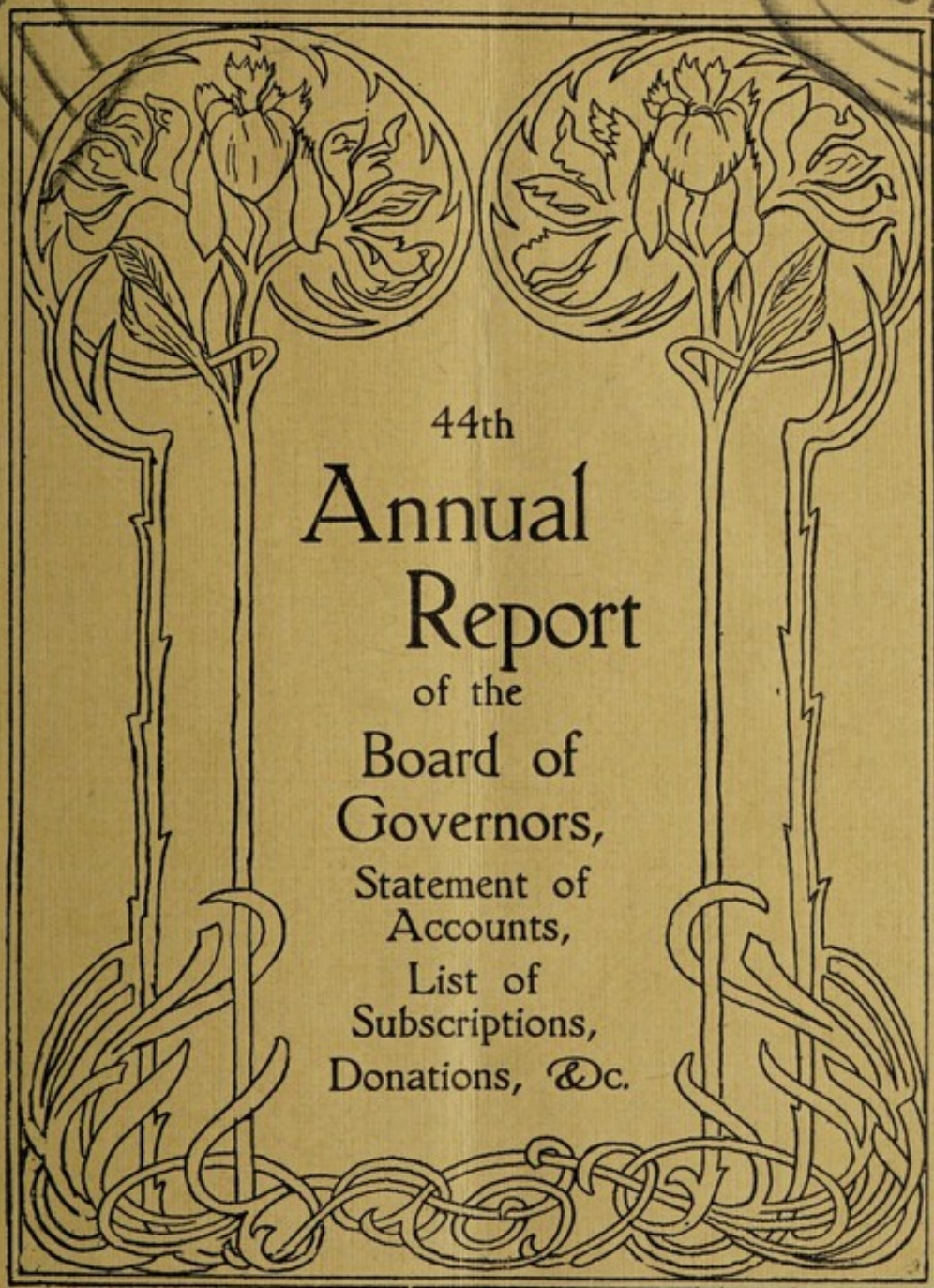

44th Annual Report of the Board of Governors of the Ilkeston Hospital, For the Year ending June 30th, 1928.

THE Board of Governors have much pleasure in presenting to the Subscribers a record of the work of the Hospital for the past year, together with list of Subscribers and various Tables and Statistics, Balance Sheets, and Income and Expenditure Accounts.

They have to announce that Miss E. Baxter, the Matron, decided to retire from Hospital work and resigned her appointment, which took effect on March 31st, 1928, after having given to the Hospital 12 years' valuable service. The Governors desire to acknowledge their appreciation of the services rendered by Miss Baxter, and wish her all happiness in the future. They have appointed Miss D. W. Swanwick as Matron, who took over her duties on April 2nd last. They are confident that Miss Swanwick will fully maintain the efficiency of the Hospital as in the past.

The Board also regret losing the services of Mr. W. E. Veasey as Honorary Auditor owing to him having left the town to take up another appointment, and they are grateful for the service that Mr. Veasey was able to render to the Board. They appointed his successor, Mr. A. R. A. Miller, Borough Treasurer, as Honorary Auditor, *pro. tem.*, pending the election at the Annual Meeting.

The Governors regret the death of Mr. W. Lings, J.P., who had been an ardent supporter of the institution from its inception.

The Governors are glad to announce that in spite of the state of trade in the district the financial results have been satisfactory, inasmuch as they are able to show a surplus over expenditure of £592 12s. 2d., and as will be seen from the Balance Sheet the assets of the Hospital now amount to £3,965 14s. 11d.

The Governors have to acknowledge the receipt of two Legacies, each of £100, from their late Honorary Architect, Mr. C. W. Hunt, and from the late Mr. F. N. Smith, of Wingfield Hall. After the continued help that both these gentlemen have been kind enough to give us in the past these Legacies are most generous.

Due to a Concert organised some months ago by Mrs. Winchester, who raised £23 10s. 0d., and with the sale of silver paper, the Governors have been able to instal 14 new lockers in the Women's Ward, thus completely equipping this Ward in this respect. They again tender their thanks to Mrs. Winchester and all friends who assisted.

The Governors desire to express their thanks to all who have assisted the Hospital in any way, and especially to

- (a) The Clergy and Ministers of the town, who have willingly continued to take in their turn Sunday Services at the Hospital. The Sunday Collections this year were £21 6s. 1d. as against £36 7s. 3d. last year. The Board fully appreciate the help thus given, but having regard to the size of the Borough still consider these collections inadequate.

The Board also desire to acknowledge many gifts of fruit, flowers and eggs.

- (b) All private Subscribers. The amount received from this source is £494 10s. 0d. as against £634 6s. 0d. for last year. Of this amount the outstanding Subscriptions are

Since the Accounts were closed a contribution of £40 has been received from the Cossall Colliery Co., Ltd., which will have to be included in next year's Accounts.

- (c) The local Colliery Companies (as shown on page 21) who, in addition to their Subscription, provided 179 tons of coal free. The Governors are most appreciative for this most generous support.
- (d) The Employees of the various Collieries, Ironworks and Factories for the subscription of £1,797 4s. 3d. The amount received last year was £1,287 12s. 2d.

The Governors offer their hearty congratulations to all who assisted in this splendid result.

- (e) The Governors are glad to note that it was possible again last year to organise the Hospital Sports, which brought in the splendid sum of £125.
- (f) The Hospital Charity Football Cup Committee have only been able to hand over £5 as against £20 last year and much more in past years. Having regard to the splendid cups that have been provided the Governors are sorry to see that the contribution is so small, but hope the Committee will in the future be able to have more successful seasons.
- (g) To Mrs. F. P. Sudbury and Mrs. Wm. Donson for organising a Dance, from which was received £7 6s. 4d. ; and also the Dance organised by Miss Clare Sudbury, which brought in the sum of £7.18s. 6d.

- (h) The Committees of the various Flower Shows, Sports, Concerts, etc., for their kind and generous assistance. The outstanding amounts received from these sources include :—

The total result from these efforts was £474 16s. 2d. as against £349 5s. 9d. last year.

- (i) To the holders of Collection Boxes, which produced £59 12s. 11d. as compared with £40 19s. 2d. last year.
- (j) The Governors feel that they must offer their sincerest thanks to the Ladies of the St. John Nursing Association and the Ladies' Committee of the Hospital for the splendid effort on Pound Day in raising the handsome sum of £83 16s. 10d. and 1,598 lbs. of groceries, vegetables, etc., their efforts in this respect having assisted the Institution most materially.
- (k) The Egg Week for the Hospital was again held and was even more successful than the one held in the previous year, no less than 8,550 eggs being deposited at the Hospital. This is a most valuable contribution and is very greatly appreciated by the Governors as a great assistance towards the support of their patients.
- (l) The Board are glad to acknowledge the payment by the Approved Societies of £243 9s. 3d. in respect of In-Patient treatment of their members. The amount received from this source last year was £150 4s. 9d.

The X-Ray Department has radiographed 455 cases during the year, as against 328 last year. The Governors again tender their thanks to the Hon. Operators, and to Mr. G. A. Seaman, the Hon. Photographer.

Ultra Violet-Ray. During the year 147 cases attended, which necessitated 2,819 treatments. It will be observed from these figures that the apparatus continues to be most useful.

The Governors would desire to call the attention of all Subscribers to the greatly enhanced work that our Institution is now

carrying out. In addition to the work mentioned above, Massage, Electrical treatment and Dental Surgery are now all in full operation, and the work during the last few months both in the number of In-Patients, Out-Patients and all subsidiary departments has very largely increased, and they can only hope that it may be possible to still further extend the scope and usefulness of the Institution, but it is necessary that subscriptions should be duly forthcoming to enable this to be done.

The number of In-Patients during the year was 382, the average number of days per patient in the Hospital being 23.72.

296 were discharged cured.

25 were relieved.

23 deaths occurred.

38 remaining in Hospital.

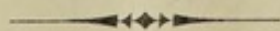

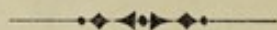
