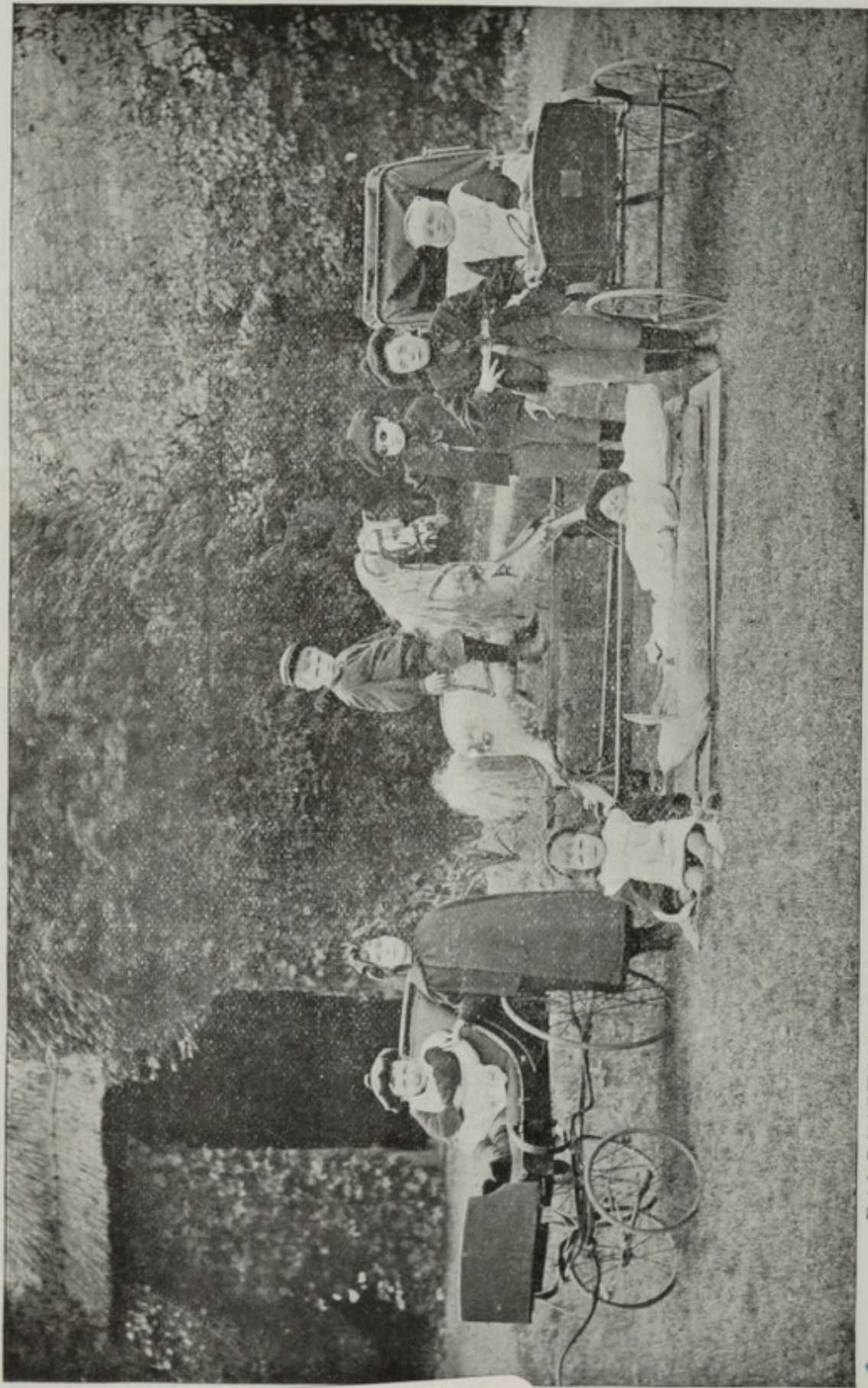

REPORT FOR 1906.



THE Committee have pleasure in presenting to the supporters of the Hospital and Convalescent Home their Report for 1906.

The number of Out-Patients treated during the year was 16,634, being 534 more than in 1905. Owing to the unfortunate occurrence of infectious illness in the wards, which temporarily restricted admissions, the number of In-Patients was 697 as compared with 767—a decrease of 70. A full return of the work done will be found on page

The Committee desire to draw attention to the greatly increased work of the Out-Patient Department. The number of cases has in spite of all efforts to keep the number down, steadily increased, and the necessity for providing additional consulting, operating and waiting rooms is becoming a serious consideration.

There was a decrease of £65 in the total ordinary income as compared with 1905, but there was on the other hand a satisfactory increase of £71 in Annual Subscriptions. This source of income the Committee greatly desire to see strengthened.

The amount received under Legacies was £2,602 5s. 5d. To the Executors who, in their discretion, allocated to the Hospital various sums, forming part of this

amount, the Committee offer their cordial thanks. A list of the Legacies will be found on page ^ . 535/

The best thanks of the Committee are due **Entertain-
ments.** to Miss Paton for kindly giving an Operetta of "Beauty and the Beast," at the Queen's Gate Hall, on 19th December, whereby she was able to present £53 to the funds of the Hospital. Also to the Great Western Railway and Paddington Borough Silver Prize Band; and to the Committee of Hitcham Working Men's Reading Room; for contributions of £44 11s. and £22 respectively, the proceeds of entertainments very kindly organized by them.

The Queen's Park Rangers Football and Athletic Club sent a donation of £14 17s. 10d. and, upon the nomination of that Club, a contribution of £9 10s. was also received from the Committee of the Southern Charity Football Cup Competition; for which amounts the Hospital Board return their best thanks.

The Committee tender their warm acknowledgments to the Rev. Francis Gurdon **Church
Offertories.** for his kind interest in the Hospital and for the valuable contribution of £128 11s., forwarded by him from the congregation and children of Christ Church, Lancaster Gate, being £97 12s. 1d. of the Christmas Day Collection, and £30 18s. 11d. Children's Offerings during the year for the "Christ Church" Cot. The total sum has been £4,322 2s. 3d.) received from collections at Christ Church, Lancaster Gate, since 1883. ^ t₂

The collection first instituted by Dr. Boyd Carpenter, for this Hospital in 1883, has since been repeated every Christmas, with the result mentioned, the amount, £4,223 11s. 3d., collected from 1883 to 1905 inclusive, having averaged £183 12s. The reduction in the amount received in 1906 is understood to be due to a division with another Hospital, whose claim on the congregation it was, on this occasion, difficult to ignore. The Committee also thank very heartily the Rev. H. P. Cronshaw, St. Stephen's Church, Westbourne Park; the Rev. Prebendary E. A. Stuart, St. Matthew's Church, Bayswater; the Rev. Marcus Rainsford, St. James's Church, Paddington; and others of the Clergy for offertories on behalf of this Institution.

The ordinary expenditure amounted to £4,340 —a decrease of £194 when compared with 1905, but the ordinary expenditure, the Committee regret to have to record, exceeded the ordinary income by £640. Every care has been taken to carry on the work of the Hospital economically, and in reducing the domestic expenditure the Committee have received valuable assistance on the part of Miss MacGregor, the Matron.

To meet the deficit a further sum of £400 was borrowed from the Bankers, raising the loan, which on 1st January, 1906, was £600, to £1,000 on 31st December.

As already stated, the Committee were fortunate in receiving £2,602 5s. 5d. from legacies, and were thus enabled to reinstate endowment funds which had been temporarily drawn upon, amounting to £1,208 for the following Cots, viz., the "George" Cot, the "Edith" Cot, the "Elsie" Cot, and the "Roper Maynard" Cot. A sum of £300 was also invested for the endowment of the "Marianne Frances Hasker" Cot. The remainder was utilised to meet the extraordinary expenditure, and £650 was transferred to supplement the income of the Convalescent Home. The Committee regret that the financial position of the Hospital prevented them from investing the legacies for the permanent endowment of the Hospital.

A picture-tile panel of "The Epiphany," has been kindly promised for the "Mary Adelaide" Ward, by Mr. and Mrs. G. H. Pollock. There now remain but four panels to be provided to complete the decoration of this ward. Particulars of the cost and designs of the panels can be obtained of the Secretary.

The Committee again thank the ladies who have been good enough to visit the Hospital regularly for the purpose of entertaining the patients; also the Rev. A. L. Lilley and the Clergy of St. Mary's, Paddington Green, for continuing the Children's Sunday afternoon Services in the wards; and the "Lady Visitors, Services, &c." "Paddington and Marylebone District-Nursing

Association," for valuable assistance rendered to a large number of patients at their own homes, subsequent to treatment at this Hospital.

The following members of the Committee retire by rotation, and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election, viz., Sir Henry Seton-Karr, C.M.G., Sir R. Melvill Beachcroft, and Mr. J. Balfour Allan.

The Committee express their sincere thanks to the members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff for their constant and skilful attention to the patients, and

for their advice and counsel in matters concerning the welfare of the Hospital. During the past year Dr. Alexander ~~X~~ Morison, owing to pressure of other engagements, resigned the position of Honorary Physician, an appointment he had held since 1896. His resignation is a cause of great regret to the Committee. Mr. J. Keogh Murphy resigned the post of Surgeon to the Throat and Ear Department, but the Hospital will continue to receive the advantage of his services as one of the Surgeons to Out-Patients. Mr. E. A. Peters has been elected Surgeon to the Throat and Ear Department, and Dr. E. D. Macnamara and Dr. Frederick Langmead have been appointed Physicians to Out-Patients. Other changes on the Staff are recorded on page [^] .

Gifts and Christmas Entertainment. H.R.H. the Princess of Wales again sent a basket of flowers for the wards—a gift of which the Committee are highly appreciative. The Committee have to thank the “London Needlework Guild” for again contributing, through the Hon. Elizabeth Edwardes and Mrs. Leonard Cohen, a large parcel of useful clothing for the patients; also Mrs. William Clark for a weekly gift of rabbits, which was continued for several months. They are also indebted to many other kind friends for useful and acceptable gifts of various kinds, a list of which will be found on page [^] .

The Committee especially thank Dr. H. E. Friend_x for again providing and exhibiting a lantern display for the In-Patients at Christmas ;

 also Miss Strudwick for floral decorations, Messrs. J. E. Spagnoletti for electrically illuminating the Christmas Tree, and (other numerous) friends for generously contributing to the expenses or forwarding gifts for the entertainment, which was in every way a success.

The Committee are gratified to be able to state **Ladies' Association.** that a Ladies' Association has been formed in connection with this Hospital, with the object of providing for the supply of children's garments, linen, blankets, &c., for the Hospital and Convalescent Home. Although formed so recently as May last the Association has made most satisfactory progress. An exhibition of the articles contributed to the Hospital was held in the Board-room of the Institution on 30th November. The parcels consisted of blankets, quilts, sheets, pillowcases, red jackets, nightgowns, pinafores, shoes, slippers, &c. There were, in all, 664 articles. It may not be generally known that upon the admission of a child to the Hospital wards, all the clothes in which it arrives are given back to its mother, and so long as the child remains an in-patient, it is clothed entirely at the expense of the Hospital: and this applies also to the Convalescent Home. It will therefore be readily understood that the gifts of the Association will prove a great boon to the suffering children, and will relieve the Hospital of considerable expenditure of funds. The Committee are very grateful for this valuable support, which they have no doubt will be further extended. Full particulars of the Association and its object will be found on page 20.

CONVALESCENT HOME.

Accommodation has been afforded in the Home for 16 Children in the winter and 24 in the summer months. 151 Children were transferred from the Hospital to the Home, making, with 15 in the Home on 1st January, a total of 166 cases for the year—an increase of 17 when compared with 1905. The very satisfactory and rapid progress made in restoring the health of convalescent children is gratifying testimony to the value of the Home. The average stay of the patients was 28 days.

The ordinary expenditure of the Home for the year was £775, and the extraordinary £257. The ordinary income, however, amounted to only £366, leaving a deficiency of £666 to be met out of the funds of the Hospital.

Miss Anderson having, as mentioned in the Report for 1905, resigned her position as Matron of the Home, was, on 30th April last, succeeded by Miss J. T. Archibald, for ~~two~~ ^{three} years one of the Hospital Nurses, and for over four years one of

the Nurses of the Home, who has since discharged her responsible duties to the entire satisfaction of the Committee.

Having accepted the appointment of Assistant Medical Officer to the City of Sheffield, Dr. Ralph P. Williams, much to the regret of the Committee, resigned his position as one of the Honorary Local Physicians to the Home. The Committee gratefully acknowledge the valuable services rendered to the Home by Dr. Williams, as also those of Dr. Weaver Adams and Mr. C. A. Wilson.

The regular weekly services for the patients have been kindly continued by the Rector of Slough, the Rev. H. P. Eliot, and his Clergy.

Upon several occasions, and greatly to their enjoyment, the children have been invited to tea and entertained at the houses of the following friends:—Rev. H. P. Eliot, Mrs. Harvey, Mrs. Tompson, and Mrs. Wardrop. Mrs. J. S. Dixon and Miss Joan Stanley sent contributions to provide toys and games at Christmas, and the cost of tuning the piano has been generously defrayed by the Rev. F. J. Browell. *(however)*

The Home is indebted to Messrs. Welford & Sons for the useful gift of a donkey, which has lately died, and to Mr. T. Henwood for a set of panniers.

The value of the work of the Convalescent Home cannot be over-estimated. By the removal of Patients from the Hospital Wards at a much

earlier period of convalescence than could be done if they were sent to their own homes, beds at the Hospital are released for the admission of acute cases, and the usefulness of the parent institution is proportionately increased. The Committee, therefore, again urge upon the friends of the Hospital the great need of more support for the Home, as the continued demands made upon the parent funds to meet the annual deficit is a serious drain upon the Hospital's resources. The Hospital itself is encumbered with a debt of £1,000 to the Bankers, and the Committee earnestly appeal for funds to enable them to pay off this debt.

EXTRACT FROM THE CONSTITUTION
OF THE HOSPITAL.

OBJECTS.

To afford Medical and Surgical Relief to the Children of the poor, under the age of 12 years for boys, and 14 for girls :

- a.* By admission to the Hospital.
- b.* Through the Out-patient Department.

To promote the advancement of Medical Science with reference to the diseases of childhood.

To diffuse among all classes of the community, and chiefly among the poor, a better acquaintance with the management of infants and children during health or sickness, and to assist in the education and training of women in the special duties of Children's Nurses.

The In and Out-patient Departments of the Hospital shall be entirely free, but patients shall be invited to contribute voluntarily to the funds so far as they are able.

GOVERNORS.

Every contributor of Two Guineas or more annually to the funds of the Hospital shall, so long as his subscription is continued, be constituted a Governor, and shall be entitled to one vote at the Annual or any Special Meeting, but a new Subscriber to the amount aforesaid shall not be so

entitled unless his subscription for the current year has been paid at least three calendar months before the day of the meeting.

Every donor of 20 Guineas, or more, at one time to the Hospital, and every collector of 50 Guineas, or more, at one time, and any one Executor, to be nominated in writing—if there is more than one all the Executors, or if there is no Executor who accepts the office, the Administrator of every Will—giving a legacy amounting to £100 or more (after deducting Legacy Duty, if any,) to the Hospital, shall be constituted a Life Governor, and shall have one vote at the Annual or any Special Meeting next succeeding the receipt of such donation or contribution, provided it has been paid not less than three calendar months before the day of the meeting, and at all subsequent meetings.

No Governor shall, under any circumstances, be entitled to more than one vote at any Meeting.

ANNUAL MEETING.

In the month of February in every year, or as soon after as may be, a General Meeting of the Governors and other Contributors to the funds of the Hospital shall be held, of which notice shall be given within one calendar month of the day of meeting, and at least a week previously to such Meeting, in two or more daily London Newspapers.

Five Governors. at any Annual Meeting, shall form a quorum.

Contributors who are not Governors shall be entitled to be present and take part in the proceedings at the Meeting, but not to vote.

At the Annual Meeting the Managing Committee shall submit a Report of the working of the

Hospital, together with an audited financial statement and balance sheet for the year ending the 31st December then last past.

At such Annual Meeting the Governors shall elect the Auditors for the current year, and three Members of the Managing Committee in place of those retiring.

SUBSCRIPTIONS.

The Annual Subscriptions shall be payable in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the quarter-day next preceding the Subscription, and no Subscriber in arrear shall be entitled to any privilege arising out of his or her Subscription until it has been paid.

NOMINATION AND FOUNDATION OF COTS.

Every Donor of £300 or more at one time, and every Subscriber of £30 or more annually (but in the latter case so long only as this Contribution is kept up), shall be entitled to have a Cot named according to such Donor's or Subscriber's pleasure during his or her life, and every Donor of £1,000, or more, at one time, and every Subscriber of £100, or more, annually, for a period of at least 10 years, shall be entitled to have a Cot named according to such Donor's or Subscriber's pleasure in perpetuity, but in every case subject to the approval of the Committee.

The Committee shall have power to accept any Donation or Bequest which may be made to the Hospital subject to any special restrictions, or for any special purposes annexed to the Gift by the Donor.

MANAGEMENT.

The General Management of the affairs of the Hospital shall, subject to the powers hereby conferred on the Governors, be vested in the Managing Committee.

COMMITTEE.


The Committee shall consist of not more than 25, nor less than 10 Members, of whom not more than 4 shall be representatives of the Medical and Surgical Staff.

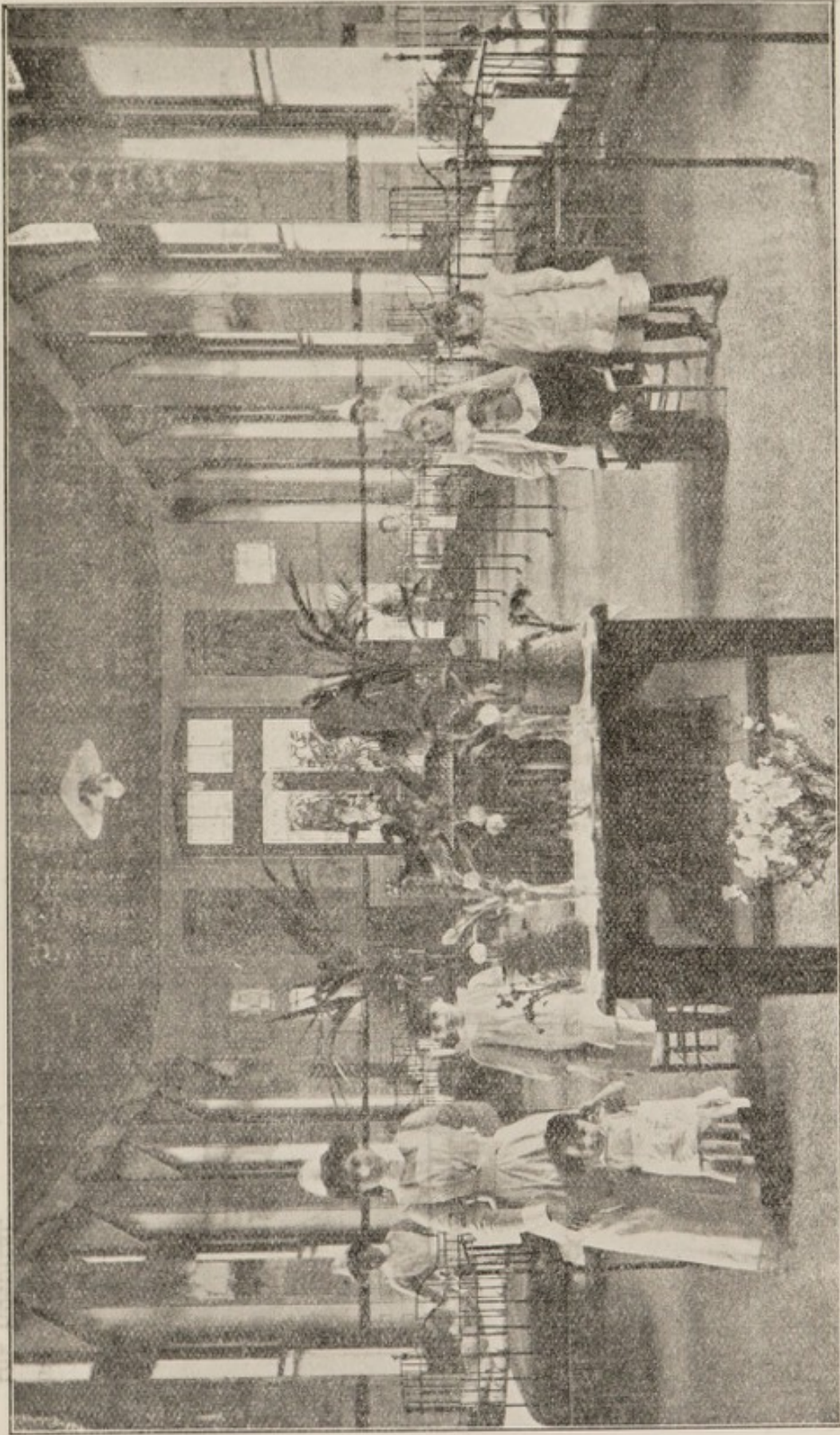

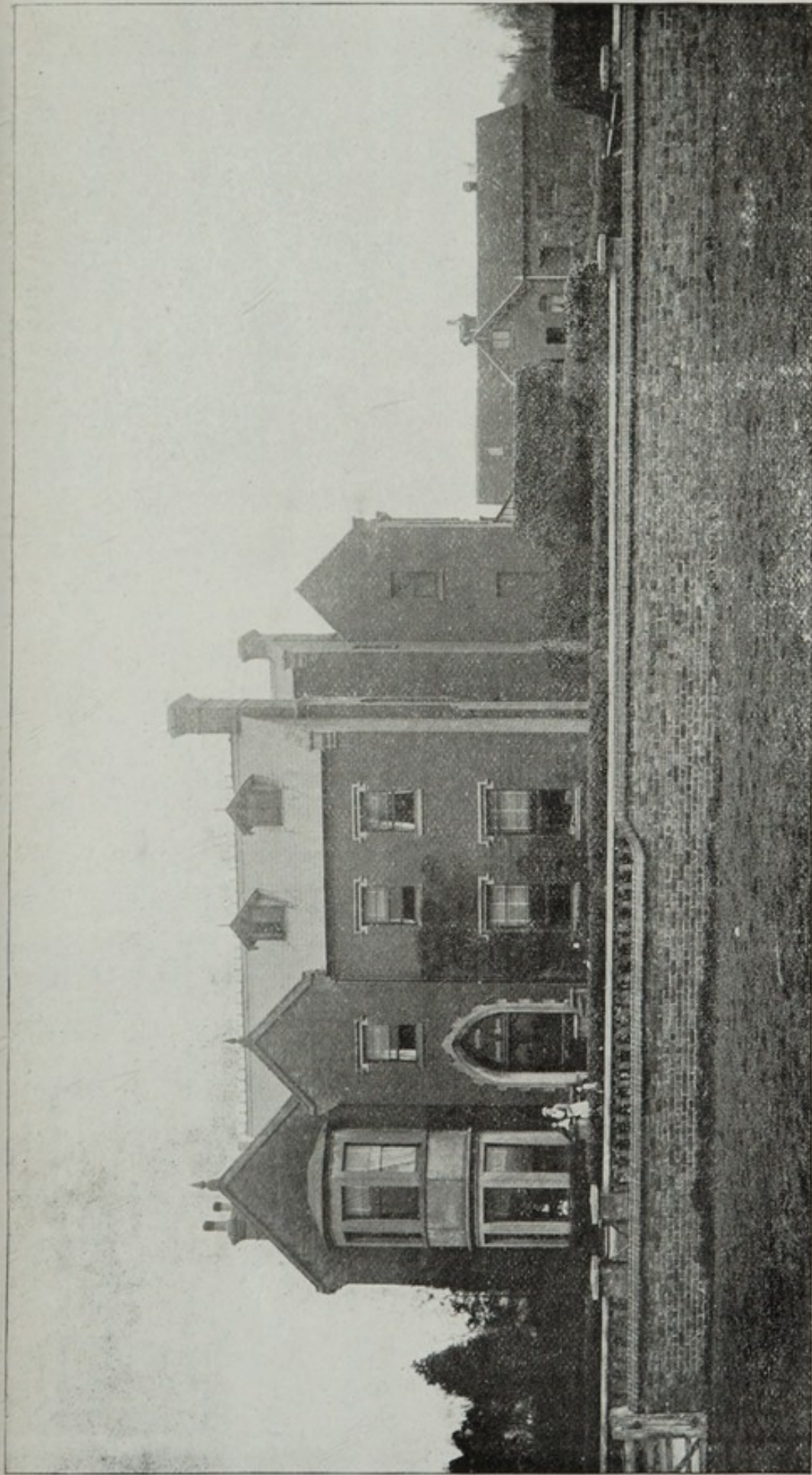

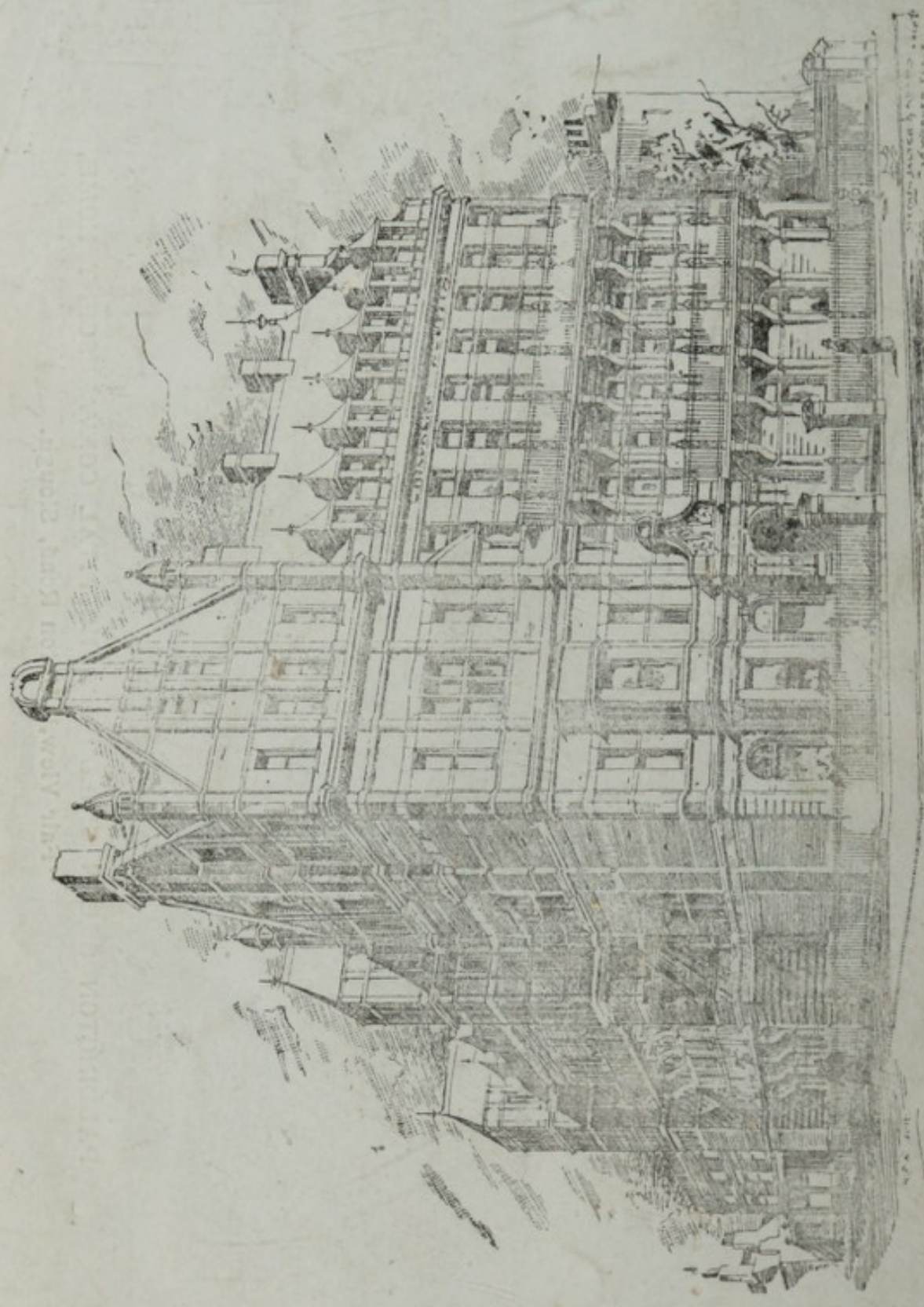
