REPORT OF SENIOR MEDICAL OFFICER

(T. HARTLEY MARTIN, M.B., Ch.B.)

TO THE CHAIRMAN OF THE MEDICAL BOARD

R. CRAIG DUN, Esq., F.R.C.S.

SIR,

I have the honour to report on the work of the Hospital during the twelve months ended December, 1930.

TUBERCULOUS CASES.

As illustrated by the state of health of the patients on discharge it is seen that 82.8% of all cases treated were discharged disease quiescent. This figure compares favourably with those of the past ten years which have varied from 78.5% to 86.8%.

199 cases in all were discharged during the twelve months January to December, 1930, but of this number 7 were considered not to be tuberculous after a period of observation. Of the remaining 192 cases—

159 were discharged "disease quiescent."

7 " " as "improved" (cases of Lupus).

5 " " as "unimproved."

1 case of T.B. Spine. Stay in hospital 94 days.

1 " T.B. Peritonitis " " 57 "

1 " Lupus " " 35 "

2 cases of T.B. Hip. " " 338 and 10 days
respectively.

4 cases of T.B. Spine.

5 " T.B. Hip.

3 " T.B. Osteitis.

1 case of T.B. Knee.

4 cases of T.B. Peritonitis, and the causes of death were:—

Generalised Tuberculosis.. .. 3 cases.

Tuberculous Meningitis 7 "

Pneumonia 1 case.

Diphtheria 2 cases.

Amyloid Disease 4 "

3 cases were transferred with Phthisis, and 1 was removed by the parents before completion of the treatment.

A more detailed analysis of the cases discharged classified according to disease groupings is given in table 1 in figures representing the numbers of cases discharged, the percentage of cases discharged quiescent, and the average duration of stay of such cases. These figures are compared with those of the years 1919 to 1929.

ARTIFICIAL LIGHT.

Tuberculous Adenitis (both without and with sinuses) still give satisfactory results and in cases of Tuberculous Peritonitis (other than those complicated by intestinal tuberculosis) good results are obtained.

The suggestion that Artificial Light hastens recalcification has not been borne out.

A full report dealing with the 280 cases treated has been submitted to the Board of Education.

RESEARCH.

The Research during the year has been carried out by Dr. McFarland on Calcium Metabolism; Dr. Wallace on Amyloid disease; and Dr. W. J. Poole on the Excretion of Tuberculous Bacilli from the kidney. A précis of these reports is appended.

AFTER-CARE.

1927—Of the 132 cases discharged, 112 or 84.8% have remained fit since leaving hospital. Of the total number discharged 130 or 98.5% are now fit. The casualties reported this year are 2 in number: 1 case of tuberculous glands and 1 case of Lupus.

1928—Of the 149 cases discharged quiescent 135 or 90.6% have remained fit since leaving the hospital, and 147 or 98.6% are now fit. The casualties this year are 2 in number: relapse in 2 cases of tuberculous glands in the neck.

1929—Of the 150 cases discharged disease quiescent 140 or 93.3% have remained quiescent since discharge and 148 or 98.7% are now fit. The casualties this year include 1 case of T.B. Hip, 5 cases of T.B. Glands, 2 cases of Lupus, 1 case of T.B. Osteitis, and 1 case of T.B. Peritonitis.

NON-TUBERCULOUS CASES.

The part that the Hospital plays as the Central Orthopædic Hospital in connection with the Orthopædic Schemes in the immediate area continues to develop. The clinics at Wallasey and Moreton, Birkenhead, Ellesmere Port, New Ferry, Hoylake, Runcorn and Stockton Heath continue to increase in size.

For all these clinics the orthopædic workshops of the hospital supply the necessary splints, appliances and boots.
