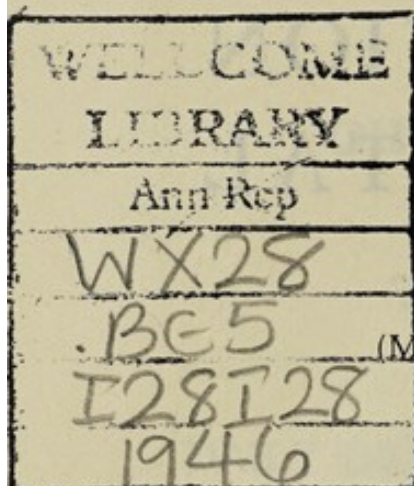

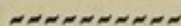

RULES

of the

Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital

1. This Institution shall be called "The Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital," and is intended for the treatment of—1st, any person suffering from an accident requiring immediate attention; 2nd, residents of the Parish of Ilkley or its immediate neighbourhood suffering from serious but non-infectious illness.

2. An Annual General Meeting of Subscribers shall be held not later than March 31st each year, to receive and adopt the Report and Accounts (duly audited), to Elect Officers, Committee and Auditor for the ensuing year, and to transact any other business.

3. All subscribers of 10/- and upwards shall be entitled to vote at any Meeting of Subscribers.

4. Ten days' clear notice of the Annual Meeting shall be given to every Subscriber. Notice shall also be given in one or more of the local papers. The omission of any individual notice shall not invalidate the meeting.

5. Every Subscription shall become due on the 1st of January in each year, and be considered annual, until notice in writing to withdraw it shall have been given to the Secretary.

6. No Subscriber whose Subscription for the previous year is unpaid shall be entitled to vote in General Meeting.

7. Any person transmitting the amount of a Congregational or other collection for the Institution, of not less than Two Guineas, shall be considered a subscriber during the current year.

8. Special meetings of Subscribers may be called by the Hon. Secretary upon behalf of the General Committee or shall be called on a requisition in writing by Ten Subscribers sent to the Hon. Secretary; ten days' clear notice of such meeting must be given to the Subscribers qualified to be present at the Annual General Meeting, such notice to specify all the business to be brought forward.

9. The property of the Institution shall be vested in Seven Trustees, chosen by the Subscribers in General Meeting, and whenever such number shall be reduced to three, vacancies shall be filled up at the next General Meeting.

10. In the case of Investments of Personal Estate, Four Trustees shall be deemed sufficient.

11. The Trustees, in accordance with the directions in all respects of the General Committee shall sell, demise, mortgage, charge, or otherwise dispose of, invest or deal with, real or personal estate and property belonging to the Institution, and no person dealing with the Trustees shall be bound to enquire into the propriety or purpose of any such alienation, disposition or dealing. The receipt of the Treasurer for the time being shall be sufficient discharge to the Trustees, and to subscribers, donors and all other persons for all moneys, or property, or subscriptions or donations, due, or belonging to, or payable to the Institution.

12. The Institution shall be under the direction of a President and a Committee consisting of eighteen members of whom not more than three shall be nominated by and be members of the Ladies' Committee and not more than three shall be nominated by and be members of the Ilkley Coronation Hospital Contributory Scheme Committee. The Committee shall be appointed by the Annual General Meeting and include a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Hon. Treasurer and Hon. Secretary.

13. The General Committee—six of whom shall form a quorum—shall meet at the Hospital once every month. They shall have power to engage and dismiss all paid officers of the Institution, fix the amount of salaries, enact regulations and bye-laws, and generally transact the business of the Institution.

14. The General Committee shall appoint six of their number as a Sub-Committee, who, together with two members of the Hon. Medical Staff (appointed in accordance with rule 21), shall act as managers, prepare accounts for the General Committee, and sanction the admission of patients recommended by the Hon. Medical Officers. The Chairman, Hon. Treasurer and Hon. Secretary shall be members of this Sub-Committee, which shall be called the Management Committee, and meet at the Hospital as required. Three shall form a quorum.

15. There shall also be a Ladies' Committee, consisting of twelve members, elected at the Annual General Meeting. Their duties shall be to collect subscriptions, to visit the Hospital in rotation, and to report or make suggestions on

any matters of importance to a Monthly Committee Meeting, which they shall hold. A minute book shall be kept by the Ladies' Committee, in which all recommendations shall be recorded, and this shall come before the General Committee at their next meeting.

16. The two members of both the General and the Ladies' Committees who shall have put in the fewest attendances shall retire at the end of each year and shall not be eligible for re-election for 12 months unless nominated for re-election by their respective Committees. This Rule, however, shall not be deemed to apply to members holding the following positions on either Committee :—Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Secretary. Vacancies in either Committee may be filled up for the current year by the remaining members of each Committee.

17. Nominations for the General and Ladies' Committees must be in the hands of the Hon. Secretary at least five days prior to the Annual General Meeting. In case more than the required number are nominated, the election shall be by ballot.

18. The General Committee may lay out any part of the property of the Institution, or the proceeds of the sale thereof in lands or buildings, repairs or alterations, and may apply the same as income or otherwise, as they may think fit.

19. The General Committee may also take over on such terms and conditions as they think fit, any funds or property held for Nursing, Hospital, or for the like purposes, and the rules of the Institution shall apply to any such funds or property, which may have already been, or may hereafter be so taken over, but subject to all terms and conditions agreed as aforesaid.

20. The Hon. Consulting Staff shall consist of one or more Hon. Physicians, one or more Hon. Surgeons, an Hon. Aural Surgeon, an Hon. Ophthalmic Surgeon, and an Hon. Radiologist.

The Hon. Medical Staff shall consist of duly qualified Practitioners resident within the Urban District of Ilkley or the Parish of Addingham, one or more Hon. Dental Surgeons, an Hon. Anæsthetist and an Hon. Pathologist, willing to give their services.

Members of the Hon. Consulting Staff and the Hon. Medical Staff shall be elected for a period of three years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

Appointments shall be made by the General Committee, but no medical officer shall be appointed unless he has been

resident and in general practice in the Urban District of Ilkley or the Parish of Addingham for not less than twelve months.

21. The Members of the Hon. Medical Staff of the Hospital shall annually appoint eight of their members to be *ex-officio* members of the General Committee, and two of such members to serve on the Management Committee.

22. Any member of the Hon. Medical Staff of the Institution shall have the right to continue the treatment of any patient under his care at the time of admission. For all other cases the Hon. Medical Officers shall attend at the Hospital for a week in rotation, and each in succession, the order of attendance to be fixed by themselves.

23. Admission to the Hospital shall be by means of an introduction from a member of the Hon. Medical Staff, followed by the relative entry in the Hospital Case Book.

24. Applicants must not come to the Hospital until they hear from the Hon Secretary or the Matron that they can be received.

25. Cases of Urgency and Accident will at once be admitted upon application. Immediate notice must be sent to the Hon. Medical Officer on duty, who will give instructions for the retention or discharge of the patient; if retained, it must be subject to the approval of the Management Committee at their next meeting.

26. Patients shall be required to pay towards their ordinary maintenance (exclusive of theatre fees and exceptional dressings, medicine or laundry) a weekly sum, the amount of which shall be fixed according to each patient's circumstances by the Management Committee. Payment may be remitted if the Committee are satisfied that the patient is unable to pay.

27. Members of the Hon. Medical Staff shall only be permitted to charge fees for medical attendance to such patients as pay not less than £3 per week towards their ordinary maintenance.

28. Any suitable patient desirous of having the comforts and nursing of the Hospital may, on the Certificate of one of the Hon. Medical Officers, and subject to the sanction of the Management Committee, have the privilege of being admitted to a private ward on payment of not less than £6 6s. 0d. per week for ordinary maintenance (exclusive of theatre fees and exceptional dressings, medicine or laundry).

29. In the discretion of the Hon. Medical Staff any medical practitioner or any qualified dentist resident in the

Urban District of Ilkley or in the Parish of Addingham, may attend patients in the private wards.

30. In cases of difficulty or inability to pay any charges made to patients in public or private wards applications for special consideration may be made to the General Committee through the Hon. Treasurer.

31. The following cases are inadmissible :—
Cases of Mental disorder, including Epilepsy.
Infectious cases.
Incurable or Chronic cases.
Ordinary Maternity cases.
Children, except in special cases.

32. No patients shall leave the Hospital without the permission of the Physician or Surgeon under whose care they may have been placed, nor enter any ward but their own without leave.

33. Patients who offend against any of the Rules of the House, or behave themselves irregularly or indecently, shall be expelled by the order of the Hon. Medical Officer on duty with the consent of the Chairman of the Management Committee or his Deputy, and no person after expulsion shall be re-admitted.

34. Any patient may, upon request to the Matron, be visited by a Clergyman, or Minister of any Denomination.

35. The relatives and friends of the patients shall be permitted to visit them at such times, and subject to such regulations, as the General Committee may from time to time determine.

36. Visitors and friends of patients are forbidden to bring any articles of food or drink, unless by special leave, in which case they shall be given in the first instance to the Matron, for the patient's use.

37. The foregoing rules shall not be altered, nor shall any New Rule be adopted, except at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special General Meeting, duly convened according to Rule 8.

A copy of any alterations already proposed shall accompany the notice convening the meeting.

Any amendment to such proposed alterations or any other resolutions to be proposed must be sent in writing to the Hon. Secretary at least five days prior to the meeting.

This Rule shall not prejudice the right of the Meeting to amend any resolution of which formal notice has been given.

ANNUAL REPORT

(FORTY-SECOND YEAR)

The General Committee of the Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital present their forty-second Annual Report for the year 1946.

THE YEAR'S WORK

Detailed statistics are published elsewhere in the Report, but brief particulars are given here for purposes of comparison between the years 1946 and 1945. At the beginning of the year 20 patients remained in Hospital, 548 were admitted during the year, making a total of 568 treated, 12 more than in 1945. The results of treatment are :—

During the past 42 years, 12,091 In-patients have received treatment, an average of 288 per annum.

Operations performed totalled 548 (including 108 minor operations) against 467 the previous year.

Road Accident cases totalled 17 against 12 in 1945.

Out-patient attendances increased by 1,401. The figures for the year are 5,410, including 1,733 Physiotherapy patients, against last year's figure of 4,009, and the number of new out-patients 1,021 against 1,241.

Despite repeated shortages and changes in nursing and domestic staffs, an efficient service was maintained. Again, grateful thanks are offered to voluntary helpers, too numerous to name, and to Matron and the remaining staff, for work well done and for carrying on in spite of difficulties.

In spite of changed conditions, the Ladies' Committee did not relax their efforts. Visiting continued systematically, and assistance was given on the domestic side. The usual "Pound Day," Flag Day and Vegetable and Flower Stall were successfully organised, bringing in a total of £161 11s. 5d. compared with £202 19s. 6d. in 1945.

The Ladies and their numerous helpers and collectors are to be congratulated on their splendid achievements. These would not be complete without mention of the annual House-to-House Subscription Collection, organised by Mrs. K. F. Hood, which realised £274 against £329 in 1945.

We are grateful to the people of the Dominions for gifts of foodstuffs received during the year through the Overseas Gifts (Food) Allocation Centre of the Ministry of Food.

The report of the Ladies' Linen League is published separately, but the Committee wish to record here their gratitude to these ladies for carrying on their good work in difficult circumstances, especially to Mrs. R. E. Leach and her band of helpers at Fellstow.

CHILDREN'S CLINIC The West Riding County Council has established an Ear, Nose and Throat Clinic, in charge of Mr. Donald Watson. Equipment has been provided by the County Authorities.

THE HONORARY STAFF Once again, the members of the Honorary Consultant and Honorary Medical Staff have given their services unstintingly and the Committee wish to record not only their own, but also the patients' grateful thanks. The Hospital temporarily lost the services, through illness, of Dr. Donald Riley, Radiologist. His services have been greatly missed and the Hospital was fortunate in being able to call upon Dr. J. K. Armstrong during Dr. Riley's enforced absence.

PHYSIOTHERAPY DEPARTMENT Miss Barbara Bell was appointed as Physiotherapist in May, 1946. She has proved a credit to St. Dunstons who were responsible for Miss Bell's training. A new combined Galvanic and Faradic Switchboard (in braille) has been installed at a cost of £60, and Diathermy apparatus is on order at a cost of £200.

Up to the time of Miss Bell's appointment the Out-patients' Massage Department was in the hands of Miss Pullan and her staff. Thanks are due to them and also to Miss Marion Prest for her help. Miss Pullan has continued to attend to the needs of the In-patients as Hon. Masseuse as before.

HOSPITAL EXTENSIONS The Ministry of Health is considering plans for extensions to the Hospital in order to provide a more suitable X-Ray Department, an Out-patient Department, and additional bath-rooms and sluice-rooms.

NURSES' HOME The Nurses' Home, Oakbridge House, has been redecorated, and fencing has been erected around the premises.

Mrs. F. C. Thompson resigned in July, 1946, from the office of Secretary, which she has held in a voluntary capacity throughout the War years. THE OFFICE The Committee wish to put on record their appreciation of her invaluable work during a very difficult time.

Mr. L. Hartley, who had been Secretary of the Hospital until his call-up for the Army, took up the appointment of Secretary-Superintendent at Accrington Victoria Hospital upon his discharge from the Services. The Committee and all his friends wish him happiness and success in his new post.

A warm welcome is extended to his successor, Mr. F. W. Sadler, who was appointed in his place in October, 1946.

Mr. G. E. Mitton has again given valuable assistance with finance and accounting matters and his services have been much appreciated.

It is with deep regret that the death is recorded of Mr. J. E. Crowther who died in December in the Hospital he had served so well. He was one of the early members of the THE GENERAL COMMITTEE Committee, having served on it for 39 years. He acted for several years as Honorary Secretary, and also as Vice-Chairman. His experience and advice have always been most helpful and his loss will be seriously felt.

An appointment in Bradford compelled Miss Stephenson to resign from the Committee in July, 1946, and in November, Mr. H. J. Behrens tendered his resignation owing to his leaving Ilkley, after having served on the Committee since 1938.

Mr. Behrens had had much experience in Hospital matters, having been for many years Chairman of The Bradford Royal Eye & Ear Hospital, Vice-Chairman of The British Hospitals Association, Yorkshire Area Committee, and a Representative of

that Committee on the Association's Council in London. His advice and guidance will be greatly missed.

Another loss has been suffered in the death towards the end of the year of Mr. W. H. Watson, the Architect, who prepared the plans of the proposed new Hospital. But for the war, it is probable that Mr. Watson would have lived to see his ideas and designs carried to completion.

Hospital equipment has been maintained and renewed where necessary. A new Refrigerator was installed for the storage of drugs and EQUIPMENT provisions at a cost of £157. A new post-mortem table was provided and a new type of water-heater for the Mortuary.

FINANCE

The Income and Expenditure Account for the year shows a disappointing result. Expenditure has exceeded income by as much as THE BALANCE SHEET £1,188 6s. 0d. Unfortunately, the reason is not far to seek. Whereas expenses of every kind have increased since 1945, e.g., Salaries and Wages by £586, Surgery and Dispensary by £78, Domestic Expenses by £78, and Provisions by £77, income from almost all sources has gone down: Donations by as much as £750, Contributory Scheme Grant by £400, Subscriptions by £43, Flag Day and "Pound Day" by £41.

On the other hand, the State Grant towards nursing salaries has risen by £244, Patients' payments by £59, and Church Offerings by £16.

The decrease in donations and subscriptions may be due, in part, to the fact that the general public are well aware that it is the Government's intention to take over the control and management of the Hospitals, and many have already withdrawn their

support. Unfortunately, they appear to have failed to realise that this change-over will not take effect until April, 1948.

In the meantime, Voluntary Hospitals must be kept running, equipped and staffed, otherwise the sick working-man and woman for whose benefit, mainly, they exist, cannot help but suffer.

The Committee are most grateful to Councils, Societies, Organisations and Firms who have made contributions during the year. The most notable are grants of £302 from the West Riding County Council, £75 from Ilkley Urban District Council, and £15 from Skipton Rural District Council, and the following donations:—"Yorkshire Observer" Hospital Foursomes £73 10s. 0d.; Ben Rhydding St. John's Ambulance £70; Ilkley Players £45 4s. 7d.; Dacre, Son & Hartley £19 12s. 0d.; Bolton Abbey "Bring and Buy" Sale, per Mrs. H. Ward, £16, and Burley Woodhead Hospital Committee £9 9s. 0d. Legacies were received from the late Mr. E. Denton Waring £150, the late Mrs. E. A. Lund £50, and the late Mr. Henry Sutcliffe £100.

Sincere thanks are due to the Contributory Scheme Committee and its workers and contributors. Despite the fact that, in present circumstances, the Scheme will be non-existent next year, the public continues to render excellent support. During the past year, the Hospital received grants totalling £1,000 against £1,400 in the previous year. Considering the number of contributions which have ceased through the closing of local munition factories, to have been able to transfer such a sum is no mean achievement and reflects great credit on the Contributory Scheme Committee and its workers.

In conclusion, the Committee wish to express their grateful thanks to all who have helped in any way during the year under review, whether by service, subscriptions or donations in kind or in cash. They make an earnest appeal for a continuance of such help from all past supporters, and a resumption of effort from those who for any reason have relaxed, so that the Hospital's last year under voluntary control may be a real success.

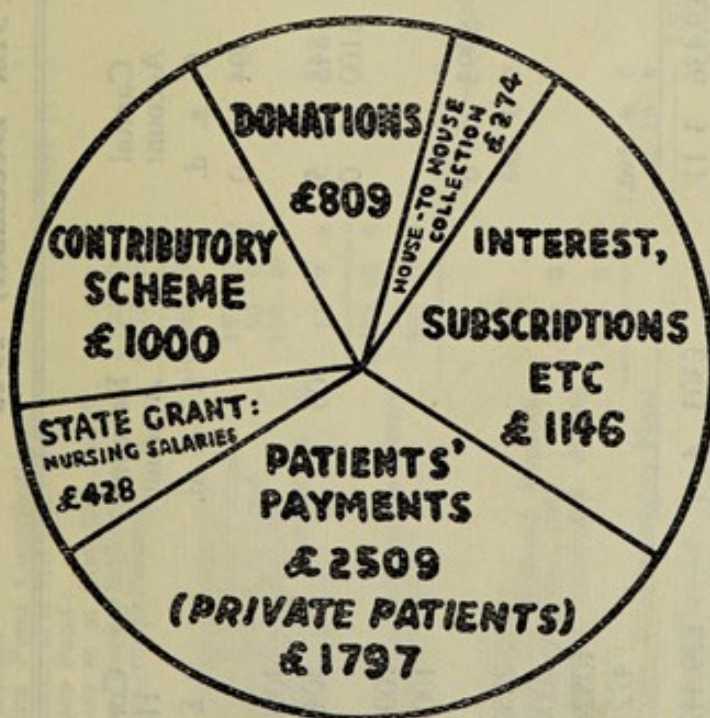

ILKLEY CORONATION HOSPITAL CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME

RULES, as Adopted at the First Annual Meeting of
the Scheme, held on 25th March, 1941

1. NAME. The name of the Scheme shall be the "Ilkley Coronation Hospital Contributory Scheme."

2. ADDRESS. The address of the Scheme shall be :—
The Secretary's Office,
The Ilkley Coronation Hospital, Ilkley.

3. OBJECTS. (a) The maintenance and support of the Voluntary Hospitals of Great Britain.

(b) To raise money by regular and systematic contributions for the support and for the extension of the usefulness of the Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital, and to allocate and pay over such moneys to the Hospital after meeting all expenses and obligations (including payments to other Voluntary Hospitals for treatment rendered to Contributors, and payments for Convalescent treatment of Contributors medically recommended for such treatment).

(c) To enable wage-earners and others within defined income-limits to obtain Hospital privileges for themselves and their dependents by means of an organised system of regular contributions, in return for which the Contributors so mentioned will be entitled to free treatment in any Voluntary Hospital.

(d) To promote co-ordination of effort, and to obtain reciprocity between the Ilkley Coronation Hospital Contributory Scheme and other Contributory Schemes.

4. DEFINITION OF A CONTRIBUTOR. A Contributor is a wage-earner or other person within defined income limits as detailed below, who contribute systematically to the Scheme out of his or her income either by direct payment or by deduction from his or her salary or wages or by any other means such a sum as the Committee of the Scheme may from time to time determine. The scale of defined income limits shall be :—

Single persons, Widows or Widowers without children under the age of 16	£4 per week
Married persons without children under the age of 16	£5 per week
Married persons, Widows or Widowers with children under the age of 16	£6 per week

5. DEFINITION OF A DEPENDENT. A Dependent is a member of the Contributor's family who is not earning wages and who is resident with and solely dependent upon the wages of the Contributor.

6. ELIGIBILITY FOR PRIVILEGES. A Contributor must have paid contributions for a period of three months before he or she becomes eligible for any privileges under the Scheme, and will cease to be so eligible if his or her contributions are more than two months in arrear. Notwithstanding that the Contributor must have contributed for at least three months before the date of application for Hospital treatment, the following persons shall be eligible for full privileges immediately upon becoming Contributors. Those who :—

- (a) join as direct Contributors on ceasing to be dependent on parents already contributing to the Scheme.
- (b) enrol through their place of employment.
- (c) transfer from another Scheme to which their contributions have been paid to the date of their transfer.
- (d) have contributed to the Scheme previously, but have allowed their contributions to lapse for any reason (such as illness or unemployment) which the Committee of the Scheme may in their absolute discretion consider satisfactory.

7. AMOUNT OF CONTRIBUTION. As from the week commencing May 4th, 1942, the Contribution to be made to participate in the privileges of the Scheme shall be at the rate of not less than three-pence per week for those members who contribute through their place of employment or through an Authorised Collector, and one shilling and a penny per month for those members who pay their contributions by the purchase of stamps. Employed children under the age of 16 can obtain full benefit for a contribution of 1d. per week, providing their contribution is paid through their place of employment or through an Authorised Collector, or 4½d. per month if their contribution is paid by the purchase of stamps.

8. BENEFITS TO WHICH MEMBERS ARE ENTITLED. Subject as hereinafter mentioned every contributor shall be eligible for the undermentioned benefits both for himself and his dependents.

- (a) Free Hospital Treatment in the general wards of the Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital, and free Out-patient treatment including X-ray examination.
- (b) Free Hospital Treatment in the general wards of any Voluntary Hospital in Great Britain, and free Out-patient treatment including X-ray examinations.
- (c) Free Convalescent Treatment to patients recovering from serious illness (other than Maternity) when, in the opinion of the patient's Doctor, such treatment is essential.

Provided—That In-patient treatment at the Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital is subject to accommodation at the Hospital being available.

The Scheme shall not be responsible for

- (i) Medical Fees.
- (ii) The Cost of treatment in Private Wards of Hospitals or Private Nursing Homes.
- (iii) Tuberculosis, Mental Cases, Infectious Diseases.
- (iv) War Disabilities for which the Ministry of Pensions is responsible.
- (v) Normal Maternity Cases.
- (vi) Abnormal Maternity Cases when the Ilkley Urban District Council is responsible for the cost of the treatment.
- (vii) Chronic, Incurable and Senile Cases.
- (viii) Injuries received in Motor Accidents where a payment is made by the owner of the car or his insurers, or under the Road Traffic Act.
- (ix) Medical Treatment such as is normally provided by a General Practitioner outside the Hospital.
- (x) Services provided for children by any School Medical Service.
- (xi) Any additional charges over and above the ordinary maintenance charges for special treatment such as Radium and Deep X-ray Therapy.

9. ADMINISTRATION OF THE SCHEME. An Annual General Meeting shall be held not later than 31st March each year to receive and adopt the Report and Accounts (duly audited), to elect Officers, Committee and Auditor for the ensuing year and to transact any other business.

All Contributors to the Scheme are entitled to vote at any Meeting of Members.

Ten days' clear notice of the Annual Meeting shall be given by advertisement in one or more of the local papers.

Special Meetings of Members may be called by the Secretary upon behalf of the Committee of the Scheme or shall be called on a requisition in writing signed by ten members and sent to the Secretary; ten days' clear notice of such Meeting must be given to the Members by Advertisement in one or more of the local papers, such notice to specify all business to be transacted. The general direction and administration of the Scheme shall be vested in the Committee for the time being of the Scheme which shall consist of not more than thirty members who shall be nominated for election and appointed as follows:—

1. Two members shall represent the General Committee of the Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital and shall be appointed annually by the General Committee of the Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital.
2. One member shall represent the Hon. Medical Staff of the Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital and shall be appointed annually by the Hon. Medical Staff of the Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital.
3. Not more than twenty-one members shall represent the contributors to the Scheme and shall be nominated in the first place by firms, groups or organisations responsible for the collection of contributions or by *bona fide* Contributors to the Scheme. No firm, group or organisation shall have more than two representatives. Nominations must be sent to the Secretary in writing not less than 14 days before the Annual General Meeting.
4. Not more than six members in addition to the above mentioned shall be nominated for election annually by the Committee of the Scheme. These members shall not represent any particular body but shall be people interested in the welfare of the sick and the operation of the Scheme.

Not less than one-third of the Committee Members appointed as in 3 and 4 above shall retire each year and none of the members so appointed shall remain a member of the Committee without seeking re-election at least once in three years. Retiring members shall be eligible for re-election if nominated for re-election by the Committee of the Scheme or by firms, groups or organisations responsible for the collection of contributions or by a *bona fide* Contributor to the Scheme.

The sequence of retiring members shall be decided upon by the Committee of the Scheme.

Vacancies in the Committee may be filled up for the current year by the remaining members of the Committee.

10. QUORUM. Five members shall form a quorum and the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

11. REPRESENTATIVES TO THE GENERAL COMMITTEE OF THE ILKLEY CORONATION COTTAGE HOSPITAL. Three members shall be appointed by the Committee to represent the Scheme on the General Committee of the Ilkley Coronation Cottage Hospital. Of these, one is always to be the Chairman for the time being of the Contributory Scheme Committee, acting *ex-officio*, who shall serve for one year. The remaining two members shall serve for three years and shall be eligible for re-election.

12. APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Scheme, who shall be appointed annually at the Annual General Meeting, shall not hold these offices for successive years, and the Chairman shall be succeeded by the Vice-Chairman. In the event of these appointments not proving practicable the Committee of the Scheme shall have power to appoint a deputy.

13. ALTERATION OF RULES. The foregoing Rules shall not be altered nor shall any New Rules be adopted, except at the Annual General Meeting or at a Special General Meeting, duly convened according to Rule 9.

ILKLEY CORONATION COTTAGE HOSPITAL CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1946

Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you, on behalf of the Ilkley Coronation Hospital Contributory Scheme, their Seventh Annual Report, the Report for the year ending 31st December, 1946.

As you will hear later from the Treasurer's Report, the year has been a fairly satisfactory one financially, and the number of contributors remains more or less the same as for the previous year. There has been a decrease in the membership from the Firms, but, fortunately, a corresponding increase in the numbers from the shops.

We had thought that some of our members might cease paying their contributions owing to the nearness of operation of the Government Security Scheme. However, we are pleased to note this is not the case, and that the majority of our members are, very wisely, continuing their membership.

During the past year, 205 members of the Scheme as In-patients staying a total of 3,524 days, have been treated at the Hospital, and the number of Out-patients 715, is a big jump on last year's number.

Of these 715, 273 have had X-ray examinations,
60 have been Physiotherapy patients, and
382 have been casualty patients.

At other voluntary Hospitals, 143 In-patients and 175 Out-patients have been treated at a total cost to the Scheme of £849 19s. 0d.

During the year, we have been unfortunate in losing some very valuable members of the Committee. Mrs. F. C. Thompson, who resigned in September, had, for nearly six years carried out the duties of Secretary. We are deeply grateful to her for the very valuable help and co-operation, and for the efficient and loyal service which she gave to the Contributory scheme during the very difficult war years.

Mr. H. J. Behrens is another member whose resignation is a great loss to the Committee. His experience and knowledge of Hospital affairs have always been of great assistance to the Committee, and he has ever been ready to give up his time and energy to help further the interests of the Contributory Scheme. His departure to the South of England leaves a vacancy on the Committee which will be extremely difficult to fill.

Miss A. E. Stephenson and Mr. A. L. Robinson are also two members whom we regret to lose. Both have given valuable service to the Contributory Scheme during their terms of office on the Committee.

We extend our sincere thanks to our Secretary, Mr. F. W. Sadler, who, in the short time he has been with us has given a great deal of help and co-operation, and has shewn that his experience and tact will be of immense benefit to us.

To our Shop-Steward, Mr. Mortimer, our grateful thanks are again due, and, as the Treasurer will later tell you, it is largely due to his efforts, and those of his helpers, that we have so large a membership amongst the shop collectors.

We should also like to thank Employers, their Wage Clerks and Cashiers for accepting the extra burden and responsibility of deducting contributions from wages.

On behalf of all our members who have received treatment at the Hospital, we should like to say how grateful we are to the Medical and Nursing Staffs of the Coronation Hospital, for the great care and attention that has been given to our members whilst receiving treatment at the Hospital.

Our thanks also are due to the Staffs of outside Hospitals, and to all those who have helped in any way, large or small, to another successful year's running of the Contributory Scheme.
