REPORT FOR 1901.

N presenting their Report for 1901 the Committee desire to express their sincere thanks to the many kind friends who have supported them in their endeavour to carry on the work of the Hospital, in the most efficient as well as most economical manner.

The ordinary income for the year shows a small improvement, a very gratifying feature being an increase of nearly £66 in annual subscriptions. The expenditure, however, has more than proportionately risen, which is to some extent to be accounted for by the numbers of both in and out patients being larger than in the previous year.

The Committee are again much indebted to the congregation of Christ Church, Lancaster Gate, for the very valuable assistance given to them in many ways, and notably by the collections on Christmas Day, which together amounted to £161118.6d., including £64118.0d. at the Children's Service. Liberal contributions have also once more been received from St. Stephen's, Westbourne Park,

and St. Matthew's, Bayswater. The kind thought which prompted this valuable assistance is much appreciated.

All the subscriptions for the endowed cots have been renewed, and another cot has been named the "Leslie Ogilvie," in memory of the late and much regretted Dr. Leslie Ogilvie, an annual subscription being promised in the names of Mrs. Ogilvie, Mrs. Mitchell, Misses Ethel and Margaret and Master George Ogilvie.

A Fairy Play was performed at 87, Lancaster Gate, for the benefit of the Hospital, by the children of Mr. Frank Hardcastle, and the sum of £16 is. od. was realised. It is a pleasure to the Committee to record this proof of the sympathy of children in the richer classes for children suffering and in distress.

It was found necessary to abandon the usual Christmas Entertainment this year owing to a case of scarlet fever occurring in the Hospital, but a Christmas Tree was provided for the few children detained in the wards, and the Matron, Resident Medical Officers, and Nurses did all that was possible for their entertainment.

Miss Edith Rendel has again kindly received children from the Hospital at her Convalescent Home at Charlwood, thus continuing to lay the Committee under an obligation which they fully recognise.

The Committee are much indebted to the Medical and Surgical Staff for valuable services rendered at a great expenditure of time and pains. They record with regret the resignations of Mr. C. Vincent Cotterell and Mr. H. Lambert Lack of their respective offices of Dental Surgeon, and Surgeon to the Ear and Throat Department, owing to their being unable any longer to give the necessary time to the work. The former had been in office no fewer than eighteen years and has always shown the warmest interest in the Hospital. He has been appointed Consulting Dental Surgeon, and has been succeeded in his old office by Mr. G. Paton Pollitt. The appointment vacated by Dr. Lack has been given to Mr. Hunter Tod.

The familiar face and genial presence of Miss Anderson, the Matron for eighteen years, will be much missed by all who come to the Hospital, indifferent health having compelled her to relinquish her increasingly heavy duties. It is with much pleasure, however, that the Committee are able to announce that they have not entirely lost her valuable services as she has consented to take up the important, but comparatively lighter work of Matron of their new Convalescent Home at Slough.

Miss S. Biddulph Pinchard was selected out of a large number of candidates to succeed Miss Anderson at the Hospital, and the Committee have every confidence that their choice will be fully justified. She entered on her duties on the 4th of September.

The Secretary continues to discharge his important duties with ability and conscientiousness, thus entirely meeting with the approval of the Committee.

The retiring members of the Committee are Mr. C. W. Empson, Mr. Robert Hanbury, and Mr. Mascie Taylor, who, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

In conclusion, the Committee appeal most earnestly to all their friends and supporters to give them the fullest help possible to enable them to carry on the work properly. Every care is taken to administer the funds economically without impairing the general efficiency.

CONVALESCENT HOME.

The Committee have much pleasure in announcing the purchase, on September 18th, of "Fair View," Slough, as a Convalescent Home, at a cost of £1,200. The lease, at £75 a year ground rent, has 62 years to run, and includes the adjoining premises, "Upton House," which is let to a good tenant for the like amount. Considerable sanitary and other improvements were necessary for the adaptation of the Fair View building, and these have cost upwards of £600. Mr. George Hanbury very generously presented the Home with the additional furniture required at a cost of £160, and has further most kindly made a loan to the Committee to meet the expenses of the purchase and the improvements. It is very desirable that this should be paid off as soon as possible, and the Committee appeal earnestly to the public to enable them, not only to raise the necessary balance of £450, but to place them in a position to carry on the work of the Home, without trenching on the resources of the Hospital.

The new Home, which was opened for patients on January 6th, 1902, is in an airy situation about a mile from Slough Railway Station, in the Upton Road. It is a spacious and well-built house, with lofty rooms, admirably suited for the purpose required. At the back is a large and well-planned

lawn, surrounded by an old red-brick wall, an ideal garden for convalescent children. The Committee feel confident that any friends of the Institution, who may be able to visit the Home, will approve of the purchase.

An entertainment was arranged at the Kensington Town Hall, on November 26th, by Mrs. Frank L. Wright and Miss Scott, assisted by Miss Grainger Kerr and others, which realised the very handsome sum of £330 10s. As a small mark of their warm appreciation of this service the Committee elected Mrs. Wright and Miss Grainger Kerr, Life Governors of the Hospital, Miss Scott, a valued friend of the Hospital, having previously been so appointed. The Committee are most grateful for this valuable help.

It is hoped to interest the residents of Slough and the neighbourhood in the Home, which will be open for their inspection any week-day between 2 and 4 p.m.

EXTRACT FROM THE CONSTITUTION OF THE HOSPITAL.

OBJECTS.

To afford Medical and Surgical Relief to the Children of the poor, under the age of 12 years for boys, and 14 for girls:

- a. By admission to the Hospital.
- b. Through the Out-patient Department.

To promote the advancement of Medical Science with reference to the diseases of childhood.

To diffuse among all classes of the community, and chiefly among the poor, a better acquaintance with the management of infants and children during health or sickness, and to assist in the education and training of women in the special duties of Children's Nurses.

The In and Out-patient Departments of the Hospital shall be entirely free, but patients shall be invited to contribute voluntarily to the funds so far as they are able.

GOVERNORS.

Every contributor of Two Guineas or more annually to the funds of the Hospital shall, so long as his subscription is continued, be constituted a Governor, and shall be entitled to one vote at the Annual or any Special Meeting, but a new Subscriber to the amount aforesaid shall not be so entitled unless his subscription for the current year has been paid at least three calendar months before the day of the meeting.

Every donor of 20 Guineas, or more, at one time to the Hospital, and every collector of 50 Guineas, or more, at one time, and any one Executor, to be nominated in writing—if there is more than one,

all the Executors, or if there is no Executor who accepts the office, the Administrator of every Will—giving a legacy amounting to £100 or more (after deducting Legacy Duty, if any,) to the Hospital, shall be constituted a Life Governor, and shall have one vote at the Annual or any Special Meeting next succeeding the receipt of such donation or contribution, provided it has been paid not less than three calendar months before the day of the meeting, and at all subsequent meetings.

No Governor shall, under any circumstances, be entitled to more than one vote at any Meeting.

ANNUAL MEETING.

In the month of February in every year, or as soon after as may be, a General Meeting of the Governors and other Contributors to the funds of the Hospital shall be held, of which notice shall be given within one calendar month of the day of meeting, and at least a week previously to such Meeting, in two or more daily London Newspapers.

Five Governors, at any Annual Meeting, shall form a quorum.

Contributors who are not Governors shall be entitled to be present and take part in the proceedings at the Meeting, but not to vote.

At the Annual Meeting the Managing Committee shall submit a Report of the working of the Hospital, together with an audited financial statement and balance sheet for the year ending the 31st December then last past.

At such Annual Meeting the Governors shall elect the Auditors for the current year, and three Members of the Managing Committee in place of those retiring.

SUBSCRIPTIONS.

The Annual Subscriptions shall be payable in advance for the current year, such year to be

computed from the quarter-day next preceding the Subscription, and no Subscriber in arrear shall be entitled to any privilege arising out of his or her Subscription until it has been paid.

Every Donor of £300 or more at one time, and every Subscriber of £30 or more annually (but in the latter case so long only as this Contribution is kept up), shall be entitled to have a Cot named according to such Donor's or Subscriber's pleasure during his or her life, and every Donor of £1,000, or more, at one time, and every Subscriber of £100, or more, annually, for a period of at least 10 years, shall be entitled to have a Cot named according to such Donor's or Subscriber's pleasure in perpetuity, but in every case subject to the approval of the Committee.

The Committee shall have power to accept any Donation or Bequest which may be made to the Hospital subject to any special restrictions, or for any special purposes annexed to the Gift by the Donor.

MANAGEMENT.

The General Management of the affairs of the Hospital shall, subject to the powers hereby conferred on the Governors, be vested in the Managing Committee.

COMMITTEE.

The Committee shall consist of not more than 25, nor less than 10 Members, of whom not more than 4 shall be representatives of the Medical and Surgical Staff.




