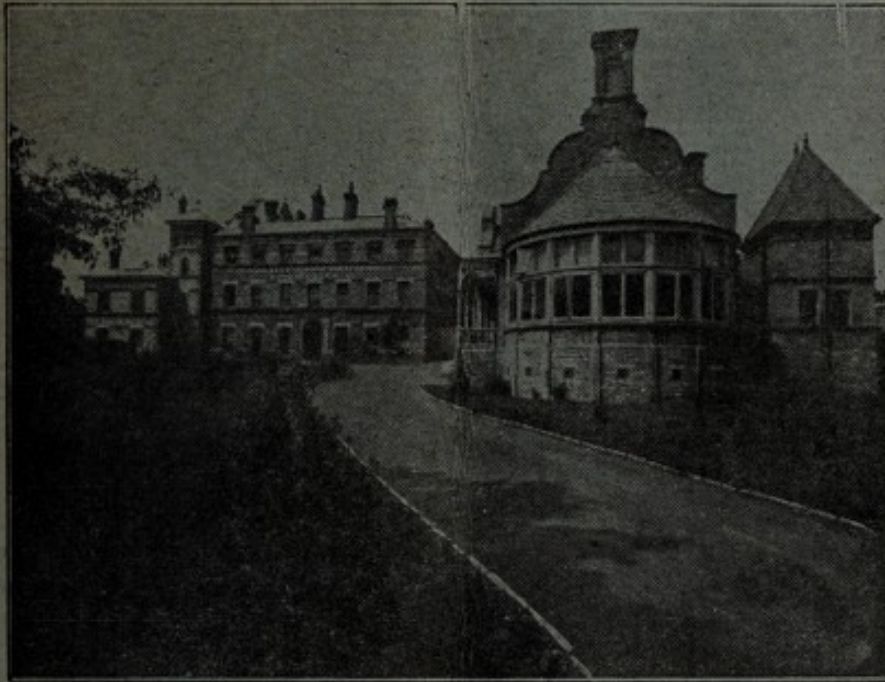

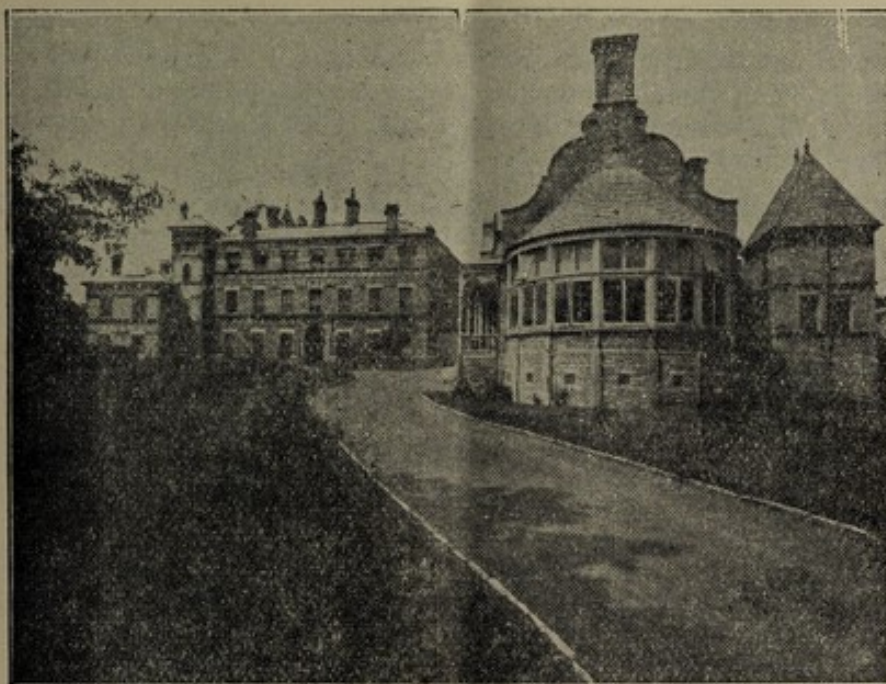

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

FOLLOWING the adoption of the Contributory Scheme no Letters of Recommendation will be issued in future. Persons whose incomes are within the limits laid down in the rules of the Scheme are expected to become members of the Scheme, and should they require Hospital treatment at any time they should bring with them their Contribution Card, upon production of which no further question as to means will be asked. The patient will be entitled to absolutely free hospital treatment.

Persons not being members of the Scheme will be expected to contribute towards the cost of their maintenance in hospital according to means. Old Age Pensioners of 70 years and over however and the necessitous poor will always receive free hospital treatment.

With the exception of urgent cases and accidents all persons attending the Hospital should bring with them a letter from their own doctor.

The Report of the Committee of Management of
the Royal Isle of Wight County Hospital to
H.R.H. The President and Governors for the
year 1943.

THE COMMITTEE have the honour to present their 96th Annual Report to the Governors : the work of the Hospital has been carried on under increasing difficulties owing to a general shortage of Staff and particularly in the domestic Staff : the patients however have received the best treatment that could possibly have been provided for them.

There were 1,432 new In-patients, a decrease of 44 over the previous year's total. Rehabilitation treatment will be undertaken shortly in connection with the Massage Department at the request of the Ministry of Health. An Orthoptic Department in connection with the Ophthalmic Department has recently been opened and a trained Orthoptist has been appointed.

The Ordinary Income amounting to £25,495 15s. 3d. was more than in the previous year by nearly £7,000 : this was due to the increased amount received from the Ministry of Health for Emergency War Services, and to an increase of £100 in the Annual Subscriptions owing to some of our Subscribers having kindly completed the form of covenant to pay their Subscriptions for seven years, or during lifetime. The Ordinary Expenditure amounted to £21,722 10s. 10d. which was £942 11s. 4d. above last year's total. The Ryde House Annexe is still under the Ministry of Health and has not been used for patients. The Committee decided to transfer the sum of £2,000 to the Nurses' Home account : the debt thereon has been reduced from £5,979 6s. 10d. to £4,169 13s. 10d.

The death of Dr. A. A. Straton by enemy action was a sad blow to everyone connected with the Hospital : since his retirement from the Honorary Medical Staff he had kindly acted as Honorary Surgeon to the Out-patients' Surgical clinic thereby rendering great assistance to the already depleted Staff : he was elected a Member of the Committee in 1942.

The Committee desire to convey their grateful thanks to all the Staff for their efficient services : the House Surgeon and House Physician retire after an appointment of six months : there have been no other changes in the Staff calling for special mention during the year.

The Dr. R. N. Aston Memorial Samaritan fund has been a great help to those Patients who were not able to pay for appliances ordered for them : the balance to the credit of this account at the end of the year was £203 11s. 1d.

The Committee are most grateful to all who have helped by their voluntary contributions of money and gifts in kind : to all who have helped with the work of the Contributory Scheme, and to the Press for their kind assistance.

The following Members of Committee retire under Rule 24 :- Mrs. Perrott, J.P., Sir Henry Sweetman, J.P., Mr. J. B. Alderslade, Miss Waistell, The Rev. H. M. Humphery, The Hon : Mrs. Wilson-Heathcote, and Mr. S. R. Bird : other vacancies are caused by the death of Dr. A. A. Straton, and of Mr. Vincent Feesey.

Any Governor, whose consent has been obtained, may be nominated for election by another Governor in writing duly signed and given to the Secretary not later than Saturday, March 11th.

THE CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME

Report of the Contributory Scheme Committee for the year 1943

THE total receipts during the year 1943 amounted to £10,696 8s. 7d., a decrease of £193 7s. 3d. over the year 1942. It will be understood that under present conditions especially, it is not always possible for collectors to complete their collections for the year before the books are closed and that the figure in the report represents the money paid in during the year and may be more or less than the true income for the year. There is nevertheless a slight drop in some areas due to the large number of members in the Services. It says much for the diligence of collectors that the income lost on account of members in the Services has very largely been made up by new enrolments.

The Committee desire to thank all Secretaries and Collectors who have been so tremendously kind to the Hospital; their work is very greatly appreciated. Though imperative that the rate of contribution should be raised in 1944, the Committee were reluctant to burden the collectors with the responsibility of making this change known to members, but Local Committees have carried out this duty with their usual zeal, and at the time of making this report there is abundant evidence that they have done their work well and members have responded magnificently to this new appeal.

We are grateful to employers of labour who during the year collected from their employees the sum of £1,006 1s. 6d.

The Administration Expenses total £567 18s. 7d. and represent 5 per cent. of the total income for the year.

With the consent of the Local Committees concerned, Mrs. E. Wheeler, the representative of contributors in the Ryde Area, and Dr. H. S. Howie Wood, the representative of the Shanklin Hospitals, have been asked to serve on the Hospital Committees for a further term of three years.

As from January 1st, 1944, the rate of weekly contribution has been increased by a penny weekly, but Old Age Pensioners above the age of 70 will not continue with payments and will still be entitled to all the benefits of the Contributory Scheme.

An Ambulance Service has been arranged for Contributors and they will be conveyed to or from the Hospital by any ambulance free of charge.

Special consideration has been given to the payments made for treatment in Mainland Hospitals and at the request of those Hospitals the rates of payment have been increased as from January 1st, 1944.

RECOVERY OF INCOME TAX ON SUBSCRIPTIONS

Charities are entitled to recover Income Tax on subscriptions received, and all that is required is that the subscriber should agree to complete a Form of Covenant to pay the subscription for a period of seven years or during lifetime, whichever period shall be the shorter, It should be pointed out that **no extra trouble to the subscriber is involved by this method.**

The sum named in the agreement can, of course, be for any amount according to the wishes of the subscriber, and the following table illustrates the great benefit to the Hospital of this scheme.
