

FORM OF BEQUEST.

"I give and bequeath to the Treasurers and Governors for the time being of the Newark Town and District Hospital and Dispensary, the sum of *

free of duty, to be applied in and towards carrying on the charitable objects of the above Institution and I direct that the receipt of the Treasurers for the time being shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors for the same."

* The sum to be expressed in words at length.

Regulations as to Admission of Ordinary In-Patients.

Sick Persons suitable for admission as In-Patients must obtain, before entering the Hospital, SIX Tickets, and the Certificate at the foot of one of the Tickets must be filled in and signed by a Medical Practitioner.

Accidents are admitted without Tickets.

Tickets last five weeks, and if the Patient remains in the Hospital for a longer period, fresh Tickets must be obtained.

In cases of minor operations where the Patient does not remain an In-Patient in the Hospital for more than three nights, Two Tickets will be accepted.

For the Regulations as to Private and Paying Patients see the Bye-laws.

Regulations for Out-Patients.

- 1—Out-Patients, other than those mentioned in (2), must attend punctually at 11 a.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays only, except in cases of emergency.
- 2—Out-Patients who have been visited in their own homes by the House Surgeon and who are well enough to attend at the Hospital, must attend there punctually at 11 a.m. on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.
- 3—Except in cases of emergency, no Out-Patient can be attended to at the Hospital unless a Ticket is produced at the *first* visit. The Medical Staff have no power to relax this Bye-law.
 - 4-Every Out-Patient must bring proper phials, etc., for their medicine.
- 5-One Ticket shall suffice for all Patients in the same house having the same INFECTIOUS disease.
- 6—Town Patients too ill to attend at the Hospital, and wishing to be visited at their own homes, must send in their Tickets before 10 o'clock in the morning, otherwise they cannot be visited by the House Surgeon till the following day.
- 7—Patients will not be visited at their own houses without previously obtaining a Ticket except in cases of sudden seizure.
- 8—If attendance is required for a longer period than Five Weeks, a fresh Ticket must be procured.

X-Ray Department.

Patients requiring X-Ray Treatment must obtain One Ticket for each treatment.

Patients requiring an X-Ray Examination must obtain Three Tickets. Contributors to the Employees' Voluntary Levy and their dependents are treated or examined free on production of One Ticket, which they must obtain from their representative.

All other persons must pay at the rates for the time being in force.

Report of the Board of Management for 1927.

The year 1927 has been a year of reconstruction.

The Nurses' Home was opened by the Marchioness of Titchfield on the 22nd February, thus completing the great work conceived and carried through by Col. Hodgkinson. The Ladies' Linen Association immediately took charge, and in three weeks the house was completely furnished and occupied.

The conversion of the bedrooms vacated by the nurses into private wards was then proceeded with, and after careful consideration it was eventually decided to undertake at the same time several much-needed extensions and improvements of the out-patients' department and the electrical treatment rooms. Mr. Watkins, the Architect of the Nurses' Home, was again called into consultation and the reconstruction is now in progress. The whole scheme is expected to cost about £3,000 exclusive of additional furnishing and equipment, but, having regard to the recent special appeal for the Home and the constant calls upon the public for the Hospital, it was decided in the first instance to realise some of the invested capital bequeathed by former benefactors and to trust to the generosity of future donors to help to replace the money so spent. In the meantime there must necessarily be a reduction of income by about £150 a year, the interest on the investments sold, and this, together with the cost of the additional staff required for the new wards, will be a source of considerable anxiety to the Board of Management.

Apart from the building, the work of the hospital has proceeded on normal lines. The number of patients treated in the several departments were:—

Of the 428 In-patients 225 came from Newark, 175 from the Country and 28 from outside the radius. They were in the Hospital on an average 24 days each, costing about £10 8s. 6d. a case, or about 8s. 8d. a day. The Out-patients, Casualties, etc., have been treated at a cost of about 7s. 11d. per patient. The X-Ray apparatus was used on 737 occasions, 98 times for In-patients and 639 times for Out-patients. The casualties included a large number of motor accidents, many of which occurred to persons passing through Newark, and having no connection with the district.

The accounts are printed in detail on other pages and it is therefore unnecessary here to do more than draw attention to a few salient points. Subscriptions shew a slight but welcome recovery, which however is more than offset by a falling-off in donations. The Employees' Voluntary Levy produced £1879, by far the largest amount yet received from this source. This sum and those sums obtained through the House-to-House Collections and the May Fair Benefit organised by the Town and District Friendly Societies, the efforts of the Newark and District Allotment Holders' Society and the collections made in the elementary schools in the town and district make up nearly half the total income for the year. Unfortunately the Trustees of the Ossington Coffee Palace have found it necessary to carry out extensive repairs to their buildings and consequently they have been unable during the past year to make any contribution to the Hospital.

By means of Boxes the following sums have been collected:— In the Hospital, £5 5s. 10d.; Old White Hart, £5 3s. 3d; Eagle Tavern, 14s. 6d.; Alpha Lodge, R A.O.B., 10s. 6d.; Vine Hotel, 6s. 11d.; Robin Hood Hotel, 10s. 9d.; Ram Hotel, £1 5s. 11d.; Clinton Arms Hotel, 12s. 6d.; Working Men's Club, 7s. 6d.; Friendly Societies' Club, 5s. 0d; Boots Ltd., 5s.; other sums, £2 10s. 1d.—Total, £17 17s. 9d.

The total income is less by £235 than in the previous year, while the ordinary expenditure shews an unwelcome increase of £580, almost the whole of which falls under the first three heads, namely, (1) Provisions, (2) Surgery and Dispensary, and (3) Domestic. In connection with item (3) it must be remembered that the

Nurses' Home has been occupied for nine months of the year, entailing expenditure for fuel, light and cleaning. The deficiency on the year is £142 in contrast to a surplus of £647 in the previous year, so with the certain loss of £150 from endowment income next year the anxieties of the Board of Management have already begun, and it is imperative that every effort should be made to increase the income in order to meet the necessary expenditure.

The Ladies' Linen Association have carried on their invaluable work, to which, at the request of the Board of Management, they have added the supervision and care of the Nurses' Home.

By the death of Mr. Wm. Bradley the Board lost a valued colleague and a staunch supporter of the Hospital. He had been a member of the Board of Management since 1897, and served as Vice-President for the four years, 1901 to 1904.

The Honorary Medical Staff has undergone no change during the year. Great thanks are due to them for their work, and also to all other members of the Hospital Staff, the Honorary Auditors and all voluntary workers and subscribers
