

Owing to heavy new rating and other special charges in 1929-1930, the Hospital is unable, for the first time in its history, to balance its current accounts without making a special appeal


### TO CLEAR THE BANK DEFICIT.



### THE ANNUAL REPORT

of the New Sussex Hospital for the Year 1930.

In presenting their Annual Report, the Council of Management are happy to record a very important extension and improvement of the Hospital by the addition of a large New Wing. This building, beautifully designed with southern aspect and garden frontage, has been generously provided by the Trustees of the late Sir John Howard.

### Prince George's Visit.

The Hospital was greatly honoured on Wednesday, October 29th, 1930, when H.R.H. Prince George, K.G., G.C.V.O., laid the Commemorative Stone of the John Howard Wards. His Royal Highness congratulated the Hospital Staff on the fine work they were doing, and especially on the work of the treatment of Cancer by Radium.

### A Pressing Need.

While rejoicing in the New Wing for In-Patients, the Council feel increasingly concerned at the serious inadequacy of the Out-Patient accommodation—the source of much discomfort to both patients and Medical Staff.

The daily clinics are of the utmost importance, not only as the main gateway to the hospital wards and for the treatment of lesser ailments, but also for the early diagnosis of serious diseases, in which delay may prove dangerous or even fatal. That any sufferer should have to be denied admission to a New Sussex Clinic owing to over-crowding is a most distressing possibility. In view of the rate of increase in Out-Patient numbers, however (1,178 more attendances were made in 1930 than in 1929), this danger can only be averted by providing a new Out-Patients' Hall with as little delay as possible. The structural alterations involved bring the estimated cost to £6,000, of which little more than one-tenth is yet in hand. This urgently needed work is thus held up for lack of funds, and the Council would warmly welcome substantial promises of immediate help from their ever-generous friends.

The Council would like it widely known that, owing to the New Wing extension, the great need of the Hospital is for an increased number of annual subscribers.

### Finance.

During 1930, as in former years, the Hospital has been indebted to Mr. F. E. Cobb, Hon. Treasurer, to Mr. C. H. Corbett, Chairman of Finance and Building Committees, and to Mr. H. E. Corbett, for generous gifts to the Hospital, especially for donations to the New Out-Patient Department Fund.

The total income from all sources during 1930 was £8,063/2/-. Compared with the previous year, the annual expenditure, amounting to £8,252/14/2, shows a slight increase.

### In-Patients.

A further increase is recorded in the number of In-Patients admitted during the year:—

1927	1928	1929	1930
539	604	-639	668

The average number of beds occupied in 1930 was 42.2, the average cost of each In-Patient amounting to £3/3/7 weekly; 576 patients were admitted to the general wards, contributing towards maintenance according to their means. 92 patients were accommodated in the private wards.

### Out-Patients.

It is important to note that the number of new Out-Patients has increased considerably, being 3,217, with total attendances amounting to 14,872, showing an increase of 1,178 over 1929. The cost of each Out-Patient was approximately 7/11, and for each attendance 1/8.

### The Radium Department.

The Hospital is continuing its work in connection with three London Hospitals in the treatment of cases of Cancer by Radium.

It will be remembered that by thus pooling the Radium owned by the Hospital and that lent by the British Empire Cancer Campaign and other public bodies, an amount to the value now of £12,000, it has been possible to have the Radium made up in different ways, and thus treat varying types of cancer with an efficient technique.

The work indeed has grown so much that it has been necessary to centralize it, and as a consequence of two public appeals, the Marie Curie Hospital, 2 Fitzjohn's Avenue, Hampstead, was opened in the summer, by Mr. Baldwin. The Queen has recently graciously consented to be its Patron.

To this Hospital it is possible to send our patients for treatment, although in those cases in which the patient is quite unable to travel, the radium can still be obtained for the treatment here.

The "Follow-up Clinic" for the Brighton patients will be continued to be held periodically here as before.

### Pathological Department.

The Pathological Department has proved of the greatest value to the work of the Hospital.

1930 was the first complete year since the opening of the Pathological Department on September 1st, 1929, and a summary of the work done from the beginning may be of interest.

In the year preceding September 1st, 1929, 241 specimens were examined for the New Sussex Hospital, and it was hoped that the opening of a small laboratory within the hospital would result in an increase in the number of investigations. That hope has been justified by the event, and, in fact, to an unexpected degree. The total number of investigations carried out in this small Department from September 1st, 1929 to April 24th, 1931, is 1,258, the total for the year 1930 being 802.

Compared with the previous year, it will be seen that the work is still increasing rapidly, and furthermore, in the case of a number of the specimens sent, several investigations were carried out although returned as a single report, so that the numbers are in reality higher than those given.

The work is divided under three headings :-

Histological (microscopic examination of tissues)

1930 ... 217

Bacteriological (examination of films and cultures from swabs, blood, urine, faeces, cerebro-spinal fluids, sputa. This also includes preparation of vaccines for treatment).

1930 ... 299

Chemical (blood counts, cell counts, estimation of various chemical constituents in blood, urine, faeces, gastric contents, etc.)

1930 ... 290

### Honorary Medical Staff.

During the past year, the Hospital has lost by death its distinguished Hon. Consulting Surgeon, Dame Mary Scharlieb, D.B.E., M.D., M.S., a notable pioneer and the doyenne among medical women.

The Council record with gratified appreciation the recent conferring of the honour of Commander of the British Empire upon Miss Louisa Martindale, M.D., B.S. (Lond.), J.P., President of the Medical Women's Federation of Great Britain, and Hon. Senior Surgeon of the New Sussex Hospital.

The Council wish to place on record their grateful thanks to the Hon. Medical Staff for the devoted and efficient work they have given to the Hospital during the year.

### Nursing Staff.

To the Nursing Staff, also, the Council's thanks are given, for loyal co-operation and good work, with a tribute to Miss Fleming, the Matron, for the high standard of efficiency maintained in the nursing services of the Hospital.

Mention should be made here of the untiring honorary services in the Out-Patient Department rendered for years past by Miss Griffith, and greatly appreciated by the Medical Staff; also of the valuable service of a member of the Sussex 40 Division V.A.D., especially in regard to a blood transfusion.

### The Secretaryship.

In September last, Miss M. C. Lander, who had served the Hospital so well for over nine years, resigned the Secretaryship, and was succeeded by Miss M. F. Lockwood, who had been for twelve years at the Royal London Ophthalmic Hospital.

### Thanks to Friends of the Hospital.

The Council wish especially to thank Mrs. G. S. Godfree for her generous help to the Linen Guild, and also for the sum of £45 produced by the Sale of Work organised by her, towards the Out-Patient Department Appeal Fund; to Mrs. Wolfe for the sum of £45, being the proceeds of a Ball organised by her, towards the funds of the Linen Guild, and for the sum of £65 towards the new Out-Patient Department Appeal Fund, as the result of a Dance arranged by her; and to Mrs. Kelway Bamber for her Remembrance Day Scheme, by which friends may name a bed in the wards for one day (by contributing 10/-) in remembrance of some anniversary or happy occasion. The Council are happy to record that by this scheme the sum of £75 was received during 1930.

### Pound Day.

The Council note with pleasure that the 1930 Pound Day was the best the Hospital has ever known, resulting in gifts of 5659 pounds weight of goods, and £243/2/6 in money. Very hearty thanks are offered to a number of Schools and the Women's Institutes of Sussex, who responded so nobly to the appeal of Pound Day.

### Xmas, 1930.

Sincere gratitude is felt also to many kind friends who helped with various Xmas Funds, thus providing a small personal gift and extra good things at Xmas for all in Hospital.

To all friends of the Hospital the Council offer their best thanks and beg that renewed efforts may be made to secure that most valued of all help for the Hospital—Additional Annual Subscribers.





### In-Patients.

### REGULATIONS AS TO ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

No Letters of Admission are required.

### GENERAL WARDS.

- Patients are required to provide themselves upon admission with a change of linen, towels, soap, brush and comb, tooth brush and a pair of slippers. They are required to pay their travelling expenses to and from the Hospital, also to pay for the washing of their personal linen. Boxes, trunks or bags cannot be left at the Hospital, and must be taken away by patients' friends.
- 2. \*Patients admitted into the General Wards receive Medical and Surgical attendance and Operations free of charge, but are expected to contribute according to their means towards maintenance. A charge is also made for Pathological investigations, X-Ray Photography or treatment, Massage and Electrical treatment.
- 3. Payments to be made Weekly, in advance. Payment for first week to be made upon admission; subsequent payments will be collected in the Wards on Thursdays, at 4 p.m.
- 4. Visitors to patients are admitted on THURSDAYS and SUNDAYS from 2.30 to 4 p.m., also on BANK HOLIDAYS at the same hour. In no circumstances can this rule be relaxed, except in the case of patients who are on the danger list.
- 5. Two visitors at a time are admitted to see each patient, and not more than two visitors in one day.
- 6. Visitors are not permitted to give to patients any article of food or drink. Only eggs, fruit or jelly can be accepted for any patient, and these are to be handed to the Sister or Nurse in charge of the Ward. No alcoholic liquor is allowed to be brought into the Hospital by patients or their friends.
- 7. Enquiries by telephone can only be answered in the case of dangerous illness, or within 24 hours after operation.
- 8. The Hospital will not be responsible for patients' money or valuables unless given into the Matron's charge.
- Patients and their friends are forbidden to offer a fee, gratuity, or present of any kind to any person in the employment of the Hospital.
- Patients leaving the Hospital should arrange to depart by 3 p.m., and must attend at the Secretary's Office prior to departure.
- Patients are required to conform in every particular to the Rules and Regulations of the Hospital.

# HELPFUL INFORMATION FOR PATIENTS WHO MAY WISH TO COME INTO THE PRIVATE WARDS OF THIS HOSPITAL:—

- Application for admission to the Private Wards of the Hospital should be made to the Secretary, accompanied by a note from one of the members of the Honorary Staff.
- 2. The weekly fees for a Private Ward are from £4/4/-, which includes board, lodging, nursing and the services of the Resident Medical Staff. Payments are asked to be made to the Secretary one week in advance. A further charge is made if required for a Pathological investigation and X-Ray examination or electrical and massage treatment.
- All patients are under the care of one of the Physicians or Surgeons attached to the Hospital, who make their own arrangements for private fees.
- 4. Patients are asked to bring with them a suitcase and to provide the necessary toilet articles for use and comfort.
- 5. Patients may have visitors daily between 3 and 4 if they will kindly ask the Sister-in-charge if it is convenient. It is not possible for the Hospital to supply visitors with tea.
- 6. Patients are asked to conform to the rules of the Hospital. No patient is allowed to partake of any stimulant unless it has been prescribed by the Medical Officer.
- 7. All patients are asked to hand over to the Secretary while they are in Hospital, any money or articles of value, for which a receipt will be given, otherwise the Hospital Authorities cannot be responsible for loss or damage.




