structural and other precautions carried out in accordance with the Ministry of Health's instructions. The greater portion of this sum will, in due course, be refunded by the Ministry.

Building and Extension Fund.

The loan to the Fund from General Purposes Fund is being slowly reduced. During the year donations and subscriptions under deed of covenant amounting to £6,255 16s. 2d. have been credited, and the outstanding debt is now £23,232 8s. 4d. Your Board still asks for further support to this Fund to help clear the old debt.

Private Patients' Department.

Rather greater use made of the Department and the absence of expense of a capital nature, have made it possible to transfer the sum

of £300 to the General Account. The following figures shew the work done :—

THE LADIES' COMMITTEE.

Despite the increasing calls on their time, occasioned by the War, the members of this Committee have with all energy and vigour continued their invaluable work for the patients. Once more your Board's hearty congratulations and sincere thanks are accorded to the Ladies for their enthusiasm and sympathy in our work.

During the year a total of 134 articles was supplied for the use of the patients, and for these gifts your Board is truly thankful. Mrs. Tinker and her helpers again organised the Egg Collection, but in spite of their united efforts the collection shewed a reduction on that of the previous year. 34,200 Eggs were delivered to the Hospital, but your Board is no less appreciative of the efforts of Mrs. Tinker and all those who gave their time and help to what this year was a most difficult task.

THE NURSING STAFF.

Twenty-three Nurses entered the Preliminary State Examination during 1940, and fourteen passed. In the Final State Examination twelve Nurses entered and nine passed.

Medals for general efficiency following the Final Hospital Examination were awarded as follows :—

- Gold Medallist—Nurse M. Hood.
- Silver Medallist—Nurse M. Lewis.
- Bronze Medallist—Nurse M. Dixon.

Senior Probationer B. M. Baines was awarded the junior Nurses book prize.

The Honorary Medical Staff's special prizes for the best practical Nurses were awarded as under :—

- Senior Prize to Senior Probationer M. T. Kerwick.
- Junior Prize to Senior Probationer M. Hoyle.

During the year 30 Pupils were admitted to the Preliminary Training School, of whom 24 passed forward to take up their duties in the Wards. It was again found impossible to organise the usual Annual Tennis Tournament for the Nursing Staff, but great enjoyment was caused by a picnic during the summer.

The training of Auxiliary Nurses continues, and the Edgerton Nursing Division of St. John's Ambulance Brigade is standing by to supply Nurses for the Decontamination Centre at the Infirmary should its use become necessary.

Your Board's congratulations are accorded to Miss E. M. Thornhill, Assistant Matron, who left in August, 1940, to take up her duties as Matron of the Brompton Hospital for Consumption and Diseases of the Chest, London, and it is pleasing to know that a member of the Staff of this Hospital has been selected for so important a post. Miss I. Walton, of the Royal Hospital, Wolverhampton, was appointed as her successor.

ALMONER'S REPORT, 1940.

The work of the Almoner's Department during 1940 has naturally been affected by war conditions. With constant air raids over the coastal areas during the latter part of the year fewer patients have been sent to seaside Convalescent Homes. We are now arranging for our patients in need of convalescent treatment to go to a very nice Home in Ilkley which is remaining open throughout the winter.

Over eleven hundred soldiers have attended the Infirmary during the year, and the records which it is necessary to keep concerning them have added considerably to the work of the Almoner's Department. The influx of refugees from London and the Channel Islands has also brought various kinds of problems to be solved.

The number of people treated following motor accidents is fortunately not so high as it was last year. £836 has been raised from Insurance Companies and other sources towards the cost of their treatment and maintenance.

Eighty-nine Surgical Appliances have been supplied at a total cost of £196 10s. 0d. Of this amount only £7 3s. 6d. has been paid by the Infirmary. The remaining £189 6s. 6d. has been paid by the patients themselves and by various Public Authorities and Philanthropic Societies.

Examples of Assistance given to Patients.

Mrs. R. was attending the Infirmary with diabetes, and was finding it impossible to get her proper diet as her husband had joined the Army and the family income had fallen to less than half what it was before the War. Her condition began to deteriorate through worry and inability to buy the proper kind of food. The Almoner made an application for extra relief to be paid to Mrs. R. by the War Grants Advisory Committee, and as this usually takes some time to come through she also asked the Soldiers, Sailors and Airmen's Family Association to give temporary aid. This they did at once and continued to do so until a permanent grant of 8/6 a week was allowed from the War Grants Advisory Committee.

Mr. S. is attending the Infirmary with malignant disease of the throat. He cannot manage to swallow solids, and he was finding it very difficult to buy nourishing liquid food, as he was only getting his Old Age Pension.

The Almoner asked the National Society for Cancer Relief for help, and they are now allowing him a grant of six shillings a week for an indefinite time. This is paid to the patient each week through the Almoner's Office.

Mr. C., a refugee from Czecho-Slovakia, was an in-patient in one of our Surgical Wards for three weeks with a septic hand. While he was in the ward he heard that he had lost his job, and as he had not paid sufficient National Health Insurance Contributions he was not in benefit to draw any sickness pay. He was worrying because he did not know how he was to pay for his board and lodging when he was discharged from the Infirmary. The Almoner wrote to the Refugees Co-ordinating Committee explaining the difficulty that Mr. C. was in, and they wrote back at once to say that as soon as he left the Infirmary they would send him sufficient money to live on until he was well enough to obtain fresh employment.

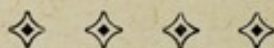

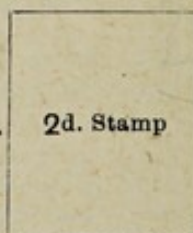

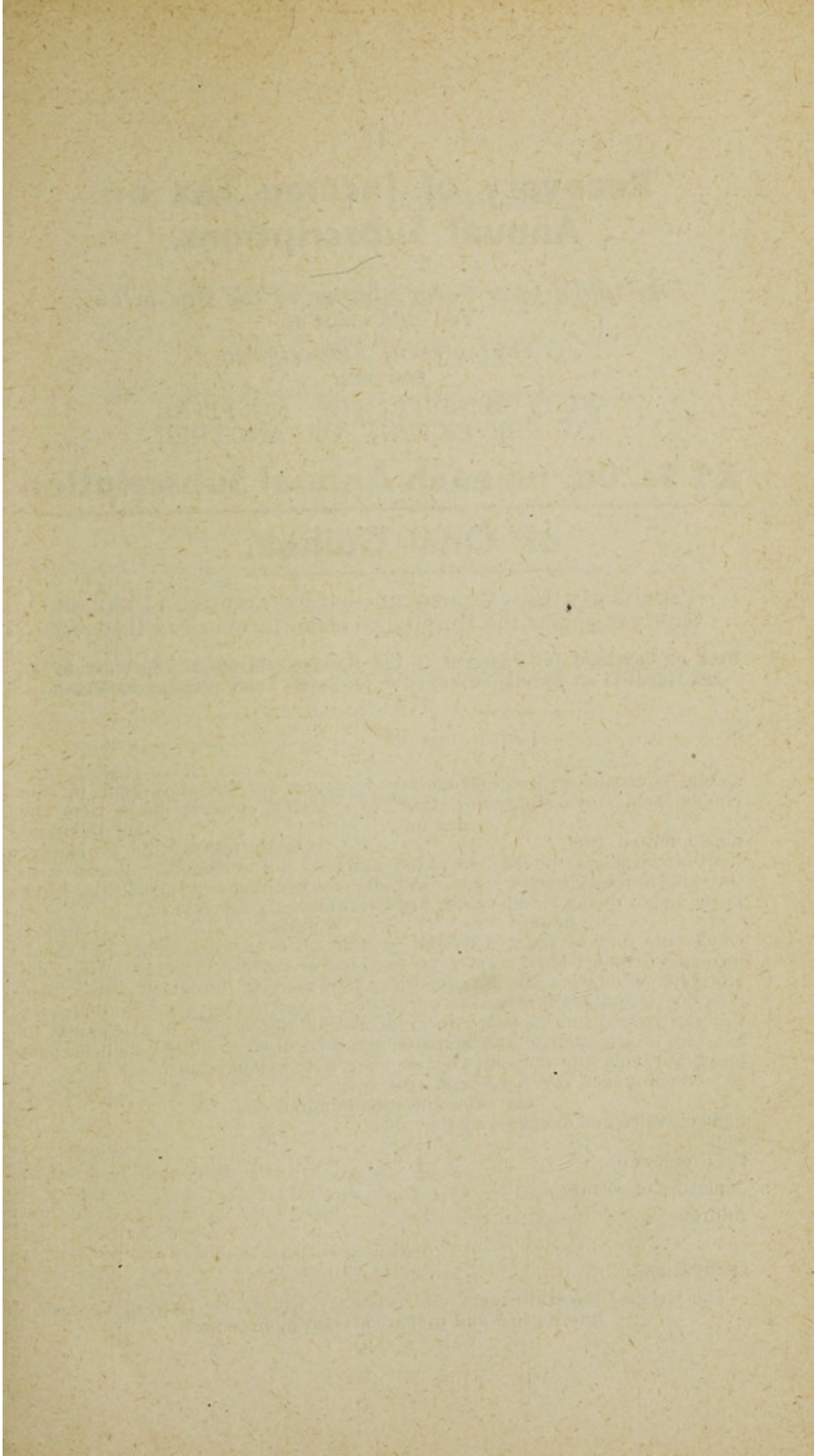

CONDITIONS.

IN-PATIENTS. Persons requiring treatment must attend the Out-patient Department, if able to do so, and consult a Member of the Honorary Medical Staff, who will, if necessary, make arrangements for admission. Those who are too ill or physically unable to carry out the foregoing arrangement should get their own Medical Adviser to communicate with the Resident Surgical Officer, who will arrange for admission if necessary.

On no account should patients arrive at the Hospital (except in the case of accident) without having been notified to do so.

OUT-PATIENTS. Out-patients must attend the Physician or Surgeon who first received them under his care, on the day of his attendance at the Hospital. Bottles or containers for the medicines or lotions are supplied by the Hospital at a small charge.

ENQUIRIES. Enquiries by telephone respecting In-patients should be made between 10 and 12 a.m. Not more than one enquiry should be made on any day, unless the Patient is notified as being in a critical condition. Telephone No. 2866.

VISITORS. Visiting days are:—Tuesday, 2-30 to 3-30 p.m. Saturday 2-30 to 3-30 p.m., Sunday 2-30 to 3-30 p.m. Only two friends are permitted at the bed-side at one time, and not more than four visitors on one visiting day. Visiting Cards are granted to relatives and must be produced when visiting.

SPECIAL NOTICE. The Hospital is entirely dependent on voluntary support, and the Board of Management strongly urges and invites Patients to contribute towards their maintenance and attention, such sums as they feel able to give. Such contributions, large or small, from those who can give assistance, are the means of helping others less fortunately situated to recover their health and strength. The right to refuse admission on financial grounds is reserved to the Board of Management.

MASSAGE TREATMENT OR X-RAY EXAMINATIONS. Treatment in these cases is provided on the recommendation of the Honorary Medical Staff, or in case of persons not being Hospital Patients, on payment of the small fees arranged. Information relating to these fees may be obtained from the Secretary or in the case of massage at the Orthopædic Clinic.

PRIVILEGES OF SUBSCRIBERS AND DONORS.

AN Annual Subscription of two guineas or more shall qualify the subscriber to be a Governor during the period for which the subscription is paid.

The Clergyman or representative of any place of worship wherein a collection of not less than four guineas is taken for the Infirmary shall be a Governor for one year following payment.

A Corporate Body, Society, or other Collective Body subscribing not less than five guineas annually shall be entitled to nominate in writing a representative as a Governor during the period for which the subscription is paid.

A donor of forty guineas or more at one time shall be a Governor for life.

A Testator who shall bequeath a sum of at least one hundred pounds to the Infirmary may by his Will nominate some person to be a Governor for life from the date of payment of the legacy. In the absence of any such nomination the Executor or Executors may, with the approval of the Board of Management, nominate some person to be a Governor for life.

A Corporate Body, Society, or other Collective Body making a donation of one hundred pounds or more at one time shall be entitled to nominate in writing a representative to be a Governor for life.

All donors making a personal gift of five hundred pounds and upwards shall be Honorary Vice-Presidents for life.

A donor of one thousand pounds to the Infirmary's Endowment Fund shall have the right to affix a name to one of the beds for adults in perpetuity, and a donor of five hundred pounds to the same Fund shall have the right similarly to name a cot in the Children's Ward.

All the annual subscriptions are considered as becoming due on the first of January in each year at which time the current year commences.
