THE FIFTIETH ANNUAL REPORT
of the Trustees of the
LAMBERT MEMORIAL HOSPITAL,
THIRSK.

For the Year ending 30th September, 1940.

The Trustees have pleasure in presenting their Fiftieth Annual Report for the year ended 30th September, 1940, comprising a summary of cases treated during the year, and a Financial Statement showing the Income and Expenditure during the same period.

Receipts for the year on general account amounted to £1109-1-2. For the same period Expenditure amounted to £1120-4-10, resulting in the debit balance due to the Bank being increased to £108-14 8.

The number of patients under treatment in the Hospital during each of the past years has been :—

1936-37, 79 ; 1937-38, 127 ; 1938-39, 126 ; 1939-40, 112.

The daily expenditure per patient during the same period was approximately as under :—

1936-37, 11/3 ; 1937-38, 10/9 ; 1938-39, 13/1 ; 1939-40, 10/1.

The daily expenditure for food in respect of each inmate, staff included during the year 1939-40 was approximately 2/1.

The Sale Stall and Street and Village Collections on behalf of the Hospital in September, 1940 realised £58-17-9. The Trustees are very grateful to all helpers.

The Trustees also especially record their thanks to the Churches for their continued and much valued help, and to the various Associations, etc., for the substantial grants made, as set out in the statement annexed.

The thanks of the Trustees are due to the Honorary Medical Staff, and other Officers for their services, to the Subscribers for their continued support, those who so kindly sent eggs, gifts of game, fruit, flowers, etc., books, magazines, and papers for the use of patients, to the Linen Guild for hospital equipment, etc., all of which have been greatly appreciated, and to all who have in any way helped the work of the Hospital during the past year.
