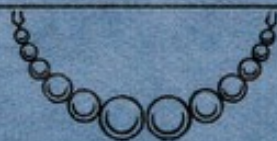

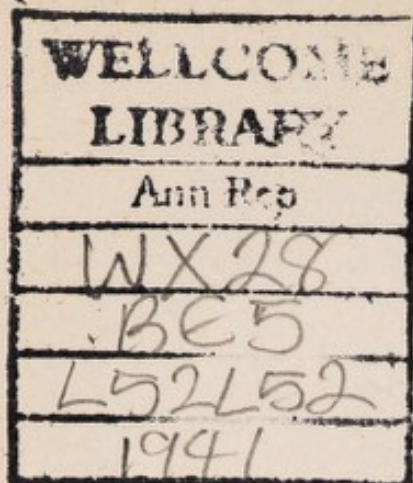

The Board of Governors has pleasure in presenting its Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st March, 1941.

The Year's Work.

Despite the many difficulties and greatly increased responsibilities occasioned by war conditions, it is pleasing to note that the normal work of the Hospital has not suffered, while its services have been extended and fully maintained.

The ordinary income amounted to £18,648, compared with £15,127 for the previous year, an increase of £3,521.

Expenditure

The ordinary expenditure amounted to £16,736, compared with £15,362 for the previous year, the increase of £1,374 being due chiefly to rising costs.

The deficit on the year's working was £244, making a total accumulated deficit of £9,232. The Board takes this opportunity of pointing out that by virtue of prevailing conditions, increased expenditure is inevitable, and sincerely trusts that greater and more widespread support will be forthcoming during the ensuing year.

Air Raid Precautions.

In the course of the past year all ground floor windows throughout the Hospital, and first-storey ward windows, have been treated with anti-splinter netting and varnish.

The operating theatres have been strongly re-inforced to withstand the effects of blast, indoor shelters have been adapted for the staff, and schemes for the protection of patients and essential departments and the provision of a decontamination unit, have been approved by the Ministry of Health and the work put in hand.

The Board desires to take this opportunity of expressing its warmest admiration and grateful thanks for the loyal and devoted service rendered by the Infirmary Staff, the Medical Practitioners serving on the E.M.S. Team, and by the volunteer Auxiliary Nurses, Auxiliary Firemen, Stretcher Bearers and Fire Watchers.

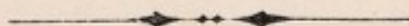
