



#### ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

FOLLOWING the adoption of the Contributory Scheme no Letters of Recommendation will be issued in future. Persons whose incomes are within the limits laid down in the rules of the Scheme are expected to become members of the Scheme, and should they require Hospital treatment at any time they should bring with them their Contribution Card, upon production of which no further question as to means will be asked. The patient will be entitled to absolutely free hospital treatment.

Persons not being members of the Scheme will be expected to contribute towards the cost of their maintenance in hospital according to means. Old Age Pensioners of 70 years and over however and the necessitous poor will always receive free hospital treatment.

With the exception of urgent cases and accidents all persons attending the Hospital should bring with them a letter from their own doctor.

They should enquire of their Approved Society if they are entitled to Ophthalmic treatment as an additional benefit, and if they are entitled to such benefit, they should NOT attend at the Hospital.

#### MOTOR AMBULANCE.

The Committee are anxious that it should be understood that Sufferers from Accidents, and Patients who are too ill to travel in the ordinary way, may obtain, by proper application made beforehand to the House Surgeon, the FREE USE of the Motor Ambulance; it is hoped, however, that patients or their friends will make a contribution towards the expenses of maintaining the Ambulance.

The Motor Ambulance is also available for the use of the General Public when it is not wanted for Hospital Patients. The Hospital Authorities can in no case accept liability, and it is not to be used for infectious cases. The charges for the use of the Motor Ambulance by the general public are 15/- for the neighbourhood of Ryde, and a minimum fee of £1 1s. within 10 miles of the Hospital, and a maximum fee of £2 2s. No gratuities are allowed. No Nurse is available to be sent with the Ambulance.

The Report of the Committee of Management of the Royal Isle of Wight County Hospital to H.R.H. The President and Governors for the year 1940.

HE Committee have the honour to present their 93rd Annual Report to the Governors, and are able to state that owing to the continued success of the Contributory Scheme, to generous support by our Subscribers and Donors, and to financial assistance from the Ministry of Health, it was possible to provide treatment for a larger number of In-patients than ever before in the history of the Hospital.

There were 1,516 new In-Patients, an increase of 114 over the previous year, and the total attendances of Out-Patients amounted to 14,987. It was found necessary to equip one of the rooms near the Out-Patients' Department as a Casualty Operating Theatre: scientific appliances of various kinds, which were much needed, have been purchased so that patients may have the benefit of the latest improvements. The Ministry of Health have taken over Ryde House, through the kindness of Mr. G. R. Brigstocke, as an Auxiliary Annexe to this Hospital in case of emergency: it has been prepared for occupation at short notice: all expenses are to be defrayed by the Ministry.

The Ordinary Income amounting to £20,246 17s. 2d. was more than in the previous year by £1,964 os. 3d., but this was again due to contributions made by the Ministry of Health for reserving emergency beds, and for the maintenance of Service Men who required treatment. The Ordinary Expenditure amounted to £19,756 11s. 3d., an increase of £2,983 2s. 1d. over the total for 1939: expenditure incurred owing to the present emergency was very heavy, and it is hoped that Subscribers and Governors will do their utmost to help the Hospital in the next year: it was again

impossible for Collections to be made. The final payments for the building of the King George V. Memorial Nurses' Home have not yet been made as the Contractors have been unable to submit their final account.

The Committee desire to convey their sincere thanks to the entire Staff of the Hospital for the way in which they have carried out their various duties, and the extra work entailed in connection with War Emergency Services. It was with very great regret that the resignation of Dr. A. A. Straton, M.D., F.R.C.S., was received last July after twenty years of valuable service on the Medical Staff: in view of the present emergency he has kindly undertaken to carry on the Surgical Out-Patients' Clinic every week until the end of the war. Dr. W. H. B. Magauran, F.R.C.S., is still away on War Service, and Dr. J. A. Lee, F.R.C.S., is continuing to act as Honorary Surgeon to the Ear, Nose, and Throat Department.

There is a separate report upon the work of the Contributory Scheme, but the Committee desire to include in this report their expression of very grateful thanks to all the workers for their continued valuable services which are very much appreciated.

The Committee are most grateful to the Honorary Solicitor, Mr. C. W. Vincent, for his help and advice on matters referred to him: also to the Press in publishing the weekly reports free of charge and in other ways.

#### THE CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME

# Report of the Contributory Scheme Committee for the year 1940

THE year 1940 has in many respects been the most successful year of the Contributory Scheme. The hard work that was so nobly done by the Local Committees during the first years of the Scheme has built up such a solid foundation for it, that it has been possible to come through the year with an increase in the receipts over 1939, despite the many setbacks brought about by the war conditions. It is difficult to express our gratitude and admiration for the very fine efforts of that great band of voluntary workers. Undeterred by the "Black-out" and despite increased work of National importance, these friends of the Hospital have carried on with an even greater keenness and determination.

A word of thanks must also be given to the employers of labour, whose loyal co-operation has helped to establish the scheme. During the year a total sum of £1,339 8s. 10d. was collected in the various works and business houses.

The total income from the Contributory Scheme for the year was £10,928 7s. 9d., an increase of £6 8s. 11d. over the year 1939.

While a drop in the Contributions might reasonably be expected on account of the men called up for Service, who are exempt from payments under the Scheme, and of which there are 1,500, we made up this drop and still more improved the position. Since January 1st, 1941, and until the time of going to press 488 new members in addition have been enrolled; this augers well for the year 1941.

During the year the following amounts were paid for the treatment of members in Hospitals other than the Royal Isle of Wight County Hospital.

The Administration Expenses total £498 10s. 2d., a decrease of £54 19s. 11d. over the year 1939, and less than 5 per cent. of the total receipts for the year.

With the consent of the Local Committees concerned, Mrs. E. Wheeler, the Representative of the Contributors in the Ryde area has been asked to serve for a further term of three years on the Hospital Committees, and Dr. Howie-Wood will represent the Shanklin Hospitals for a further term of three years.

I must congratulate Mr. Lord very much on the result of the year's working. It is very much due to his enthusiasm and personality that the Scheme is so successful.
