ANNUAL REPORT, 1927.

THE Board of Governors have the honour to submit their Report for the Year 1927, together with the Audited Accounts.

The Board deeply regret to record the death on 26th January, 1928, of Sir Fredric Wise, D.L., J.P., M.P., who was a Vice-President of the Hospital, and who on all occasions took such a keen and kindly interest in the work of the Institution. The loss of such a man to Ilford and to England will be felt by all classes of the community and by none more keenly than those who had the privilege of being associated with him in his work for the sick of this district.

FOREWORD.

The past year has been one of paramount importance in the history of the hospital. In June Lady Patricia Ramsay very kindly opened the War Memorial Children's Wing, which includes a beautiful Memorial Hall. The addition of this building enabled the Governors adequately to cater for the sick children of Ilford, the section of our community which surely commands the most ready sympathy of one and all. The War Memorial Children's Wing is a splendid addition to the Hospital Buildings and a perpetual monument to the work of the War Memorial Committee and to all who helped to honour Ilford's Glorious Dead.

This extension, which increased the accommodation of the Hospital from 52 to 64 Beds, will doubtless prove to have played a large part in the history of Ilford's Hospital, for the problem of Voluntary Hospital service in the large and thickly populated area of which Ilford is the natural centre became acute towards the end of the year under review; the great question whether the necessary service could be provided by voluntary means or whether a Hospital on the rates was the only solution had to be decided quickly, and the Governors are glad indeed that they were able to prove their ability to grapple with this great task, and if they receive the increased public support they confidently expect, the large and efficient Hospital essential in the future will be provided by the development of the old "Emergency," and the pioneer work of the enthusiasts who built their little Hospital 16 years ago will bear fruit which, if not anticipated, is richly deserved.

This great ideal will not be achieved without much striving, but many difficulties have already been overcome and increased service to the Public will be given during the coming year. The Governors are at once proceeding to build towards the completion of the One Hundred Bed Scheme and will shortly announce the

opening of an Out-patient Department which will be staffed by Honorary Consulting Physicians, Surgeons and Specialists drawn from the great London Hospitals; in-patients in the Public Wards will also be under the care of this Consulting Staff, and two Resident Medical Officers will be engaged, one of whom will always be on the premises.

THE YEAR'S WORK.

The work of all Departments of the Hospital has been carried on in full activity throughout the year. It will be seen from the Statistical Tables on page 22 that the average number of available Beds shows an increase, and that 785 In-patients were admitted as compared with 781 in 1926. These totals have been adversely affected by the unfortunate outbreaks of infectious diseases and consequent closing of the Children's Ward. In order to reduce the possibility of such outbreaks to a minimum, the Governors have been obliged to curtail visiting privileges in the Children's Ward. Towards the end of the year, complete separation was effected between Public and Private Patients. The Public Wards are definitely reserved for those who cannot afford to pay for the Medical Treatment they receive. In the Public Wards the Doctors give their services entirely free of charge, but all patients who are in a position to do so, are asked to contribute towards the actual cost of their maintenance by the Hospital. In the Private Wards, patients pay a fixed fee to the Hospital and arrange privately with their Doctor with regard to professional fees. Thus no possible misunderstanding can arise as the two branches of the Hospital's work are separate: the Public Wards, a charity, the Private Wards, self-supporting. During the year 656 Out-patients attended for X-Ray Examination; 246 Out-patients made 4,237 attendances in the Massage Clinic, and 1,357 Patients received attention in the Casualty Department.

FINANCE.

The Accounts for the year duly audited by Mr. R. Barlow Tyler, F.C.A., will be found on pages 18 to 21.

Income.—The Governors report with very great pleasure and gratitude that during the year 1927 £9,899 13s. 10d. was received as compared with £7,706 0s. 8d. in 1926. Nor is this all, for the sum of £1,698 8s. 6d. has been added to the Building Fund and £1,470 to Hospital Endowments; the total increase in the Hospital's Receipts was therefore no less than £5,362 1s. 8d. (Contributions to the Building and Endowment Fund are acknowledged under these headings.)

This income is, of course, quite inadequate to provide the increased public service which is so necessary, but it is nevertheless most encouraging and heartens the Governors in their efforts to provide "A Hospital worthy of the Borough."

Annual Subscriptions, Donations, Congregational Collections, Workpeople's Collections, Grants from Central Funds and payments by Patients all show an increase, but the Governors earnestly appeal for new Annual Subscribers, as this item of Income, which should be the vital bed-rock of Hospital finance, is woefully inadequate.

As in past years, the Governors have to thank the Ilford Hospital Saturday Committee for a considerable part of the Hospital's revenue. Here again it is their privilege to report a "Record." During the Saturday Committee's financial year its members have been responsible for the collection of no less than £3,415 19s. 4d. towards the Funds of the Hospital; full particulars of which may be found in the Committee's Annual Report. To the Chairman, General Secretary, Officers, and every member of the Ilford Hospital Saturday Committee the Governors tender their hearty congratulations upon this magnificent performance, for which they, and the Patients who benefit so much, are deeply grateful. The Ilford Hospital Saturday Committee will, in future, work in much closer co-operation with the Hospital Authorities, and it is confidently expected that whilst this arrangement will prevent any possibility of overlapping and will ensure a united appeal, it will not hamper the Committee, but rather help it to proceed from strength to strength. The Governors report with equal pleasure that King Edward's Hospital Fund for London increased their grant from £400 in 1926 to £1,000 in 1927 (£500 towards the Building Fund). Apart from the cash value of this grant, the Governors are highly gratified by this significant recognition of the work of the Hospital and its important and opportune encouragement of their aims for the future. The Metropolitan Hospital Sunday Fund for the first time made a grant towards the Funds of the Hospital; a Donation of £100 was received, and this addition to the Hospital's Income is very gratefully welcomed. During the past year two splendid sporting efforts have reached their goal—the Ilford Footballers Bed Fund and the Goodmayes Cricket and Sports Club having both completed the collection of £1,000; Beds have been named in the perpetual honour of the many sportsmen who have shared in these memorable achievements.

Sportsmanship in junior circles has not lagged behind; the Ilford National Auxiliary Sunday School Union again gave an annual subscription of £30 towards its Cot Fund and has now

contributed a total of £460; and the Ilford Schools Football Association contributed £45 6s. 11d. in 1927 and made its total contribution £317 12s. 8d. These equally fine efforts by local children are particularly striking, and it is doubtful if many Hospitals receive such generous and consistent support from the future citizens of their districts.

A new appeal effort this year was made in connection with the Stock Exchange "Help Yourself" Society and received magnificent support. When the Hospital's Accounts were closed at the end of the year £388 had already been received from the Society, and it is pleasing to add that not all the Hospital's helpers went unrewarded.

A Grant of £350 was received from "Alexandra Rose Day," as compared with £325 in 1926. The Governors gratefully acknowledge this substantial help and their indebtedness to the Mayoress, Mrs. F. H. Dane, for her active interest, and to Mrs. E. Hinton for her splendid organisation. Another great success was achieved by Miss M. Austin who, continuing the series of Concerts instituted by Mr. J. Harris, was able to hand to the Hospital the sum of £211 2s. 6d. The Governors record their appreciation of the continued courtesy and helpfulness of Messrs. The Provincial Cinematograph Theatres, Ltd., who again so kindly lent the Ilford Super Cinema for this important event. It is again the Governors' duty and pleasure to acknowledge the generosity of Lady Griggs, who gave further evidence of her practical sympathy with the work by contributing £200 towards the Equipment of the Children's War Memorial Wing.

A donation of £141 8s. was received from Mrs. J. E. Price Watts, whose Garden Party (at which this sum was raised) proved as enjoyable to her guests as it was profitable to the Hospital. The sporting spirit of the Stock Exchange was further evidenced by the donation of £50 from the Stock Exchange Mutual Subscription Fund.

During the year £75 was received from the Estate of the Rev. Joseph Fletcher, a Legacy of £10 from that of Mr. J. P. Smith, and £10 from that of Mrs. Williams.

The Governors very gratefully acknowledge generous donations of £30 0s. 1d. from Messrs. T. H. Harries & Co., the proceeds of their increasingly successful Staff Dance; £25 from the Worshipful Company of Grocers; £20, the proceeds of a Whist Drive very kindly given by Councillor Mrs. Carrell; £20 8s. 7d. from the Ilford Masonic Society, and £20 from the North Hainault Allotment Holders' Association.

Congregational Collections.—The generous support of Religious Bodies in Ilford was increased last year; the list is headed with the sum of £25 5s. 1d. collected at the Mayor's Civic Service, closely followed by the sum of £24 9s. sent by St. John's Church, Seven Kings.

The List of Workpeople's Contributions is headed by the London and North Eastern Railway, Stratford Employees Hospital Association, who sent a donation of £50, whilst the Box Collection List is headed by The Loxford Social Club and Institute with the capital effort of £21 6s. 9d. It is hoped that Box Collections will show a very considerable increase in future, and to this end all existing boxes are to be recalled and new official boxes issued in their place. An item of £105 5s. 3d. was received at the end of the year as the result of a claim for the return of Income Tax on Investments for the last six years. Receipts on account of services rendered to patients amounted to £3,609 3s. 2d., an increase of £548 14s. 11d.

Building Fund.—The Building Fund of the Hospital is at present £5,853 2s. 8d.; in addition the Hospital has been promised £3,000 by King Edward's Hospital Fund for London and £100 by Messrs. Rothschild when the Hospital has collected sufficient money to extend its accommodation to 100 Beds. The principal addition to the Building Fund during 1927 was the sum of £1,267 11s. 9d., provided through the efforts of the Mayor of Ilford, Alderman F. H. Dane, M.B.E., J.P., E.C.C. The Governors very gratefully acknowledge this splendid effort, and they trust that the example of Ilford's first Mayor will be followed by his Successors. The Mayor of Ilford is President of the Hospital during his year of Office, and it is earnestly hoped that each President will identify himself with the Hospital's efforts as enthusiastically and successfully. *En passant*, it may be mentioned that before the end of the year under review, Alderman W. J. O. Sheat, O.B.E., J.P., C.C., had already given very practical intimations of his earnest intentions in this respect. The sum of £500 to be added to the Building Fund from King Edward's Hospital Fund for London has already been mentioned. The Governors are indebted to the Langthorne Lodge No. 1,421 for the handsome donation of One Hundred Guineas towards the Building Fund which was also enriched by a Legacy of £100 from the Estate of the late Mr. James Lockerbie.

Endowment Fund.—In April, 1927, the United Services Fund presented a cheque for £1,000 with which sum two Cots in the Children's War Memorial Wing have been endowed in the name

of the Local Welfare Committee of the United Services Fund. The tablets bear the following wording :—

“United Services Fund Cot
Endowed by the Ex-Service
Men of Ilford in Memory of
their fallen Comrades.
The Great War 1914-1918.”

It is difficult to imagine anything more fitting than these Endowments in the War Memorial Wing, and many children of Ex-Service men will have reason to share the Governors' deep gratitude for the generosity of the United Services Fund. The Endowment Fund of the Hospital has also been enriched through the efforts of the Ilford Scottish Association, to whom the Governors express their deep gratitude for the sum of £470 towards the endowment of a Bed. It is interesting to note that £100 of this sum was raised by the efforts of the Ilford Scottish Ladies' Association.

Expenditure.

The Expenditure for the year was £8,599 15s. 4d., as compared with £8,076 8s. 4d. in 1926, an increase of £523 7s. When it is considered that the Ward accommodation of the Hospital has been increased by almost one-third during the year under review, it will be seen that the Governors have practised the most rigid economy compatible with efficiency. The effect of this economy is better indicated by the fact that the cost per bed, per week, has been reduced from £3 10s. 7.25d. in 1926 to £3 6s. 2.4d. in 1927.

Capital Expenditure.—£446 18s. 1d. was expended during 1927 under this heading, which included Furniture and Equipment of the new Ward, provision of new Anæsthetic Room, Furniture, etc., for the accommodation of the additional Nurses necessitated by the enlargement of the Hospital, and Professional Fees in connection with future extensions.

OFFICERS.

In view of developments, the necessity for which was clearly foreseen, and in view of the growing competition and highly specialised administration of hospitals, the Governors unanimously decided to appoint a professional Secretary, and selected Mr. G. Since the War and until coming to Ilford, in July 1927, Mr. Hepworth was engaged as Treasurer's Secretary at St. Mary's Hospital, London, and for eight years before the War was at St. George's Hospital, London. The Governors are pleased to record that Mr. Hepworth has already justified his selection. To Mr. G. J. Maggs the Governors tender their grateful thanks for his splendid work during many years as Honorary Secretary, and as a mark of their gratitude have elected Mr. Maggs to be a Vice-President of the Hospital.

Nursing Staff.

The efficiency of the Nursing Staff has been well maintained, and its numbers increased owing to the addition of the Ilford War Memorial Children's Wing. It is gratifying to be able to record that a large proportion of patients have, after discharge, written expressing their great appreciation of the work of the Nurses.

At Christmas the Nurses, enthusiastically led by the Matron, spared no effort to make the holiday as happy as possible for the patients, and succeeded admirably. In this connection the Governors gratefully thank the friends of the Hospital who so kindly gave Donations to the Christmas Entertainments Fund and Gifts (including a splendid selection of toys for the Children).

Thanks to the Medical Staff.

The Board conclude their Report with the expression of their sincere thanks to the members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff for their constant attention and kindness to the patients, and for their valuable service to the Hospital throughout the year.

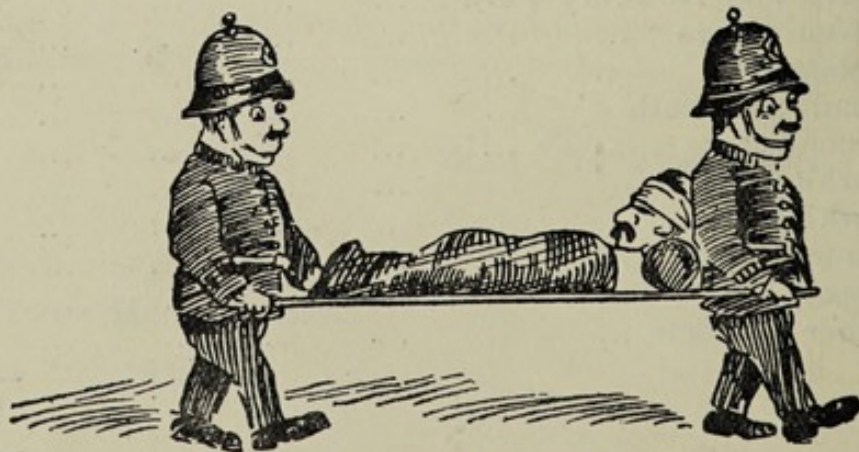



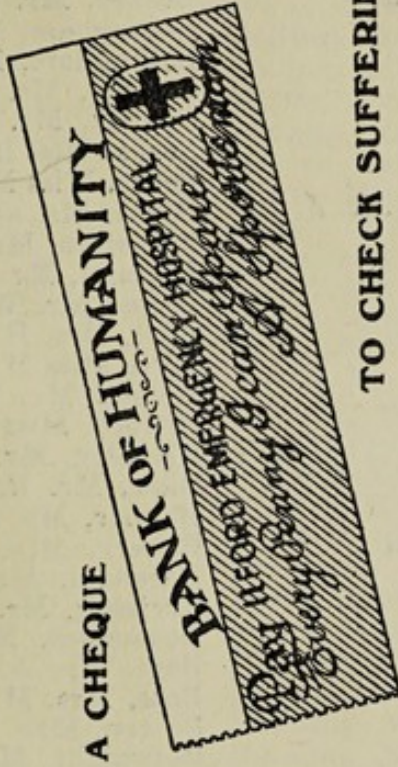

ILFORD EMERGENCY HOSPITAL (INCORPORATED).

The Hospital contains 64 Beds, allotted as follows:—

Public Wards : Male, 14 ; Female, 14.

Private Wards : 14.

Children : 22.

GOVERNMENT AND MANAGEMENT.

The Hospital is under the general direction of the Chairman and Governors and of Standing Committees appointed by the Board of Governors. The Board of Governors consists of 37 Elected Members, of whom 10 are nominated by the Ilford Medical Society, 9 by the Ilford Hospital Saturday Committee, 6 by the Ilford War Memorial Committee, and one by the United Services Fund.

The Annual General Meeting is held in February unless otherwise arranged. Extraordinary Meetings may be convened by the Governors whenever they think fit or upon requisition signed by 20 Members.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF SUBSCRIBERS.

Every Male contributing a Donation of not less than 10 guineas and every Female contributing not less than 5 Guineas is entitled to election as a Life Member upon giving due notice in writing.

Every person contributing 10s. 6d. annually shall have the right to become an Annual Member upon giving due notice in writing.

Honorary Life Members, Life Members, and Annual Members are entitled to attend and vote at General Meetings and are eligible for election as Governors.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Except in cases of emergency, Patients are only admitted upon the recommendation of a Medical Practitioner, who, whenever possible, shall be the Patient's usual Medical Adviser. Applicants are treated as In-Patients or Out-Patients at the discretion of the Medical and Surgical Staff and as accommodation available in the Wards may permit. Accidents and other cases deemed urgent by the Medical Officers are, so far as space permits, admitted at all times.

Out-Patients.

X-Ray Department.—Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, at 5.45 p.m.

Massage, Light, and Radiant Heat Departments.—Men : Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays. Women : Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays (by appointment).

Visiting Regulations.

The following are the days and hours when patients may be visited by their friends :—

Adults.—Wednesdays, Sundays, and Public Holidays, 2 to 4 p.m. (Husbands, wives, or other nearest relatives of Patients whose business precludes them from visiting on Wednesday afternoons, may visit Adult Patients on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 7.15 p.m. to 7.45 p.m.)

Children.—Wednesdays, Sundays and Public Holidays, 3 p.m. to 3.30 p.m. (Parents and Guardians only). Parents or Guardians may also call at the Hospital and make enquiries about their children during the Adult Visiting Hours.

Except for urgent reasons, Visitors cannot be admitted at other times.

Children under 15 are not allowed to visit the Wards without special permission.

Not more than TWO Visitors will be permitted to visit a patient at the same time.

Visitors who have been directly or indirectly in contact with cases of infectious diseases are earnestly requested to refrain from entering the Wards.

Private Wards.

The Private Wards are intended for the benefit of Patients who, although of limited means, are able to pay the cost of their maintenance and treatment in the Hospital.

The charge is 15s. per day for a Single Room, 10s. 6d. per day in other Private Rooms, but a minimum total charge of one guinea is payable. These charges include Accommodation, Board, Nursing, Medicine, necessary Stimulants and Surgical Dressings. A charge of £1 1s. will be made for the use of the Operating Theatre. Special Nurses (and their laundry, board and lodging),

Massage or Electrical treatment, Pathological or X-Ray examinations, and any expensive remedies or daily or continuous dressings, ordered by the Medical Officer in charge of the patient, are additional charges.

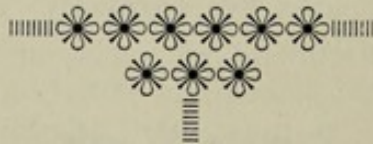
The day of admission and the day of discharge are counted together as one entire day. Private patients make their own arrangements for their personal laundry.

Patients shall arrange with their Physician or Surgeon the fees to be paid for treatment or operation, and the fee for the Anæsthetist, all such sums being paid direct by the Patient.

Patients may be visited by their friends from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. daily, exception being made in the case of a husband or wife of a Patient who is unable to visit during these hours; in these circumstances, the Patients may be visited from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Permission to visit at any other times can only be granted in exceptional cases, and subject to the approval of the Medical Officer in charge of the Patient. Application in this connection to be made to the Secretary.

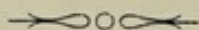



DISTRICT NURSING COMMITTEE.

The District Nursing Committee have much pleasure in submitting their Report and Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1927.

The number of cases dealt with during the year were 483, as compared with 481 in 1926. These cases involved 10,550 visits, medical and surgical, and in these numbers there were 15 massage cases, involving 725 treatments. The records show that the apportionment of the 483 cases to the electoral wards of Ilford were as follows :—Clementswood 55, Cranbrook 60, Loxford 67, North Hainault 72, Park 62, Seven Kings 107, South Hainault 37, Becontree 23.

With the increased number of attendances the payments of patients show a corresponding increase, being £429 1s. 3d., against £390 16s. 8d. for 1926, the average cost per attendance being 1s. 5d.

The Receipts from Donations and Box Collections show a slight decrease, and additional support is necessary if the District Nursing Committee is to remain entirely self-supporting.

The Committee desire to record their grateful thanks to all who have helped in this work by sending Donations. As in the past the churches in the neighbourhood have been very generous in their support, and the Committee are also indebted to the Central Council for District Nursing in London.

During the year three full-time nurses have been constantly employed, and their services have been augmented by a Relief Nurse and a Visiting Masseuse.

The efficiency of this staff is well maintained, and many expressions of appreciation have been received from patients and from members of the medical profession.

The Committee again place on record their thanks to the nurses for the loyal and satisfactory manner in which they have carried out their splendid work.

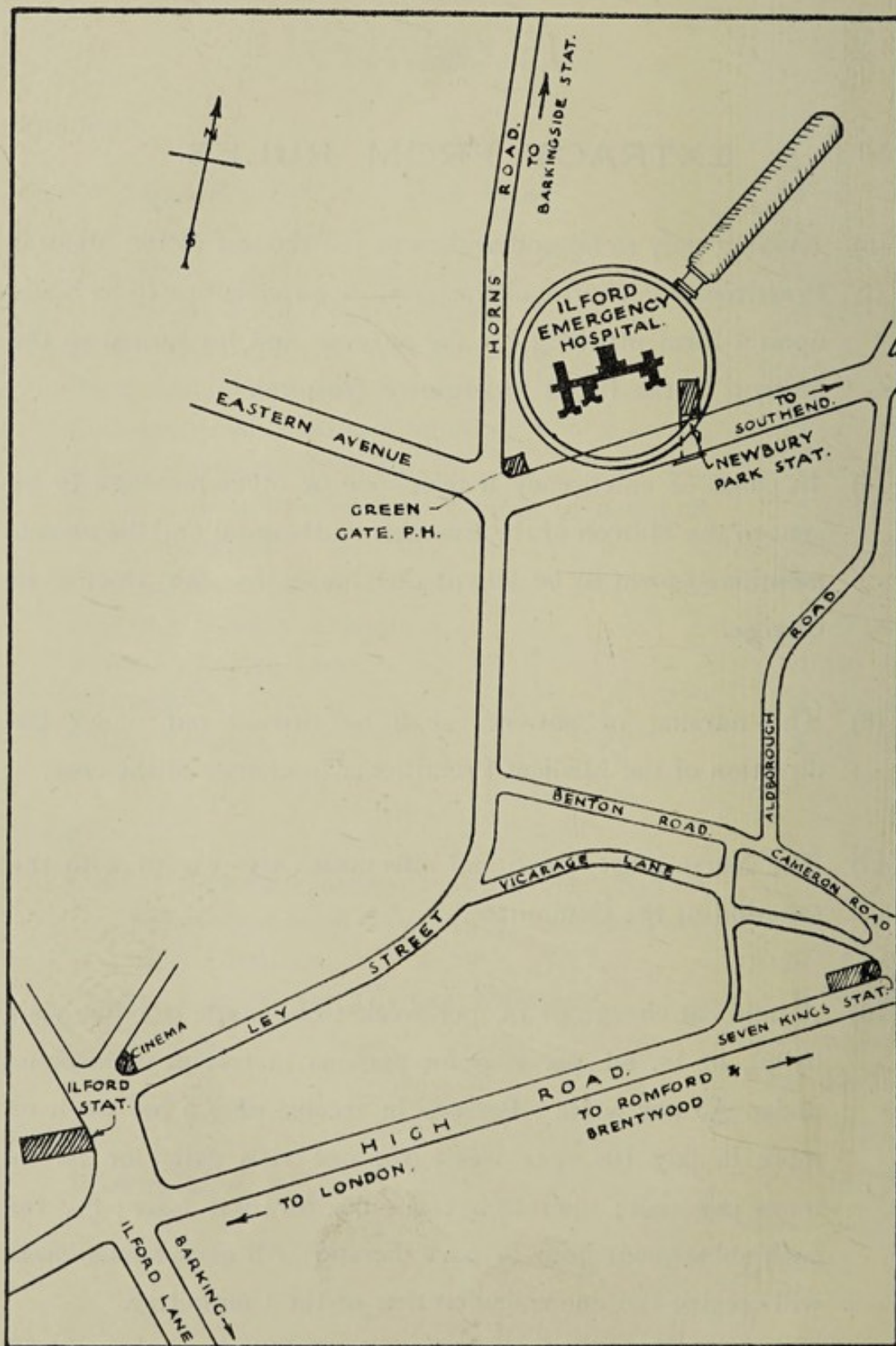

ILFORD DISTRICT NURSING COMMITTEE.

EXTRACT FROM RULES.

- (5) Nursing only to be undertaken at the request of the Medical Practitioner in charge of the case, such requisition to be made upon a form provided for the purpose and forwarded to the Matron of the Ilford Emergency Hospital.
- (6) In cases of emergency a telephone or other message to be sent to the Matron of the Emergency Hospital and the above-mentioned form to be left at the house by the Doctor in Charge.
- (8) The nursing of patients shall be carried out under the direction of the Medical Practitioner in charge of the case.
- (12) The Nurse must not attend infectious cases except with the sanction of the Committee.
- (16) A uniform charge of 7s. per week to be made (for one visit daily), or 1s. 6d. per visit for persons in receipt of incomes under £5 per week. Persons in receipt of £5 per week or more to pay 10s. per week (for one visit daily) or 2s. or more per visit; operation cases 5s. for first hour; 5s. for each subsequent hour or part thereof. All necessitous cases will receive the due consideration of the Committee.

An official receipt must be given for all sums paid.
