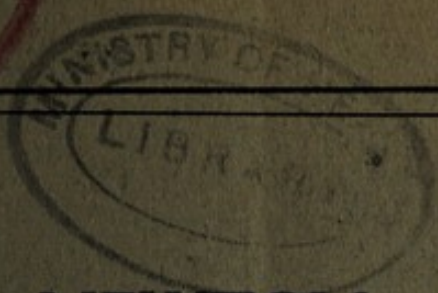

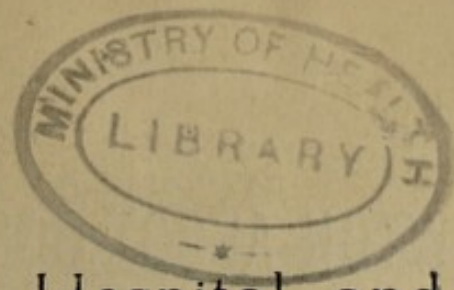

NEWTON ABBOT HOSPITAL AND DISPENSARY.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE.

*Presented to the Annual General Meeting of Subscribers
30th January, 1930.*

YOUR Committee beg to report that the In-Patients treated in the Semi-Private Wards and the General Wards of the Hospital during the year 1929 numbered : Semi-Private cases, 54 ; General Ward cases, 631, which, with 126 Renewals, make a total of 811. In the operating theatre 423 operations were performed.

The average stay of patients received in the Hospital during the year has been for the Private Patients 10 days, Semi-Private Patients 17 days, and General Ward Patients 14 days. The average for the whole number of patients is 14 days' stay.

The average daily number of Patients has been : Private Patients, 2.8 ; Semi-Private, 2.6 ; Male Ward, 12 ; Female, 9 ; Children, 4. Total, 30.3.

It is gratifying to your Committee to be able to state that the Patients have expressed themselves as entirely satisfied with their treatment and their food whilst in the Hospital.

The Out-Patients numbered 685, with 4,507 attendances ; the Massage Patients, 68, with 507 attendances ; the Diathermy Patients, 51, with 336 attendances ; and the Ultra-Violet Ray Patients, 52, with 660 attendances.

The cases treated by Radium numbered 105.

In the Ophthalmic Department there were 182 new cases and 531 attendances, being an increase of 30 new patients and 92 attendances on the previous year. An Ophthalmic Session is now held weekly on Wednesdays instead of once a fortnight.

The Dental Surgeons paid 60 visits, saw 200 Patients, and did 900 extractions.

In the Private Wards 101 cases were treated, and the receipts amounted to £777 17s. 6d.

In the X-Ray Department 703 examinations were made, whilst the treatment cases numbered 42 with 120 attendances. A perusal of the report of the Radiological Surgeon will afford evidence that notwithstanding the great improvement which has resulted from the new X-Ray Installation, further developments are earnestly desired.

Most hearty thanks are due to the Medical Officers, the Radiological Surgeon, the Ophthalmic Surgeon, and the Dental Surgeons for the large amount of work they have done and the highly satisfactory results of their treatment of the Patients; to the Matron and Nursing Staff for their careful attention to the cases under their charge; and to the Honorary Masseuses for their good work. We desire to emphasise that in addition to their services to Patients in the Hospital the Medical Officers devote valuable time to delivering courses of lectures to the Probationer Nurses, thus greatly assisting in the efficiency of their training.

The income for the year amounted to £5,413 5s. 5d. The expenditure totalled £4,601 13s. od., leaving a balance on 31st December of £811 13s. 5d.

During the year a Legacy of £143 6s. 3d. was received from the estate of the late Mr. Ephraim Yeo. Also the final balance from residue of the estate of the late Miss L. D. W. Whidborne, amounting to £171 os. 7d. It is with sincere thanks and gratitude we report a donation of £2,500 from the estate of the late Mrs. Fisher, made by Mr. G. R. Thompson, who apportioned £1,250 for the endowment of a bed in the Female Ward, and the remaining £1,250 for the purchase of Radium.

These enabled the purchase as additions to the endowment funds of the Hospital of £463 18s. od. India 4½ per cent. Stock 1958-60, and £1,611 4s. 7d. of India 4½ per cent. Stock 1950-58.

Hospital Investments, with the above mentioned added, are the same as at the end of 1929, and the whole stand in the names of the same Trustees.

The stock of Radium in the possession of the Hospital has in the course of the year been increased at a cost of £974 10s. 9d., and the whole is valued at £4,700.

Your Committee desire to express their most hearty thanks to the Committee of the Hospital Saturday Fund for the promotion and organisation of the Hospital Saturday Fete and collection, and to congratulate them on the success of their efforts.

The Editor of the "Advertiser" (Mr. A. B. Pope) has very kindly continued to organise a Silver Paper (or Lead Foil) Collection, which during the year has brought in the sum of £41 1s. 9d., for which your Committee is most grateful.

Dr. David Wilson (to whom the thanks of the Committee for his past services are due and are gratefully offered) having resigned his post as Honorary Ophthalmic Surgeon to the Hospital, your Committee appointed Dr. J. Masterton Thomson to fill the vacancy.

In the course of the year and to the regret of your Committee Dr. H. J. Pocock resigned from the Honorary Medical Staff on ceasing to practice in and leaving the district, and Dr. Ivan T. Barling was elected to fill the vacancy. Also Mr. A. E. Bailey, on leaving this neighbourhood to reside elsewhere, resigned the office of Hon. Treasurer. which he had so efficiently filled. This vacancy was filled by the election of Mr. James Patch.

The Newton Abbot Hospital Contributory Scheme, to the commencement of which reference was made in the Committee's report for the year 1928, was brought into operation on the 1st January, 1929, and has secured very general support throughout the Hospital district. During the year 1929 of its members were admitted as In Patients and were thus relieved from any weekly payments. The Committee of the Scheme transferred to the funds of the Hospital £1,100 up to 31st December, 1929.

Your Committee desire to thank Mr. G. P. de Faye and Captain W. J. V. Watts for auditing the accounts; the Ladies and Gentlemen who have made gifts to, and all those who have in any way assisted the Hospital during the year.

REPORT OF THE MEDICAL STAFF FOR 1929.

During the year 1929 the number of Patients treated in the General Wards of the Hospital was 631, and in the Semi-private Wards 54, making (with 126 Renewals) a total of 811. The number of Patients treated in the Private Wards was 101. The Out-patients numbered 685, with 4,507 attendances. The Massage Patients numbered 68, with 507 attendances; and the Diathermy Patients 51, with 336 attendances. Operations performed in the Operating Theatre totalled 423. The cases treated by Radium totalled 105; and those treated by Ultra Violet Rays 52, with 660 attendances; the latter apparatus is proving a valuable asset to the Hospital.

The Medical Staff desire to express their appreciation of the services continuously rendered by the Matron and the Nursing Staff, as well as their ready and cheerful response to the many calls of emergency which so frequently arise.

REPORT OF THE RADIOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT.

There has been a considerable increase in the number of X-Ray examinations during 1929, namely, 703 as compared with 460 for the previous year. This increase shows that a reliable X-Ray equipment is appreciated.

Treatment cases numbered 42, with 120 attendances.

There is an increasing demand for X-Ray treatment, especially for the use of high voltage therapy, and to make the X-Ray department fit to cope with this demand, the question of installing a transformer for therapeutic purposes should be earnestly considered.

Our existing plant is fully capable of doing all diagnostic work, but it cannot be expected to produce the very high voltage demanded for X-Ray Therapy to-day in many cases. It seems a pity now that this Hospital is becoming recognised as a convenient and efficient centre that these cases should seek relief elsewhere. However, this matter is bound up with the still more urgent question of increasing the number of beds. At present the demand far exceeds the supply, and unless that number to cope with the everyday needs of the Hospital is increased, it is difficult to plead for further X-Ray facilities, which will also increase that demand.

REPORT OF THE OPHTHALMIC DEPARTMENT.

During the year 1929 there have been 182 new cases and 531 attendances at the Ophthalmic Department of the Newton Abbot Hospital and Dispensary.

This shows an increase of 30 new patients and of 92 attendances over the previous year.

Since taking over the work of this Department in September last, the Dispensary has been held weekly instead of every second week as hitherto.

The operative work from January to September is included in the records of the Torbay Hospital. Since September three minor operations have been performed on out-patients. It is hoped that the bulk of the operative work in the future may be done in the Newton Hospital, but the great difficulty is in getting beds when required. There are already several names on the waiting list for beds.

RULES.

- I.—The Establishment shall be called “THE NEWTON ABBOT HOSPITAL AND DISPENSARY.” Its objects are to provide for the accommodation of the Poor when suffering from sickness or accident, as In-Patients, and also for the free benefit of a Dispensary for Poor out-Patients.
- II.—The management shall consist of seven Trustees, two Auditors, the Medical Officers, a Committee, Treasurer and Secretary.
- III.—The Committee shall consist of the Medical Officers, the Radiological Surgeon, the Ophthalmic Surgeon, the Dental Surgeons, three ladies and twelve gentlemen, to be elected at the Annual General Meeting from the Subscribers to the funds of the Hospital. The Secretary to be ex-officio a member of all Committees, in addition to the other members of those Committees, and the Treasurer to be ex-officio a member of the Committee. The Committee shall co-opt for the period of its office two representatives of the Newton Abbot Hospital Contributory Scheme who will be nominated by the Committee of that Scheme.
The Committee shall have power to co-opt for its period of office a number (not exceeding six) of Supporters of the Hospital from the Country Districts within the Hospital Area.
- IV.—The Medical Officers shall have the control of the Hospital Medical and Surgical Department, and the Radiological Surgeon, Ophthalmic Surgeon and Dental Surgeons of their respective Departments. The four junior Medical Officers shall have the control of the Dispensary Department.
- V.—The Domestic arrangements shall be under the direction of the Committee.
- VI.—The Committee shall meet at least once weekly.
- VII.—Should a vacancy occur in the Committee during the course of any year, the Committee shall elect one of the Subscribers to fill the vacancy until the Annual General Meeting then next ensuing. Should a vacancy occur in the Medical Staff in the course of any year the Committee shall elect a Medical Gentleman practising in the town to fill the vacancy until the next Annual General Meeting of the Subscribers.

- VIII.—The Establishment shall consist of a Matron, who shall be a Certificated Nurse, and such Nurses, Probationers, and Servants as the Committee shall find necessary.
- IX.—The Matron shall at all times reside at the Hospital, that she may be at the service of any case that may be brought in; any necessary leave of absence shall be applied for through the Committee, who shall make the needful arrangements for a substitute during an occasional absence of the Matron.

Finances.

- X.—The funds necessary for the support of the Hospital and Dispensary shall be raised by Voluntary Donations and Annual Subscriptions, Offertories, Collections and weekly payments by Patients. Contributions in kind and small sums will also be thankfully received, so as to enlist the sympathies of all in the work.
- XI.—A Statement of the Receipts and Expenditure made up to the 31st of December in each year shall, after being verified by the Auditors, be laid before the Annual General Meeting, and when approved, be printed, and a copy shall be sent to every Subscriber or Donor to the funds of the Institution.
- XII.—Annual Subscriptions shall become due on 1st January in each year, and shall be deemed to be payable unless notice to discontinue the same shall have been given previous to such 1st January in any year.

Subscribers and their Privileges.

- XIII.—Annual Subscribers shall be entitled to recommend Patients to the benefits of the Hospital and Dispensary for a Subscription of:—

during the year. And may recommend five In-Patients or four In-Patients and six Out-Patients during the year for each additional subscription of £5.

Annual Subscribers of 10/- shall be entitled to recommend Three Out-Patients; of 7/6, Two; of 5/-, One; during the year.

- XIV.—Any person who shall make an authorised collection in aid of the Funds of this Institution shall have the same privileges as an ordinary Subscriber of an equal amount for one year from the date at which such collection is paid to the general funds of the Hospital.
- XV.—Any person making a donation of a sum from 5/- up to £5 shall have the same privileges of recommending Patients for one year from the date of making such donation, as a subscriber of a similar sum to that amount.
- XVI.—Any person making a Donation of £10 and upwards shall have privileges of recommending Patients for the term of life, the same as if he were an annual Subscriber of one-tenth of such sum.
- XVII.—The recommendations of Subscribers shall be available for one month for In-Patients, and for six weeks for Out-Patients, and any Patient who may require the benefit of the Institution for a longer period must obtain a fresh recommendation for each successive month or six weeks as the case may be.

Patients.

- XVIII.—The Admission of Patients recommended under Rule XIII. shall be decided on by the Medical Officers; except in cases of severe accident or cases certified by the Medical Officer to be urgent, which shall be admissible at all times to the Hospital.

Members of the Hospital Contributory Scheme and their dependents as specified in the Rules of that Scheme will be admitted to the benefits of Hospital treatment as may be considered necessary by their Medical attendant. They will not be required to obtain or to be furnished with Subscribers' Recommends.

- XIX.—If, in the opinion of a Medical Officer, any person applying for the benefits of this Institution on the recommendation of a Subscriber, is from position and means not entitled to be a Patient of the Institution, the Medical Officer shall forward the form of recommendation to the Secretary with a statement of the facts, and the Secretary shall lay the same before the Committee at their next meeting.

XX.—Patients suffering from Infectious or Contagious Diseases, advanced Pulmonary Consumption, or who shall be of Unsound Mind, shall not be eligible for admission as In-Patients.

XXI.—No Patient shall be retained in the Hospital beyond the period of three months, unless by order of the Committee, such order to be only given after receiving a special report from the Medical Officer in charge of the case.

XXII.—The amount of weekly payments to be made by each Patient shall in all cases be decided by the Committee, and each case shall be submitted to the Committee at their next meeting after the Patient has been admitted.

Weekly payments will not be required from members of the Hospital Contributory Scheme or from their dependents.

XXIII.—In the event of a Patient of this Hospital requiring any Surgical Instrument, which it may be beyond his means to procure, the Committee, on receiving the written recommendation of the Medical Officer in charge of the case, may provide the whole or part of the cost of such instrument.

XXIV.—Everything required for the In-Patients shall be provided in the Hospital, and they shall not receive food or drink from any other source except by permission of the Medical Officers. Out-Patients shall bring their own bottles, pots, and bandages.

XXV.—There shall be eight Private Wards in the Hospital available for Patients who may be admitted into the Hospital with the consent of the Committee, on the term of their paying such sum for their nursing and maintenance while Patients as that Committee shall determine, in no case being less than £3 3s. od. per week. Such private Patients to engage their own Medical Attendant at their own cost.

Annual Meetings.

XXVI.—An Annual Meeting of the Subscribers shall be held every year in the month of January; the day for holding such meeting to be named by the Committee, and at least ten days' notice of the same shall be given by circular to each subscriber. At this Meeting all Officers for the coming year shall be appointed; the Accounts for the past year shall be examined and passed; and the Committee shall make its report to the Meeting as to the state of the Institution, its efficiency, the work it has done, and the state of its funds, with a list of subscriptions and donations, and any arrears in the same; this report shall be printed and a copy sent to each Subscriber or Donor.

Special General Meeting.

XXVII.—A special General Meeting may be called by the Committee, or by a requisition to the Secretary from not less than Five Subscribers (such requisition stating the object for which the meeting is to be called), which shall be forwarded to the Secretary in writing not less than fourteen days before the day proposed for the Meeting, and the Secretary shall give not less than seven days' notice in writing to each Subscriber, also stating the object of the Meeting.

XXVIII.—No Rule shall be altered or New Rule added except at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special General Meeting, to be called for that object, nor shall such alteration or addition be made, unless not less than fourteen days' notice in writing of the same shall have been given to the Secretary previous to the proposed day of meeting, and the Secretary shall have given not less than seven days' notice in writing to each Subscriber, stating the additions to or alterations proposed to be made in the Rules.

XXIX.—The Committee shall have the power to frame Bye-Laws for the regulation and management of the Institution.
