# RULES

#### OF THE

# Ikley Coronation Cottage Ibospital.

1. This Institution shall be called "The Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital," and is intended for the treatment of—1st, Any person suffering from an Accident requiring immediate attention; 2nd, Residents of the Parish of Ilkley or its immediate neighbourhood suffering from serious but non-infectious illness.

2—An Annual General Meeting of Subscribers shall be held not later than March 31st each year, to receive and adopt the Report and Accounts (duly audited), to elect Officers, Committee, and Auditor for the ensuing year, and to transact any other business.

3.—All subscribers of 10/- and upwards shall be entitled to vote at any Meeting of Subscribers.

4.—Ten days' clear notice of the Annual Meeting shall be given to every Subscriber. Notice shall also be given in one or more of the local papers. The omission of any individual notice shall not invalidate the meeting.

5.—Every Subscription shall become due on the first of January in each year, and be considered annual, until notice in writing to withdraw it shall have been given to the Secretary.

6.—No Subscriber whose Subscription for the previous year is unpaid shall be entitled to vote in General Meeting.

7.—Any person transmitting the amount of a Congregational or other collection for the Institution, of not less than Two Guineas, shall be considered a subscriber during the current year.

8.—Special meetings of Subscribers may be called by the Hon. Secretary upon behalf of the General Committee or shall be called on a requisition in writing by Ten Subscribers sent to the Hon. Secretary: ten days' clear notice of such meeting must be given to the Subscribers qualified to be present at the Annual General Meeting, such notice to specify all the business to be brought forward.

9.—The property of the Institution shall be vested in Seven Trustees, chosen by the Subscribers in General Meeting, and whenever such number shall be reduced to three, vacancies shall be filled up at the next General Meeting. 10.—In the case of Investments of Personal Estate, Four Trustees shall be deemed sufficient.

11.—The Trustees, in accordance with the directions in all respects of the General Committee shall sell, demise, mortgage, charge, or otherwise dispose of, invest or deal with, real or personal estate and property belonging to the Institution, and no person dealing with the Trustees shall be bound to enquire into the propriety or purpose of any such alienation, disposition or dealing. The receipt of the Treasurer for the time being shall be a sufficient discharge to the Trustees, and to subscribers, donors and all other persons for all moneys, or property, or subscriptions or donations, due, or belonging to, or payable to the Institution.

12—The Institution shall be under the direction of a President and a Committee consisting of Fifteen Members (of whom not more than three may be ladies) who shall be appointed by the Annual General Meeting, and include a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, an Hon. Treasurer and an Hon. Secretary, each of the three ladies to be nominated by and be members of the Ladies' Committee.

13.—The General Committee—six of whom shall form a quorum—shall meet at the Hospital once every month. They shall have power to engage and dismiss all paid officers of the Institution, fix the amount of salaries, enact regulations and bye-laws, and generally transact the business of the Institution.

14.—The General Committee shall appoint six of their number as a Sub-Committee, who, together with two members of the Hon. Medical Staff (appointed in accordance with rule 21), shall act as managers, prepare accounts for the General Committee, and sanction the admission of patients recommended by the Hon. Medical Officers. The Chairman, Hon. Treasurer and Hon. Secretary shall be members of this Sub-Committee, which shall be called the Management Committee, and meet at the Hospital, as required. Three shall form a quorum.

15.—There shall also be a Ladies' Committee, consisting of Twelve Members, elected at the Annual General Meeting. Their duties shall be to collect subscriptions, to visit the Hospital in rotation, and to report or make suggestions on any matters of importance to a Monthly Committee Meeting which they shall hold. A minute book shall be kept by the Ladies' Committee, in which all rcommendations shall be recorded, and this shall come before the General Committee at their next meeting.

16.—The two members of both the General and Ladies' Committees who have put in the fewest attendances shall retire at the end of each year, and shall not be eligible for re-election for twelve months. This, however, shall not be deemed to apply to Members holding the following positions on either Committee- Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Secretary, nor shall it be deemed to apply to any Member of the General Committee who is nominated for re-election by that Committee. Vacancies in either Committee may be filled up for the current year by the remaining members of each Committee.

17.—Nominations for the General and Ladies' Committees must be in the hands of the Hon. Secretary at least five days prior to the Annual General Meeting. In case more than the required number are nominated, the election shall be by ballot.

18.—The General Committee may lay out any part of the property of the Institution, or the proceeds of the sale thereof in lands or buildings, repairs or alterations, and may apply the same as income or otherwise, as they may think fit.

19.—The General Committee may also take over on such terms and conditions as they think fit, any funds or property held for Nursing, Hospital, or for the like purposes, and the rules of the Institution shall apply to any such funds or property which may have already been, or may hereafter be so taken over, but subject to all terms and conditions agreed as aforesaid.

20.—The Hon. Consulting Staff shall consist of one or more Hon. Physicians, one or more Hon. Surgeons, an Hon. Aural Surgeon, an Hon. Ophthalmic Surgeon, and an Hon. Radiologist.

The Hon. Medical Staff shall consist of duly qualified Practitioners resident within the Urban District of Ilkley or the Parish of Addingham, one or more Hon. Dental Surgeon, an Hon. Anæsthetist, and an Hon. Pathologist, willing to give their services.

Members of the Hon. Consulting Staff and the Hon. Medical Staff shall be elected for a period of three years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

Appointments shall be made by the General Committee, but no medical officer shall be appointed unless he has been resident and in general practice in the Urban District of Ilkley or the Parish of Addingham for not less than twelve months.

21.—The Members of the Hon. Medical Staff of the Hospital shall annually appoint eight of their members to be *ex-officio* members of the General Committee, and two of such members to serve on the Management Committee.

22.—Any member of the Hon. Medical Staff of the Institution shall have the right to continue the treatment of any patient under his care at the time of admission. For all other cases the Hon. Medical Officers shall attend at the Hospital for a week in rotation, and each in succession, the order of attendance to be fixed by themselves.

23.—Admission to the Hospital shall be by means of an Introduction from a member of the Hon. Medical Staff, followed by the relative entry in the Hospital case book.

24.—Applicants must not come to the Hospital until they hear from the Hon. Secretary or the Matron that they can be received.

25.—Cases of Urgency and Accident will at once be admitted upon application Immediate notice must be sent to the Hon. Medical Officer on duty, who will give instructions for the retention or discharge of the patient; if retained, it must be subject to the approval of the Management Committee at their next meeting.

26.—Patients shall be required to pay towards their ordinary maintenance (exclusive of theatre fees and exceptional dressings, medicine or laundry) a weekly sum, the amount of which shall be fixed according to each patient's circumstances by the Management Committee. Payment may be remitted if the Committee are satisfied that the patient is unable to pay.

27. – Members of the Hon. Medical Staff shall only be permitted to charge fees for medical attendance to such patients as pay not less than  $\pounds_3$  per week towards their ordinary maintenance.

28.—Domestic servants in service in the Urban District of Ilkley, or in the Parish of Addingham, may be admitted to the Hospital at a minimum charge of 40/- per week for their ordinary maintenance, subject to the approval of the Management Committee, and by arrangement with their employer, who shall be responsible for the payment.

29. Any suitable patient desirous of having the comforts and nursing of the Hospital may, on the Certificate of one of the Hon. Medical Officers, and subject to the sanction of the Management Committee, have the privilege of being admitted to a private ward on payment of not less than  $\pounds 6$  6s. od. per week for ordinary maintenance (exclusive of theatre fees and exceptional dressings, medicine or laundry).

30.—In the discretion of the Hon. Medical Staff any medical practitioner or any qualified dentist resident in the Urban District of Ilkley or in the Parish of Addingham, may attend patients in the private wards.

31.—In cases of difficulty or inability to pay any charges made to patients in public or private wards applications for special consideration may be made to the General Committee through the Hon. Treasurer. 32.—The following cases are inadmissible :--

Cases of Mental disorder, including Epilepsy. Infectious cases.

Incurable or Chronic cases.

Ordinary Maternity cases.

Children, except in special cases

33.—No patients shall leave the Hospital without the permission of the Physician or Surgeon under whose care they may have been placed, nor enter any ward but their own without leave.

34.—Patients who offend against any of the Rules of the House, or behave themselves irregularly or indecently, shall be expelled by the order of the Hon. Medical Officer on duty with the consent of the Chairman of the Management Committee or his Deputy, and no person after expulsion shall be re-admitted.

35.—Any patient may, upon request to the Matron, be visited by a Clergyman, or Minister of any Denomination.

36.—The relatives and friends of the patients shall be permitted to visit them at such times, and subject to such regulations, as the General Committee may from time to time determine.

37.—Visitors and friends of patients are forbidden to bring any articles of food or drink, unless by special leave, in which case they shall be given in the first instance to the Matron, for the patient's use.

38.—The foregoing rules shall not be altered, nor shall any New Rule be adopted, except at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special General Meeting, duly convened according to Rule 8.

A copy of any alterations already proposed shall accompany the notice convening the meeting.

Any amendment to such proposed alterations or any other resolutions to be proposed must be sent in writing to the Hon. Secretary at least five days prior to the meeting.

This Rule shall not prejudice the right of the Meeting to amend any resolution of which formal notice has been given.

# Twenty-fourth Annual Report

THE GENERAL COMMITTEE of the ILKLEY CORONATION COTTAGE HOSPITAL have pleasure in presenting their Report for the year 1928, which was the twenty-fourth year since its foundation.

The number of cases admitted during the year was 290, and 10 were remaining in Hospital from the previous year, making a total under treatment of 300. This is an increase of 22 over the previous year, and is the third highest total since the Hospital opened.

The totals in previous years were as follows :---

Of admissions during 1928, 107 were males and 183 females.

The average occupation of a bed has been 12.07 days (as against 12.5 days in 1927), and the average number of beds occupied per diem 9.9 (as against 8.9 in 1927).

As in previous years, a number of the patients came in for a day only for dental operations or the removal of tonsils and adenoids. There were in the past year 105 of these cases, and after making a deduction for them, the average for the remaining patients is about 18 days each.

Owing to the increased number of females treated, there was at certain times of the year a difficulty in gaining immediate admission to the female ward. The demand is not now so great, but the whole question of accommodation will require the serious consideration of the new committee.

The cases admitted during the last two years were classified as follows :---

Of the above patients 10 were admitted in 1928 as the result of accidents, compared with 24 in the previous year.

The number of operations carried out in the Hospital was 186 (including 31 dental cases) as against 166 (including 29 dental cases) in 1927.

Since the Hospital was opened in 1905, 4,878 cases have received treatment, 685 having been medical and 4,193 surgical and accident.

The results of the 300 cases under treatment during 1928 were as follows :---

The death-rate was 3.3% compared with the previous year's figure of 2.5%. The average for a number of years is about 4%. Of the 10 deaths during the year, three occurred within 48 hours of admission.

The financial position corresponds very closely with the forecasts given in the report last year, when the Committee stated that, apart from any serious alteration in the cost of living, they anticipated that the expenditure in a normal year might be considered to have stabilised at about  $\pounds$ , 1,800.

In the year under review the total expenditure was  $\pounds_{1,855}$ , an increase of  $\pounds_{42}$  over 1927. The receipts showed an even more striking resemblance to the forecasts made last year, when the Committee said that the regular sources of income would produce about  $\pounds_{1,300}$ , leaving a sum of  $\pounds_{500}$  to be obtained by special donations, dances and other functions, which they hoped would be received.

As against the estimate of  $\pounds_{1,300}$  the actual receipts came to  $\pounds_{1,280}$ , and as against the estimate of  $\pounds_{500}$  the actual receipts were  $\pounds_{520}$ .

The total receipts amount to  $\pounds 1,803$ , as against the estimate of  $\pounds 1,800$ , a reduction of  $\pounds 70$  on the previous year, but in view of the difficult times through which the business community of the district is passing, this is a result upon which the subscribers may be congratulated.

The net result was a loss of  $\pounds 52$  on the year's working, and no legacy or unexpected donation of any large amount was received

during the year to make up the deficiency, as has sometimes happened in previous years,

The Committee are gratified to find that the subscriptions are maintained at last year's total, being  $\pounds_{400}$  as against  $\pounds_{402}$ , and also that the contribution from the Ilkley and District Workpeople's Fund, while a little less than last year, still remains a valuable and generous addition to the income.

The congregational collections are on the same level as last year. The details are as follows :--

The Committee warmly thank the Clergy and Congregations of the Churches who have so generously helped them.

The Hospital Flag Day eclipsed its previous successes, and produced the record sum of £118 1s. 7d. Once more the Committee wish to recognise the splendid services of the organisers and collectors of this fund.

The income received from patients is  $\pounds 453$ , a decrease of  $\pounds 84$ . The ordinary patients paid  $\pounds 391$  against  $\pounds 413$ , and the private patients  $\pounds 62$ , against  $\pounds 124$ .

The Committee carefully examined once more the whole question of payments by patients, and have sought to emphasise that patients are asked to contribute only according to their means, and wish to state again that treatment is free to those patients who cannot afford to pay anything. Large notices to this effect have been placed in each ward, and a copy is sent out with each account.

Many gifts in kind have been gratefully received, and on Pound Day about £50 worth of groceries and provisions were brought to the Hospital, and over £25 in cash.

The sum of £,105 11s. 11d. was received from the Ilkley Amateur Dramatic and Operatic Society as the result of their performance of "Miss Hook of Holland," in the King's Hall, and the Committee wish particularly to thank the officers and organisers of this society for their most generous action in devoting so large a proportion of their proceeds to our funds. One of the outstanding events of the year was the Past Patients' Ball and Whist Drive, which was held in the King's Hall and Annexe. This was organised by three past patients of the Hospital : Mrs. Cummington, Miss Dance and Mrs. White, and was a remarkable success, so much so, in fact, that some of those who wished to attend, found it impossible to gain admittance, and a sum of  $\pounds$ 60 was returned to people who could not get in.

This was a wonderful testimony to the organising capacity of the three ladies and their numerous helpers, and also to the interest locally taken in the institution and its work by those who have been patients in the past.

The magnificient sum of  $\pounds 131$  5s. 5d. was paid to the Hospital as a result of this successful effort.

The following special donations were received during the year, and a list of these together with other similiar donations will be issued with the annual report. The Committee warmly thank all these generous donors for their help.

Certain alterations of rules were made at a special meeting of subscribers held on July 10th, the most important of which concerned Rule 20.

The Committee felt that there was no longer any need to limit the numbers of the Hon. Consulting Staff and of the Hon. Medical Staff, and the previous restrictions were removed.

In consequence, there were elected to the Hon. Consulting Staff, with the approval of the Hon. Medical Staff, Dr. F. W. Eurich and Mr. W. Maxwell Mumby, both distinguished specialists who have added considerable strength to the Hon. Consulting Staff.

The Committee are also pleased to announce the election of Dr. Marion Greaves and Dr. Riley to the Hon. Medical Staff.

The Committee were anxious that the Medical Practitioners who practiced in Addingham should be eligible to join the Hon. Medical Staff, as from this parish patients are accepted and subscriptions and donations are given. An alteration of the rule was accordingly made, but it is a matter of regret that so far no application has been received from a Practitioner in Addingham.

Once again the Committee recognise the value of the voluntary and efficient work of the Hon Consultant and Hon. Medical Staff, and acknowledge their indebtedness to them for their invaluable services.

The Ladies' Committee have been assiduous in their efforts to promote the welfare of the Hospital, and the Matron and the Nursing Staff have been untiring in the performance of their duties, at many times under great pressure of work, and to all of them great praise is due.

The Ladies' Linen League which publishes its own report, has received many gifts during the year and has collected  $\pounds 37$  in subscriptions. The Ladies' Committee are taking advantage of the January sales to replenish their stock of linen from the funds which they have in hand.

It is to be hoped that generous support will continue to be given to this organisation which renders such splendid service to the Hospital.

The Committee wish again to recognise the voluntary services of the lady collectors, and to them, and to all subscribers and donors, they offer their grateful thanks.
