WHAT KING EDWARD VII HOSPITAL DOES FOR THE DISTRICT

Open Day and Night

Receives many thousand patients for medical or surgical treatment, the major part coming from East Berks, South Bucks, and the adjacent parts of Surrey and Middlesex, altogether embracing an area of about 300 square miles.

The Hospital is mainly supported by Voluntary contributions. All the wards are of the most modern type, and have open-air balconies (vita glass screens) and are equipped with the latest and most improved appliances. No person needing treatment is ever refused admission, unless the case is infectious, mental, or of chronic disability. During the late war a military wing of 100 beds was temporarily added, thus placing many of the wounded within reach of their wives or relatives in the neighbourhood.



The wards for the indoor patients contain at the present time over 180 beds for men, women, or children, and the various departments of the Institution (in addition to other special treatments) include Radiographic Investigation, Pathological Research and Analysis, Radium Application, Heliotherapy, Dental Clinic, Ophthalmic Rooms, Orthopaedic Treatment, Electric Baths and Application, Throat and Nose Clinic, Tuberculosis Treatment, Massage, Insulin Courses, Special Maternity Ward, Injections, also Preventive Medicine, and After-care Treatments, etc.

There are two Operation Theatres, and also separate Private Wards for paying patients (which share in the advantage of day and night medical supervision, and of highly-trained Nursing), and there is a special ward for road and other accidents.

Hospital Ambulances are available when needed.

Privileges of Donors and Subscribers.

Individuals who may be donors of twenty guineas (or upwards) in one sum become Governors of the Hospital for life. Subscribers of one guinea (or upwards) become Governors during the year of their subscription.

Donors at one time of one thousand pounds have the privilege of naming a bed as a memorial so long as the Hospital exists, or Donors of five hundred pounds a cot in the Children's Ward. Donors of two hundred and fifty pounds in one sum may place a memorial tablet or inscription in the Hospital. Subscribers at one time of a hundred guineas may name a bed during the year of such subscription—or similar subscribers of forty guineas a child's cot for the same period.

TICKETS OF ADMISSION, FOR PATIENTS, TO THE HOSPITAL are issued to Donors or Subscribers (except to these mentioned immediately above who elect other privileges), also to Societies, or Corporations, or to the Controllers of guaranteed Annual Collections, in the following ratio according to the

THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING





REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR 1929

IN presenting the ONE-HUNDRED-AND-ELEVENTH Annual survey of the affairs of the above Institution since its last reconstitution it is interesting to observe that the present fabric of this Hospital has now "come of age," twenty-one years having elapsed since its first occupation. The forerunner of the present building on this spot, the ancient two-storeyed Hospital of St. Peter (like that of St. Bartholomew's in London), goes back to the twelfth century. During the past seven hundred eventful years, though twice razed to the ground, and twice removed to a different site in Windsor, yet in that long period of its beneficent and varied history there has probably never been a more memorable year in the annals of this Institution than 1929.

The past twelve months have been ones of unparalleled activity and progress. During 1929, the reconstruction of considerable parts of the central portion of the Hospital damaged by the recent fire, and the erection of four large new Wards with all the most recent improvements has been carried out. (The cost of one of these new Wards has been defrayed by Sir Edward Stern, Bt.) The spacious Nurses Home —the Lady Gomer Berry Hostel—standing in its grounds adjacent to the Hospital is fully described in separate Report. During the same period the Out-patients' Department has been rearranged, enlarged, and a new Canteen added, and space has been provided for a new Operating Theatre to be equipped by Sir J. Skevington and Major Skevington in memory of their sister. The number of Private Wards has also been increased to twenty-five during the year.

The Board have adopted a scheme in co-operation with the Royal National Pension Fund for Nurses, under which Sisters or Nurses would receive a considerable sum at a fixed age, or an annuity on retirement from service. The plan came into operation early in 1930, and the thanks of the Committee are due to Messrs. Mitchell, Mumford, and Durant, for the time they gave to the consideration of the many different modes of making provision for those who devote the best years of their lives to the alleviation of human suffering.

In meeting the heavy responsibility entailed by the increased number of patients a most helpful feature is the steady growth of the recently introduced "Contributory Scheme," which now embraces Windsor and all the surrounding districts.

The only change in the Medical Staff was the addition of Mr. Maxwell as Honorary Assistant Surgeon.

The Orthopaedic Clinic under the Supervision of Mr. Girdlestone, held each Monday, is entirely and efficiently staffed by the Windsor Detachment V.A.D., of which Lady Edward Spencer-Churchill is Commandant and Mrs. Carteret Carey Assistant Commandant. The other members of this 66th Berkshire detachment who attend regularly are Mrs. Norris Elye, Mrs. Chetwynd-Stapleton, Miss F. Wilder, Miss A. Wilder, Miss E. Archer-Shee, Miss Crofts, Miss B. Harris, Mrs. Cox, and Miss Lawson.

Tin-Foil. This new source of income started in the Autumn of 1927 has again met with great success and the competition for the prizes offered by the Committee has been extremely keen and a considerable sum was realised. The largest amount brought in by one person was 211 lb.

The Hospital has again received exceptional help from Mr. H. S. Quekett, Mr. C. M. Dyer, and the members of the Stock Exchange Dramatic and Operatic Society, who allowed the Hospital to participate in their Christmas Charities, and have been responsible for the furnishing and equipping of Queen Mary Ward.

The Mutual Subscription Fund Committee of the London Stock Exchange, through the generosity of Mr. A. Aaron and Mr. Hamilton, again sent their generous donation.

Through the generosity of Mrs. Rees Mogg the Committee have been enabled to open a Radium Department at the Hospital which will prove a great benefit to patients needing this treatment.

The full list of donations will be found on pages 35—75.

The Linen Guild during the past twelve months has again been responsible for keeping the Hospital supplied with Linen. The Committee offer their sincere thanks for this continued support.

The Committee have to thank Mrs. Mumford for again arranging sewing parties during the year, and those ladies who have so ably seconded her by their regular attendance each week; also Miss Baker of the local St. Johns Ambulance Brigade for assistance rendered in the Out-patients' Department every Monday; and Mr. Farrow for on many occasions affording the Committee voluntary assistance in engineering matters.

The Committee's thanks are due to all those who helped to make the Hospital Fête such a huge success in 1929 and also to the owners of cars who have kindly brought patients to and from the Hospital.

The Committee wish to express their high appreciation of the efficient manner in which Miss Morris, the Matron, and the Nursing Staff have carried out their duties throughout the year.

DETAILS OF SCHEME.

The Scheme is intended to help the Hospital, and benefit only those whose financial circumstances would lead them in case of accident or serious sickness to apply to a General Hospital for treatment in its Public Wards or Out-Patient Department, and in general should be considered to concern only those whose income is within the limits of the Insurance Act. Full details may be obtained on application to the Secretary.

REPORT 1929.

The Subscription Organisation Committee in submitting their third Report are pleased to state that further progress has been made in opening up new Districts and that an increased number of members has been obtained with a correspondingly increasing revenue.

Thirty-nine District Committees have been formed since the start in 1927. In addition fifty-seven firms in the district are working the Scheme on behalf of their employees and pay direct to the Hospital.

Numerous expressions of appreciation have been received from patients as to the skill and attention of the Medical and Nursing Staff.

From the Statement of Accounts on the next page it will be seen that the sum of £9,739 12s. 10d. has been collected against £9,111 12s. 8d. in 1928 and £4,414 3s. 6d. in 1927. There are now approximately 25,000 members enrolled.

The Committee again take this opportunity to thank all District Secretaries, Treasurers, Collectors, and Office Staffs of Firms for their untiring efforts and voluntary work in connexion with the Scheme.

ROAD ACCIDENTS.

THE resources of the Hospital are every year more and more severely taxed by adventitious causes, one of the most prominent of which at the present time is due to the increase of road traffic, and the high rate of speed at which mechanically propelled vehicles now travel.

The number of more serious cases treated at the Hospital arising out of injuries caused by accidents on the road during the past twelve months have been as follows :

Some of the patients brought in remain in Hospital for only a brief period—others for several weeks—and some even linger in the wards for several months. Many of these come from the immediate neighbourhood, but a very large number—for motor-cars and motor-cycles travel long distances in a day's run—come from very remote parts of the country. Some of the patients when recovered make a contribution towards the expenses entailed by their residence in the Hospital while disabled, but unfortunately the greater number (even of those who are personally insured against accident) do not recoup any part whatsoever of the large outlay caused through their misadventure.

Hence a very considerable extra expense (one which grows each year) is thrown upon the Hospital, and often by mischance and due to passers through Windsor and its vicinity coming from other parts of England.

[It is hoped, in the case of *insured* persons, that, some day, legislation will provide for Hospitals being repaid, as a first charge, the actual cost of maintenance of the injured persons while in the Hospital, which—as mentioned above—at the present time falls very heavily upon the annual income of the Institution—which has so many great calls every day upon it for other important purposes.]

RADIUM has been in use for some time in the Hospital on suitable occasions which are becoming more frequent owing to the enlarged area now served by the Hospital. The treatment is one requiring close supervision. For this purpose a special department has been recently arranged under Mr. Carter Braine, a Specialist in its application, and a considerable, and very costly, stock of Radium is now permanently kept in the Hospital with due precautions.

This has only been rendered possible by the very generous gift of a resident in the neighbourhood of Windsor, who had heard of the need of the Hospital.
