ANNUAL REPORT, 1934

THE Board of Management have the honour to submit their Report for the year 1934, together with the audited accounts.

FOREWORD

During the year the "Baker Memorial Wing" has been completed and is now in use. The new Wing consists of a Private Nursing Suite of 21 beds on the ground floor and a large General Ward of 34 beds on the first floor. Mr. Henry T. Baker, to whose great generosity this handsome addition to the Hospital is largely due, laid the Foundation Stone on 23rd June, 1934, and the Wing was opened for the reception of patients on 19th January, 1935. The Architects, Messrs. Dawson, Son & Allardyce, and the Building Committee have spared no effort to make the new Wing as attractive and well equipped as possible, and the Board consider that they have done their work excellently. Mr. Baker has himself rendered considerable help and has shown great interest in the progress of the work. Consequent extensions have been made to the Nurses' Home and to the Medical Officers' residency. An extension to the "Walter Stevens "Children's Ward will shortly be completed, when the Hospital will have over 200 beds available. In addition the Casualty Department has been considerably extended, additional Waiting Rooms, Consulting Rooms and Recovery Wards having been provided.

The erection of Buildings has in no way interfered with the work of the Hospital. All available beds have constantly been filled and the various Casualty and Out-Patient services have increased by approximately 20 per cent.

The ordinary expenditure of the Hospital increased from $\pounds 29,080$ 6s. 9d. in 1933 to $\pounds 30,462$ 4s. 3d., a difference of $\pounds 1,381$ 17s. 6d. and the maintenance income from $\pounds 29,321$ 3s. 1d. to $\pounds 30,449$ 10s. 5d. There was, therefore, a deficit of $\pounds 12$ 13s. 10d. on this account, to which must be added $\pounds 220$ contributed to the Ilford District Nursing Committee. Although the increase of maintenance income did not quite keep pace with the higher expenditure consequent upon the increased work, it should be pointed out that during the year there was a capital outlay of $\pounds 21,471$ 19s. 9d. upon new Buildings, etc., and, in spite of this fact, the Building Fund Debt was reduced by $\pounds 5,770$ (From $\pounds 24,720$ to $\pounds 18,950$).

This Debt must be liquidated before further essential extensions are undertaken, and for the coming year, a maintenance income of approximately $f_{2}40,000$ will be required.

During the year 142 beds have been available and 154.4 occupied daily, extra beds being constantly in use. The total number of In-Patients was 3,245, and there were 104,361 Out-Patients attendances. The Board again call attention to the fact that this, the youngest of the large General Hospitals of Greater London receives less of its income from Endowments and Legacies than any comparable Hospital. It has therefore been much more difficult to meet ever-growing expenses, particularly in view of an almost continuous building programme. A capital outlay of $\pounds 173,979$ has been expended since 1930 when the King George Hospital was inaugurated.

The Board earnestly appeal to all who can influence benefactors and introduce new friends in order that progress can be continued until the Hospital is in every way adequate for the extensive area it serves.

OBITUARY.

The Board, with the deepest regret, record the loss of these most generous friends-

Mrs. Henry T. Baker passed away in April. Her memory will for ever be preserved in the Wing which, with her husband, she dedicated to the alleviation of the sick and suffering.

Further great losses were sustained in the passing of Mrs. Dane, the first Mayoress of Ilford, whose humane work was so well-known, and Mr. Alfred North, one of the Hospital's oldest friends and subscribers.

THE BECONTREE CENTRE, DAGENHAM.

During the year 8,283 patients made 49,401 attendances, and, in the treatment of minor casualties and patients requiring dressings, etc., the Centre continues to do most valuable work for residents of the Housing Estate, particularly children.

The value of the Centre has been greatly increased during the year under review by the development of the Tonsils and Adenoids Clinic for the Essex County Council. The Centre has been furnished with 10 cots, and operations are performed every week, the total of such operations during the year being 298.

A Sister and three Nurses are in residence and the Centre is visited daily by a Medical Officer of the Hospital, who is also available for emergencies.

The ladies of the Dagenham Section continue to undertake most valuable mending work for the Centre and for the main Hospital.

FINANCE.

The Accounts for the year, duly audited by W. R. Barlow Tyler, F.C.A., will be found on pages 22 to 33.

The following is an extract from the Auditors' Report :---

Whilst I regret that the record for some years of ensuring that Annual Income exceeded Expenditure on general Running Account has been broken, I do feel that your Board of Management and you are to be congratulated on a financial progress in 1934. I have referred to the small deficiency of $\pounds 232$ 13s. 10d., but against this, no less a sum than $\pounds 25,978$ 2s. 2d. has been raised on account of Buildings and Equipment Funds, although I must acknowledge, that of this total figure, $\pounds 10,000$, the generous donation of Mr. Baker, was available at the commencement of the year. King Edward's Fund for London gave a grant of £2,587, and a further grant to the Building Fund which is included under that heading. The grant from the Metropolitan Hospital Sunday Fund was $\pounds 340$.

The Board again tender cordial congratulations and grateful thanks to the Officers and Members of the King George Hospital Aid Society, who once again rendered invaluable help. The total amounts contributed by the four Sections were as follows :—Barking Section $\pounds700$ 0s. 6d., Dagenham Section $\pounds623$ 15s. 10d., Ilford Section $\pounds1,034$ 5s. 6d., South Hainault and Goodmayes Section $\pounds239$ 10s. 4d. The Honorary Secretaries will be glad to enrol new members to assist them in their work.

The Board are pleased to report that the Hospital received an allocation of $\pounds700$ from the Alexandra Rose Day Committee, this amount constituting a record. $\pounds600$ was in respect of the Ilford Collection, and $\pounds50$ each of Barking and Dagenham. This very generous help is largely due to the splendid work of the Lady Organisers: Ilford—Mrs. E. Hinton, Barking—Mrs. Ware, and Dagenham—Mrs. Poston.

King George Hospital's own Day "White Rose Day" also proved a record success, over $\pounds 450$ being collected. The adoption of a White Rose as the Hospital's emblem instead of a Flag proved instantly successful, and it is hoped that this event will become increasingly profitable.

The Board very gratefully acknowledge £500 from Smith's (Kensington Estate) Charity.

A further substantial donation of £500 has been received from The Alfred Rothschild Trust, per Sir Milsom Rees, G.C.V.O., D.Sc., F.R.C.S., making the total received from this source £4,500.

An Exhibition of Railway Stock was kindly held by the London and North Eastern Railway for the benefit of Charity, the King George Hospital receiving the Lion's share amounting to no less than £389 6s. 1d. This Exhibition was remarkable not only for its excellence as such and for the great public interest displayed but for the self-sacrificing voluntary work of large numbers of Railway Officials and Workers.

The board acknowledge the receipt of a generous contribution of \pounds 91 10s. 0d. towards the Young Memorial Fund. This Fund was raised in respect of the late John Young, Esq. in place of sending flowers. The Hospital would greatly benefit if this most effective method of paying tribute were more generally adopted.

Through the kindness of the Port of London Authority and the Essex County Cricket Club, a Match was played on the ground of the former in aid of the Hospital, which resulted in a profit of $\pounds 84$ 3s. 2d. These teams will meet again in aid of the Hospital funds on 29th June, 1935, at the Port of London Authority ground, and it is hoped that this popular annual event will secure even wider support.

The services of all concerned in the management of the Ilford School's Football Association during 1934 are particularly appreciated by the Board of Management, $\pounds 56$ 9s. 8d. was received from this source making a total of $\pounds 710$ 5s. 8d. since the inauguration of this competition.

On 13th December, the Linen Guild held their Annual General Meeting in the new Ilford Ward. The Lady Gwendoline Colvin, C.B.E., presided, and the Chairman, Mrs. Seymour Hicks (Miss Ellaline Terriss), was present. A most interesting address was given by Miss Merriman, R.R.C. The Meeting was a memorable one and remarkable progress was recorded. The Guild have undertaken to equip the new Ilford Ward with Linen as well as the Children's Ward Extension and will, in addition, undertake regular mending work. The Board deeply appreciate this invaluable help and very cordially congratulate the Officers and Members of this virile Organisation upon the great success achieved.

The Hon. Secretary, Mrs. P. Tyson Davidson, will be very glad to hear from prospective members and to supply them with full particulars.

The Board are also very grateful to Mrs. Amies and her friends who have worked so hard throughout the year in the making of Hospital garments for use at the Hospital and the Five Elms Centre.

THE PATIENTS' LEAGUE.

The Board gratefully acknowledge the invaluable help of the League during the past year. In addition to contributing $\pounds 13$ 11s. 6d. towards the funds of the Three Towns Bazaar, and $\pounds 25$ towards the pro-

vision of a new Diathermy Apparatus, the League donated £30 towards the Samaritan Fund, the principal object of which is to supply surgical instruments and to defray the cost of convalescence in deserving cases. The League has given £138 11s. 6d. to this Fund since 1928.

THE NEW PRIVATE NURSING WING.

Special attention is called to the fact that the ground floor of the new "Baker Memorial Wing" is reserved for Private Patients, 21 beds being available. These rooms have been tastefully arranged and furnished, and are provided with all modern facilities for comfort. A spacious sun-room has been provided at the Southern extremity of the Wing and this feature will doubtless be greatly appreciated by convalescent patients. General particulars of the terms of admission to the Private Nursing Wing will be found on page 109. Further information is contained in a brochure, copies of which will be furnished by the Secretary upon request.

It has long been realised that an ideal Private Patients' service can only be given in a separate Block, and now that this luxurious suite has been made available by Mr. Baker's generosity, it is hoped that full advantage will be taken of it by those residents of the area who, whilst not socially eligible for admission to the General Wards, are still of moderate means.

X-RAYS TREATMENT DEPARTMENT.

Thanks to the generosity of the Corporations of Ilford and Barking and the Urban District Council of Dagenham, the Hospital is now equipped with an up-to-date X-Rays Treatment Department in addition to its X-Rays Diagnostic service. The provision of this expensive plant marks a great step forward and enables the Hospital to alleviate much suffering by the application of deep therapy treatment in cases of malignant growths, etc., and to treat a large number of skin diseases, etc., by superficial therapy. Formerly residents in this area were obliged to travel long distances to obtain such facilities. The donors have performed a very real public service in this matter. As evidence of the great need, it is interesting to note that no less than 495 treatments were given in this new Department between 30th October, 1934 and February, 1935. The thanks of the Board were tendered at an official opening of the Department, which took place on 30th October, 1934, and at which the Civic Heads, Aldermen and Councillors of the Three Towns were present.

CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

Substantial progress has been made in the development of the King George Hospital Contributory Scheme during the year.

The total income during the period under review amounted to $\pounds 2,469$ from twopence per week contributors, and from Annual Subscribers, an increase over the preceding year of $\pounds 279$.

204 Contributors and their dependents received In-Patient treatment and Out-Patient attendances totalled 3,648.

The area has been recanvassed during the year as a result of which the membership has been increased from 3,276 at the 1st January to 6,876 at the 31st December, 1934, an increase of over 100 per cent. This big effort was made at considerable expense and its justification will depend upon the continuance of the zealous and ungrudging work of the large body of ladies and gentlemen who gave their time as Voluntary Collectors for the Scheme. Their number has increased during the year from 125 to 224, and the Board would like to place on record their grateful appreciation of this invaluable service.

During the year the Voluntary Collectors' Association was formed with the object of bringing the Voluntary Collectors in closer contact with one another and the Hospital gave them official recognition by allocating Annual Governorships to them in accordance with the Bye-Laws. An attractive Badge of membership is issued to each Collector.

A further alteration which it is hoped will make the Scheme more popular with the public is that arrangements are now made to refund to the members their full contributions if they are treated at another Hospital after having applied for and been unable to obtain admission at their own Hospital.

With the added financial burdens of the extensions which are now open, the regular collection of the weekly contributions is becoming a more and more important factor in the Hospital's Budget, and the Board confidently rely upon the Voluntary Collectors' Association to continue it splendid work.

Full particulars of the Scheme will gladly be supplied on request by the Secretary and Superintendent of the Hospital, and offers of personal service will be welcomed.

LEGACIES.

The Board of Management are deeply grateful for the Legacy received from the Executors of L. M. Riddell, Esq. of $f_{.63}$.

LIBRARY.

The facilities offered by the Hospital Library Service, which has been greatly assisted by the generous co-operation of the Municipal Authorities of Barking, Dagenham and Ilford, have been gratefully appreciated by the Patients. The Board are most grateful to the Hon. Librarian, Miss Dorothy Hilder, and her Assistants, Miss Norah Burn, Mrs. Culling, Miss Ruth Gibson, Miss Doreen Morton and Mrs. F. Smith for being so good as to undertake this work.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

The Board again tender very sincere thanks to the Honorary Medical Staff for the great service they render to the Hospital.

It is again emphasized that the status of the Voluntary Hospitals has, in the main, always been dependent upon its ability to attract the voluntary service of the most eminent members of the Medical Profession.

No change has to be reported in the personnel of the Staff during the year.

RESIDENT MEDICAL STAFF.

The Resident Medical Staff consists of a Resident Medical Officer, who is a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, three House Surgeons, one House Physician and one Casualty Officer.

NURSING STAFF.

The Board of Management and the Honorary Medical Staff again express their satisfaction with the work of the Nursing Staff and are pleased to report that a very high standard has been maintained.

Lectures have been given by members of the Honorary Medical Staff and the Matron, a high percentage of passes being attained in the examinations. A full-time Sister Tutor has now been appointed.

Valuable voluntary assistance has again been given by members of the Leytonstone Division of the British Red Cross Society whose assistance is highly appreciated.

Christmastide was happily spent, the Nursing Staff sparing no effort in an endeavour to make the Hospital as homelike as possible. The decorations were pretty and effective.

The Nativity Play, "Angels of Bethlehem," was very beautifully rendered and much appreciated by a crowded audience.
CONCLUSION.

In conclusion, the Board again tender their most grateful thanks to the public who have so loyally supported the development of the King George Hospital, which His Majesty The King in opening the Hospital described as a "Great Enterprise." Romantic and rapid though the growth of the Hospital has been, it is still far from adequate for the needs of the area it serves, and during the coming year it will still be a painful necessity to refuse patients daily for lack of room. Nevertheless, further extension is impossible until the Building Fund Debt is liquidated, and the increased maintenance income made secure.

The Board confidently leave the issue with the public. They feel sure that a necessity which cannot be questioned, coupled with the increased prestige of the Hospital will soon allow of the further progress of the King George Hospital towards its ultimate inevitable position as one of the largest and best equipped Hospitals of Greater London.

GOVERNMENT AND MANAGEMENT.

The supreme control and government of the property and affairs of the Society is vested in the Governors.

The management of the Society is vested in a Board of Management consisting of the President, Treasurer and not less than 28 members, with power to co-opt not more than five additional members.

General Meetings are held in the months of January, April, July and October of each year, the Meeting held in the month of April being called the Annual General Meeting.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF SUBSCRIBERS. LIFE GOVERNORS

The following shall be qualified as Life Governors :--

Every donor of not less than 30 guineas (in one payment or in payments spread over three years) to the funds of the Society. If any such Donation shall be made by the Trustees of a Will or Settlement they shall be at liberty to nominate one person to be such Governor as aforesaid in their stead.

ANNUAL GOVERNORS

The following shall be qualified as Annual Governors :--

Every Annual Subscriber of not less than 2 guineas to the funds of the Society during the period covered by such subscription. (Also nominees of collecting organisations, contributory Associations, etc., as specified in the Bye-laws.).

Associate Members subscribing not less than $\pounds 1$ Is. to the funds of the Society during the period covered by such subscription.

Annual subscribers of $\pounds 1$ ls. but less than $\pounds 2$ 2s. per annum shall be entitled to attend and speak at the Annual General Meetings.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

All Governors are eligible to be nominated for election as members of the Board of Management when vacancies arise, such nominations to be in the form prescribed by the Bye-laws.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Except in cases of emergency, Patients are only admitted upon the recommendation of a Medical Practitioner, who, whenever possible, shall be the Patient's usual Medical Adviser. Applicants are treated as In-Patients or Out-Patients at the discretion of the Medical and Surgical Staff and as accommodation available in the Wards and in the Consultative Out-Patient Department may permit. Accidents and other cases deemed urgent by the Medical Officer are, so far as space permits, admitted at all times.

The General Wards of the Hospital are reserved for those who cannot afford to pay for the medical treatment they receive. In these Wards the Physicians and Surgeons give their services entirely free of charge, but all patients who are in a position to do so are asked to contribute towards the actual cost of their maintenance by the Hospital.

* X-Ray Examinations are only made when ordered by a member of the Medical Staff of the Hospital, excepting Private Patients, for whom appointments should be made and fees paid according to the prescribed scale.

Massage, Light and Radiant Heat Departments.—Men : Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Women : Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays (by appointment).

* X-Ray Therapy treatment is given any day by appointment when ordered by a member of the Medical Staff of the Hospital, excepting Private Patients, for whom appointments should be made and fees arranged.

Visiting Regulations.

The following are the days and hours when patients may be visited by their friends :--

- Adults.—Wednesdays, Sundays, and Public Holidays, 2 to 4 p.m. (Husbands, wives or other nearest relatives of Patients whose business precludes them from visiting on Wednesday afternoons, may visit Adult Patients on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 7.15 p.m. to 7.45 p.m.).
- Children.—Wednesdays, Sundays and Public Holidays, 3 p.m. to 3.30 p.m. (Parents and Guardians only). Parents or Guardians may also call at the Hospital and make enquiries about their children during the Adult Visiting Hours.

Except for urgent reasons, Visitors cannot be admitted at other times.

Children under 15 are not allowed to visit the Wards without special permission.

Not more than TWO Visitors will be permitted to visit a patient at the same time.

Visitors who have been directly or indirectly in contact with cases of infectious diseases are earnestly requested to refrain from entering the Wards.

Patients on the Danger List may be visited at any time.

Private Nursing Wing.

The Private Nursing Wing is intended for the benefit of Patients who, although of limited means, are able to pay the cost of their maintenance *and treatment* in the Hospital.

The charge is 15s. per day (£5 5s. per week), but a minimum total charge of 1 guinea is payable. These charges include Accommodation, Board, Nursing, Medicine, necessary Stimulants and Surgical Dressings. A charge of £1 1s. will be made for the use of the Operating Theatre. Special Nurses (and their laundry, board and lodging), Massage or Electrical treatment, Pathological or X-Ray examinations, and any expensive remedies or daily or continuous dressings, ordered by the Medical Officer in charge of the patient, are additional charges,

The day of admission and the day of discharge are counted together as one entire day. Private patients make their own arrangements for their personal laundry. Patients shall arrange with their Physician or Surgeon the fees to be paid for treatment or operation, and the fee for the Anaesthetist, all such sums being paid direct by the Patient, and being additional to the Hospital charges.

Patients may be visited by their friends from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. daily, exception being made in the case of a husband or wife of a Patient who is unable to visit during these hours; in these circumstances, the Patients may be visited from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Permission to visit at any other times can only be granted in exceptional cases, and subject to the approval of the Medical Officer in charge of the Patient. Application in this connection to be made to the Secretary and Superintendent.

Patients on the Danger List may be visited at any time.

The District Nursing Committee have pleasure in submitting their Report and Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1934.

The number of new cases treated was 564, involving 10,963 visits, of which 6,911 were to Medical cases, 2,879 to Surgical cases, 5 to assist at Operations in patients' homes, and 1,168 for Massage. The cases were distributed as follows :—Cranbrook 64, Park 60, Seven Kings 90, North Hainault 151, South Hainault 38, Loxford 78, Clementswood 23, and Becontree 60.

Three full-time nurses and one supply nurse and a masseuse were employed throughout the year.

The Accounts show a small balance carried forward to 1935 of $\pounds 3$ 8s. 11d. after taking credit for $\pounds 220$ transferred from the Hospital as a donation in respect of administration costs and the housing of nurses.

The total sum received from patients was $\pounds 450$ 17s. 10d. as compared with $\pounds 482$ 19s. 10d. in 1933.

The cost of work done for the necessitous poor during the year was £334 11s. 7d. The amount received from patients averaged 9.9d. per visit as against an average cost of 1s. 5.2d. £35 was received from the Central Council of District Nursing, and a grant of £20 from the Metropolitan Hospital Sunday Fund. Amongst the donations received during the year were the following :—£21 from the St. Clement's Sick and Poor Fund and £5 from the Rev. David Sutherland. A complete list of donations appears on page 112.

Much of the work of the District Nursing Association is done for those who, whilst infirm and almost destitute, are not eligible for admission to a Hospital.

The cost of working during 1934 was £785 9s. 5d. Owing to the association of the District Nurses with the King George Hospital it is perhaps not generally realised that it is a separate work, greatly needing support. As will be seen from the Accounts, the total amount received in subscription and donations was no more than $\pounds 99$ 10s. 1d. The balance has to be made up by patients' payments and a donation from the General Fund of the King George Hospital, which adversely affects the Hospital's Income and Expenditure Account.

An earnest appeal is made for increased support for this very essential Public Health Service.

EXTRACT FROM RULES.

- (5) Nursing only to be undertaken at the request of the Medical Practitioner in charge of the case, such requisition to be made upon a form provided for the purpose and forwarded to the Matron of King George Hospital.
- (6) In cases of emergency a telephone or other message to be sent to the Matron of King George Hospital and the above-mentioned form to be left at the house by the Doctor in Charge.
- (8) The nursing of patients shall be carried out under the direction of the Medical Practitioner in charge of the case.
- (12) The Nurse must not attend infectious cases except with the sanction of the Committee.
- (16) A uniform charge of 7s. per week to be made (for one visit daily), or 1s. 6d. per visit for persons in receipt of incomes under £5 per week. Persons in receipt of £5 per week or more to pay 10s. per week (for one visit daily) or 2s. or more per visit; for attendance at operations a charge of 5s. to be made for first hour; 5s. for each subsequent hour or part thereof. All necessitous cases will receive the due consideration of the Committee.

An official receipt must be given for all sums paid.
