# ANNUAL REPORT, 1928.

THE Board of Governors have the honour to submit their report for the year 1928 together with the Audited Accounts.

The Governors deeply regret to record that two of their number have passed away during the year—Dr. H. Ernest Watts and Mr. J. E. Halloway. Dr. Watts had been associated with the Hospital from its earliest days and always devoted himself to its welfare. He was Chairman of the Medical Committee from the inception of the Hospital. Mr. Halloway set a rare example of energy and enthusiasm as Organiser of the South Hainault and Seven Kings Wards of the Ilford Hospital Saturday Committee. These great friends of the Hospital will be hard indeed to replace.

In December the Hospital suffered a further loss in the death of the Lord Lieutenant of Essex, the Right Honourable Lord Lambourne, who, it was expected, would have become the first President of the King George Hospital.

#### FOREWORD.

The Governors, in their Report last year, foreshadowed the necessity for creating a large General Hospital, and this task has engaged their unremitting attention throughout the year under review. To secure the whole-hearted co-operation of adjoining districts whilst safeguarding the interests of Ilford, and to accomplish the necessary change from Cottage Hospital to General Hospital principles without unfairness to existing interests, has been a task the difficulties of which were so great that some delay was unavoidable. The Governors are very glad to report that all preliminary difficulties have now been overcome, and that the general principles for the establishment of King George Hospital to serve Ilford, Barking and Dagenham, have been accepted by representatives of all concerned. The Governors tender their most grateful thanks to His Majesty the King for so graciously allowing the proposed Hospital to be associated with his name. The King and Queen have also very kindly headed an appeal for the Building Fund issued by the Lord Mayor of London and the Chairman of the London County Council. King Edward's Hospital Fund for London has been ready at all times to give sympathetic help in the solution of the Hospital problem of this area, and the benefit of the Fund's experience has been invaluable.

The first extension of the Hospital to provide about 130 beds will be undertaken as soon as sufficient money is in hand, and the Hospital will then become King George Hospital. The cost of this extension will be approximately  $\pounds 60,000$ , of which  $\pounds 30,000$  is in hand or promised. The Governors earnestly appeal for funds to enable them to undertake this vital work immediately, and to open King George Hospital free of debt.

Although so much time has been given to future development the Governors have not neglected immediate extension to the limit of their financial resources, and in October His Worship the Mayor of Ilford, as President of the Hospital, opened two new Ward Blocks and a new Casualty Receiving Room. These buildings are at present used for Nurses' Quarters, Dining Rooms, Administrative purposes, and an Out-Patient Department, pending further extensions, when they will revert to their proper use. The pressing needs of the moment have thus been satisfied without recourse to wasteful expenditure upon temporary buildings. The opening of the Consultative Out-Patient Department has been delayed pending the appointment of the future Staff of the Hospital. In the meantime the Department will be in use as a Tonsil and Adenoid Clinic for Children sent by the Ilford Borough Council from the Schools and from the Maternity and Child Welfare Clinic. A small Ward in the War Memorial Children's Wing has been set aside for the retention of such cases from this Clinic as it is necessary to retain overnight.

At the beginning of the year the Governors, following the example of other Hospitals, adopted the Federated Superannuation scheme for Nurses and Hospital Officers (Contributory). This is a pension scheme to which the Hospital and members of its Staff both contribute. The adoption of this scheme does away with the haphazard method of granting pensions as an act of grace, and by its adoption the Hospital can attract the best type of nurses and Hospital officers.

An important and original innovation during the year has been the formation of an Ilford Hospital Group of the Hospital Saving The Hospital Saving Association, in return for Association. contributions of 3d. per week from persons within certain income limits, relieves its contributors and their dependents from (a) enquiry at Hospital as to means (b) from any payment as inpatients in an ordinary Ward, and (c) from any payment as an out-patient. The Association also gives assistance in other ways, e.g., payment towards convalesence, surgical instruments, etc. By joining the Ilford Hospital Group (E.1152) contributors will be assisting their local Hospital as well as themselves, for although they can go to any Hospital on the Association's list when in need of treatment, the Ilford Hospital will receive any money left in its Group after benefits and expenses have been paid. The great need is for honorary collectors who will act as organisers for a road Full particulars will gladly be furnished by the or roads. Secretary of the Hospital.

The Consulting Radiologist at the Hospital has reported that an expenditure of  $\pounds 800$  is required to perfect the equipment of the X-ray Department in order that complete work in diagnosis and treatment can be undertaken. The present plant would then become available for emergency work at any hour of the day or night. It is difficult to imagine an object upon which a philanthropic individual or body could expend  $\pounds 800$  with greater benefit to our community.

A Samaritan Fund, the purpose of which is to provide Ambulance service, fares, help towards the purchase of instruments and other forms of help not properly payable from ordinary Hospital Funds has been opened with the assistance of a Donation of  $\pounds 5$ from the Patients' League.

During the year two Resident House Officers have constantly been engaged, and the Hospital has not been without a Doctor on the premises.

#### THE YEAR'S WORK.

The work of the Hospital has increased very considerably during the year under review. It will be seen from the Statistical Tables on page 22 that 55 in-patients were resident daily throughout the year, as compared with 44 in 1927. Apart from important plans and work for the future, the Governors regard this increase of no less than one-fifth in the main in-patient work of the Hospital as the most important and satisfactory feature of their Report.

During the year 604 out-patients attended for X-ray examination. 161 out-patients made 3,610 attendances in the Massage Clinic, and 2,652 patients received attention in the Casualty Department.

#### FINANCE.

The accounts for the year, duly audited by Mr. R. Barlow Tyler, F.C.A., will be found on pages 18 to 21.

#### Income.

It is with very great pleasure and gratitude that the Governors again report an increase of income, which in 1928 was  $\pounds 10,160$  1s., compared with  $\pounds 9,899$  13s. 10d. in 1927 and  $\pounds 7,706$  0s. 8d. in 1926. In addition, the sum of  $\pounds 1,354$  0s. 9d. has been added to the Building Fund and  $\pounds 800$  to the Endowment Fund. Contributions to the Building and Endowment Fund are acknowledged now under these headings. Although the income has proved sufficient for maintenance during the year, the work of the Hospital has increased so rapidly that the Governors view the future with considerable anxiety and cannot hope to carry on their work, much less extend it, without a considerable increase in the support from the public. It is gratifying to report that annual subscriptions have increased; but this item, which should be the mainstay of the Hospital's finance, is still woefully inadequate, and the Governors appeal to friends of the Hospital to become *regular* contributors.

Again the Governors have to thank the Ilford Hospital Saturday Committee for their continued generous support. Their direct cash contribution by no means indicates the extent of the Committee's work. The increased success of such regular efforts as Flag Day, Alexandra Rose Day, Pound Day, the "Help Yourself" Society, etc., is largely due to the unflagging work of the Hospital Saturday workers. To Mr. Ben Henderson (Chairman), Mr. J. Harris (Vice-Chairman), and Mr. H. J. Gilby (Hon. Secretary), and to all Ward Organisers and workers of the Ilford Hospital Saturday Committee the Governors tender renewed congratulations and thanks. Mr. R. J. Stanger, Hon. Secretary of that Committee until March, 1928, was obliged to relinquish office owing to ill-health. The Governors pay tribute to his work for the Saturday Committee and for the Hospital at a time of exceptional difficulty.

King Edward's Hospital Fund for London again increased their grant to the General Fund—the grant being  $\pounds 632$ as compared with  $\pounds 500$  in 1927. Liberal grants from the King's Fund towards the extension of the Hospital are referred to in the paragraph headed "Building Fund."

The Governors gratefully acknowledge a grant of  $\pounds 120$  from the Metropolitan Hospital Sunday Fund—an increase of  $\pounds 20$  as compared with 1927.

A grant of £450 was received from Alexandra Rose Day, as compared with £350 in 1927. The Governors are deeply grateful to the Committee, and again have to thank Mrs. E. Hinton for her splendid organisation, the Mayoress for her support, and all the ladies who worked so hard to make possible this substantial addition to the Hospital's funds.

As in previous years sports clubs figure very prominently in the list of subscribers. The Ilford Golf Club head the list with a donation of  $\pounds 130$  9s. 5d. which completes the  $\pounds 1,000$  necessary to name a bed. The Ilford Hospital Football Charity Competition and the Goodmayes Cricket and Sports Club (Mayfield) having already named beds commenced the endowment of further beds with contributions of  $\pounds 103$  and  $\pounds 72$  16s. 8d. respectively. The Ilford Schools Football Association beat all previous records with the substantial gift of  $\pounds 64$  15s. 2d. Donations of  $\pounds 22$  from the Mayfield Lawn Tennis Club,  $\pounds 21$  from the London Football Association Charity Cup Competition, £18 13s. 3d. from the Ilford Wanderers' Football Club, and £9 8s. 3d. from the Hainault Forest Golf Club give further evidence of very generous interest in local sporting circles. During the year invaluable help has again been received from religious bodies of all denominations. The Ilford Auxiliary National Sunday School Union has sent £30 towards its Cot Fund and has now subscribed a total of £490. Amongst other substantial items were donations of £26 16s. 6d. from St. John's Church, Seven Kings, £21 from Goodmayes Congregational Church, and £18 10s. from the Cranbrook Park Wesleyan Church. It must not be forgotten that in addition to such direct donations, the grant from the Metropolitan Hospital Sunday Fund is due to collections made in Churches.

The "Help Yourself" Society proved even more successful than last year.  $\pm 300$  was received in 1928 and a further  $\pm 100$  was received too late for inclusion in the Accounts. The Stock Exchange Mutual Subscription Fund very kindly increased their donation from  $\pm 50$  in 1927 to  $\pm 150$  in 1928.

Mr. J. Harris and Miss M. Austin again organised a concert at the Super Cinema, with the kind consent of the Provincial Cinematograph Theatres, Ltd. This annual event which provides Ilford with a rare musical treat in addition to swelling the Hospital's income resulted in a profit of  $\pounds 164$  19s. 7d.

The Governors again acknowledge their debt of gratitude to Mrs. Price Watts whose annual Garden Party at White Hall, Chigwell, is so eagerly anticipated. Here again a big increase is to be recorded, the proceeds in 1928 being no less than  $\pounds 236$  3s. 5d.

Pound Day admirably organised by Mrs. A. C. Hatcher was most successful. The Hospital benefited to the extent of 3,965 pounds of goods, 680 eggs, and  $\pounds 31$  11s. 3d. in cash.

A substantial donation of  $\pounds 50$  was received from "K" Division of the Metropolitan Police, being part of the proceeds of their Annual Boxing Tournament.

Amongst other important donations received were £30 from Ilford and District Grocers, Provision Dealers and Italian Warehousemen's Association, £26 from the Great Eastern Railway Members' Accident Fund, £25 from the London & North Eastern Railway Stratford Employees' Hospital Committee, £23 10s. 0d. part collection from the Ilford Masonic Service, £21 from the North Hainault Allotment Holders' Association, a new annual subscription of £20 from the Directors of the Prudential Assurance Company, Ltd., £21 from Mr. E. G. Ford, £19 from the pupils of Glenarm College, and £15 3s. 10d. from the Ilford and Newbury Park Brownies. Considerable help was received through the medium of collection boxes and employees' collections. Some of the principal items being £48 16s. 8d. from the Ilford Skating Rink, £21 14s. 9d. Messrs. Plessey & Co., Ltd., £17 13s. 5d. Messrs. Austins, Ltd., £14 15s. 9d. Loxford Social Club and Institute, £13 Messrs. Ilford, Ltd., and £12 11s. 6d. from Messrs. J. Burns & Co. The Governors feel that the total income from collection boxes is . capable of considerable increase and will gladly supply boxes upon request.

LEGACIES: During the year  $\pounds 500$  (less  $\pounds 50$  death duty) was received from the estate of the late Sir Fredric Wise, M.P., and a further  $\pounds 87$  12s. 5d. from the estate of the late Rev. Joseph Fletcher.

#### BUILDING FUND.

The Building Fund was enriched during the year by £549 19s. 8d. from the Mayor's Extension Fund per Alderman W. J. O. Sheat, O.B.E., J.P., C.C., and £500 from King Edward's Hospital Fund for London. Amongst substantial contributions to the Mayor's Appeal Fund, the Santa Claus League per Mr. Leonard Lewin was responsible for £99 12s. 7d. A Whist Drive held by Mrs. Sheat produced £30, His Worship the Mayor gave a donation of 25 guineas, and donations of £25 were received from Mr. J. H. Macadam and Messrs. Henley's Telegraph Works. A flag day was held in May, and although the weather was as unfavourable as it could be, the ladies concerned were sufficiently undaunted to collect £257 13s. 5d. A very enjoyable Dance was held at the New Burlington Galleries, London, in June, the profit from which effort was £12 9s. 6d.

In addition to the sum of  $\pounds 3,000$  formerly set aside by King Edward's Hospital Fund for the extension of the Hospital, the Fund have allocated  $\pounds 10,000$  to the King George Hospital Building Fund. These exceptionally large grants are a significant recognition of the great hospital needs of the district, but will not become available until at least an equal amount is forthcoming from other sources, as contributions from the Fund are expressly made to stimulate public effort and not to replace it.

#### ENDOWMENT FUND.

In February, 1928, the Ilford Chamber of Commerce presented a cheque for  $\pounds 800$ , with which sum a bed has been endowed in the King Edward Ward. Every such endowment increases the financial stability of the Hospital and reduces the burden of maintenance. The Governors are deeply grateful to the members of the Ilford Chamber of Commerce for this splendid effort.

#### GIFTS.

In addition to cash contributions many valuable gifts were received during the year and are acknowledged on page 58.

To all whose generosity has made it possible to carry on the work of the Hospital the Governors tender their most grateful thanks. In doing so they feel that they are but expressing the gratitude of the many hundreds of patients who have received help when they stood in greatest need. The Governors earnestly solicit the continued support of all old friends, and hope that their ranks may be swelled year by year in order that the Hospital may widen its scope and increase its service to the community.

#### EXPENDITURE.

The daily average number of patients having increased from 44 to 55, the year's expenditure was  $\pounds 9,745$  15s. 4d., as compared with  $\pounds 8,599$  15s. 4d. in 1927, but as the cost per bed has again been reduced the expenditure is considerably lower in proportion to work performed. The total expenditure on in-patients is included in arriving at the cost per bed per week, which was  $\pounds 3$  10s. 7.25d. in 1926,  $\pounds 3$  6s. 2.4d. in 1927, and  $\pounds 3$  1s. 11.08d. in 1928. These figures show that very considerable measures of economy have been adopted, but whilst subscribers may thus be assured of wise expenditure, they may also be satisfied that the reduction of cost has not been attained at the expense of the patient's treatment or comfort.

#### Capital Expenditure.

The extensions referred to in the Foreword of this Report were erected at a cost of  $\pounds 5,200$ . In addition, the Governors have acquired the freehold of a piece of land adjoining the Hospital, in order to give full scope for possible extensions, at a cost of  $\pounds 520$ . Other capital items during the year included the equipment of new buildings, additions to the Central Heating system, final payments for the completion of the War Memorial Wing, and the installation of an effective fire alarm system which was very badly needed indeed. By this system alarm is given simultaneously throughout the Hospital. The total capital expenditure was  $\pounds 6,649$  17s. 1d.

#### VICE-PRESIDENT AND HON. LIFE MEMBERS.

Alderman W. J. O. Sheat, O.B.E., J.P., C.C., upon conclusion of his term of office as Mayor of Ilford and President of the Hospital was unanimously elected a Vice-President.

The Governors have added the names of Miss M. Austin, Messrs. C. A. Bowley, W. H. Stevens, and J. E. Price Watts, F.R.C.S., to the list of Hon. Life Members in consideration of the great services they have rendered to the Hospital.

#### NURSING STAFF.

The Governors and Medical Staff express their satisfaction with the work of the Nursing Staff during the year, which, in their opinion (and in the expressed opinion of many old patients), has reached a very high standard. Early in the year Miss F. Fairbairn, then Home and Tutor Sister, was appointed Matron in place of Miss G. Davis, who resigned in view of her approaching marriage.

The nurses' efforts to make Christmas a happy time in the Hospital were particularly successful. In this connection the Governors gratefully thank the many friends of the Hospital who so kindly gave donations to the Christmas Entertainment Fund, a wealth of toys for the children, and gifts for the patients, all of whom also received a greeting card and a personal visit on Christmas Day from His Worship the Mayor and the Mayoress of Ilford.

#### THANKS TO THE MEDICAL STAFF.

The Board conclude their Report with the expression of their sincere thanks to the members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff. The difficult transition period through which the Hospital is passing has demanded no small measure of loyalty from the doctors who have served the Hospital so long and so well. For the constant attention and kindness to patients, and for the valuable service rendered by the medical staff to the Hospital throughout the year, the Governors are deeply grateful.

### ILFORD EMERGENCY HOSPITAL (INCORPORATED).

The Hospital contains 64 Beds, allotted as follows :--Public Wards : Male, 14; Female, 14. Private Wards : 14. Children : 22.

#### GOVERNMENT AND MANAGEMENT.

The Hospital is under the general direction of the Chairman and Governors and of Standing Committees appointed by the Board of Governors. The Board of Governors consists of 37 Elected Members, of whom 10 are nominated by the Ilford Medical Society, 9 by the Ilford Hospital Saturday Committee, 6 by the Ilford War Memorial Committee, and one by the United Services Fund.

The Annual General Meeting is held in February unless otherwise arranged. Extraordinary Meetings may be convened by the Governors whenever they think fit or upon requisition signed by 20 Members.

#### QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF SUBSCRIBERS.

Every Male contributing a Donation of not less than 10 guineas and every Female contributing not less than 5 Guineas is entitled to election as a Life Member upon giving due notice in writing.

Every person contributing 10s. 6d. annually shall have the right to become an Annual Member upon giving due notice in writing.

Honorary Life Members, Life Members, and Annual Members are entitled to attend and vote at General Meetings and are eligible for election as Governors.

#### ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Except in cases of emergency, Patients are only admitted upon the recommendation of a Medical Practitioner, who, whenever possible, shall be the Patient's usual Medical Adviser. Applicants are treated as In-Patients or Out-Patients at the discretion of the Medical and Surgical Staff and as accommodation available in the Wards may permit. Accidents and other cases deemed urgent by the Medical Officers are, so far as space permits, admitted at all times. The General Wards of the Hospital are reserved for those who cannot afford to pay for the medical treatment they receive. In these Wards the doctors give their services entirely free of charge, but all patients who are in a position to do so are asked to contribute towards the actual cost of their maintenance by the Hospital.

#### **Out-Patients.**

X-Ray Department.-Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, at 5.45 p.m.

Massage, Light, and Radiant Heat Departments.—Men: Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays. Women: Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays (by appointment).

A Consultative Out-Patient Department will be opened as soon as the Visiting Staff has been appointed. In this Department Hospital patients recommended by their local doctors will be able to obtain consultation with Consulting Physicians, Surgeons and Specialists in Aural, Ophthalmic, Gynæcological Departments, etc.

#### Visiting Regulations.

The following are the days and hours when patients may be visited by their friends :---

- Adults.—Wednesdays, Sundays, and Public Holidays, 2 to 4 p.m. (Husbands, wives, or other nearest relatives of Patients whose business precludes them from visiting on Wednesday afternoons, may visit Adult Patients on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 7.15 p.m. to 7.45 p.m.)
- Children.-Wednesdays, Sundays and Public Holidays, 3 p.m. to 3.30 p.m. (Parents and Guardians only). Parents or Guardians may also call at the Hospital and make enquiries about their children during the Adult Visiting Hours.

Except for urgent reasons, Visitors cannot be admitted at other times.

Children under 115 are not allowed to visit the Wards without special permission.

Not more than TWO Visitors will be permitted to visit a patient at the same time.

Visitors who have been directly or indirectly in contact with cases of infectious diseases are earnestly requested to refrain from entering the Wards.

#### Private Wards.

The Private Wards are intended for the benefit of Patients who, although of limited means, are able to pay the cost of their maintenance and treatment in the Hospital.

The charge is 15s. per day for a Single Room, 10s. 6d. per day in other Private Rooms, but a minimum total charge of one guinea is payable. These charges include Accommodation, Board, Nursing, Medicine, necessary Stimulants and Surgical Dressings. A charge of  $\pounds 1$  1s. will be made for the use of the Operating Theatre. Special Nurses (and their laundry, board and lodging), Massage or Electrical treatment, Pathological or X-Ray examinations, and any expensive remedies or daily or continuous dressings, ordered by the Medical Officer in charge of the patient, are additional charges.

The day of admission and the day of discharge are counted together as one entire day. Private patients make their own arrangements for their personal laundry.

Patients shall arrange with their Physician or Surgeon the fees to be paid for treatment or operation, and the fee for the Anæsthetist, all such sums being paid direct by the Patient.

Patients may be visited by their friends from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. daily, exception being made in the case of a husband or wife of a Patient who is unable to visit during these hours; in these circumstances, the Patients may be visited from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Permission to visit at any other times can only be granted in exceptional cases, and subject to the approval of the Medical Officer in charge of the Patient. Application in this connection to be made to the Secretary.

Patients on the Danger List may be visited at any time.

## DISTRICT NURSING COMMITTEE.

The District Nursing Committee have much pleasure in submitting their Report and Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1928.

The number of cases dealt with during the year was 433. These cases involved 10,632 visits, as compared with 10,550 visits in 1927. In these numbers there were 21 massage cases, involving 695 visits. The records show that the apportionment of the 433 cases to the electoral wards of Ilford was as follows : Cranbrook 93, Park 54, Seven Kings 77, North Hainault 52, South Hainault 25, Loxford 60, Clementswood 50, Becontree 22.

With the increased number of attendances the payments of patients show a corresponding increase, being  $\pounds 435$  19s. 2d. against  $\pounds 429$  1s. 3d. for 1927, the average cost per attendance being 1/4.4.

The balance of  $\pounds 49$  2s. 4d. was brought forward from 1927, and the sum of  $\pounds 150$  is owing from the Nursing Association to the Hospital for Maintenance of Nurses, Administration, etc. A glance at the Accounts will, therefore, show that there was a deficit on the year's working of  $\pounds 163$  15s. 7d. This deficit is the result of the large amount of work done by the Association without payment.

As an example of the free treatment given by the Nurses nine long-standing Necessitous Cases on the Books of the Association received no less than 1,727 visits from Nurses during 1928 at a cost to the Committee of  $\pounds 97$  19s. 0d., whilst the total amount of work done during the year without payment was  $\pounds 137$  3s. 6d. It will be seen, therefore, that the deficit is almost entirely in respect of charitable work. The Committee wish to point out that these Patients are most frequently old people who are chronically ill and are not fit subjects for admission to Hospital, but who must have skilled attention at home, which, but for the District Nurses, they would not receive. In some cases the Association provides skilled nursing for chronic invalids until they pass away. The amount of suffering which would result if the Association's efforts were in any way curtailed through lack of Funds could be better imagined than described.

The Committee feel certain that the nature of this beneficent work is only to be fully realised to ensure generous support with a view to increasing, rather than decreasing, the measure of such help.

They appeal for donations, which should be addressed to the Secretary, at the Ilford Emergency Hospital, and will very gladly give the fullest possible particulars to any generous sympathiser who may be interested.

The Committee desire to record their grateful thanks to all who have helped in this work by sending Donations. As in the past the churches in the neighbourhood have been very generous in their support, and the Committee are also indebted to the Central Council for District Nursing in London.

During the year three full-time Nurses have been constantly employed, and their services have been augmented by a Relief. Nurse and a Visiting Masseuse.

The efficiency of this Staff is well maintained, and many expressions of appreciation have been received from Patients and from members of the medical profession.

The Committee again place on record their thanks to the Nurses for the loyal and satisfactory manner in which they have carried out their splendid work.

### ILFORD DISTRICT NURSING COMMITTEE.

#### EXTRACT FROM RULES.

- (5) Nursing only to be undertaken at the request of the Medical Practitioner in charge of the case, such requisition to be made upon a form provided for the purpose and forwarded to the Matron of the Ilford Emergency Hospital.
- (6) In cases of emergency a telephone or other message to be sent to the Matron of the Emergency Hospital and the abovementioned form to be left at the house by the Doctor in Charge.
- (8) The nursing of patients shall be carried out under the direction of the Medical Practitioner in charge of the case.
- (12) The Nurse must not attend infectious cases except with the sanction of the Committee.
  - (16) A uniform charge of 7s. per week to be made (for one visit daily), or 1s. 6d. per visit for persons in receipt of incomes under £5 per week. Persons in receipt of £5 per week or more to pay 10s. per week (for one visit daily) or 2s. or more per visit; for attendance at operations a charge of 5s. to be made for first hour; 5s. for each subsequent hour or part thereof. All necessitous cases will receive the due consideration of the Committee.

An official receipt must be given for all sums paid.
