42nd Annual Report of the
Board of Governors of the
— Ilkeston Hospital, —
For the Year ending June 30th, 1926.



THE Board of Governors have much pleasure in presenting to the Subscribers a record of the work of the Hospital for the past year, together with list of Subscribers and various Tables and Statistics, Balance Sheets, and Income and Expenditure Account.

The Governors regret to state that the deplorable stoppage in the Mining Industry has seriously affected the income of the Hospital. They anticipate that the year ending on June 30th, 1927, will be still more seriously affected, and they therefore appeal to all who can to help the finances of the Institution. It is, however, satisfactory to note that the income has exceeded the expenditure by £204 os. 3d.

The Governors have transferred £750 from the Revenue to the Reserve Account. The assets of the Hospital, as will be seen from the Balance Sheet, now stands at £2,985 4s. 4d.

The Governors wish to gratefully acknowledge the kind gift of an Ultra Violet-Ray Apparatus and a Daylight Lamp for the Operating Theatre by Mrs. Rotheram Cecil, of Dronfield. These were handed over to the Institution by Mrs. Rotheram Cecil on May 29th, in the presence of a large number of subscribers and friends.

This generous gift will prove of the utmost service, and will greatly add to the utility of the Hospital.

The Governors record with deep regret the death of Mrs. Moss. Mrs. Moss was an active member of the Ladies' Committee and attended their meetings until the last. She had been interested in the Hospital since its inception in Station Road, and showed her practical sympathy in many ways.

The Governors desire to express their grateful thanks to all who have assisted the Hospital in any way, and especially

- (a) The Clergy and Ministers of the town, who have willingly continued to take in their turn Sunday Services at the Hospital. The Sunday Collections were £23 4s. 4d. this year as against £25 10s. 4d. last year.

The Governors desire to acknowledge many gifts of fruit, flowers and eggs.

- (b) To all private Subscribers. The amount received from this source is £476 3s. 2d. as against £454 18s. 5d. for last year. Of this amount the outstanding Subscriptions are—Manners Colliery Co., Ltd., £100 ; Shipley Collieries, Ltd., £100 ; Stanton Ironworks Co., Ltd., £37 10s. 0d. ; Mapperley Colliery Co., Ltd., £43 6s. 8d. (1924-25).

- (c) To the local Colliery Companies (as shewn on page 21), who, in addition to their Subscription, provided 148 tons of coal free.

- (d) To the employees of the various Collieries, Ironworks and Factories for the Subscription of £1,638 7s. 10d. The amount received last year, which was then a record, was £2,521 1s. 7d.

This reduced amount is chiefly due to the loss of Subscriptions due to two months of the Strike falling in this financial year.

The Governors offer their hearty congratulations to all who assisted in the splendid result.

- (e) To the Hospital Sports Committee for the sum of £93 0s. 6d. The amount received last year from this source was £160, and the Governors wish to express their appreciation and their gratitude to the Committee for their work.

- (f) To the Hospital Charity Cup Committee for £30 received. The amount from this source last year was £15.

The Governors congratulate the Committee on the increased contribution.

- (g) To Mrs. F. P. Sudbury and Mrs. Donson for again organizing the Annual Hospital Ball and Children's Dance, from which was received £55 14s. 0d.

- (h) To Mrs. Geo. Spencer for the handsome sum of £106, being the proceeds of a Shilling Fund organized by her.

- (i) To the Committees of the various Flower Shows, Sports, Concerts, &c., for their kind and generous assistance.

- (k) To the Ladies' Committee and the St. John's Nursing Association for their efforts in organizing Pound Day, which produced £67 5s. 8d. and 1,232 lbs. of most useful vegetables and goods.
- (l) To Mr. and Mrs. Clough, Mr. and Mrs Eyre, Mr. and Mrs. Calder, and Mr. and Mrs. Robinson, for the proceeds of a Dance at West Hallam, which amounted to £31 2s. 0d.
- (m) The Board are glad to acknowledge the payment by the Approved Societies of £71 17s. 9d. in respect of In-Patient treatment of their members. The amount received from this source last year was £18 8s. 2d.

The X-Ray Department has radiographed 190 cases during the year, as against 147 last year. The Governors again tender their thanks to Dr. Dobson, the Hon. Operator, and to Mr. G. A. Seaman, the Hon. Photographer.

Ultra Violet-Ray. In the short period between May 29th, when the apparatus was handed over by Mrs. Rotheram Cecil, to June 30th, 61 cases were treated.

Hon. Medical Staff. The Governors have pleasure in announcing that Mr. H. G. Leslie Fletcher, L.D.S., R.C.S., Eng., has been offered and has accepted a position on the Hon. Staff as Hon. Dental Surgeon.

The number of In-Patients during the year was 363, the average number of days per patient in the Hospital being 23'97.

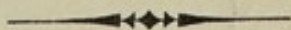

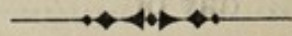
