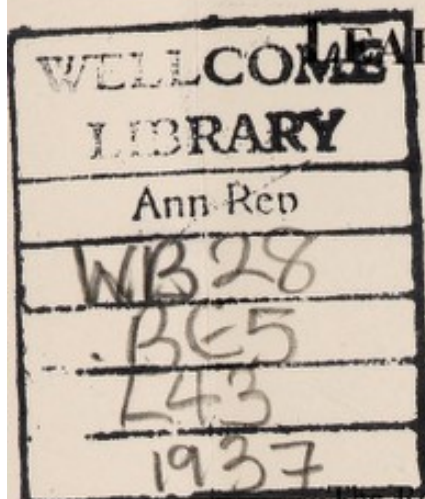

THIS the 50th Annual Report reminds us that we have been in existence half a century.

That we have received the affection and support of the inhabitants of Eastbourne and district over this long period is very gratifying—forty-seven years we were in Marine Road and just over three years ago we moved to our present fine, modern building in St. Anne's Road.

In presenting this Report we are happy to say we have had a most satisfactory year. Much good work in the healing of the sick and suffering has been done, and the financial support has been most encouraging.

We most sincerely thank the donors and subscribers for their invaluable support, as also those others who in so many ways have helped us, and we feel confident in the future.

We record the naming of a Child's Cot by the will of the late Mrs. E. E. Hart to the memory of her mother, Mrs. Julia Marden, also the receipt of several substantial legacies for which we are heartily thankful.

The "Bun Pennies" continue to be a source of special help and during the year we have been given many additions to our Theatre equipment. We are also promised shortly extra apparatus for the X-ray department. This makes a total sum of £331 17s. 5d. received to date. Our grateful thanks are due to Mrs. Jethro Robinson and Miss I. J. Dodd and those who subscribe to this Fund for their valuable assistance.

The Ladies' Linen League continues to supply the linen for the Hospital and this, in these days of rising prices, is a substantial help to the finances of the Hospital. We acknowledge this service with gratitude and sincere thanks.

Lady Purves-Stewart very kindly opened our Thirty-Third Annual Sale of Work at the Town Hall on 19th October last. Her gracious presence and appealing words did much to make the Sale a success. £319 13s. was the sum taken during the day. We record our grateful thanks to Lady Purves-Stewart for coming to help us. We also record our very warm thanks to all those ladies who took stalls,

dispensed refreshments, arranged the competitions and in so many other ways helped to organise another successful annual event.

The Jumble Sale contributed £48 11s. 9d., Pound Day £21 7s. 3d. and 1,945 lbs in goods, Penny-a-week Fund £106 15s. 9d., and Church Collections £15 5s.

For this splendid financial help we record our sincere thanks as also to those ladies and gentlemen who give their services in the collection and organisation.

The Medical Report shows a large increase in the cases admitted and we tender our very best thanks to the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff and the Honorary Dentist for their devoted and willing attention to duties during another year.

During this year we have had the pleasure of welcoming Mr. D. E. O'Connor Cuffey, F.R.C.S., as Honorary Consulting Ear, Nose and Throat Surgeon.

The Matron and Nursing Staff have fulfilled their duties to the utmost and we tender to them our very warm thanks.

Mr. Councillor A. E. Rush and Mr. H. A. Franklin have joined the Committee of Management during the year and we have had the benefit of the advice of these two well-known business men.

We regret the loss through death of several valued friends and supporters of the Hospital.

The many substantial donations received from various organisations and the increase in subscriptions has been very encouraging, but our expenditure for the year has exceeded our ordinary income by £517 1s. 9d., so again for the third year in succession we have been obliged to use legacy money to balance our budget.

We hope the services of this Hospital are sufficiently appreciated by the inhabitants to merit a continuance of their support and that many new supporters will be forthcoming in 1938, our GOLDEN JUBILEE YEAR.

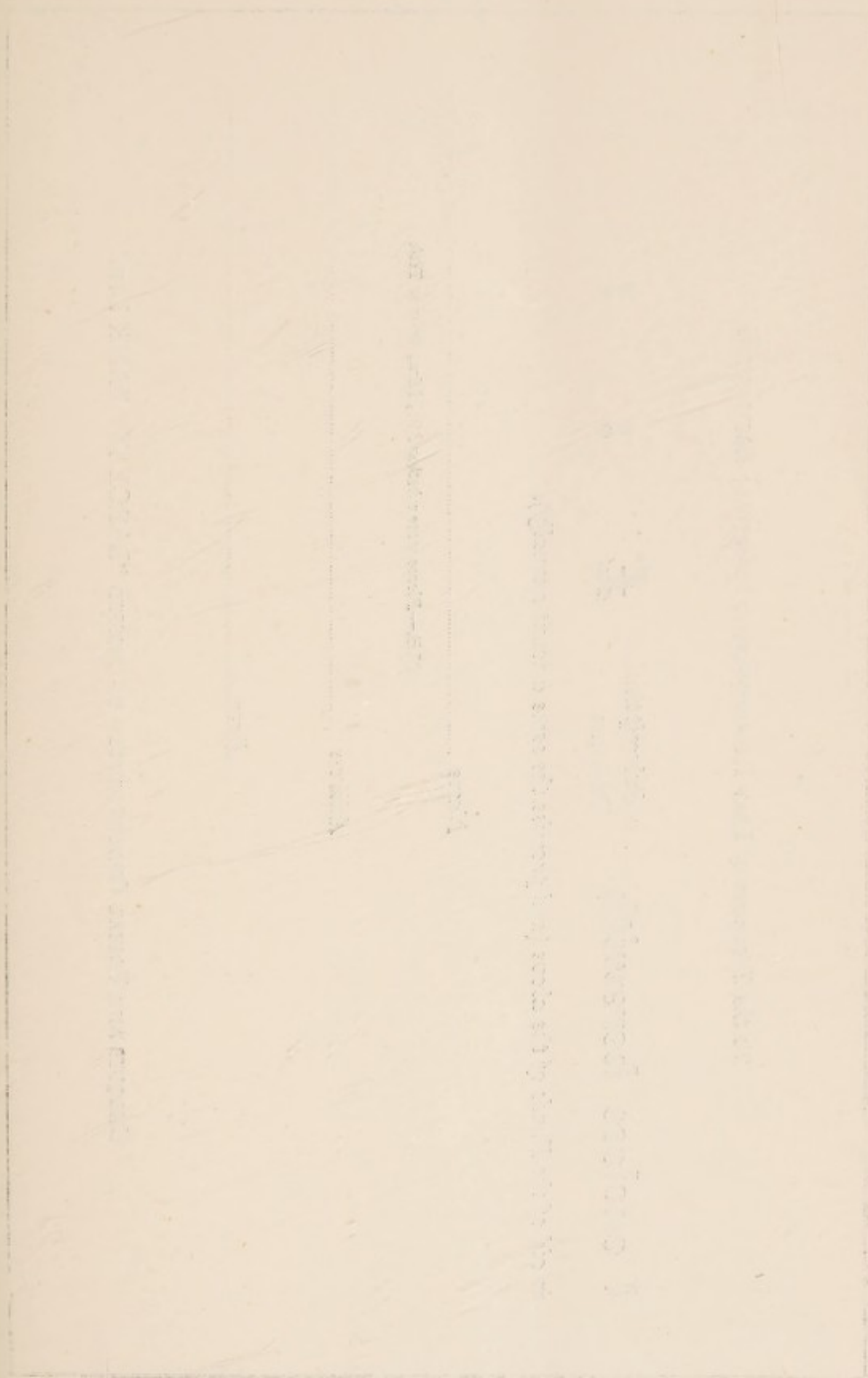

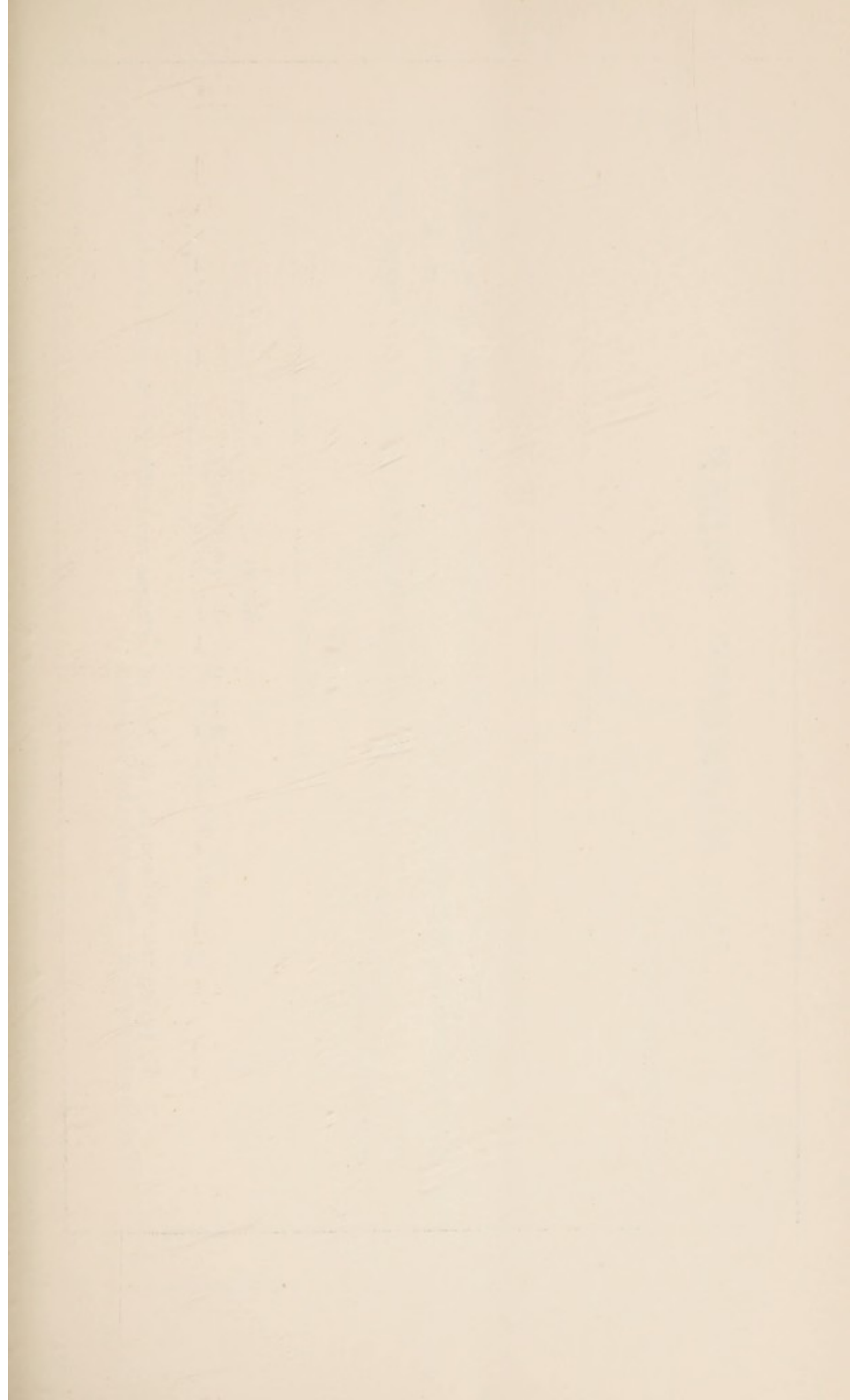
