



## TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT

of the Governors, presented to the Annual Meeting of Subscribers, held in the Mayor's Parlour, Town Hall, Leigh, on Thursday, 21st May, 1931.

The Board of Governors beg to present their Twenty-Fourth Annual Report.

The Statement of Accounts, which has been duly audited by Mr. Herbert Boardman, Chartered Accountant, is annexed.

The average stay of each patient in the Infirmary has been 16.36 days. The following table shows the average stay of patients in the Infirmary in the ten preceding years :--

The number of deaths is 89, being 29 more than last year.

It has to be remembered that many patients are in a serious condition when admitted, especially with a number of severe accident cases.

The highest number of patients in the Institution at any one time during the year was 87. This is explained by the fact that under severe pressure patients have been accommodated on couches. The total number of operations during the year was 1089.

The X-Ray Department continues to prove its usefulness, and the number of treatments given in this department and the Massage Clinic this and the previous two years are given below :—

The Infirmary Staff, Resident and Non-Resident, consists of 1 Resident House Surgeon, 1 Matron, 1 Assistant Matron and Tutor Sister, 1 Theatre Sister, 1 X-Ray Sister, 2 Massage Sisters, 1 Aural Clinic Sister, 4 Ward Sisters, 1 Night Sister, 1 Dispenser, 3 Staff Nurses, 20 Probationers, 1 Kitchen Sister, 1 Assistant Cook, 1 Housemaid Waitress, 3 Housemaids, 4 Ward Maids, 2 Kitchen Maids, 4 Laundresses, 2 Daily Helps, 1 Seamstress, 1 Engineer, 2 Stokers, 1 Gardener, 1 Door Attendant, 1 Page Boy and a Secretary.

Notwithstanding the continued depression of trade, the annexed accounts shew an improvement in the contributions, although the Maintenance Fund still reveals a deficit of £4,625, and the Institution is indebted to the Bank in the sum of £4,293 5s. 8d. The cost of carrying on the Institution continues to be very high, the total for the year being £13,200 13s. 8d.

The Board is deeply grateful to the Deputy Mayor (Mr. Alderman N. Fairhurst, J.P.) for his efforts on their behalf by promoting the Summer Fair, which realised £169 os. 7d., and for the performance by the Sacred Heart Amateurs, due to his influence, which resulted in a profit to the Funds of £19 os. 10d.

Their very warmest thanks are also accorded to the Mayor of Leigh (Mr. Councillor W. Higenbottam, J.P.) for his untiring efforts to raise funds. The Christmas House to House Appeal in Leigh realised  $\pounds_{212}$  16s. 5d. The Mayor induced Tyldesley to launch a similar effort, which produced £88 16s. 3d. Astley also had a like collection, realising £28 17s. 9d. Various other efforts inaugurated by the Mayor produced splendid results. These include £28 9s. 3d. as proceeds of a concert at Lowton, £145 18s. 9d. from the Ladies' Section of the Mayor's Committee, Special New Year's effort amounted to £205 17s. 2d. The foregoing, with several donations, made the Mayor's effort all told into £733 18s. 11d., which is very commendable in view of the times.

Several efforts have been made locally to raise funds—one by a Billiards Handicap, which proved most popular; another by a Snooker League, which was well patronised. Various Whist Drives and Dances have also been held and well attended.

The Leigh Charity Bowling Handicap was revived last season and was very well supported.

For these various efforts the Board of Governors is most grateful to the promoters.

During the year a contributory scheme has been devised whereby Recommend Patients are able to make a voluntary contribution to the funds whilst in Hospital. The income from this source has amounted to  $\pounds$ 197 14s. od.

The Board during the year has had installed a Heater Condenser Plant and a new pump at considerable expense, which has resulted in the saving of some 4,000 gallons of water weekly, which formerly went to waste. This will considerably reduce the expenditure on town's water for boiler-feed purposes.

After much thought and deliberation, the Board has recently placed a contract for a new X-ray Plant, the former apparatus, installed 17 years ago, having become out of date and inaccurate for diagnostic work. The cost of this is expected to reach almost  $\pounds_{1,000}$ , and a special appeal for subscriptions for this object is respectfully made. Dr. J. B. Higgins, the visiting Radiologist, has left, having obtained another appointment at Crumpsall Infirmary. He has been succeeded by Dr. J. B. Hartley, of Manchester Royal Infirmary, and, owing to the increase of work in this department, three visits per week are necessitated instead of two per week as formerly.

A very substantial wall has now been erected on the North side, thus ensuring privacy and shelter on the Orchard Lane side of the Institution. A private donation has been made to cover the cost of this.

During the year Dr. F. P. Sturm expressed a desire to be relieved of his appointment as Honorary Aurist and Laryngologist to the Infirmary. The Board, with great regret, agreed to Dr. Sturm's wishes, and unanimously appointed him Honorary Consulting Aurist and Laryngologist to the Institution, and also Honorary Physician. The Board also would particularly like to express their warmest appreciation of the great work performed in the Infirmary by Dr. Sturm during the time he has been on the Honorary Staff.

The bequest to the Institution's Endowment Fund from the late Mrs. Annie Jones, widow of the late Dr. Benjamin Jones, has been received amounting to  $\pounds_{3,393}$  18s. 4d. A suitable tablet of bronze has been erected to commemorate this much appreciated gift.

The Institution also is cited in the will of the late Miss Evelyn Margaret Leather, formerly of Leigh, and who recently died in Southport. It also benefits under the will of the late Miss Hannah Hayes, a former Leighite, whose decease lately occurred in Blackpool.

The late Mr. Wm. Blackburn, of Southport, and formerly of Leigh, has also provided for the Institution in his will by the endowment of a cot in memory of his son. In each case the estates are in process of realisation, and the exact amounts eventually to come to the Infirmary are as yet indefinite.

The Leigh Masonic Group has during the year contributed a further  $\pounds_{176}$  7s. od. to the Endowment Fund, this making an aggregate gift of  $\pounds_{526}$  7s. od. This sum will now endow a cot, and a suitable tablet will be erected to commemorate this in due course.

It is very interesting and pleasing to note that the Executive Committee of the Maypole Colliery Explosion (1908) Relief Fund are applying to the Chancery Court for permission to endow a bed in both Leigh and Wigan Infirmaries, the dependants being more or less well provided for, with a surplus sum in hand. The procedure involved is rather complicated and may take some time, as the Court, no doubt, will give an opportunity for objections to be made by any interested person.

The Annual Demonstration in 1930 produced  $\pounds 234$  5s. od. a record for this event. The Carnival was a greater success than ever, and the enormous procession reflects great credit on the organisers. The cordial thanks and congratulations of the Board are tendered to them.

The Board of Governors has taken the greatest interest in the administration of the Infirmary and for the comfort and welfare of all patients. In their regular attendance and visits to the Wards they have heard the keen appreciation of their treatment from patients, and practically no complaints.

The Board has under consideration at present a Superannuation Scheme for the Nursing Staff, and hope through the Finance Committee to present a report and recommendations for those whose efforts are of such value to the sick.

The "Pound Week" held during last year proved of great value, the Food Account having been very materially helped by the generous offerings of groceries and gifts in kind. The Board expresses its deep appreciation of these many small gifts, which in the aggregate amount to a considerable saving.

The response to the collections in the Places of Worship on Infirmary Sunday in November, 1930, amounted to  $\pounds$ 172 8s. 3d. The figures for the three preceding years are given :—

The Board desire again most sincerely to thank the Hon. Surgical and Medical Staff for the valuable, highly skilled, efficient and greatly appreciated services they have continued to render throughout the year, and for their assiduous attention to the suffering patients. Thanks are also tendered to the Nursing Staff for the capable manner in which they have discharged their respective duties under the skilled direction of the Matron. Many letters of appreciation and gratitude have again been received from former patients or their families.

The Governors venture again to remind friends and supporters that for a donation or a legacy of  $\mathcal{L}_{1000}$ , a bed (or for  $\mathcal{L}_{500}$  a cot) can be named in perpetuity at the Infirmary, and that no more useful method of perpetuating the memory of relatives and friends could be devised. These donations and legacies have already helped to relieve the sufferings of humanity in the district. A tablet is placed on the wall over the selected bed, and will remain there as long as the Institution exists. The following tablets commemorating endowments are now fixed :—

A tablet has been affixed in the Marsh Nurses Home to commemorate Miss Marsh's wonderful generosity to the Building and Endowment of the Home.

The Governors are pleased to report that the Radiological Department is increasing in its usefulness, as will be seen by the foregoing figures, and this must be a source of gratification to the donors. Dr. Hartley is in charge of this Department.

The Governors again desire to tender their thanks to all Subscribers, and to express their gratification at the good results which have been attained from the regular collections made at many of the works in the district, and they again appeal to those firms who are not contributing regularly to adopt a regular system of collections, so as to ensure that a permanent Maintenance Fund will always be available to keep the Institution in good working order. A greater income is necessary to maintain the Institution now the extensions are completed, as the Staff (which includes a Resident Surgeon) has been augmented, and the additional upkeep entails the expenditure of a considerable amount of money.

The Governors desire to urge upon every firm in the neighbourhood the necessity for contributing, both by the firms themselves and by their employees.

## To carry out the work in the coming year $\pounds_{13,000}$ at least will be required for maintenance.

The work cannot be left undone; common humanity demands that it shall go on. The Board feel fully justified in asking for the help of all people able to afford it.




