

The Forty-First Annual Report.

31st December, 1928.

HE Committee of Management present their 41st Annual Report and Statement of Accounts and take this opportunity to thank most gratefully and sincerely all those Subscribers and donors who have given so kindly and generously in support of the Hospital.

The total number of patients treated at the Hospital during the year was 454, of whom 189 occupied beds, and 265 were out-patients. In 1927 there were 466, of whom 186 occupied beds and 280 were out-patients. The aggregate number of attendances on the 265 out-patients was 1,881. 9,646 patients have been treated at the Hospital since its opening in 1888.

The Hospital can accommodate 16 patients. Patients are admitted by "Letter of Recommendation," which can be obtained from subscribers, who are entitled to recommend one in-patient for each guinea subscribed. These "Letters" are only available for one year from the date of issue, and entitle patients to treatment for a period not exceeding one month.

ACCOUNTS FOR 1928.

The total ordinary receipts for the year amount to £2,450 6s. 3d., and the expenditure £1,992 10s. 0d.

Lady Reginald Hall very kindly responded to our invitation to open the Twenty-fourth ANNUAL SALE OF WORK, held at the Town Hall on the 30th October last. Lady Hall's presence attracted a large gathering at the opening ceremony, and the result was a record, the Funds of the Hospital benefiting by the sum of £399 8s. The Committee are grateful to the ladies and gentlemen who at no small sacrifice to themselves helped to bring about this splendid result, and thank them very much indeed.

THE JUMBLE SALE realised £46 12s. 10d., and POUND DAY £43 4s. 6d., and 900 pounds in kind. The Committee say "many thanks" to those who contributed to these excellent objects.

PENNY-A-WEEK FUND.—Our share of the sum collected was £144 13s. 2d., and we most sincerely thank the Committee and helpers of this splendid organisation for their generous aid.

Special Donations and Collections from Churches, as per list attached, are very much appreciated.

NEW BUILDING FUND.

In our last two reports we have hinted at a New Hospital, and certain small sums have been given to be ear-marked "New Building."

By the time this Report is in the hands of the Subscribers and Donors, we shall be in the happy position of owning a vacant piece of freehold land at the corner of Seaside and Ringwood Road, which we consider to be suitable for the erection of the new Leaf Hospital.

In choosing this position we have borne in mind the increasing need for our work to continue at the East end of the town.

We want to commence building at an early date, but our financial position must first be made reasonably secure, and to that end we are inviting DONATIONS (however small) to the LEAF HOSPITAL BUILDING FUND. Can you help?

We regret the decease of a member of our Committee, Mr. R. W. Jay, who was very helpful and ready at all times with sound advice.

The Rev. J. A. Brookes, who has been one of the Hon. Chaplains for some years, has left the Parish to take up duty at Hampden Park. We miss his kindly and cheerful presence, and wish him all success in his new work.

The Committee have again to return their best thanks to Mr. David Ligat, Consulting Surgeon, Dr. E. A. Neatby, Gynæcologist, Dr. A. H. Croucher, Dr. H. J. A. Pollard, Dr. R. R. Pirrie, Anæsthetist, and Mr. Harold Turner, Dental Surgeon, for their sympathetic and skilful treatment of the patients, gratuitously given; to the Matron and Staff for their devoted attention to their respective duties to which the patients never fail to testify, and to the kind donors of various articles (as per list), which have been so much appreciated by the patients.

Annual Subscriptions are much needed to ensure an income, and the Committee would be very grateful if those who are interested in the work of the Hospital would become Annual Subscribers.
