

The Sixty-Seventh Annual Report

for the year 1940.



THE Committee have pleasure in submitting their sixty-seventh Annual Report and Statement of Accounts being that for the year ended 31st December, 1940, and, because of the importance of conserving paper, they have reduced the size considerably.

They desire to express their thanks to the subscribers and friends of the Hospital without whose help and support the benefits of the Hospital would be curtailed.

The number of patients treated during the year was 354 and they were in for a total of 5458 days, giving an average period for each patient of rather over 15 days.

The average cost per patient per week was £4 0s. 4d. as compared with £3 13s. 6d. in 1939. Of the 354 patients treated, 154 were admitted with Hospital and Convalescent Fund Recommends and 54 were private patients. There were 190 operations.

In the X-ray Department 563 patients have been treated and of this number 244 received free recommends from the Hospital and Convalescent Fund.

The ordinary Income for the year, inclusive of special receipts, was £4112 8s. 3d., and there was also a sum of £132 18s. 3d. received from the Ministry of Health for treatment of men serving in the Forces, and Evacuees. The expenditure was £3290 9s. 11d.

During the year, the following Legacies have been received—£450 from the late Miss Edith Millard, of Weston Coyney; £1651 1s. 10d. from the late Mr. R. S. Milner (making a total of £5217 1s. 10d. now

received from his Estate,) and £329 18s. 1d. from the late Mr. A. J. Twyford, of Blackpool.

Donations of £100 each from Miss Hannah Whittles and Miss Elizabeth Whittles and £250 to the Building Fund from the Leek Burial Society to commemorate the centenary of their foundation have also been gratefully received.

The Hospital has been appointed an A. R. P. Grade 1 Hospital by the Ministry of Health and during the year treated a certain number of both Service Patients and Evacuees, and the Committee wish to express their appreciation of the voluntary help given by the Leek Red Cross Detachment and St. John Ambulance Brigade.

The Committee have granted the Matron leave of absence to take up duties as Matron of the Red Cross Hospital at Sharpcliffe Hall, and when she is called to this post, Sister Casey will be in charge of this Hospital.

The Committee once again desire to place on record their deep appreciation of the excellent services rendered during the year by Mr. Eric Young and all Members of the Honorary Consulting Staff, to Dr. Bellamy, the Honorary Radiologist, to Mr. H. J. Arundel, the Honorary Solicitor, and to the Honorary Auditors, Mr. George Clay and Mr. H. H. Goodwin. To each one the Committee are much indebted for their services.

The Members of the Ladies' Linen Guild have again during the year rendered excellent services and the Committee tender to them their thanks and appreciation of the great help so freely given.

The Committee wish to express their appreciation and thanks to all donors of gifts "in kind" and to all who assisted in any way to make the Christmas Festivities enjoyable, and also to the Matron and Staff for the excellent work done during the year.
