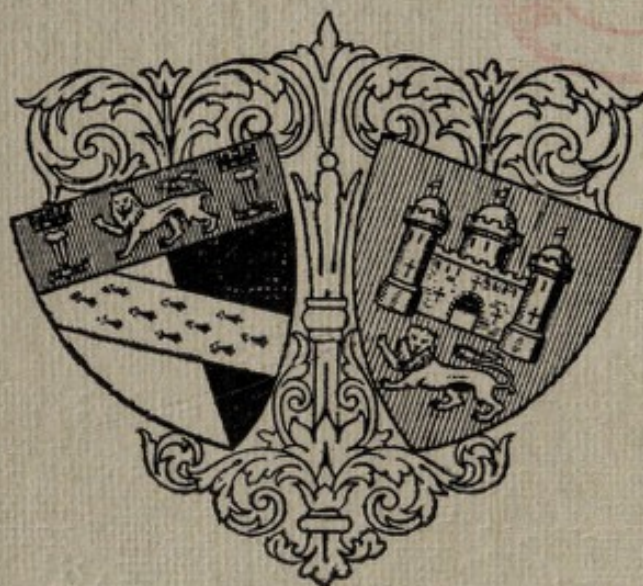

169th Annual Report *of the Board of Management*

The Board of Management submits to the Governors its Report for the year 1940.

It will be appreciated that the normal work of the Hospital has been greatly affected by War conditions and that no useful comparisons as to numbers of patients can be made with previous years. There has been available throughout the year 430 beds (including those in the Private Patients' Home), but approximately 125 of them have had to be kept vacant for possible air raid casualties. On occasions this number of vacant beds has been increased at the request of the Government with the result that out of the total of 430 beds, only 291 have been, on an average, in daily occupation. Fortunately, it has not been necessary to use many of these beds for air raid casualties, but military patients, evacuees and air-raid casualties numbering in total 847, were admitted under the Government's Emergency Medical Scheme. It will be realised that under these conditions it has been difficult to meet the needs of the ordinary Hospital patients and this has occasioned much anxiety to the Board throughout the year. It is therefore gratifying to report that the number of patients on the "waiting list" was not larger at the end of the year than at the end of 1939.

The various problems connected with Air Raid Precautions have presented much difficulty. The efficient darkening of the Hospital, the maintenance of adequate ventilation of the wards at night, the protection of patients and staff against air raids, and the provision of alternative supplies in the event of essential services being out of action, have all required much consideration and forethought.

In-patients and Out-patients. The total number of admissions for the year were 6,133 as against 6,840 in 1939, whilst the average length of stay of each patient was 17.06 days as compared with 18.07 days in the previous year. New Out-patients decreased from 25,770 in 1939 to 20,876 and the total attendances from 113,614 to 112,820.

Financial. The total income for 1938, the last completed year of peace, was £63,764. From the same sources in 1940 the income was £63,905. In 1938 our total expenditure was £68,841 and in 1940, £78,799. Fortunately this deficit has been made good by the payment by the Government towards the cost of the Casualty Service provided under the National Hospital Emergency Scheme.

High as the expenditure has been it would have been higher but for the postponement of many "repairs and renewals" which in ordinary times would have been made. To meet this expenditure, which will have to be incurred eventually, the Board has placed £5,000 to a special reserve account. Under the heading of Extraordinary expenditure £2,192 has been spent on the provision of new distribution mains for the electricity supply and, as foreshadowed in the last Annual Report, this has enabled the Hospital to take advantage of better terms offered by the Norwich Corporation for the supply of electricity, whereby a saving of £350 in consumption costs is shown during the year. Apart from this and re-wiring the electrical installation of the Leicester Nurses Home and King Edward Block, only essential repairs to buildings and a small amount of painting have been carried out.

The average cost of each in-patient per week was £4 6s. 7d., as compared with £3 9s. 2d. in the previous year. These figures do not reflect an accurate comparison owing to the large number of vacant beds, for which a full staff had to be maintained.

No fewer than seventeen Legacies were received in 1940, the total of £4,482 including bequests of £1,000 each from Sir Henry Holmes and Mr. Henry Page. £500 has been transferred to the Perpetual Endowment Fund and the balance of the account, £3,716, has been carried forward to next year.

Norfolk Hospitals Contributors Association.—The amounts received from the Association during the year equalled those of the past three years, namely, £37,300 to the Hospital, £1,300 to the Fletcher Convalescent Home, and £1,150 to the Eye Infirmary, making a total of £39,750. The fact that these grants have been maintained despite the many difficulties caused by the War is very gratifying and the Committee of the Association and its Officers are to be congratulated on the continued success of their efforts. It has been customary in this Report to give statistics of Contributory Scheme patients and their cost, but these would be so misleading in view of the abnormal conditions that it is considered advisable to omit them for the duration of the War.

Donations.—Receipts from this source are less than usual, but it is particularly gratifying to report a record amount from Fakenham and District Hospital Week, £278 5s. 9d. Amounts

received through the Life Governors' Association are referred to in a later paragraph and other large contributions include gifts of £100 each from Mr. E. C. Keith and an anonymous lady.

Entertainments.—Very few Entertainments were organised for the benefit of the Hospital funds and of £318 received under this heading, £170 came from the "Eastern Evening News" Darts Tournaments. The men's section raised £105 and the women's section, £65.

Alexandra Day.—A record in the receipts from Alexandra Day was achieved during the year and the sum of £570 allocated to this Hospital was £110 more than in 1939. The Board congratulates the Lady Mayoress (Mrs. Hunt) and the Honorary Secretaries, Mrs. Andrews and Mrs. Eric Hinde, on this record success.

Nursing.—The percentage of successes in the Final State Examinations has been excellent for the year. A large number of candidates have come forward for training and the Preliminary Training School is well booked up for the coming months.

An informal Prize Giving was held, when the medals and prizes were presented to the successful candidates by the Chairman of the Nursing Committee.

The number of candidates for the Civil Nursing Reserve who have completed their 50 hours training to date is 340.

Hospital Orderlies attached to Field Ambulances of the R.A.M.C. are now being trained in relays of six at a time for a period of three weeks.

The Private Nursing Staff is now administered from the Assistant Matron's Office at the Hospital instead of at 80, St. Stephen's Road. This new arrangement has proved quite satisfactory.

Private Patients Department.—This is almost the only Department of the Hospital which has not been affected to any great extent by War conditions. The number of patients admitted was 593, as compared with 552 in the previous year, of which 294 and 321 respectively were members of the Insurance Scheme. The membership of this Scheme has decreased during the year, there being about 4,050 subscribers at the end of the year as compared with 4,210 at December, 1939.

Honorary Medical Staff.—It is with great regret that the Board has to record the death of Dr. J. S. Levack the Honorary Radiologist to the Hospital. Dr. Levack had been associated with the X-Ray Department for over seventeen years and had rendered very valuable service. In accordance with a decision made some time ago to make no permanent appointments to the Honorary Medical Staff during the War, temporary arrangements have been made to carry on the work of the department.

Dr. Morgan, who was stated in the last Report to be away on active service, returned towards the end of the year, and subsequently Dr. Latter left for service in the Royal Air Force. In addition to Mr. Highmoor and Dr. Maingay, who are still away on active service, Dr. A. G. Smith, the Honorary Dermatologist, and Dr. Rogerson, a temporary Honorary Anæsthetist, are now serving with His Majesty's forces.

Radium Department.—The arrangement recorded in the last Report, by which the radium is stored when not in use in a borehole 50 feet deep, has been continued during the year and has enabled the necessary treatments to be carried out. To the regret of the Board, Mrs. Thackwell has resigned her appointment as Radium Officer, a position in which she had rendered very valuable service since the Hospital was made a Regional Radium Centre in 1932. The Board does not propose to fill the vacancy caused by Mrs. Thackwell's resignation at the present time.

Blood Transfusion Service.—At the request of the Ministry of Health, special efforts have been made during the year to augment the number of donors and as a result these increased from 650 to nearly 2,000 by the end of the year. Hundreds of transfusions have been carried out and a large quantity of blood and plasma are now always available in case of a sudden emergency. The organisation of this Service, which is of such vital importance to the National effort, is continued by the British Red Cross Society, the Rover Scouts, and Toc H, with the help of the Women's Voluntary Service organisation. The Board is grateful to the medical and nursing staffs for undertaking this additional work. It is hoped to develop this Service still further and more volunteers as donors will be welcomed.

Linen Guild. Despite difficulties occasioned by the War and the counter claim of many similar efforts in connection with the Services, the Linen Guild has continued its very valuable assistance. The number of articles provided is necessarily much smaller than usual, but £172 (which is only £10 less than in 1939) was collected for the purchase of linen.

Patients' Library. The patients, particularly the service ones, much appreciate the issue of books which has continued to be undertaken by the British Red Cross Society.

Life Governors Service Association.—The organisation of Natural Rose Day was again undertaken by the members of the Life Governors Association and, as with Alexandra Rose Day, a record success was achieved this year. To this Hospital the sum of £435 was allocated, an increase of £135 on the amount received in 1939. Messrs. Ernest Morse & Son again generously provided the roses and to them and the collectors and helpers the Board is extremely grateful.

Although it was not found possible to arrange a series of Championship Whist Drives throughout the County on the same large scale as in 1939, an effort was made to continue the organisation in a much smaller way. As a result the Association were able to hand over £165 to the funds of the Hospital.

The reduction in the number of visitors to patients in the Hospital is reflected in the total sum collected by lady members of the Association, £300, which is about £150 less than that realised in a normal year.

Gifts in Kind.—Mr. F. B. Seago is to be congratulated on again organising the Egg Week Collection, despite the difficulties caused by the War. The number of eggs received this year was 128,497 as compared with 221,946 in 1939. Of this year's total this Hospital retained 84,541 and the balance was distributed amongst other charitable institutions in the County and City.

Many gifts of fruit and vegetables were received from Harvest Thanksgiving Services and the Norwich Junior Chamber of Commerce provided sufficient turkeys for the Christmas dinners of both patients and Staff.

The public are reminded that gifts of vegetables and fruit are always welcome, particularly in these times, when it is not always possible to purchase even adequate supplies.

Maintenance of the " Mina Charles " Bed.—The Board is pleased to report that a bed is now being maintained and will continue to be so for the duration of the War, from the Interest on a sum of £2,000 which Colonel S. F. Charles and Mr. L. B. Charles had set aside for the maintenance of a bed in the Coltishall Nursing Home. As this Home is now closed for the duration of the War, it is the wish of the donors that the yearly income from this Fund is to be paid to this Hospital for the maintenance of a bed to be named " the Mina Charles Bed." It is agreed that this bed should be used primarily for members of the Mothers' Unions at Wroxham, Salhouse, or Crostwick, but that if not required for such purposes it can be used for the ordinary needs of the Hospital. The Board is grateful to Colonel Charles and Mr. Charles for their kind thought for the Hospital.

Conclusion.—The Board has endeavoured in this Report to give to the Governors a brief summary of the work of the Hospital for the first completed year of the War. It will be realised that with the constant changes in the national situation, it has been far from an easy year for the staff, but the Board is glad to record its thanks to all engaged in the Hospital service for the way in which they have overcome the many difficulties that have arisen and have adapted themselves to meet the demands of the national emergency. The Board would especially commend the plans drawn up by the Honorary Medical Staff for dealing with air raid casualties. In carrying them into effect the co-operation of the nursing, clerical, and domestic staffs, both male and female, has been essential and has been most efficiently given. The demands made on the services of the Hospital by the authorities to meet the exigencies of the war, have been many and varied and it is gratifying to feel that those services designed for the requirements of peace have been so readily adapted to the needs of the national emergency.

Not the least of these services is the provision for training large numbers of nursing auxiliaries and the giving of practical experience in first aid and minor surgical treatment to orderlies of R.A.M.C. Units stationed in the district. In addition, medical students from some of the large London Hospitals, seriously damaged by enemy action, have continued their clinical studies here and have been given instruction and lectures by members of the Staff.

It is gratifying that, despite the loss of many of the usual sources of income and the abnormal rise in the costs of all commodities, the financial position has not suffered as the result of the year's working. At the same time it must be borne in mind that considerable expenditure must be incurred when conditions permit, in order to bring the Hospital to the state of efficiency which existed before the War. The Board therefore appeals to the public for all possible support for the Hospital in these difficult and anxious times.

The number of patients admitted to the General Wards in 1940 was 5,540, as compared with 6,330 in the previous year, a decrease of 790. Included in the number of admissions are military patients, evacuees and air-raid casualties, totalling 847, etc., for all of whom the Government have made a payment towards the cost of their maintenance, but the amounts received are not included in the financial returns of the Department. Under this Emergency Medical Scheme of the Ministry of Health 292 of these patients were transferred to hospitals in other parts of the country, 69 to the Fletcher Convalescent Home at Cromer and 132 (all soldiers) to Woodbastwick Hall Auxiliary Hospital.

In the Out-patient Department the number of new patients interviewed was 18,364 as compared with 17,341 in 1939, the number of Emergency Medical Scheme patients included in these figures for the two years being 2,028 and 254 respectively.

The proportion of Contributory Scheme patients has decreased from 77.2 per cent. to 64.0 per cent. for the In-patients and from 85.7 per cent. to 78.5 per cent. for Out-patients. This, of course, is due to the abnormal conditions caused by the War and the large number of Emergency Medical Service cases in both In- and Out-patient Departments.

Although the large decrease in the number of ordinary patients has limited the usual social service and other activities of the Department, this has been made up by the additional work entailed by the treatment of so many Emergency Medical Service patients. Not only is the compilation of records of patients treated under this Government Scheme undertaken by the Department, but it has been found that many of them and their relatives need assistance in directing them to Organizations which have been established to deal with distress occasioned by the War.

The members of the Rotary Club of Norwich have continued their valuable assistance in the transport of patients and to them and to many other organizations the thanks of the Almoning Committee are due.

The number of road accident cases admitted was about the average of the past few years, namely, 200, but the amount paid by the Insurance Companies was less than in 1939, namely, £693 as compared with £812. For 292 Out-patients treated, these Companies paid £183 as compared with £295 in the previous year. The decrease in the receipts is due to the fact that the treatment of military patients injured as the result of road accidents is not paid for under the Road Traffic Act.

FORM OF LEGACY TO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE HOSPITAL.

I bequeath to the Treasurer for the time being of the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital the sum of.....pounds, free of duty, to be applied to the general purposes of the said Hospital, and I declare that the receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of the said Hospital shall be a sufficient discharge for the same.

FORM OF LEGACY TO LEICESTER PERPETUAL ENDOWMENT FUND.

I bequeath to the Treasurer for the time being of the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital the sum of.....pounds, free of all duty, to be held by him upon the same trust as and in augmentation of the Leicester Perpetual Endowment Fund, and I declare that the receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of the said Hospital shall be a sufficient discharge for the same.

Extracts from the Laws relating to Governors and Board of Management.

QUALIFICATION OF GOVERNORS.

Law III.—The qualifications of Governors are as follows:—

LIFE GOVERNORS.

(1) Every person who shall contribute not less than fifty guineas at one time or during one year shall be a Governor of the Hospital for life, or may nominate some other person to be a Governor for life.

(2) Any Firm, Body Corporate, Society, Club, or Association, which shall contribute not less than one hundred guineas at one time, or during two consecutive years shall complete the subscription of an aggregate like sum, may, at the time of contribution or completion thereof, nominate an individual member of such Firm, Body Corporate, Society, Club, or Association, to be a Governor for life.

(3) Any Society, Club, or Association, which shall contribute in any one year not less than one hundred and fifty guineas apart from payments which carry Contributory Scheme benefits to the Norfolk Hospitals Contributors' Association, may nominate a representative of such Society, Club, or Association to be a Governor for life, provided that not less than seventy per cent. of the cost to the Hospital of the maintenance of patients who are members of the Norfolk Hospitals Contributors' Association be given to the Hospital in the year in question.

(4) Any Parish or Workpeoples' Contributory Fund paying not less than one hundred and fifty guineas in any one year to the Norfolk Hospitals Contributors' Association, may nominate a representative to be a Governor for life for each one hundred and fifty guineas so contributed, provided that not less than seventy per cent. of the cost to the Hospital of the maintenance of patients who are members of the Norfolk Hospitals

Contributors' Association be given to the Hospital in the year in question.

The number of Life Governors representing any Contributory Fund under this qualification shall not exceed five at any one time, this number to include any Governors for twenty years nominated under the qualification in Section 8.

(5) A Testator who shall bequeath a sum of not less than £500 may by his Will nominate some person to be a Governor for life. In the absence of any such nomination the executor or executors may, with the approval of the Board of Management, nominate some person as a Governor for life.

GOVERNORS FOR THE PERIOD OF TWENTY YEARS.

(Alternative to Sections 2, 3, and 4 of this Law.)

(6) Any Firm, Body Corporate, Society, Club, or Association which shall contribute not less than one hundred guineas at one time or during two consecutive years shall complete the subscription of an aggregate like sum, may, at the time of contribution or completion thereof, nominate the holder of a particular office in such Firm, Body Corporate, Society, Club, or Association, while he continues to hold such office, and his successors for the time being in such office, as Governor for the period of twenty years from the date when the said aggregate like sum shall have been subscribed or completed.

(7) Any Society, Club, or Association which shall contribute in any one year not less than one hundred and fifty guineas apart from payments which carry Contributory Scheme benefits to the Norfolk Hospitals Contributors' Association may nominate the holder of a particular office in such Society, Club, or Association, while he continues to hold such office, and his successors for the time being

in such office, as Governor for the period of twenty years, from the date when such sum shall have been subscribed, provided that not less than seventy per cent. of the cost to the Hospital of the maintenance of patients who are members of the Norfolk Hospitals Contributors' Association be given to the Hospital in the year in question.

(8) Any Parish or Workpeoples' Contributory Fund contributing not less than one hundred and fifty guineas in any one year to the Norfolk Hospitals Contributors' Association may nominate, for each one hundred and fifty guineas, contributed up to seven hundred and fifty guineas, the holder of a particular office in such parish or Workpeoples' Contributory Fund, while he continues to hold such office, and his successors for the time being in such office, as Governor for the period of twenty years from the date when such sum shall have been subscribed, provided that not less than seventy per cent. of the cost to the Hospital of the maintenance of patients who are members of the Norfolk Hospitals Contributors' Association be given to the Hospital in the year in question. The number of Governors representing any contributory Fund under this qualification shall not exceed five at any one time, this number to include any Life Governors nominated under the qualifications in Section 4.

ANNUAL GOVERNORS.

*(9) Every person who shall annually subscribe four guineas or upwards shall be a Governor of the Hospital during payment. Subscriptions are due on the 1st January in each year.

*(10) Any Firm, or Body Corporate, or any Parish, whether by Church Collections or otherwise, which shall contribute eight guineas or upwards, may nominate in writing a person as Governor who shall during one year after payment have the same rights and privileges as an individual subscriber of four guineas.

(11) Any Parish or Workpeoples' Contributory Fund contributing £50 or more in any one year to the Contributory Scheme of the Norfolk Hos-

pitals Contributors' Association shall be entitled to nominate for the ensuing year one Governor for each £50 so contributed. In the case of Contributory Funds contributing one hundred and fifty guineas or more in any one year, this privilege of nominating Annual Governors shall be considered as an alternative to the privilege given in Section (4)

(12) Any Society, Club, or Association, or any Parish by Church Collection or other means apart from the Contributory Scheme, which shall contribute £50 or upwards in any one year to the Norfolk Hospitals Contributors' Association, shall be entitled to nominate one Governor for the ensuing year.

(13) The Committee of the Norfolk Hospitals Contributors' Association shall be entitled to nominate twelve Annual Governors.

(14) The members of the Honorary Medical Staff of the Hospital shall be Governors, and shall be entitled respectively to the same rights and privileges as Subscribers of Four Guineas per annum.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.

XIV.—The ordinary business of the Hospital shall be transacted by the Board of Management, which shall be thus constituted:—

(1) The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Trustees, shall be Members ex-officio.

(2) Eighteen Governors (not being Honorary Medical Officers of the Hospital) shall be elected, six at the Annual General Board in each year, three of the six being resident in the County of Norfolk, and the other three in the City of Norwich. At the same time the three County Members and the three City Members of the Board who have been longest in office shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election. No Member, however, who has served for two consecutive terms of three years shall be eligible for re-election for one year, with the exception that two of the retiring members may be co-opted by the Board of Management in accordance with Law XVII. Any elected Member of the Board of Management who has

failed to attend at least one-half of the meetings of the Board during the preceding twelve months, unless prevented by sickness or any other unavoidable circumstances allowed by the Board, shall be ineligible for re-election.

(3) Three representatives of the Norfolk Hospitals Contributors' Association who shall be elected upon the nomination of the Committee of that Association at the Annual General Board in each year.

(4) The County Director for Norfolk of the British Red Cross Society and the Order of St. John of Jerusalem in England for the time being.

(5) The Chairman for the time being of the Committee of Management of the Jenny Lind Hospital for Children.

(6) Two representatives of the Norwich Corporation and two representatives of the Norfolk County Council.

(7) The Honorary Medical Staff shall be Members ex-officio, with all the privileges of such Membership except the power to vote. The Honorary Medical Staff shall annually nominate four of their number, who shall have the power to vote.

XV.—The vacancies occurring amongst the elected Members of the Board of Management shall be filled as follows :—

(1) Any Governor intending to nominate a Member or Members of the Board of Management shall send to the Secretary before twelve o'clock

noon on the second Saturday in March the name of each Governor whom he nominates. The Secretary shall forthwith write to each Governor so nominated, requesting to know whether, in the event of election, such Governor would be willing to serve.

(2) A list of all the Governors nominated shall be affixed by the Secretary in a conspicuous place in the Board Room, and the names of such as consent to act, as well as of those who retire, shall be inserted in the advertisement convening the Annual General Board.

(3) If a sufficient number of Governors to fill up the vacancies occurring by rotation or otherwise shall not so consent, the Board of Management shall nominate a sufficient number to make up the full complement of the Board.

(4) If the number of nominations exceed the number of vacancies, an election shall be conducted by a Committee of not less than three Governors chosen by the Board of Management to act as Scrutineers. A Governor wishing to vote at such an election must send to the Scrutineers, on the form supplied with the Annual Report, a list signed by him of the names of the persons whom he wishes to select from those so nominated and consenting to act, not exceeding the number of vacancies. These voting papers must reach the Scrutineers not later than seven o'clock on the evening preceding the Annual General Board.

(5) The declaration of the Poll shall be made by the Chairman at the Annual General Board.

*All Subscribers of two guineas and upwards prior to 1st January, 1921, who have maintained their subscriptions, are Governors.

Private Patients' Department.

This Private Patients' Department

of the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital has been instituted in order to provide those whose incomes fall within certain limits with treatment which they could otherwise only procure at considerable expense in a private Nursing Home or by admission to the General Wards of the Hospital. (Admission to the General Wards is now limited to persons whose incomes do not exceed £300 per annum.)

For many years the need for this provision has been obvious and the demand for it increasing.

For thirty-five shillings a year, paid yearly, or thirty-six shillings if paid half-yearly, or quarterly in advance, "Hospital treatment," including physicians' and surgeons' fees and certain special Out-patient treatment, can now be obtained for persons whose incomes fall within the following limits:—

Class (a) Single persons under £350 per annum.

(b) Married couples without children under 16, £450 per annum.

(c) Widows and widowers with a child or children under 16, £450 per annum.

(d) Married couples with a child or children under 16, £550 per annum.

Each member will be entitled to this free "Hospital treatment" for himself, his wife and children under the age of 16 years, six months after the payment of his first premium.

No applicant over 60 years of age can be accepted as a new member of the scheme.

The Private Home

is in Brunswick Road, and consists of thirty-three separate rooms.

Visitors are allowed daily, between the hours of 3 and 4 p.m., subject to the consent of the Medical Officer in charge.

Patients are under the care of a member of the Visiting Medical Staff of the Hospital and no patient can be admitted as an In- or Out-Patient without a preliminary consultation between a member of the Visiting Medical Staff and the patient's own doctor. The fee for this consultation is not covered by the member's premium.

The premium covers all medical, surgical, nursing and maintenance costs, whilst the patient is in the Home, but does not cover the cost of any special appliances, drugs or instruments which may be ordered for treatment after discharge from the Home.

No patient shall remain as an In-patient for more than four consecutive weeks, except with the permission of the Committee of Management and by payment of a charge for maintenance.

Maternity, Mental, or Infectious cases cannot be admitted.

Applications for membership cannot be considered if the applicants or their dependents require immediate treatment.

Whilst every effort is made to reserve accommodation in the Home for members of the Insurance Scheme, in the event of a member requiring immediate admission and the Home being full, the patient will be admitted to one of the general wards in the Hospital and transferred to the Private Home as soon as a room becomes vacant—usually within two or three days.

The Special Out-patient Treatment

referred to consists of: X-ray Examinations if recommended by a member of the Visiting Medical Staff. (A preliminary consultation with a member of the Visiting Medical Staff is necessary for both In- and Out-patients.)

X-ray Treatments limited to six, with an interval of at least six months before another course of six treatments can be provided. Should more than six continuous treatments be necessary, arrangements can be made for the same to be provided by an additional payment. The treatment of Ringworm by X-ray is not undertaken.

Massage, Electrical and Light Treatments limited to eighteen, with the same conditions as to an interval of six months and payment for additional treatments as for X-ray Treatments.

Pathological Examinations, if recommended by a member of the Visiting Medical Staff.

Pathological Treatment as a continuation of In-patient Treatment only.

No ordinary drug treatment, Venereal Disease or Dental Treatment is given.

The Private Patients' Department

is managed on behalf of the Board of Management by a Committee on which members of the Insurance Scheme are represented, and the decision of the Board of Management on any question relating to the admission or care of patients shall be accepted as final.

The Board of Management reserve the right to refuse any application, for membership of the Insurance Scheme, to cancel any existing membership, or to revise the conditions under which members have joined.

Admission to the Private Patients Home of Non-Members of the Insurance Scheme

So far as accommodation will permit, patients who have not adopted the Insurance Scheme will be received in the Home as In-patients, following a Consultation with a member of the Honorary Medical Staff, at a charge of £4 14s. 6d. per week, and an additional charge for medical attendance which will not exceed fifteen guineas.

The income of patients admitted under this arrangement must come within the limits laid down under the Insurance Scheme

Admission of Patients.

IN-PATIENTS. **Urgent Cases and Accidents** can be admitted at any time of the day or night. Owing to the great demand on the accommodation much trouble and expense may be avoided by making enquiry by telephone as to whether there is a bed available before sending a patient to Hospital.

The admission of cases which are not urgent, but which are not well enough to attend in the first instance as Out-patients, should be arranged either with a member of the Visiting Staff or through the Secretary's Office. No patient can be admitted without being seen by a member of the Visiting or Resident Staff.

OUT-PATIENTS. The Out-Patient Department is intended only for cases requiring Specialist opinion and special treatment. All patients must bring with them a letter from their doctor giving details of their case. The Out-patient Department is open as follows —

X-ray examinations are only carried out for the purpose of diagnosis or treatment and cannot be made for litigation or compensation purposes.

The X-ray Department is open from 9.30 a.m. to 5 p.m. (Sundays and Bank Holidays excepted).

All cases of accident not requiring immediate admission, in which an X-ray examination may be necessary, should reach the Hospital before 1 p.m., otherwise there is a difficulty in dealing with them on the same day.

*Children should attend Jenny Lind Hospital, Ear, Nose and Throat Department, Wednesdays, 10 a.m.

PATHOLOGICAL examinations are only made for patients already under treatment by a member of the Visiting Staff.

DENTAL treatment is given only to those patients who are already under the care of a Physician or Surgeon for other complaints. Patients needing Dental treatment only cannot receive it at the Hospital.

48th Report *of the Committee of Management* TO THE *Annual General Board of Governors.*

THE Committee submits to the Governors its Report for the year 1940.

There has been a further great reduction in the number of patients admitted, due of course to war conditions. The number 544 is 291 less than in 1939 and is only approximately half the number admitted during the last normal year. The average number of beds occupied, however, has not decreased in the same proportion, and the average length of stay of each patient has increased, which is evidence of the tendency to transfer patients from the Hospital in a much earlier stage of convalescence than formerly.

Of the children,

73 were admitted from the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital.
79 were admitted from the Jenny Lind Hospital, and
12 were admitted through the Norfolk Hospital Contributors' Association.

The average number of beds occupied was 34.1 (47.1 in 1939), and the average length of stay was 22.1 days as compared with 17.8 in the previous year.

Included amongst the admissions were 73 patients who were treated under the Government's Emergency Hospital Scheme. Most of these were soldiers, but Air-Raid Casualties from the Hospital and Evacuees were also included.

There were no less than 139 " Ambulance " cases compared with 66 in the previous year and many of these were in bed for their whole

stay, often as long as six weeks. Not only has the men's shelter been used for these patients, but one of the women's dormitories has also been utilised in this way. This has necessitated an increase in the Nursing Staff by the appointment of two nurses on night duty.

The Rest Room has again proved useful for the accommodation of the Hospital Nursing Staff, 29 Sisters and Nurses utilising this room for a total period of 160 days.

The difficulty in obtaining goods has reduced the "turn-over" of the Canteen. From the receipts, £14 has been spent on equipment for the patients' pantry and the upkeep of the Wireless Installation and there is a balance of £26 in hand at the end of the year. The Committee is greatly indebted to Miss Alexander for her continued organisation of the Canteen.

The total income of the Home was £4,011 as compared with £3,257 in the previous year, the increase being due to the payment of £1,552 (as against £448 in 1939) by the Ministry of Health for the maintenance of Emergency Service patients and for the reservation of vacant beds for casualties. The total expenditure was £3,315 as compared with £3,529 in 1939, so that for the first time for several years there was a surplus of income over expenditure. This surplus amounting to £696 is being carried forward. The average cost per patient per week has increased from £1 8s. 0d. to £1 15s. 7d., this increase being due to the abnormal War conditions, as well as the lesser number of beds occupied.

Dr. Vaughan has continued his invaluable supervision of the patients by visiting the Home almost daily throughout the year.

Weekly services, which have been much appreciated, have been held by the Rev. G. A. Barclay and the Rev. D. C. H. Mitchell.

The Committee is gratified that the Home continues to be of such assistance to the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital. In these difficult times it is often necessary for beds in the Hospital to be cleared at short notice, and as has been emphasised in a previous paragraph, many patients have been taken in a much earlier stage of convalescence than would have been possible a few years ago. In practically every case the patients have improved considerably by their stay at Cromer.

Report of the Committee for the Year 1940.

THE statistics of the patients admitted are almost identical with those of 1939, when it was reported that, on account of the War, there had been a marked decrease in ophthalmic work. The total admissions were 244, as compared with 243; the average number of beds occupied was the same, 15, and the average length of stay, 22.6 days, as against 22.7 days in 1939.

Further decreases are shown in the figures for the Out-patient Department. New Out-patients totalled 1,498 as compared with 1805 and the attendances were 5,306 as compared with 6,259.

The total ordinary income was £1,704, only £16 less than in 1939, but expenditure, on account of the greatly increased cost of all commodities, rose from £3,063 to £3,590.

A legacy of £20 was received from Mr. William Ernest Fox, of Aylsham.

The excess of expenditure over total income was £1,865 and this balance has, as usual, been transferred to the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital General Account.
