#### 63rd ANNUAL REPORT

## of the Board of Governors of the Ilkeston General Hospital for the Year ended 30th June, 1947

The Board of Governors have great pleasure in presenting to the subscribers their report of the Hospital's activities during the last twelve months, incorporating the Income and Expenditure Accounts, Balance Sheets and Statistical Tables.

From the Income and Expenditure Account appearing on pages 15 and 16 it will be observed that the excess of expenditure over income for the year is £3,806/6/10, a debit balance of £1,043/3/4 brought forward from last year gives a total deficiency of £4,849/10/2. During this financial year £1,922/13/0 has been transferred from the Reserve and Building Funds Accounts to the General Account leaving the Hospital with an adverse balance of £2,926/17/2.

The Governors once more wish to express the gratitude of the patients and all concerned to the Hon. Medical Staff for the unqualified services rendered during the past year. It will be observed that Dr. G. G. Myers, L.R.C.P., is now included in the list of Hon. Medical Staff.

It is with regret that we have to announce that the Linen Guild, which has done such noble service in the past and for which the Governors take this opportunity of extending their sincere thanks, have now retired from their field of activity. From the funds in hand the hospital has during the year received gifts of linen, etc., and a cash payment of £111/17/8 representing the balance in hand.

We are indebted to the various committees of the Contributory Funds for the amount of  $f_{5,931/2/9}$  which represents the Hospital's main source of Income.

Our thanks are again extended to the Churches in the town and surrounding district for their contribution of £31/15/5.

The splendid work done by the Entertainments Committee has supplemented the hospital funds to the extent £55 for which we extend our thanks.

The untiring efforts of the organisers of the various Concerts, Sports and Shows, held during the year have resulted in the total sum of £334/4/10 being raised for the hospital and the Governors wish to thank all those concerned. The outstanding efforts being:—Ilkeston Town F.C. £76/3/9, Hallam Fields Show £57, Cotmanhay Working Men's Club £50/8/6, Spring Cottage Inn £21, Woodside Club £20, Granby Club £19/17/0, Ilkeston Tradesmen's Association £18/15/2.

The hospital is grateful for the amount of £272/13/7 received by donations and contributions.

To the many private subscribers whose continued support of our hospital is greatly valued we convey our thanks and appreciation. The outstanding donors are:—The Stanton Ironworks Co. Ltd. £100, The Ilkeston Co-operative Society Ltd. £25, The Prudential Assurance Co. Ltd. £20, The Derbyshire Public Assistance Committee £10/10/0, C. R. Crompton, Esq. £10/10/0, Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire Electric Power Co. £10/10/0, Butterley Co. Ltd. £10 and The Belvoir Estates Ltd. £7/7/0.

The Governors cordially thank the local Colliery Companies for their generous gifts of coal which unfortunately ceased on 31st March, 1947.

Collecting boxes at the various Licensed Premises reached the handsome sum of £274/12/7 and we wish to convey our sincere thanks to all those who participated in this splendid effort. The Erewash Hotel again head the list with £30/10/6, The Rutland Cottage Inn £29/15/0 and The White Cow Inn £24/16/0.

The Governors gratefully acknowledge legacies of £200 from the late Miss A. M. Harvey and £100 from the late Mr. R. H. Starr.

The Massage Department Building Fund has found many friends and supporters during the past year noteable in Miss A. W. Cox who raised £374/3/3, The Ilkeston General Hospital Darts League who raised £350 and the Pillow Blaskey School of Dancing £39/3/8. The amount standing to the credit of this account at 30th June, 1947 was £1,473/6/6.

To the many who have sent miscellaneous gifts to the Hospital, particularly for the patients, the Governors offer their sincere thanks.

The Junior Hospital Committee have recently purchased Lockers, Bed Tables and Special Beds for the hospital to the value of £225. We have not been able to record the results of their fervent and sustained efforts elsewhere in this year's Report, but the Governors and Patients are desirous of taking this opportunity of expressing their feelings of gratitude and admiration for their continued interest in the welfare of our hospital.

The Clergy and Minister are asked to accept the thanks of all for officiating at the Sunday Morning Services and for ministering to the patients so regularly.

Miss M. A. Annand resigned the post of Matron in March of this year and these varied duties are now in the capable hands of Miss M. F. Willey.

The Governors wish to record their appreciation to all members of the Nursing and General Staff for their devoted services so willingly given.

During the interim period prior to the Nationalisation of the Health Services it is vitally important for the welfare of our hospital that all those who have given so freely of their time and energies should continue to do so. The Governors appeal to all those who are interested in our institution to make every effort to help maintain the standard of the hospital for the mutual benefit of all.

The X-Ray Department has radiographed 2,621 cases with 4,025 treatments during the year, as against 3,307 last year.
