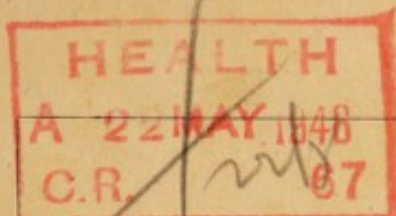

REPORT 1945

The Committee desire to draw attention to the interesting fact that this year the Hospital reaches its 80th year of service. From the modest beginning in October, 1866, to the present hospital which was opened in September, 1939, is an achievement in which all responsible for its development and support may feel justifiably proud.

Whatever changes may be introduced in the organisation of Hospital Service, the Committee trust that all past, present and future supporters will still regard this as "Our Hospital" and continue with ever increasing interest and support.

In presenting the accounts for the year 1945 the Committee offer the following observations. We are still in the period of steadily rising costs as the following examples will show:—

It will, therefore, be realised that increasing efforts will be needed if we are to maintain our past sound financial position. The Income and Expenditure account shows a slight excess of Income but it will be noted that without the legacies which we were fortunate to receive during the year, there would have been a deficit.

In spite of all difficulties the Linen League has had a very successful year and maintained its extremely valuable contribution. The Committee desire to express their gratitude to the organisers and their band of willing helpers.

The Oswestry and District Hospital Nursing Association continues to get good support and perform a much needed work. The Committee express gratitude to the organisers and all who contribute to make this possible.

The Committee extend sincere gratitude to all subscribers, Churches who send contributions, Hospital box holders, the "Oswestra" Whist Committee, the organisers of the Alexandra Rose and Hospital Flag Days, the Borough Magistrates for contributions from proceeds of Sunday opening of cinemas, the Hospital Savings Association, the Oswestry N.F.S. Social Club and all other donors for amounts received. Also for many gifts received.

The Committee desire to express their thanks to the Honorary Medical Practitioners for their generous services, to the Matron, Home Sister, Sisters and Nurses for the constant care and attention bestowed by them upon the patients. To members of the Voluntary Aid Detachments, some of whom still give such valuable help. To Miss M. M. Jones for her most efficient work in charge of the X-Ray Department. To other Staff who loyally fulfil their duties. To all kind friends and well-wishers who have bestowed gifts or gratuitous services concerning all collections, funds, efforts or work directly or indirectly in the interests of the Hospital.
