# The Thirty-sixth Annual Report

OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE

## Lambert Memorial Hospital,

For the Year ending 30th September, 1926.

The Trustees have pleasure in presenting their Thirty-sixth Annual Report for the Year ending 30th September, 1926, comprising a summary of cases treated during the year, and a Financial Statement showing the Income and Expenditure during the same period.

Receipts for the year amounted to £698 1s. 1d., and the balance from the previous year was £75 14s. 11d., making a total of £773 16s. 0d. For the same period Expenditure amounted to £889 16s. 3d., resulting in a balance of £116 0s. 3d., being due to the Bank.

The Trustees draw attention to the fact that Expenditure for the past year has exceeded income by the sum of £191 15s. 2d. The increased Expenditure was mainly due to the many serious cases requiring long and special treatment and to the provision of necessary hospital equipment. Receipts were considerably less than in the previous year during which the hospital was exceptionally fortunate as regards special efforts and donations. The hospital being carried on most economically it is by increased Income only that the Trustees can expect to meet present day expenditure.

The number of Patients under treatment in the Hospital during each of the past four years has been—

The daily expenditure per patient during the same period was approximately as under—

1922-23	—	10s. 4d.	1924-25	—	8s. 3d.
1923-24	—	10s. 2d.	1925-26	—	9s. 3d.

The daily expenditure for food in respect of each inmate, staff included, during the year 1925-26 was 2s. 6d.

The special effort on behalf of the Hospital in September, 1926, realised £102 1s. 10d., which will be brought into the next Financial Statement. The Trustees are grateful to Mrs. Walker, Mount St. John, the Ladies' Committee, Mr. Tennant, and the many helpers who contributed to its success, and to the kind friends who sent money and goods, and the public for its support. Having regard to the financial position it will be realised how important this effort is to the Hospital.

The Trustees also specially record their thanks to the Churches and Chapels for their continued and much valued help, and to the various Associations, etc., for the substantial grants made, as set out in the Statement annexed.

The thanks of the Trustees are due to the Honorary Medical Staff, to Mr. E. Mitchell for kindly auditing the accounts, and other Officers for their services, to the subscribers for their continued support, and also to those who so kindly sent linen, eggs, fuel, gifts of game, fruit, flowers, etc., books, magazines, and papers for the use of patients, all of which have been greatly appreciated.

The Trustees also wish to express their appreciation of the help given by members of the Red Cross, the Police Force, and other friends of the Hospital.

A telephone has been installed during the past year.
