





ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

POLLOWING the adoption of the Contributory Scheme no Letters of Recommendation will be issued in future. Persons whose incomes are within the limits laid down in the rules of the Scheme are expected to become members of the Scheme, and should they require Hospital treatment at any time they should bring with them their Contribution Card, upon production of which no further question as to means will be asked. The patient will be entitled to absolutely free hospital treatment.

Persons not being members of the Scheme will be expected to contribute towards the cost of their maintenance in hospital according to means. Old Age Pensioners of 70 years and over however and the necessitous poor will always receive free hospital treatment.

With the exception of urgent cases and accidents all persons attending the Hospital should bring with them a letter from their own doctor.

They should enquire of their Approved Society if they are entitled to Ophthalmic treatment as an additional benefit, and if they are entitled to such benefit, they should NOT attend at the Hospital.

MOTOR AMBULANCE.

The Committee are anxious that it should be understood that Sufferers from Accidents, and Patients who are too ill to travel in the ordinary way, may obtain, by proper application made beforehand to the House Surgeon, the FREE USE of the Motor Ambulance; it is hoped, however, that patients or their friends will make a contribution towards the expenses of maintaining the Ambulance.

The Motor Ambulance is also available for the use of the General Public when it is not wanted for Hospital Patients. The Hospital Authorities can in no case accept liability, and it is not to be used for infectious cases. The charges for the use of the Motor Ambulance by the general public are 15/- for the neighbourhood of Ryde, and a minimum fee of £1 1s. within 10 miles of the Hospital, and a maximum fee of £2 2s. No gratuities are allowed. No Nurse is available to be sent with the Ambulance.

The Report of the Committee of Management of the Royal Isle of Wight County Hospital to H.R.H. The President and Governors for the year 1941

THE Committee have the honour to present their 94th Annual Report to the Governors, and are pleased to state that the work of the Hospital has been carried on with increased efficiency, and further progress has been made towards providing the latest equipment for the relief of sickness and suffering.

There were 1,422 new In-patients, a decrease of 94 over the previous year's record total; the attendances of Out-patients amounted to 17,129, showing an increase of 2,142. A new Massage Department is shortly being opened to deal more effectively with the large number of these cases.

The Ordinary Income amounting to £19,920 19s. 3d. was less than in the previous year by £325 17s. 11d. There was a decrease of £50 in Annual Subscriptions and of £50 in the donations by others than patients. The Ordinary Expenditure amounted to £19,834 16s. 9d., an increase of £78 5s. 6d. over the total for 1940. The Ministry of Health have undertaken to pay for the cost of the maintenance of Ryde House Annexe, which, so far, has not been required for the use of patients: a sum of £467 9s. 11d. has been paid out, but only £96 2s. od., has as yet been refunded. final payments for the building of the King George V. Memorial Nurses' Home have now been made; until the debt to the Bank can be paid off the charges on the overdraft will be debited half yearly, but with the help of legacies the debt is gradually being reduced. The Committee hope that our subscribers and donors will do their best to support the Hospital in this next year, especially as the usual collections cannot take place until the war is over.

The Committee again desire to convey their sincere thanks to the entire Staff of the Hospital for the way in which they have carried out their duties; they are all working under difficulties, and have willingly accepted fresh responsibitities. Mr. J. Dixon Robinson resigned his appointment as one of the Honorary Dental Surgeons owing to duties outside the Island; Mr. W. W. Hargreaves has kindly consented to undertake the whole of the duties of the Dental Department until he is called up for service with the R.A.M.C., when he will arrange with his locum tenens to carry on. The Ear, Nose and Throat Department has again lost the services of Dr. W. H. B. Magauran, F.R.C.S., until the end of the war; arrangements have been made with Mr. Harold Downer, D.L.O., R.C.P. and S. Eng., who is on the Staff of the Royal Sussex County Hospital to act as Specialist to the Department.

There is a separate report upon the work of the Contributory Scheme, which continues to be very successful notwithstanding the difficult prevailing conditions: the Committee desire to include in this report their very grateful thanks to all the workers for their valuable services which are very much appreciated.

The Committee are very grateful to all friends of the Hospital for contributions both in money and in kind which are a great help in these difficult times. The assistance of the Press at all times readily given is most welcome.

THE CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME

Report of the Contributory Scheme Committee for the year 1941

THE TOTAL amount collected during the year 1941 was £10,800 os. 11d., a decrease of £128 6s. 10d. on the year 1940. The results for the year are very satisfactory particularly having regard to the large number of members in the Services who are now exempt from payments under the Scheme. The efforts of the Local Committees have been magnificent and one cannot speak too highly of them—their work goes on unceasingly, surmounting all obstacles, and their loyalty under present conditions is most gratifying; we can never thank them enough.

We are grateful also to the employers of labour who during the year collected £1,174 9s. 1d.; their kind co-operation has done much to ensure the smooth working of the Scheme.

Our records show that 1,796 members are in the Services representing a temporary loss in annual income of £676 4s. 4d. After allowing for cancellations for various reasons the net increase in enrolments during the year was 739. It is gratifying to note therefore that in spite of the many difficulties the Scheme continues to progress.

During the year the following amounts were paid for the treatment of members in Hospitals other than the Royal Isle of Wight County Hospital.

The payments to the Shanklin Hospitals show an increase over the previous year as do the payments to the Isle of Wight County Council, but the payments to London and Provincial Hospitals show a decrease over the previous year. New arrangements for payment in respect of Radium treatment at the Royal South Hants and Southampton Hospital have been submitted by the County Council to the Ministry of Health but are still not approved. The Contributory Scheme has therefore been called upon to pay during the year £315 13s. od. for Radium treatment for Contributors at Southampton. It is hoped however that we shall in due course be re-imbursed.
