

#### THE REPORT

of the Board of Management of the New Sussex Hospital for the Year 1929.



In presenting their Annual Report for 1929, the Board of Management record that the past year has been one of steady growth and development.

The New Wing has been in full occupation throughout the year, an additional department has been opened, and the numbers benefited are greatly in excess of those in any preceding year.

The Hospital is still further indebted to those generous supporters, Mr. F. E. Cobb, Mr. C. H. Corbett, and Mr. H. E. Corbett, for their many gifts during 1929, especially for the addition of a Sun Parlour to accommodate three patients, which they have had built and fully equipped.

Steps taken towards Incorporating the Hospital have been almost completed. This will be the last Report to be presented under the old Constitution.

#### In-Patients.

The following statement gives the number of In-Patients admitted during the year, and for comparison, the totals for 1927 and 1928:—

1927.	1928.	1929.
539	604	639

The average number of beds occupied was 42.1, as compared with 40.6 in 1928, and the average stay of In-Patients was 24.03 days, as against 23.2 in the preceding year.

The average cost of each In-Patient amounted to £3 3s.  $2\frac{3}{16}$ d. weekly. The average total cost of each bed occupied amounted to £164 9s. 10d.

532 Patients were admitted to the General Wards, paying according to their means towards the cost of their maintenance; 107 Patients were accommodated in the Private Wards available for those of limited means.

#### Out-Patients.

In 1929 new Out-Patients numbered 3,161, their total attendances amounted to 13,694, an increase of 3,476 over the previous year.

The average cost of each Out-Patient was  $6/11\frac{3}{4}$ , and each attendance  $1/7\frac{3}{8}$ .

The accommodation in the Out-Patient, the X-Ray, the Massage Departments, and the Dispensary, is proving inadequate. Plans for improving it are before the Board, and the attention of those interested in the Hospital is drawn to the Appeal which appears on the inside of the cover of this Report.

#### Special Department.

A Pathological Department has been opened, it being felt that this would be of immense advantage to the Hospital.

#### The Radium Department.

Since September, 1925, this Hospital has been working, in connection with three London Hospitals, in the treatment of cases of cancer by Radium. By pooling the Radium owned by the Hospitals, and that lent by the British Empire Cancer Campaign, it has been possible to treat patients with an efficient technique; for as modern research has shown, the dosage, filtration, and actual mode of administration is of the greatest importance. A small insufficient dose of Radium may not only be useless, but may cause actual harm.

When it is remembered that the cost of Radium necessary for *one* application in a case of cancer, may be as high as £3,500, it is easily understood how difficult it is for a hospital to own a sufficient quantity of Radium, especially as it has to be made up in different forms for different types of cases.

A whole-time Medical Research Officer, working under the Medical Research Council, has been a vital factor in this organization.

Patients applying for treatment have, however, become so numerous, and the time wasted by the transfer of the Radium from hospital to hospital so great, that it was decided to centralize the work, and open a new hospital in London, in which the gynæcological surgeons in the four hospitals concerned could treat their patients.

Two public appeals were issued, and the response to these enabled the Cancer Research Committee to acquire and convert a large house, standing in its own garden, into a suitable hospital. Miss Elizabeth Scott (niece of the late Dr. Alfred Scott, of Brighton), was chosen as architect, and in September, 1929, the new hospital, named The Marie Curie Hospital, was opened, under the management of a Board, on which are representatives from each of the hospitals concerned.

The advantages to the patients is obvious. They can, should it be found desirable, be transferred for the actual treatment, to a hospital specially planned and organized for the purpose, and yet remain under the care of their own surgeons and physicians.

At the same time, the "Follow-up Clinic" for Brighton patients will be continued to be held periodically as before, at the New Sussex Hospital.

#### Staff.

The Board gratefully acknowledge the splendid work of the Honorary Staff throughout the year.

Owing to the increase in the work in every department of the Hospital, it has been found necessary to appoint a Resident House Physician, in addition to a Resident House Surgeon.

The Federated Superannuation Scheme for Nurses has now been in force in this Hospital for one year.

#### Special Thanks.

The Board would take the opportunity, which this Report offers, of expressing their appreciation of the valuable services rendered by a Member of the Sussex 40 V.A.D., who was a donor for blood transfusion; to the Sussex 196 V.A.D. (Brighton Branch), and Sussex V.A.D. (Hove Branch), whose Members have given their services in the Hospital Wards throughout the year, and to Miss Griffith, for her untiring labours in the Out-patient Department.

#### Finance.

The total Income from all sources during 1929 was £7,804 7s. 7d., an increase of £938 17s. 5d. as compared with the previous year.

As against this, the total Expenditure amounted to £8,032 14s., as against £7,189 15s. 7d. in 1928.

Annual Subscriptions for 1929 have amounted to £643 5s. 6d. Whilst this figure is the highest yet recorded, the Board would like it widely known that further Subscribers are urgently needed. They are fully conscious of the increasing responsibilities attendant upon the growth and development of the Hospital, and feel sure that all those interested in its welfare will lose no opportunity of spreading the knowledge of its work, and obtaining additional support.

The kindness of those who contributed to the happiness of the Patients at Christmastide, is gratefully acknowledged. For this, and for the many generous gifts of flowers, fruit, etc., the Board tender their cordial thanks.

No Legacies were received during 1929. It is hoped that all interested in the work of the Hospital will do their utmost to influence Charitable Bequests in its favour. A Form of Bequest will be found facing page 4.



#### Matron's Report,

Year ending December 31st, 1929.

It has been considered necessary during the past year to increase the number of the Nursing Staff, so as to bring into force the eight-hour day system.

The Nursing Staff now consists of five Charge Sisters, one Night Sister, one X-Ray and Sister Tutor, five Junior Sisters and 15 Probationer Nurses.

There is always left on duty in each Ward a fully qualified Sister.

Probationer Nurses are received at the age of 17 or 18 years for a two years' training, during which time they attend lectures given by the Hon. Medical Staff and the Sister Tutor. At the completion of their two years' training they pass on if suitable to one of three London Hospitals.

It is hoped that in the near future the Board of Management will be able to see their way to provide the Nurses with a Study and Lecture Room, which we are very urgently in need of.

#### REGULATIONS AS TO ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

No Letters of Admission are required.



#### GENERAL WARDS.

- Patients are required to provide themselves upon admission with a
  change of linen, towels, soap, brush and comb, tooth brush and a pair
  of slippers. They are required to pay their travelling expenses to and
  from the Hospital, also to pay for the washing of their personal linen.
  Boxes, trunks or bags cannot be left at the Hospital, and must be
  taken away by patients' friends.
- 2. \*Patients admitted into the General Wards receive Medical and Surgical attendance and Operations free of charge, but are expected to contribute according to their means towards maintenance, £1-1-0 a week being the minimum. A charge is also made for Pathological investigations, X-Ray Photography or treatment, Massage and Electrical treatment.
- Payments to be made Weekly, in advance. Payment for first week to be made upon admission; subsequent payments will be collected in the Wards on Thursdays, at 4 p.m.
- 4. Visitors to patients are admitted on THURSDAYS and SUNDAYS from 2.30 to 4 p.m., also on BANK HOLIDAYS at the same hour. In no circumstances can this rule be relaxed, except in the case of patients who are on the danger list.
- Two visitors at a time are admitted to see each patient, and not more than two visitors in one day.
- 6. Visitors are not permitted to give to patients any article of food or drink. Only eggs, fruit or jelly can be accepted for any patient, and these to be handed to the Sister or Nurse in charge of the Ward. No alcoholic liquor is allowed to be brought into the Hospital by patients or their friends.
- Enquiries by telephone can only be answered in the case of dangerous illness, or within 24 hours after operation.
- The Hospital will not be responsible for patients' money or valuables unless given into the Matron's charge.
- Patients and their friends are forbidden to offer a fee, gratuity, or present of any kind to any person in the employment of the Hospital.
- Patients leaving the Hospital should arrange to depart by 3 p.m., and must attend at the Secretary's Office prior to departure.
- Patients are required to conform in every particular to the Rules and Regulations of the Hospital.

#### BY ORDER OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE.

\* Remarks with regard to payment do not apply if the patient is eligible for benefit under the Sussex Provident Scheme.

# FOR THE GUIDANCE OF THOSE WISHING TO AVAIL THEMSELVES OF THE PRIVATE WARDS.

- Application for admission to the Private Wards of the Hospital should be made in writing to the Secretary, accompanied by a recommendation from one of the members of the Honorary Staff.
- 2. The weekly charge made by the Hospital is from £4 4s. This includes board, lodging, nursing and the services of the Resident Medical Officer. Such payment to be sent to the Secretary one week in advance. A further charge is made for Pathological Investigations, X-Rays, Electrical and Massage Treatment.
- All patients are under the care of one of the Physicians or Surgeons attached to the Hospital, for whose private fees they are responsible.
- Patients are asked not to bring with them more than one small suit case, and to provide necessary toilet articles.
- Visitors are allowed daily between 3 and 4 p.m. by permission. Visitors cannot be supplied with tea.
- 6. Patients are expected to conform to the rules of the Hospital in all matters relating to medical treatment, diet and regimen, and no patient is permitted to take any stimulant unless prescribed by the Medical Officer.
- The Hospital will not be responsible for patients' money or valuables unless given into the Secretary's charge and a receipt obtained.


This Department is equipped both for diagnosis and treatment.


#### The Sussex Provident Scheme.


